Dear Friends,

I want to thank all of you for your ongoing support of Stamford Peace and our Beyond Limits Academic Program. I started Stamford Peace in 2008 with a broad objective of using the game of basketball as a tool of positive influence on local young people, on and off the court. Anchored by the tenet that "basketball is a privilege", from the outset we have emphasized to our players that playing the game – and the accompanying "investments" of considerable time and money made by parents and coaches in our players' success – is neither a "given" nor an "end" in and of itself, but rather it is the ongoing reward for our players' pursuit of excellence in their core responsibilities in the classroom, in the community, and at home.

As much as things have changed over the years, more has stayed the same. We relish the important role our programs continue to serve in bringing together young people of all backgrounds to both play and learn – giving those who most need it a fundamental boost to success. In addition to our basketball activities, Beyond Limits helps level the educational "playing field" between our community's traditional have's and have-not's. At a time in history when affluent families have more resources than ever supporting them, young people from low to moderate income families are at greater risk of falling further behind. Beyond Limits delivers heavily subsidized academic tutoring, enrichment activities, and academic advocacy as a means of offsetting financial disadvantage. In fact, the demand for our academic services has never been greater.

Of course, not all those who require low-cost academic support are basketball players; and not all of our basketball players require academic support. However, we are committed to serving both constituencies at the same time. We could not be more proud of the growth of our Peace Academy program which offers "books & basketball" activities to the youngest and most promising student-athletes who play in our basketball leagues. In addition to regular basketball training, Peace Academy provides academic enrichment programming in partnership with Junior Achievement and Odyssey of the Mind; plus this past summer berthed its own summer reading club.

Needless to say, we could not do all we do without the generous support of all of you. Our participants, volunteers, donors and community partners continue to fuel our organization and inspire our dreams. PEACE on 3; Family on 6!!!

Stamford Peace Youth Foundation (formerly Stamford Peace Basketball Club) was founded in 2008 by Brian Kriftcher (boys' Varsity basketball head coach at Trinity Catholic High School, Stamford, CT) and co-founded by Lenwood Latta. We use a combination of competitive basketball activities, academic support (through our Beyond Limits Academic Program), and mentoring to positively influence local young people and help them achieve their full potential, on and off the court. Stamford Peace participants come from diverse socioeconomic, religious, racial, and ethnic backgrounds, from in and around Fairfield County. Lower income families receive substantial financial assistance and subsidies in order to participate. Stamford Peace is dedicated to the philosophy that "basketball is a privilege" representing a reward for consistent effort and achievement in children's core responsibilities in the classroom, in the community, and at home. PEACE Basketball and Beyond Limits are the two main pillars of our programming.





Established in 2013 by Andrew Sklover and Brian Kriftcher, our Beyond Limits Academic Program provides high-quality, subsidized peer-to-peer tutoring, enrichment activities, mentoring and academic advocacy striving to develop academic confidence in local area youth. Tutoring is conducted by high school juniors and seniors and local college students who provide one-on-one support, primarily in math and science, to local middle school and high school students. Among the students receiving our academic support are Stamford Peace student-athletes and many non-athletes. More than 75% of all students receiving tutoring are from families eligible to receive free or reduced-price school lunch, who typically do not have access to high-level academic supports. Fees/expenses are highly subsidized by Stamford Peace. In addition to our regular tutoring, Beyond Limits conducts workshops and other enrichment activities covering financial literacy, standardized test preparation, college planning and financial aid, and other topics. We actively partner with parents, teachers and administrators as important shared advocates for our participants.



## **PRISM** **PR**actical **I**vestigations of **S**cience & **M**ath **AND** **P**eace Basketball for Scholar Athletes

Last summer, we launched our Beyond Limits PRISM Program, a week-long academic camp providing rising sixth graders with a variety of skills needed to help them transition smoothly into middle school. Among the lessons we provided were sessions in time management, leadership, note-taking and listening. Students had the opportunity to reinforce math fundamentals, while increasing their overall comfort level with STEM subjects.



This coming summer, our PRISM program will also incorporate an afternoon basketball camp option. The morning session will focus on building academic confidence, while the afternoon session will focus on basketball skill development. Together, students will discover how math and science relate to everyday life including basketball, with an integrated curriculum and a hands-on experiential approach featuring outdoor activities, such as orienteering, jenga, cornhole, and basketball. As always, an emphasis will be placed on good sportsmanship, positive/constructive relationships, and fun!



