Four members of the National Collegiate Hockey Conference will host home series this week including a rare one-game weekend featuring Rocky Mountain neighbors Colorado College and Denver on Saturday, Nov. 12 in the Mile High City. It is the only meeting of the week between NCHC teams. In other action, Miami hosts No. 4/5 Michigan, Minnesota Duluth welcomes Alaska Anchorage and Western Michigan plays host the Michigan State. Nebraska Omaha and St. Cloud State are both on the road. The Mavericks visit Bemidji State, and the Huskies travel to Minnesota State. North Dakota has the week off.

LAST WEEK'S ACTION

All eight members of The National were embroiled in their respective conference action last week, posting a record of 8-7-4. The record includes head-to-head action between Colorado College and Nebraska Omaha and Denver and Minnesota Duluth.

Colorado College suffered its first loss of the year, losing to UNO, 7-5, in the wild opener of their weekend. The Tigers answered back with a 5-2 win on Saturday in Omaha. Miami shook off a five-game winless streak with back-to-back 2-1 wins at Alaska in CCHA action. Minnesota Duluth played Denver to a 3-3 draw in the opener of their weekend series before blanking the Pioneers, 4-0, in the rematch. Western Michigan split a weekend with in-state rival and fellow CCHA team, Michigan. The Broncos beat the Wolverines, 3-2, on Friday night at Yost Ice Arena before bowing to their hosts, 5-2, the following night.

St. Cloud State picked up a win and a draw at home last weekend against Wisconsin. The Huskies hammered the Badgers, 7-2, before settling for a 3-3 tie. North Dakota ran into a hot Minnesota team at home, losing 2-0 on Friday and 3-2 on Saturday.

POLLING PLACES

Colorado College remains the top-ranked NCHC team in the national polls, coming in third in the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls. Western Michigan is next, coming in fifth and sixth respectively. They're followed by Minnesota Duluth, Denver and North Dakota. All eight NCHC teams are at least receiving votes this week. - The Tigers, who play a single game this Saturday at the University of Denver, are 3-1 so far during a stretch of five consecutive road games on NHL-size sheets of ice. They'll try to get a jump on regaining possession of the Gold Pan for the first time since 2008-09 when they visit Magness Arena later this week.
- After going 0-for-4 on the power play in its season opener against Bemidji State on Oct. 14, Colorado College has clicked for at least one PPG in five straight games while posting a 31-percent (9-for-29) success rate with the manpower advantage. CC was 5-for -13 (38.5 percent) in last week's split at Nebraska Omaha.
- Senior center/team captain Nick Dineen, an Omaha native, accounted for three of the power-play tallies in the series with UNO and now has collected 9 points (6g,3a) in four all-time appearances against the Mavericks. He recorded a career-best 4 (1g,3a), including an assist on the gamewinning goal, in Saturday's 5-2 victory. Dineen was named the WCHA's Offensive Player of the Week, the second time he's earned the honor in his career. The other also came after facing his home town team last season.
- The 45 saves by Josh Thorimbert on Saturday, including 23 in the second period, represents a career high for the sophomore net minder from Saskatoon, Saskatchewan.
- Sophomore left wing Jaden Schwartz, who snapped a 2-2 deadlock with 6:27 left in the third period of Saturday's contest, has either scored or helped set up the game winner in four of Colorado College's five victories in 2011-12 as well as in all five of its post-season triumphs last March. He takes a 12-game point-scoring streak into this week's game at DU.

- Junior center Rylan Schwartz has scored nearly half (11) of his 23 goals as a Tiger in the team's last nine games dating back to the final three post-season outings of the 2010-11 campaign. He now has factored in on 21 game winners after earning the primary assist on his younger brother's decisive red lighter on Saturday. He's scored six GWG, including two in '11-12, and assisted on 15.
- Eighteen different CC players have collected at least one point this season after senior left wing Tim Hall, junior right wing Andrew Hamburg and freshman winger Charlie Taft each picked up his first of the season in last Friday's 7-5 loss at CenturyLink Center. Eleven have scored.
- The seven goals allowed on Friday matched the total that Colorado College had given up in its first four games combined.
- Senior defenseman Gabe Guentzel recorded the 17th multiple-point game of his collegiate career with a power-play goal and an assist on Dineen's PPG just 65 seconds apart early in the second period of Saturday's victory.
- Empty-net tallies by Rylan Schwartz and sophomore left wing Dakota Eveland late in the series finale in Omaha gave the Tigers six ENG already this season after they scored only one during all of 2010-11.
- With seven more points (1g,6a) in last week's split, CC defensemen collectively have accounted for 21 (4a,17a) of the team's total of 65 (27g,38a) so far in 2011-12.
- Despite dropping a pair of decisions at DU last season, the Tigers head there this weekend with an all-time record of 14-8-4 at Magness Arena against their archrival. They are 18-8-3 in 29 meetings with Denver at the Colorado Springs World Arena.

