# The Breakdown Sports Tip Off Classic presented by Eastbay is THE premier girls' high school basketball event in the state

Twenty-four top girls' teams and dozens of college prospects hit the courts at Hopkins' Lindbergh Center for a one-day showdown, Saturday, Dec. 3, 2011

HOPKINS, Minn. (Nov. 18, 2011) – Anxious to see a showdown between Braham's preseason No. 1 squad led by high-scoring Rebekah Dahlman and the No. 1 team in Class A, Maranatha Christian, a battle between powerhouses trying to defend their state titles? How about a first look at No. 1 Hopkins and the Coffey sisters against Tessa Cichy and Hill-Murray? Or the second-ranked team in Class AAAA (Eden Prairie) against the No. 2 team in Class AAA (Benilde-St. Margaret's)? Well, don't wait until March to get your basketball fix. Those games are among a dozen terrific matchups between the elite in Minnesota girls' high school basketball at the **BREAKDOWN SPORTS** Tip Off Classic presented by Eastbay.

Many of the top players and teams in the state of Minnesota will be on the courts at Hopkins' Lindbergh Center for the annual Tip Off Classic, Dec. 3, 2011.
