Goalie Equipment Highlights

Outfitted 25 goalies-down from 30 last season. Some families have elected to either purchase or borrow used gear to avoid the rental fees. We had an increase in the goalie position this past season with the Mites. The majority of the Mite coaches are using the gear for offseason training. Additional Mites are also using the gear for off-season training. Rental fees are estimated at \$1,200.00 for the season. Repairs and sterilization of equipment will be done in the off-season which usually saves the association an additional \$1,000.00 each year.

Girls Team Successes

- *District 10 does not allow statistics to be kept on any team below the 12U level.
- *At the 10UB level, the girls won the District 10 end of season tournament. They outscored their opponents 17-4, including a championship win by a 3-2 margin.
- *The 12UA team didn't always experience the most success in terms of wins and losses, but the overall development of the girls could be seen by the end of the year. District 10 was a very competitive district at this age group, and at times, up to five D10 teams were rated in the top ten of the state.
- *The 14UA team started out slowly with a goalie who had never played hockey prior to this year. Through considerable amounts of team development, the 14UA team peaked at playoff time, and ended up making it to the regional tournament by winning the consolation bracket. They almost accomplished the same feat at regions, but lost their second consolation game.
- *The girls program continues to build upon prior successes, and the numbers at the mite level increased 45% over the previous year. The numbers at all other levels remained relatively consistent. Hopefully these numbers will continue to grow with the emphasis that is being placed on recruitment and subsequent Taste of Hockey and Initiation clinics.

Girls Committee Highlights

Marketing to the Public

- *The girls committee assisted the High School Booster Club with Youth Night at the Forum. Several girls who were not involved with hockey were brought along as friends as a potential recruitment opportunity.
- *The girls committee continued to have a presence at Taste of Hockey and Initiation Clinics, offering used equipment free of charge to any girls new to hockey or to CPYHA.
- *The girls committee is looking at opportunities to recruit new girls into the association through increasing our presence at community and/or school functions. We would utilize current youth and high school players in these recruitment efforts.

Girls Committee Highlights

Work in Progress

- *The Girls Committee continues to maintain a used hockey equipment drive, and through this we helped outfit several girls who were new to hockey.
- *Through an offer from USA Hockey the Girls Committee in conjunction with equipment and the House Committee received practice jerseys that were distributed to several of our teams during this past season.
- *As always, recruitment is a focus of the Girls Committee and we have several ideas to try to increase numbers at the 8U/Mite and 10U levels.
- *Girls traveling teams participated in a fundraiser to help in offsetting their individual ice bills.

High School Coach Involvement

- *Jim Koltes is in his second year as the Varsity Coach for Champlin Park. He continues to bring an increased level of investment, enthusiasm and involvement in the girls program and has been an active participant in Girls Committee meetings.
- *Varsity Girls continued to assist with practices and attend games, and Coach Koltes offered the use of the Varsity Locker Room to the youth teams for home games.
- *Coach Koltes conducted a fall skills camp, and a summer training program for the girls youth program. Several girls will be participating in STP this second year as it is seen as a valuable training opportunity.



Safety Review 2011-2012

- 10 and up within the CPYHA. Computer labs were rented through community education on five evenings at a total expense of \$284 to the association. Individual player expense was \$5 a test. Test was administered and reviewed by National Dizzy and Balance. Educational materials from the CDC and MN Hockey were available for patents and players at the time of testing. The CPYHA website has signs and symptoms posted for possible concussion along with links to websites with more information.
- A four step action plan for suspected concussion was developed and implemented within the association. Action plan and forms are available on the website.
- 4 incident reports for suspected concussions were submitted. All players submitted a Physicians approval for return to play
- Process and forms to obtain insurance coverage through USA Hockey is developed and will be made accessible to all members of the association.