- Denver renews its in-state and Gold Pan Trophy rivalry with Colorado College on Saturday, Nov. 12.
- The Pioneers and Tigers are tied for sixth in the WCHA with six points each.
- The Pioneers have held possession of the Gold Pan Trophy, awarded to the annual series winner between DU and CC, for the past two seasons.
- DU owns a 156-109-14 advantage over Colorado College in the all-time series which dates back to 1950.
- CC owns a 10-8 advantage in 18 years of Gold Pan competition.
- The Pioneers went 2-2 against the Tigers last season, claiming 5-3 and 4-1 wins at Magness Arena and suffering 3-2 and 9-2 losses at the World Arena.
- The Pioneers are 3-2 against the Tigers in their last five games and 4-3-3 in the last 10.
- Denver has been outscored 16-7 during its current four-game winless streak (0-2-2).
- The Pioneers charted a 3-3 overtime tie and 4-0 loss against 2011 NCAA champion Minnesota Duluth last weekend.
- Junior co-captain Drew Shore (Denver, Colo.) and sophomore Jason Zucker (Las Vegas, Nev.), who lead Denver in scoring with 10 points each, were held pointless last weekend against the Bulldogs.
- Freshman Joey LaLeggia (Burnaby, B.C.) leads WCHA rookie blueliners in goals (4) and points (7).
- Goaltender Adam Murray (3-2-1, 3.18 GAA, .907 Sv%) stopped a career-high 43 shots in the 3-3 tie against UMD last Friday and freshman Juho Olkinuora (0-1-1, 2.31 GAA, .907 Sv%) had 21 saves in the 4-0 loss last Saturday.
- Murray has six starts and Olkinuora has played in four games with two starts.
- Sophomore forward Beau Bennett (Gardena, Calif.) has missed the last four games with a wrist injury.
- DU has struggled to a 16.6 percentage (6-for-36) on the power-play and 80.9 percentage (38-for-47) on the penalty-kill.
- DU has played 11 forwards and seven defensemen in seven of eight games this season.
- DU hosts Nebraska Omaha (Nov. 18-19), Princeton (Nov. 25) and Miami (Nov. 26) this month at Magness Arena.

- Miami picked up a pair of 2-1 wins at Alaska last weekend to earn its first weekend sweep of the season. With the victories, the RedHawks earned their first league wins of the year and also snapped their five-game losing streak. Miami is now 5-0-1 in its last three trips to Alaska and has won four straight over the Nanooks overall, limiting UAF to one goal in each of those games.
- The RedHawks held Alaska to just one goal both nights, which were season lows for goals allowed. Miami's previous low was two goals allowed on Oct. 8 vs. Bemidji State and Oct. 22 at Ferris State. On Friday, senior goalie Cody Reichard made a season-high 29 saves and combined to stop 53

of 55 shots he faced in the two games.

