Two members of the National Collegiate Hockey Conference will square off head-to-head this week when No. 11 Denver hosts No. 19 Nebraska Omaha in a two-game set at Magness Arena. Five other members of The National will face off in conference action as fifth-ranked Colorado College hosts Wisconsin, Miami welcomes Bowling Green, eighth-ranked Minnesota Duluth takes on Minnesota State, North Dakota travels to Bemidji State and St. Cloud State plays a home-and-home series with top-ranked Minnesota. Only Western Michigan, which played a rare Tuesday game at Notre Dame, is off. The Broncos return to action next Tuesday by hosting the Irish.

LAST WEEK'S ACTION

Seven of the eight members of The National were in action last week with only North Dakota idle. Those teams posted a record of 6-4-2 which includes one game head-to-head between Colorado College and Denver. In that game, the Pioneers built a 5-1 lead only to see the Tigers claw back to make it a 5-4 final.

In other action, Minnesota Duluth continued its surge and is now unbeaten in its last eight (6-0-2) with 5-0 and 3-1 wins over visiting Alaska Anchorage. Miami earned three of four points against Michigan with a 2-1 win and a 3-3 tie at Cady Arena. Nebraska Omaha did the same on the road, tying Bemidji State, 3-3, before closing the weekend with a 5-1 win at the Sanford Center.

St. Cloud State worked out a road split at Minnesota State. After dropping the first game, 4-2, the Huskies rebounded for a 3-2 win. Western Michigan, playing three games in five days, ran into a tough Michigan State team at home, losing 3-2 and 4-2. The Broncos then dropped a 3-2 decision at Notre Dame on Tuesday, Nov. 15.

Colorado College is once again the top-ranked NCHC team in the national polls, coming in fifth in the USCHO.com and the *USA Today/ USA Hockey Magazine* polls. Minnesota Duluth is eighth followed by Western Michigan at 10 and Denver at 11. Nebraska Omaha returned to the rankings, coming in at 19 in the USCHO.com poll. Full results are on page seven.

- Last Saturday's loss was CC's third in a row to Denver at Magness Arena, where the Tigers now are 14-9-4 in 27 all-time showdowns with their archrival. The teams meet again at the World Arena on Dec. 2, when CBS Sports Network will provide a live national telecast.
- After completing a five-game stretch on the road, Colorado College now plays 11 of its next 15 contests at home.
- Ten different CC players recorded a point apiece against the Pioneers on Saturday. Sophomore center Archie Skalbeck, whose first goal of the season at 17:05 of the second period cut DU's lead to 5-3, became the 13th Tiger to score in the team's first seven games.
- Colorado College has held its opponent scoreless on the power play in five of its seven outings, including Saturday's when Denver went 0-for-4 in its 5-4 victory.
- The Tigers have struck for at least one PPG in six consecutive games, building a 30.3-percent success ratio (10-for-33) during the streak. They were 1-for-4 against DU on Saturday, when all four of their goals were scored by sophomores.
- With an assist on defenseman Eamonn McDermott's power-play tally early in the second period against Denver, sophomore left wing Jaden Schwartz extended his point-scoring streak to 13 consecutive games dating back to last season.
- Second-period goals last Saturday by left wing Dakota Eveland and Skalbeck came just 1:52 apart, marking the sixth time in 2011-12 that CC has scored twice in less than two minutes.
- Junior defenseman Mike Boivin and junior center Rylan Schwartz each have collected an assist in Colorado College's last three games. Boivin's 7 points (2g,5a) this season is just one shy of his total in 31 appearances as a sophomore in 2010-11.

- CC defensemen collectively have accounted for 23 (5q,18a) of the team's total of 75 points (31q,44a) so far in 2011-12.
- Junior forward Scott Winkler's six assists through seven games equals his total in 26 outings as a sophomore in '10-11.
- The 15 shots on goal in the final 20 minutes of Saturday's loss to DU represents a single-period high for the Tigers this season.
- This week's series against Wisconsin at the World Arena features rematches of a three-game first-round playoff set between the teams last March. Colorado College, which advanced to the WCHA Final Five with a 2-1 victory in Game 3 and eventually reached the NCAA quarterfinals, is 12-4-1 in its last 12 meetings with the Badgers dating back to the 2006-07 campaign.

