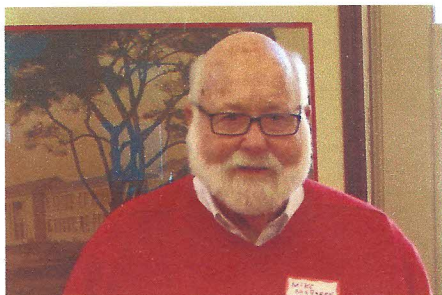

Dear Panther Alumni,

At our beloved Burlingame High, we are headed to the last part of the school year with only two months to go. As you may remember, this is an especially exciting time for our seniors, as they get ready to wrap up their high school experience and prepare for the next set of opportunities in their lives. The rest of our students continue to enjoy the tremendous resources that are available at BHS. Our academics continue to be among the top in the state as indicated by the following best high school rankings in California: <https://k12.niche.com/rankings/public-high-schools/best-overall/s/california/>. A recent mid-cycle progress visit by WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges) affirmed our accreditation status and our commitment to continuous improvement on behalf of all BHS students.

In addition to the strong scholastic and athletic programs, we have the unique PAWS (People, Action, Work, and Service) program at BHS that offers students a variety of service-oriented opportunities. PAWS program has progressively allowed our students to be more visible in the service sector and instill a culture of volunteerism. In school year 2013-2014, for example, BHS students were selected for the prestigious Jefferson Awards as the Bay Area Regional Winner and for the 4th place winner at the National Ceremony in Washington DC. This recognition was based on our student involvement in a range of local projects and individual students' initiatives to help the community.

Examples of community service projects include the *We Scare for Hunger* drive that integrated the project with *Facing History* class on unit on hunger and homelessness and culminated in a walking field trip to

Invision Shelter Network. We are also in our second year of the *Soles without Holes* drive and nearly doubled our participation in the number of shoes donated. *Soles without Holes* is a non-profit charity founded by one of our current students who had searched for a way to give back to the community. Shoes were donated to Pacific Garden Mission homeless shelter in Chicago, Covenant House Shelter in New Orleans and Detroit, SF Medical Respite and Sobering Center, and Orphan's Heart in Guatemala and Africa. The *Gift of Words* drive during the holidays contributed books to the San Francisco based Children's Book Project. Moreover, our partnership with Books, Inc. allowed our students to hold free gift-wrapping and send the donated tips to Children's Book Project.

This highlight of the PAWS program is a small insight to the incredible activities that our students are involved in on a daily basis. When you have an opportunity, please visit the campus and see the wonderful updates. The stadium bleachers were refurbished in the fall and look modernized. The new academic building is well underway to completion and should be available by the end of summer.

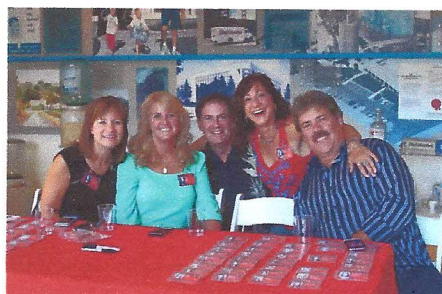

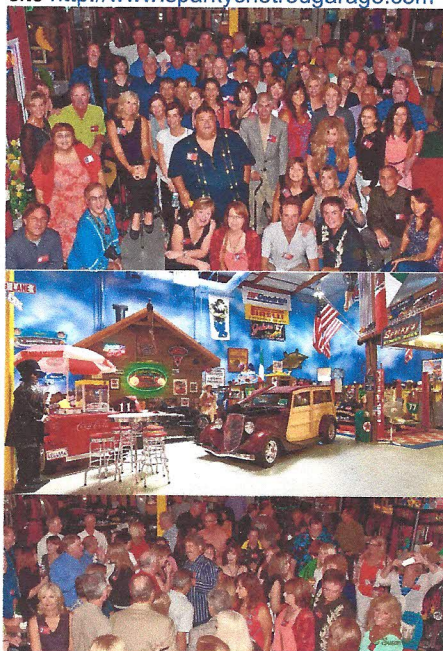

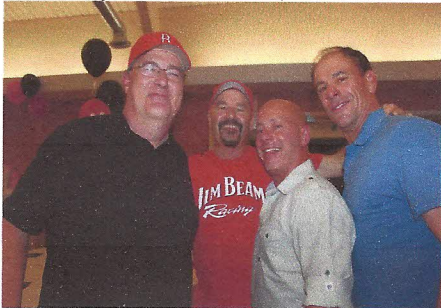