- Freshman forward Tyler Biggs dished out a pair of assists over the weekend with one in each game. In doing so, he extended his point streak to a career-long four games. The four-game point streak matches the longest by any RedHawk this year, as Alden Hirschfeld started the year with a point in four straight games. Biggs is now tied for the team lead among freshmen with five points.
- Junior forward Curtis McKenzie scored a power play goal for Miami in the second period Saturday to break a scoreless deadlock. The power play goal was Miami's first man-advantage goal in its last 27 opportunities and was the RedHawks first power play goal in CCHA play (six games). Miami's last power play goal prior to Saturday came Oct. 14 at Colgate in the second period, a drought of 21 periods and seven games.
- The RedHawks were a perfect 12-for-12 on the penalty kill over the weekend, including tying a season high with seven kills Friday, the third time Miami has done so. The 'Hawks have now killed 16 straight penalties dating back to Oct. 28 (Miami's last three games), after allowing at least one power play goal in each of the six games prior and two in each of the previous five contests.
- Sophomore forward Max Cook scored his first goal of the season and just the second goal of his career Saturday in the third period. The goal broke a 1-1 tie and turned out to be the game-winning goal, which was his first-career game-winning goal and first even strength goal. His only other goal came Nov. 26, 2010 at Western Michigan on the power play.
- Miami was outshot in both games over the weekend, including 30-14 on Friday. The 14 shots on goal were Miami's fewest since putting 13 on net Nov. 6, 2009 at Michigan (also a Miami win). The RedHawks have been outshot five times in 2011 but are 3-2 in those contests compared to 1-4 when Miami outshoots its opponent. The 'Hawks have fired less than 20 shots twice now this year, but won both games with the other coming Oct. 14 at Colgate when Miami had 15 shots on goal.
- The RedHawks scored first in both games this weekend and have done so in seven of 10 games this year. Miami is just 4-3 in those games however. All 10 of Miami's games have been within two goals as the RedHawks are 4-2 in one-goal games, including both contests with UAF, but are 0-4 in two-game games. Miami won both games this weekend by scoring just two goals, something it hasn't done since March 27, 2010, a 2-1 win over Alabama-Huntsville in the NCAA Tournament, as the 'Hawks were 0-5-4 when scoring two goals or less last year.
- Miami trails in the all-time series with Michigan, 69-25-3, including 22-19-2 in Oxford. Recently, however, the RedHawks have had the upper hand against the Wolverines, winning five of the last six meetings, including three straight, and are 7-3 vs. Michigan since the 2008-09 season. The RedHawks have never won four straight over the Wolverines. The last four regular-season series' between the teams have ended in sweeps (three for Miami, one for Michigan), including Miami's sweep of UM in Oxford last year.
- Head coach Enrico Blasi is 11-21-1 against Michigan as the head coach of Miami. He was just 3-11-1 against UM as a player at Miami. Michigan enters the weekend ranked in the top 10 and was No. 3 last week. Miami is 0-4-0 against ranked teams this year, getting swept at No. 14 Ferris State and by No. 18 Lake Superior State.
- A win Friday over Michigan would give Miami its first three-game winning streak of the season and its first four-game winning streak against Michigan in program history. However, Miami is just 1-3 at home this year compared to 3-3 on the road.
- Senior goalie Cody Reichard is 5-2 in his career against Michigan with a 2.05 GAA and a .922 save percentage in seven starts. He also has two shutouts against UM. Senior goalie Connor Knapp set his career high for saves with 55 against Michigan on March 28, 2010 in an NCAA Regional Final, which was two saves shy of the school record, a game Miami won.

- The defending NCAA champion Bulldogs will put their six-game unbeaten streak (4-0-2) on the line this weekend when they host the University of Alaska Anchorage in a pair of WCHA engagements. It marks the start of a four-game homestand for UMD, which, after a Nov. 19 clash with Minnesota State University-Mankato, will not return to AMSOIL Arena until Jan. 20.
- UMD skated out of Denver with three of a possible four points last weekend following up a 3-3 draw Friday night with a 4-0 victory over the eighth-ranked Pioneer the next evening. Three different Bulldogs scored in the opener, including senior defenseman Scott Kishel, who also added an assist, as UMD rallied from a 3-1 deficit and outshot the Pioneers 46-33 on the night. On Saturday, senior center Travis Oleksuk collected a pair of goals and senior goaltender Kenny Reiter rejected all 29 shots Denver sent his way for his second shutout in three games.
- During it six-game unbeaten streak, the Bulldogs have outscored the opposition 21-9 while killing off 24 of 25 power play attempts (96 percent).
- With a goal and two assist over the weekend in Denver, senior team captain Jack Connolly hiked his career scoring harvest to a nation-leading 150 points (50 goals and 150 assists). That moved the 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist into 20th place on UMD's all-time scoring charts, two points behind the No. 19 occupant, center Tim Stapleton (2002-06) and thee points behind Monty Jones (1973-77). Connolly, the country's