- Denver (4-3-2, 3-2-2 WCHA) hosts Nebraska Omaha (6-5-1, 5-2-1 WCHA) in a two-game WCHA series on Nov. 18-19. The Mavericks are tied for second in the WCHA with 11 points, while the Pioneers are sixth with eight points.
- DU is 8-3 all-time against UNO, including a 6-0 mark in Denver. The Pioneers and Mavericks split a two-game series in Omaha last season.
- DU ended a four-game winless streak with a 5-4 win over in-state rival Colorado College on Nov. 12.
- Junior co-captain Drew Shore (Denver, Colo.) leads the Pioneers with 13 points (4g, 9a), while sophomore Jason Zucker (Las Vegas) ranks second with 12 points (5g, 7a). Shore tallied three points (1g, 2a) in DU's win over CC and leads DU with two game-winning goals.
- Zucker leads DU with five multi-point games and two power-play goals.
- Sophomore Beau Bennett (Gardena, Calif.) returned to the lineup after missing four game with a wrist injury and scored DU's first goal against Colorado College. Bennett has seven points (2q, 5a) in five games.
- Freshman Joey LaLeggia (Burnaby, British Columbia) leads WCHA freshman blueliners with seven points (4g, 3a) and is tied for first among all WCHA blueliners with four goals.
- Junior goaltender Adam Murray (Anchorage, Alaska) has posted a 4-2-1 record, 3.32 goals against average and .904 save percentage in seven games, while freshman Juho Olkinuora (Helsinki, Finland) has added a 0-1-1 mark, 2.31 goals against average and .907 save percentage.
- Head coach George Gwozdecky posted his 400th career win at Denver on Oct. 21.
- DU has struggled on the power play, converting just 6-of-40 (15%) opportunities. The Pioneers have scored with the man-advantage in just three of nine games.
- DU is 40-for-51 (80.4%) on the penalty kill and has allowed a power-play goal in seven games.
- DU is 2-2-1 against ranked opponents and 3-1-1 at home.
- The Pioneers continue their seven-game homestand against Princeton (Nov. 25), and Miami (Nov. 26).

- Miami earned a win and a tie against No. 4/5 Michigan over the weekend, topping the Wolverines 2-1 Friday while tying 3-3 Saturday. In doing so, the RedHawks extended their unbeaten streak to a season-long four games, the first three of which were wins, all by a score of 2-1. The one goal allowed in each of the wins ties Miami's season low while the RedHawks improved to 5-2 in one-goal games with Friday's win.
- Friday's win over UM marked Miami's first win over a ranked team in five tries this season. It was also Miami's first victory over a top-five team since beating No. 4 Michigan on Nov. 7, 2009 in Ann Arbor, 5-1.
- Friday's win was the RedHawks' fourth straight over Michigan, a first in program history, while the tie Saturday stretched Miami's unbeaten streak against the Wolverines to a program-best five games after sweeping UM in the regular season last year and defeating them in the 2010 NCAA Midwest Regional final. The RedHawks last loss to Michigan was March 19, 2010 in the CCHA Tournament semifinals. Miami is now 8-3-1 against the Wolverines since the 2008-09 season.
- Miami was 6-for-6 on the penalty kill over the weekend, fending off three penalties in each game. Miami has now killed 22 straight penalties dating back to Oct. 28, a, stretch of five games. Prior to the five-game stretch, the 'Hawks had allowed two power play goals in each of the previous five games.
- Saturday's overtime tie was Miami's third overtime game of the season as the RedHawks had lost their previous two overtime contests (Oct. 15 at Colgate and Oct. 27 vs. Lake Superior State). Miami won the shootout however, 1-0, in the fourth round on a goal by sophomore Bryon Paulazzo.

The shootout win was Miami's first since Jan. 28, 2011 at Notre Dame.

