Defenders have to act quick in tight spaces, exchanging positions and quick transition is key!

Smaller numbers allow for more touches on the ball.

The Unit of 6 players is encouraged to play as a group and instruct each other for movement.



Players have to transition more often because of the tight space and quickness of play.

players are encouraged to be as creative as possible with the ball. Getting out of tight spaces with moves is magical!

The heavy, dense, no bounce ball forces proper striking technique and better control of a smaller size ball.

~ACADEMY PROGRAM~

Campton United's Academy is a seasonal program for ages 5 through 8. It has become integral in developing and preparing players for Club/Travel soccer. The original idea for the Academy Program was to give players, that were identified at Campton's ID Camp, the opportunity to train in a professional environment. The Campton Academy has grown from 12 players in the spring of 2010 to 56 players in the winter of 2011/2012.

The Academy Program is approached as one big TEAM... Players have the opportunity to:

- Train, compete and socialize with a large group of players.
- Build more social skills and develop friendships.
- Compete with and learn from other players of similar age and ability.
- Are placed in an environment that allows them to develop awareness of their "club culture" among different peers with whom they compete.
- No scores, results or standings are kept for the Academy program.
- The focus is on individual development and enjoyment, free from standings and the pressure of results.

Training Philosophy for our Academy Program:

Children should be having fun with the ball. The most fundamental skill in soccer is individual mastery of the ball and the creativity that comes with it. As this skill is mastered, the rest of the game becomes easier. Our training is focused around facilitating the development of the skills necessary to move and control the ball well through a variety of game orientated activities. At this age, the primary goal is to make the players' experience with soccer so enjoyable that when he or she has a choice of activities, he or she will choose to play soccer on his or her own.

Campton United is proud to present a Spring Program for players ages 4 thru 10. The Junior Soccer Academy, or JSA, is a program for beginner and/or recreational players, it was designed around the core concept of teaching players comfort and mastery of the ball. At the early levels of youth soccer, ball skills, FUN and experimentation within the game are key to player development. Introduce your player to professional coaching and advanced training ideas that will help your child improve their game. JSA will be starting the first week in April.