top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third among NCAA skaters with a career-high 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions. Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010). Connolly, who has suited up in all 135 outings over the past four season, became just the 14th Bulldog ever to reach the 100 mark for a career. The current owner of an eight-game scoring streak, he is second in the WCHA in overall power play points with ninth, is tied for sixth in assists (9) and is tied for seventh in points (13). Connolly, a member of the All-WCHA first team and WCHA All-Academic Team the past two winters, is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (Norm Maciver, 1985-86).

- This past Saturday night in Denver, UMD was held without a power play goal and failed to outscore the opposition for the first time this season.
- Senior Travis Oleksuk has racked up a WCHA-leading nine goals this season, three of which came at the expense of Denver last weekend. The Thunder Bay, Ontario, product, who is a plus-6 on the year, has picked up at least one point in all but one of UMD's 10 outings this season. Oleksuk and junior left winger Mike Seidel have combined to score 38.9 percent of UMD's goals. Seidel has five tallies to his 2011-12 credit, including a team-leading three on the power play, but has been blanked in that department in each of the past four games.
- UMD is now unbeaten in 22 of its 27 games away from Duluth since the start of the 2010-11 season (16-5-6).
- Kenny Reiter shutout Saturday night against the Pioneers was the eighth of his career, which is one shy of the school record held by All-American Alex Stalock. Reiter, blanked the Pioneers for the final 101:09 of the weekend and, for the second time in three games, stopped a penalty shot (by Denver's Jason Zucker with 4:30 to go in the second period Saturday). Over the course of UMD's six-game unbeaten streak, he has crafted a 1.46 goals against average and a .944 saves percentage in six starts. Reiter, a three-time WCHA All-Academic Team pick, has compiled a nifty 34-19-7 career record with Bulldogs. That translates into a .625 winning percentage, the second best mark in club history behind All-American Rick Kosti's .753 figure (60-18-2 between 1983-85). Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA playoffs, the Pittsburgh, Pa., native has lost just twice in his last 13 appearance (9-2-2).
- After giving up eight power plays in 18 opportunities to the opposition during the first two weekends of the 2011-12 season, UMD has allowed just one goal (at Providence College on Oct. 22) in 25 man advantage chances since.
- Senior Brady Lamb, who will bring a personal-best four-game scoring streak into Friday night's clash with Alaska Anchorage, ranks third among WCHA defensemen in points with 10 and has managed at least a goal or an assist in eight of UMD's 10 outings to date.
- Over the last four seasons, UMD has gone 13-4-17 in overtime games (.632), picking up a school-record seven of those wins one year ago.
- Senior defenseman Scott Kishel picked up his first goal as a Bulldog last Friday night (in his 56th lifetime game) and also helped set up another score for the first two-point night of his career. Kishel's whose 10 points this season are bettered by only five other WCHA blueliners at the moment, has already skated in three more games this year than he did all of last season.
- The Bulldogs are 8-7-2 at AMSOIL Arena since that \$80-million, 6,726-seat facility opened on Dec. 30, 2010.
- Center/left winger Caleb Herbert, who was credited with an assist in the 4-0 triumph at Denver Saturday, is tied for fourth in the WCHA rookie scoring race with seven points.
- Junior defenseman Wade Bergman tops the 2011-12 Bulldogs in plus-minus rating (+7) and is a plus +20 for his career. That's second only to Jack Connolly's +35 figure among current Bulldogs.