- Junior Reilly Smith scored two goals Saturday, giving him his second multi-goal game of the season and the 11th of his career. He finished with three points on the night, having a hand in all three goals. He now leads Miami with seven goals and nine points and ties for 18th nationally in goals per game (0.70 gpg).
- Freshman Austin Czarnik scored a goal and added two assists for a career-high three points in Saturday's game, having a hand in all three goals. It was his second career multi-point contest and first career multi-assist game.
- Freshman Tyler Biggs scored his second career goal Friday, extending his point streak to a career-long five games, the longest by any RedHawk this year. The score was the game-winner, marking his first-career game-winning goal.
- Miami scored just 1:41 into the game Friday on a goal by freshman Jimmy Mullin. The goal was Miami's fastest to start a game this year as the 'Hawks have scored first in eight of 12 games this year, including all five wins.
- Miami has won 11 straight over the Falcons, including all four times last year, and 18 of the last 19 meetings. Despite Miami's recent success, BGSU still controls the all-time series 58-42-7 going back to 1978. In Oxford, Miami leads 26-24-2, with the 'Hawks having won 12 in a row at home. Head coach Enrico Blasi is 26-8-2 against BGSU behind the bench at his alma mater.
- This weekend's games will feature several coaches who are Miami alumni, as both Miami head coach Enrico Blasi ('94) and assistant coach Nick Petraglia ('04) went to Miami. In addition, Bowling Green head coach Chris Bergeron ('93) played for the RedHawks from 1989-1993, including three years with Blasi and served as a captain for two years. He was also an assistant coach under Blasi for 10 years prior to taking over the Falcons. BGSU assistant coach Barry Schutte ('97) also played four years at Miami and was a captain.
- This weekend will be Miami Hockey's Alumni Weekend as several former players will be in town in addition to the Bowling Green coaches who are Miami alumni.
- Miami's two seniors goalies, Connor Knapp and Cody Reichard, are both 4-0 in their career against Bowling Green as Knapp has a 1.25 GAA vs. BGSU in his career and Reichard a 1.75 GAA.
- Junior forward Reilly Smith has 11 points in just six career games against the Falcons on seven goals and four assists. Last year he had five goals and three assists in four games vs. BGSU.
- Senior forward Patrick Tiesling, who transferred from Bowling Green, scored his first career goal against his former team last year on Jan. 14, 2011.

- UMD, which sports the second longest unbeaten in the nation at the moment, will make its final two home appearances of 2011 this Friday and Saturday night by hosting Minnesota State University-Mankato. The two clubs traded wins in their lone two meetings one year ago (Feb. 18-19 in Mankato) and have not collided in Duluth since Oct. 16-17, 2009. The Bulldogs are unbeaten in their last six home confrontations with the Mavericks (5-0-1) since being swept by them on Jan. 27, 28, 2006.
- After this weekend's series with the Minnesota State-Mankato, the Bulldogs won't return to AMSOIL Arena until Jan. 20 to begin a two-game non-conference set Alabama-Huntsville.
- The defending NCAA champion Bulldogs posted their second consecutive home sweep of 2011-12 and extended their unbeaten run to eight games (6-0-2) by derailing the University of Alaska Anchorage twice last weekend at the AMSOIL Arena. UMD rolled to a 5-0 triumph in the opener, getting goals from five different players and a 27-save performance from senior goaltender Kenny Reiter, before skating past the Seawolves 3-1 the following evening. Two-time All-American center Jack Connolly Rookie defenseman Derik Johnson and senior center Travis Oleksuk all scored once for the Bulldogs Saturday while sophomore right winger J.T. Brown picked up a pair of assists.
- During their eight-game unbeaten streak, the Bulldogs have outscored the opposition 30-9.
- With two goals and two assists in the weekend sweep over Alaska Anchorage, team captain Jack Connolly hiked his career scoring harvest to a nation-leading 154 points (52 goals and 152 assists). That moved the 2010-11 Hobey Baker Memorial Award finalist into 18th place on UMD's all-time scoring charts, nine points behind the No. 17 occupant, three-time All-WCHA honoree Mike Peluso (1994-98) and 10 points behind his former linemate, Justin Fontaine (2007-11). The 154 points Connolly has rolled up as a collegian are 32 more than the next closest active NCAA skater (University of Maine senior Brian Flynn). Connolly, the country's top returning scorer from a year ago (he finished third in the NCAA with a careerhigh 59 points), has been a model of consistency when it comes to offensive contributions. Case in Point: Since the start of the 2009-10 season, he has been held pointless for more than one game only once (Jan. 23 and Jan. 29, 2010). Connolly, who has suited up in all 137 outings over the past

four seasons, will take a 10-game scoring streak -- one shy of his personal best -- into Friday's clash with Minnesota State-Mankato. He currently leads the WCHA in overall power play points with 11, is tied for second in scoring (17 points) and for fourth in assists (11). A member of the All-WCHA first team and WCHA All-Academic Team the past two winters, Connolly is just the second two-time All-American the Bulldogs have ever had in their lineup (defenseman Norm Maciver, in 1985-86, was the other).