From its inception, Stamford Peace has demonstrated that with intensive, ongoing investments in local young people – beginning at the elementary and middle school ages – we can make a huge positive difference in their lives. Since 2017, PEACE Academy has done just that by taking an integrated basketball and academic enrichment approach to promising 1st thru 5th graders. Investing deeply in these young student-athletes – through regular basketball trainings; as well as activities such as academic tutoring as part of Beyond Limits, a summer reading club, Odyssey of the Mind activities, and Junior Achievement financial literacy workshops – we are able to “hook into them” at their earliest and most impressionable stages. Currently, we have 25 student-athletes participating in PEACE Academy -- with the interest in this program only growing!



This past year, we launched the Signature Scholars Program in a tri-party partnership among Stamford Peace, Signature Bank and A-List Education. The program provided college admissions testing and other college preparatory assistance, at no cost, specifically for low-to-moderate income Stamford public high school students who generally lack access to such supports. Yet another way in which we are working to level the playing field!



As a kickoff to this initiative, Stamford Peace hosted a special showing of the ESPN Films 30-for-30 documentary, "When the Garden Was Eden," followed by a presentation and conversation with New York Knicks' legend Dick Barnett, PhD., who played 14 NBA seasons, including as a member of the Knicks' 1970 and 1973 NBA Championship teams. Following his basketball career, Dr. Barnett earned his PhD in Education from Fordham University and recently retired from teaching Sports Management at St. John's University in New York. A true role model both on and off the court, Dr. Barnett spoke to more than 100 student-athletes and their parents about the importance of education.



Our original effort, PEACE Basketball offers mission-focused basketball programming for boys and girls ages 5–18 years old residing in and around lower Fairfield County. Among our PEACE Basketball offerings are a boys' winter house basketball league in which nearly 700 players participate; higher-level boys' and girls' travel basketball teams; our Trifecta Hoops summer and vacation day basketball camps; an outdoor summer league at Scalzi Park; one-on-one and small group training; and year-round open gym opportunities. Using high-level basketball instruction, training, and competition, we teach the importance of education and other essential life skills to local student-athletes. Among the life lessons emphasized to participants in the Stamford Peace program are the value of teamwork, discipline, a strong work ethic, personal integrity, sportsmanship and resiliency. The broad pursuit of excellence — on and off the basketball court — remains a cornerstone of PEACE Basketball.





For the fifth consecutive year, the Stamford Peace Boys Basketball League ("SPBBL") honored one of its players with the Kyle A. Markes Humanitarian Award. This award celebrates the memory of former Peace player, Kyle Anthony Walter Markes, who passed away in December 2013 after a year-long battle with acute lymphoblastic leukemia. Each season the award is bestowed upon an SPBBL 8th grader who is nominated by his/her coach for displaying the qualities for which Kyle was known -- a good teammate and student-athlete, with a love for life, friends and family. For the 2017-2018 season, we were pleased to bestow the award upon CARL CORIDON, an 8th grader at New Canaan Country School.



In 2018-2019, we introduced a new program in which SPBBL athletes had the chance to earn a Stamford Peace "Gold Standard" sweatband for embodying the league's core values of outstanding sportsmanship, teamwork, encouragement and positive attitude. PEACE Basketball, through its Trifecta Hoops Basketball Camps brand, runs basketball camps and clinics for elementary and middle school children as a source of basketball skill development, fitness and fun! Stamford Peace acquired Trifecta in 2017, accessing an important earned revenue opportunity which support our various Beyond Limits and PEACE Basketball activities. Over the past decade, nearly

5,000 young people have participated in high-level instructional basketball camps, clinics, leagues and travel opportunities through Trifecta and PEACE Basketball. Our camps utilize a form of “deep practice” designed to help players improve their ball handling, shooting, decision making, and all around offensive skills. Camps are challenging yet fun for all ages and skill levels.



This summer, Stamford Peace continues its partnership with the City of Stamford Recreation Department by providing rising 6th thru 11th graders the opportunity to play basketball outdoors in a safe and energetic setting. A throwback to days when kids routinely played outdoors, our Summer League at Scalzi consists of 10 games, two games each weekday evening, played on the blacktop at Stamford's Scalzi Park! Almost as much fun as watching our young people compete outdoors is witnessing the appreciation of passers-by who glow at the return of youth basketball activity to the park. We are grateful to NBC Sports Group for their sponsorship of the league this past summer.

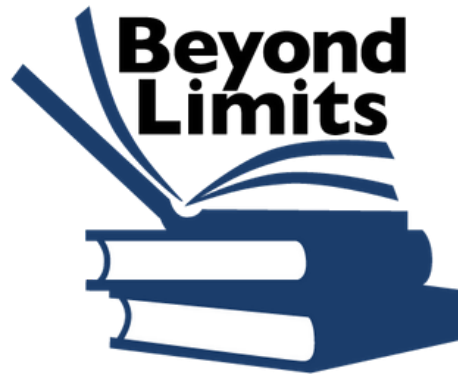

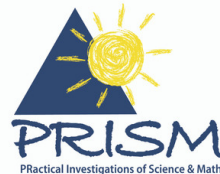




# Strength in Collaboration

Many thanks to all of our donors, volunteers and attendees. You helped make the evening a "slam dunk" success!