- UNO split its weekend series with Colorado College, winning 7-5 on Friday before dropping a 5-2 decision on Saturday.
- In Friday's win, the Mavericks set a new season-high for goals scored in one game.
- Matt White led the Mavericks in scoring last week with two goals and four points. All came in UNO's 7-5 win on Friday, matching a team season-high for points in a game. With the big night, White extended his point-scoring streak to six games before it was snapped the following night. Still, White ranks second in WCHA scoring for all games played with five goals and 11 assists for 16 points.
- Terry Broadhurst also built a six-game point-scoring streak with a goal and two assists in Friday's 7-5 win. Like White, his streak was snapped on Saturday. Broadhurst now is tied for fifth in WCHA scoring for all games played with eight goals and six assists for 14 points.
- Freshman Jayson Megna notched the first multiple-goal game of his career when he had two goals in UNO's 7-5 win over CC. Megna sits in a five-way tie for four in WCHA freshman scoring for all games played with seven points.
- Rookie goaltender Dayn Belfour hit a milestone when he picked up his first collegiate win in Friday's 7-5 victory. Belfour worked 20 minutes in relief of John Faulkner, stopping nine of 10 shots.
- In Friday's win, defenseman Andrej Sustr was a remarkable +5. The following night, he had a goal in UNO's 5-2 loss to CC, establishing a new

career high for goals in a season (3).

- On Friday, UNO head coach Dean Blais coached in his 500th game as a head coach. The game came 17 years to the day that Blais earned his first win as a head coach, a 6-4 victory at Denver while leading North Dakota.
- The Mavericks posted their third straight game with multiple powerplay goals when they scored two in their 7-5 win over CC. That string came to an end when the Mavs went 0-for-7 in Saturday's 5-2 loss.
- Ryan Walters scored his first goal of the season in Friday's win over the Tigers, and it turned out to be the game winner. He had a shorthanded tally the following night.
- UNO has already scored three shorthanded goals in the first ten games of the year. They had six shorthanded markers in 39 games last season.
- The Mavericks will play their next four games on the road beginning with a series at Bemidji State on Nov. 11 and 12.
- The Beavers lead the all-time series with UNO, 6-5-1. They were the only team UNO did not beat last year, going 0-5-1 in regular season and playoff action. The Mavericks are 1-6-1 in their last eight games against BSU. They are 0-2-0 at the Sanford Center.
- Only once in the last eight meetings has either team scored more than three goals. UNO has scored two goals or fewer in six straight meetings.

- The Fighting Sioux (3-6-1, 1-5-0 WCHA) are idle this week and will return to action Nov. 19-20 at Bemidji State.
- UND is coming off a pair of WCHA losses at fifth-ranked Minnesota, falling 2-0 and 3-2 on Saturday.
- The Sioux held a 2-1 lead late in Saturday's game, but suffered the sweep after Minnesota rallied with two goals in the final 6:04.
- It marked the first time UND had been swept in a regular season series at Minnesota since 1996-97.
- The Sioux went on to win the program's sixth of seven national titles that year.
- Junior goalie Aaron Dell enjoyed a tremendous series at Minnesota, stopping 69 of 74 shots (.932).
- Last Friday, Dell made a season-high 30 saves on 32 shots. The following night he stopped 39 of 42, the most saves he's ever had during a regular season game and one shy of the career-high 40 he had in the 2011 WCHA Final Five championship game.
- Dell owns a 2.02 goals-against average and a .937 save percentage over his last three games (all starts) after opening the year with a 3.41 GAA and .843 SV% in his first seven games (six starts).
- Junior forward Danny Kristo, who leads the team with 12 points, was held without a point in the Minnesota series, the first time this season he has gone consecutive games without reaching the scoresheet.
- Freshman forward Rocco Grimaldi scored his first career goal on Saturday at Minnesota.
- Grimaldi had played in just three of UND's first nine games due to injury.
- UND's penalty-killing was outstanding at Minnesota, holding the Gophers' league-leading power-play to just one goal on seven chances.
- The Sioux have now killed 21 of 22 opponent power-plays spanning the last 14 periods.
- Senior defenseman Ben Blood extended his consecutive games played streak to 110 games.
- Ryan Duncan (2005-09) and Chris Porter (2003-07) hold the school and NCAA record, having each played in 175 straight games.
- After setting a UND single-season record by winning 59.9% of his face-offs last year, junior center Corban Knight is on track to topple his own record, having won an even 60% of his draws this year.
- UND is three goals away from reaching the 10,000th in program history, a history that dates back to 1946-47.