- After posting his second consecutive shutout and third in the last four games Friday night against Alaska Anchorage, Kenny Reiter finally surrendered his first goal in 166:45 of action the ensuing night when Seawolves center Eric Scheid tallied 5:18 into he first period. That 166:45 shutout streak is a school record and exactly 19 minutes more than the previous mark set by All-American Alex Stalock from March 19-March 27, 2009. Over the last eight games, Reiter has compiled a 6-0-2 record, a 1.23 goals against average and a .955 saves percentage in eight starts. The three-time WCHA Scholar-Athlete Award recipient ranks second in the WCHA with an overall goals against average in 2.05 and is fifth in saves percentage (.923). In addition, his three shut outs this season are bettered by only one other NCAA puckstopper (Minnesota's Kent Patterson with five). Reiter is now 36-19-7 for his career with the with Bulldogs. That translates into a .637 winning percentage, the second best mark in club history behind All-Amrican Rick Kosti's .753 figure (60-18-2 between 1983-85). Going back to the start of the 2011 NCAA playoffs, the Pittsburgh, Pa., native has lost just twice in his last 15 appearances (11-2-2).
- Senior Travis Oleksuk has racked up a WCHA-leading 11 goals this season, two of which came at the expense of Alaska Anchorage last weekend. The Thunder Bay, Ontario, product, who is a plus-6 on the year, has picked up at least one point in all but one of UMD's 12 outings this season. Oleksuk, Connolly (six) and junior left winger Mike Seidel have combined to score exactly half of UMD's goals thus far. Seidel has five tallies to his 2011-12 credit, including three on the power play, but has been blanked in that department in each of the past six games.
- After giving up eight power plays in 18 opportunities to the opposition during the first two weekends of the 2011-12 season, UMD has has allowed just one goal (at Providence College on Oct. 22) in 30 man advantage chances since.
- Senior Brady Lamb, who had his career-high five-game scoring streak terminated in Saturday's 3-1 victory over Alaska Anchorage, is currently third among WCHA defensemen in points with 12 and has managed at least a goal or an assist in nine of UMD's 12 outings to date.
- The Bulldogs are 10-7-2 at AMSOIL Arena since that \$80-million, 6,726-seat facility opened on Dec. 30, 2010.
- Sophomore right winger J.T. Brown, a 2010-11 WCHA All-Rookie League team pick and the reigning Frozen Four Most Outstanding Player, stands third on the UMD scoring charts with 14 points and has put a team-leading 561 shots on goal -- 19 more than the next closest Bulldog (Mike Seidel).
- Over the last four seasons, UMD has gone 13-4-17 in overtime games (a .632 winning percentage), picking up a school-record seven of those wins one year ago.
- Junior defenseman Wade Bergman tops the 2011-12 Bulldogs in plus-minus rating (+9) and is a plus +22 for his career. That's second only to Jack Connolly's +37 figure among current Bulldogs.
- The Bulldogs have outscored their opponents 15-6 in the third period this year.
- UMD currently sports the highest-scoring senior class in the NCAA. The seven Bulldogs in the group, including goaltender Kenny Reiter (one assist) and left winger Cody Danberg, who suffered a season-ending knee injury on the opening night of play last month, have combined to rack up 21 goals and 35 assists for 56 points -- 19 points more than their nearest competitors Clarkson University and Colgate University.
- Scott Kishel currently owns a four-game scoring streak, which is a career high for the senior defenseman. Kishel whose nine points this season are bettered by only four other WCHA blueliners at the moment, has already skated in five more games this year than he did all of last season (seven).
- The UMD is averaging 6,338 spectators a night during its first full season at AMSOIL Arena. Only five other schools in the country -- Wisconsin (11, 098), North Dakota (10,754), Minnesota (8,839), Colorado College (7,263) and Boston College (6,480) -- have drawn more. Since moving into that \$80-million, 6,726-seat facility on Dec. 30, 2010, UMD has compiled an 10-7-2 record (5-3-0 in 2011-12).

- UNO took three of four points on the road last weekend with a 3-3 tie and a 5-1 win at Bemidji State.
- In Saturday's win, the Mavericks snapped a seven-game winless streak against the Beavers dating back to last season (0-5-2).
- Freshmen Josh Archibald and Jayson Megna led the Mavericks in scoring last weekend with four points each. Archibald had two goals and two assists while Megna had a goal and three assists. Terry Broadhurst led UNO with three goals including two in Saturday's 5-1 win. His first goal on Saturday was the game winner. Two of the three goals came on the power play.
- For his efforts, Archibald was named the Red Barron WCHA Rookie of the Week. He is the first Maverick to pick up a weekly award.

