The consensus from the board is to favor inclusion of players on teams as opposed to limiting team size at a maximum of 23 players on 11-player teams. Players get injured during the year, and it's important to have strong numbers to replace players. Also, it is very important to include players who are interested now, as over time players tend to not continue playing as they get older.

The Board must explicitly communicate to football parents why we believe it's important to not leave players off the team. This affects playing time, and the board does not wish for coaches to have the brunt of playing time complaints.

Doug Snyder stated that teams over the size of 30 players are very difficult to manage. <u>Mark made a motion</u> to include players onto 11-player teams until a limit of 30 is reached. Motion passes by a vote of 3 to 1. Two members refrained from voting.