- The St. Cloud State men's hockey team will journey to Mankato, Minn. on Nov. 11-12 for a pair of road games at Minnesota State.
- The Huskies and Mavericks have enjoyed a long history of competition in all sports and the hockey series between these two programs started in 1969-70, when the Huskies posted a 3-1 record against Minnesota State (then called Mankato State) that season.
- Since the Huskies made the move to the NCAA Division I level in 1987-88, St. Cloud State has posted a 22-14-7 record against the Mavericks.
- In the last five outings against MSU, the Huskies own a 2-2-1 record and they are 3-4-3 against MSU in the last 10 games.
- Last year at the NHC, the Huskies tied 3-3 and lost 6-2 on Jan. 28-29, 2011, which was the only meeting between the two teams in 2010-11.

- In fact, the Huskies have hosted the Mavs in six consecutive games at the NHC. The last time SCSU played in Mankato was on March 5, 2010, when the Huskies lost 4-2 at the Verizon Wireless Center.
- SCSU coach Bob Motzko is 5-10-4 in games played against MSU during his career in St. Cloud
- The Huskies received votes in the latest USCHO.com Division I national poll.
- St. Cloud State enjoyed a big weekend back home on Nov. 4-5 with a 7-2 victory and a 3-3 tie against WCHA rival Wisconsin.
- The Huskies now own a four-game unbeaten streak against the Badgers...rookie netminder Ryan Faragher continues to impress with his play this winter. In starts against UW, Faragher earned the win and tie and also coined 59 saves over the weekend. He now has a 2.19 GAA and a .930 saves rate this winter with a 2-2-1 record. Faragher gained the starting nod two weeks ago against North Dakota due to an injury to SCSU junior team captain Mike Lee.
- SCSU sophomore forward Cory Thorson scored his first career goal at 8:18 of the 2nd period in SCSU's win on Nov. 4 (the goal was also the GWG for the Huskies)...junior forward David Eddy had a breakout weekend against UW. Eddy scored his first two goals of the campaign on Nov. 4 and he completed the weekend with an assist on Ben Hanowski's goal on Nov. 5. Eddy now has two goals and three assists this year...on the topic of big weekends, Hanowski scored two goals on Nov. 4 and he also had SCSU's important third goal on Nov. 5. Hanowski and fellow Little Falls H.S. graduate senior forward Jared Festler own the team's goal scoring lead this year with six apiece after 10 games...sophomore Nic Dowd scored his first career shorthanded goal on Nov. 4, with a breakaway goal against the Badgers at 11:02 of the third period.
- Freshman defender Tim Daly found his way onto the scoresheet for the first time in his career with an assist on Thorson's game winner against UW on Nov. 4.
- Senior defender Zam Zabkowicz added his first assist of the year for the Huskies with a helper on David Eddy's goal on Nov. 4.
- Rookie defender Andrew Prochno continues to turn heads in 2011-12. He scored the first goal for the Huskies in both games against Wisconsin this weekend. He now has three goals and two assists for SCSU this winter.

Freshman forward Brooks Bertsch made his collegiate debut for the Huskies on Nov. 5 against Wisconsin.

• SCSU team captain senior Drew LeBlanc suffered a lower body injury in the closing seconds of the second period on Nov. 5. The game officials opted to end the period early due to the length of time it took to provide the needed care for LeBlanc. Both teams came back out on the ice after the intermission and completed the final :29 of the second before switching ends and immediately starting the third period. - Western Michigan hosts Michigan State for a pair of games in Kalamazoo. Puck drops for both Friday and Saturday's games are at 7:05 p.m., with Saturday's game being broadcast live by Comcast.
- Western Michigan went into Yost Ice Arena and ended the University of Michigan's 20-game home winning streak by beating the Wolverines,
- 3-2, last Friday. Michigan was able to pick up the win on Saturday for the series split. Dane Walters netted the game-winning goal with 57 seconds remaining in the third period to seal Friday's win, while Nick Pisellini made a season-high 34 saves.
- Michigan State leads the all-time series at 61-29-8 and holds a slim margin over the Broncos in Kalamazoo at 23-22-2. Western Michigan has had the edge in Kalamazoo with the Broncos sweeping the Spartans last season. WMU is 4-2-1 at home against MSU in their last seven games. Trevor Elias has one goal and four assists for five points to lead all Broncos in scoring against the Spartans, while Nick Pisellini has two wins with a 2.00 goals against average and a .911 save percentage in net.