- With points in both games, Broadhurst now has points in eight of his last nine games (9-5-14). He and teammate Matt White are now in a three-way tie for second in WCHA scoring for all games with 17 points.
- Jayson Megna now has points in seven of his last eight (4-7-11) after scoring in both games last weekend. He ranks second in WCHA freshman scoring for all games. Megna also leads UNO's freshmen in scoring with those 11 points while Archibald leads UNO's rookies with five goals.
- Jaycob Megna earned a milestone on Saturday, scoring his first collegiate goal in UNO's 5-1 win. The primary assist came from his older brother Jayson.
- With two assists in Saturday's 5-1 win, sophomore defenseman Andrej Sustr now has points in three of his last four games (1-4-5) and has totaled three goals and eight points in 12 games this year. His goal total is already a career high, and he is one point from tying his career high for points in a season set in 39 games last year. Sustr is in a three-way tie for seventh in scoring for all games among WCHA defensemen.
- UNO has now registered 40 or more shots on goal in three straight games and five of the last seven. In another game during that string, they had 39 shots. The Mavericks have registered 40 or more shots in six of their 12 games this season and have outshot opponents in all but one game.
- The Mavericks scored a powerplay goal in each game at Bemidji State and have now earned at least one man-advantage marker in five of their last six games (10/33, 30.3%).
- Friday's game at Bemidji State was UNO's first overtime game and first tie of the season. UNO was 0-3-2 in overtime last season.
- UNO has already scored three shorthanded goals in the first ten games of the year. They had six shorthanded markers in 39 games last season.
- The Mavericks continue their four-game road trip by visiting Denver for games on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 18 and 19.
- The Pioneers lead the all-time series, 8-3-0. They are 6-0-0 in Denver. Last year, the two teams split a two-game series in Omaha. The Mavericks won 5-2 on Friday, and DU responded with a 4-2 victory on Saturday.

- The Fighting Sioux (3-6-1, 1-5-0 WCHA) return from a weekend off to travel to Bemidji State on Saturday and Sunday.
- UND has lost just once in 23 all-time meetings with the Beavers, going 21-1-1 (.935). That includes a perfect 7-0-0 record at Bernidji.
- Last season the Sioux earned a road sweep at BSU, winning 5-2 and 5-1 in the first games played in BSU's new Sanford Center, then added a February sweep in Grand Forks.
- UND's lone loss to the Beavers all-time was a 7-5 setback on Feb. 7, 1970, the second meeting between the two programs.
- Prior to the bye week, UND most recently suffered a pair of losses at then-fifth-ranked Minnesota, falling 2-0 and 3-2 on Saturday.
- The Sioux held a 2-1 lead late in Saturday's game, but suffered the sweep after Minnesota rallied with two goals in the final 6:04.
- It marked the first time UND had been swept in a regular season series at Minnesota since 1996-97. The Sioux went on to win the program's sixth of seven national titles that year.
- Junior goalie Aaron Dell enjoyed a tremendous series at Minnesota, stopping 69 of 74 shots (.932). On Friday, Dell made a season-high 30 saves on 32 shots. The following night he stopped 39 of 42, the most saves he's ever had during a regular season game and one shy of the career-high 40 he had in the 2011 WCHA Final Five championship game.
- Dell owns a 2.02 goals against average and a .937 save percentage over his last three games (all starts) after opening the year with a 3.41 GAA and .843 SV% in his first seven games (six starts).
- Junior forward Danny Kristo, who leads the team with 12 points, was held without a point in the Minnesota series, the first time this season he has gone consecutive games without reaching the scoresheet.
- Freshman forward Rocco Grimaldi scored his first career goal on Saturday at Minnesota. Grimaldi had played in just three of UND's first nine games due to injury.
- UND's penalty killing was outstanding at Minnesota, holding the Gophers' league-leading power play to just one goal on seven chances. The Sioux have now killed 21 of 22 opponent power plays spanning the last 14 periods.
- Senior defenseman Ben Blood extended his consecutive games played streak to 110 games. Ryan Duncan (2005-09) and Chris Porter (2003-07) hold the school and NCAA record, having each played in 175 straight games.
- After setting a UND single-season record by winning 59.9 percent of his faceoffs last year, junior center Corban Knight is on track to topple his own record, having won an even 60 percent of his draws this year.
- UND is three goals away from reaching the 10,000th in program history, a history that dates back to 1946-47.