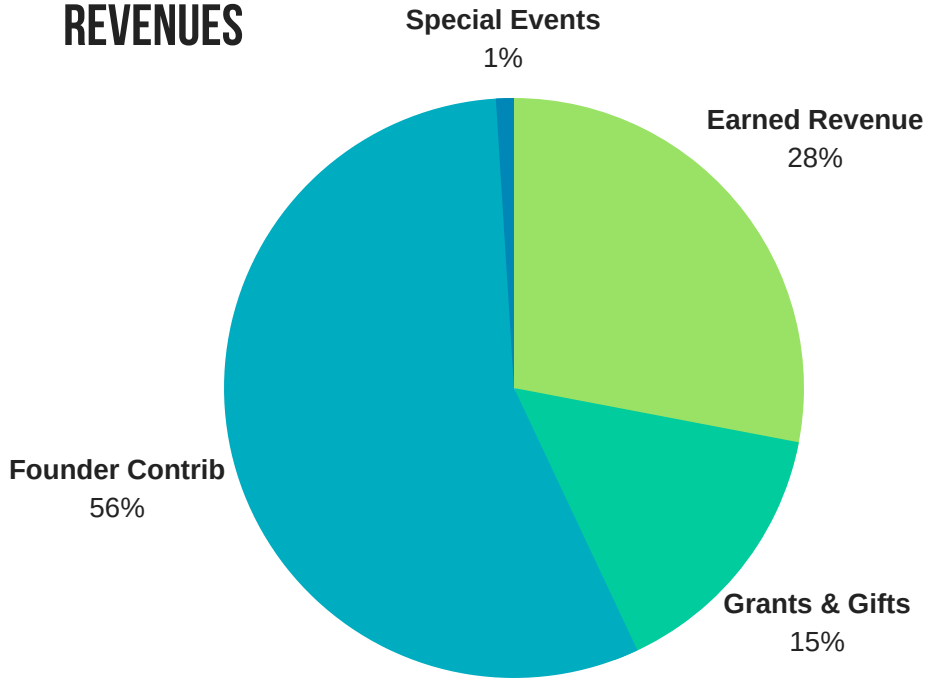

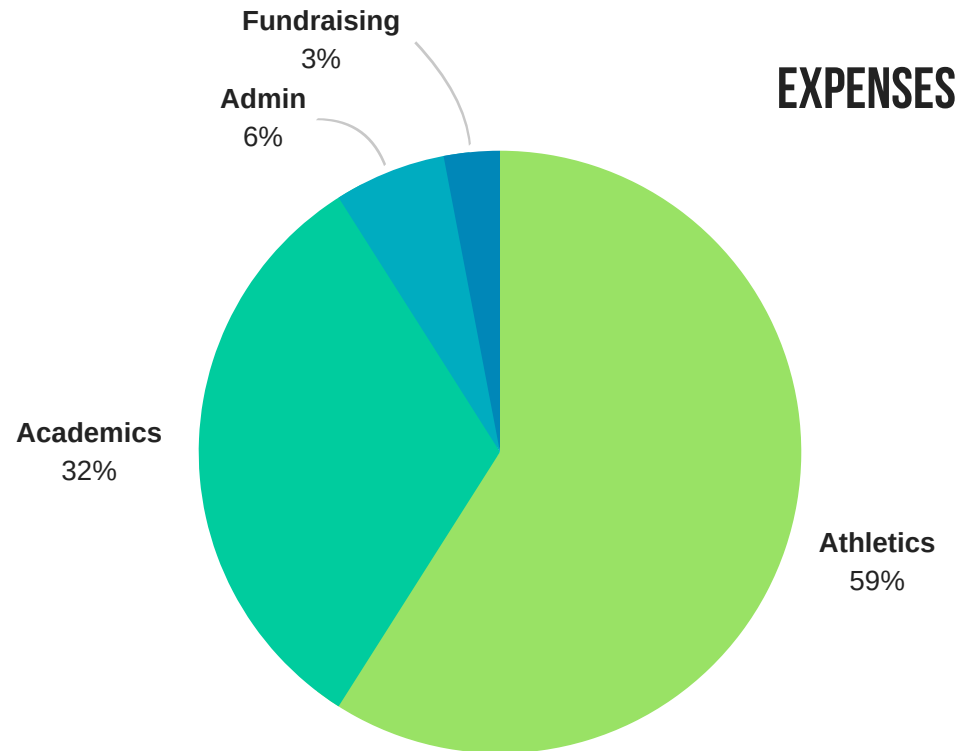