- The St. Cloud State University men's hockey team posted a weekend split in action at Minnesota State University on Nov. 11-12. The Huskies dropped a 4-2 decision on Nov. 11 and then completed the weekend with a 3-2 victory over the Mavericks at the Verizon Wireless Civic Center on Nov. 12. This marked the first victory for the Huskies in Mankato since a 4-2 win on Dec. 5, 2008. Of note, SCSU had played six consecutive games against MSU at the National Hockey Center in St. Cloud before the two teams paired up on Nov. 11 in Mankato.
- Freshman forward Brooks Bertsch, who hails from Dubuque, lowa, scored his first collegiate goal with a marker at 13:31 of the first period against MSU on Nov. 11. He is just the second player with lowa listed as his home state to score a goal in the SCSU records. SCSU's top player listed from lowa is Brian Cook, who had 48g/76a durng his career with the Huskies from 1987-91. Cook's hometown is listed as Waterloo, lowa in the Husky records.
- Sophomore forward Cory Thorson continues to impress with his play in 2011-12. He only notched one assist in 12 games during his freshman season. In 2011-12, Thorson already has played in 12 games with 3g/3a to his credit. He brings a four-game point streak and a two-game goal streak into the upcoming series against Minnesota. Thorson had goals in both games at Mankato on Nov. 11-12, and he has lit the lamp in three of his last four games this season.
- SCSU exploded for three goals in the first period and then held on for the 3-2 win at Mankato on Nov. 12. Thorson opened the scoring with SCSU's first goal at 1:19 of the first. Ben Hanowski posted his team-leading 7th goal of the season at 1:48 of the first, before David Eddy notched the game-winner at 9:07 of the first to make it 3-1...sophomore forward Mitch MacMillan charted assists in both games at MSU and now has four assists this winter...senior forward Jared Festler leads the Huskies with a +9 on the plus/minus this season.
- Freshman goalie Ryan Faragher played a key part in the Huskies' 3-2 win at MSU. A resident of Fort Frances, Ont., Faragher charted 29 saves in the victory and this total include 11 saves in the third period. In the game, MSU outshot the Huskies 31-19 overall and 12-3 in the third period... SCSU is 2-0-2 in games played at home this season and 2-5-0 in games played on the road this year... the win on Nov. 12 marked the first time in 2011-12 that the Huskies have gained a victory on Saturday night. SCSU is 1-3-2 in games played on Saturday night this season and 4-2-0 in games played on Friday night this season.
- The Huskies have been racking up the travel miles in the early portion of the 2011-12 season, SCSU's schedule will see the Huskies on the road for 11 of its first 16 games of the 2011-12 season.
- SCSU will continue its season on Nov. 18 with a home game against WCHA rival Minnesota, but the Huskies will get back in the bus on Nov. 19 for a date at Minnesota. On Nov. 26-27, the Huskies will travel to Nebraska-Omaha for a pair of games.
- The Huskies will be hosting Minnesota for the first time since 4-3 win at the NHC on Jan. 22, 2010.
- Last year, SCSU split a pair at Mariucci with a 5-2 win over Nov. 22, 2010 and a 2-1 loss on Nov. 23, 2010... Minnesota leads the all-time series against SCSU 47-26-12.
- Minnesota was SCSU's first opponent as a Division I program as the Huskies played the Gophers in an exhibition game in Eveleth, Minn. on Oct. 3, 1987. The Gophers won that contest 6-0. In the first regular season meeting between the two teams, SCSU and Minnesota skated to a 3-3 tie on Oct. 12, 1990 at the NHC.
- SCSU is 3-2-0 in the last five meetings against Minnesota, and the Huskies are 3-6-1 in the last 10 meetings against Minnesota.
- A former assistant coach for the Gophers from 2001 to 2005, Motzko is 8-9-3 all-time against Minnesota.
- Senior forward Jared Festler has enjoyed success against Minnesota with five goals and four assists in nine games played against Minnesota during his career.
- SCSU is 2-3-0 in the last five games played at Mariucci Arena.
- SCSU sophomore defender Kevin Gravel added assists to his totals in both games at Minnesota State. Gravel now has four assists this season for the Huskies in 12 games. A Los Angeles Kings draft pick, Gravel is the son of former Husky Jim Gravel, who posted 51g/50a during his tenure at SCSU from 1977-81.
