- The U.S. Women's National Under-18 Team is in Heinola & Vierumäki, Finland, for the 2013 IIHF U18 Women's World Championship. Yesterday, the U.S. beat the Czech Republic, 10-0, to improve its record to 2-0-0-0. The team wraps up the preliminary round vs. Sweden on Jan. 1.
- The U.S. National Under-17 Team, part of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, is at the 2013 World Under-17 Challenge in Drummondville and Victoriaville, Quebec. The U.S. defeated Canada Atlantic on Dec. 30 to move to 1-1-0-0. Today the U.S. faces Canada Quebec.

TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. National Junior Team concludes preliminary round play in the 2013 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship today against Slovakia. A regulation or overtime win would vault Team USA into the playoff round, while a loss would drop it into the relegation round. The U.S. and Slovakia are tied for third place in Group B with three points each.

THE SERIES VS. SLOVAKIA

- The U.S. leads the all-time series vs. Slovakia, 8-0-0-3-1 (WOTW-OTL-L-T).
- Team USA won the last two meetings in 2010 and 2011, and has won five out of six games since 2003.

Trailing 2-0 in the third period, **Jacob Trouba** scored a power-play goal at 11:02 to bring Team USA within a goal. The U.S. withstood four Canadian power plays in the final minutes and gained a man-advantage for the last 1:37 of regulation, but could not tally the equalizer against Malcolm Subban, who had 36 saves. **John Gibson** made 30 saves en route to U.S. Player of the Game honors.

TOURNAMENT LEADERS

Alex Galchenyuk's five points (1-4) are tied for third-best on the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championship scoring list. His four assists are tied for second-best in the tournament. He has a point in all three games.

Among defensemen, **Jacob Trouba** is tied for first in goals (3) and points (3-0--3). Trouba has a goal in each game to lead

the U.S. offense. His three goals are just one off the pace of the IIHF World Junior Championship's overall leader.

John Gibson ranks second among his peers with a .951 save percentage.

As a team, the U.S. leads the tournament in penalty killing success at .909 (10-for-11).

PRODUCTIVE BLUE LINE

Team USA's defense corps has contributed half of the team's 10 goals and all three of its power-play goals. **Jacob Trouba** has a goal in every game, including a power-play goal vs. Russia and Canada. Against Germany, **Seth Jones** had a goal and an assist, while Shayne **Gostisbehere** had a power-play goal.

FACE-OFF FORTUNES

Each of Team USA's four primary centers is succeeding at above 50% in the face-off circle. **Vince Trocheck** leads the way at 66% (38-20), followed by **Cole Bardreau** (63%, 24-14), **J.T. Miller** (59%, 24-17) and **Sean Kuraly** (54%, 27-23).

MULTI-POINT PERFORMERS

Against Germany, five players tallied two or more points. Alex Galchenyuk and Riley Barber each had 1-2--3 lines, while Seth Jones and Sean Kuraly had a goal and an assist each. Blake Pietila had a pair of assists.

PASS, SHOOT, SCORE

The line of Alex Galchenyuk, Sean Kuraly and Riley Barber combined for eight points in the 8-0 win vs. Germany on Dec. 27, nearly half of Team USA's offensive output. Galchenyuk and Barber each had a goal and two assists, while Kuraly had a goal and an assist. Galchenyuk was named the

Player of the Game. The line opened the first and second periods with a goal in the opening moments -- Kuraly at 19 seconds of the first frame and Barber 14 seconds into the second.

CAPTAIN AMERICA

Defenseman **Jake McCabe** is wearing the captain's 'C' for Team USA. Joining McCabe as alternate captains are **Cole Bardreau**, **Seth Jones**, **J.T. Miller** and **Jacob Trouba**. The alternate captains will be split into two pairs, with Jones and Miller wearing an 'A' when the U.S. wears its white jerseys and Bardreau and Trouba doing do so in the blue jerseys.

McCabe is in his second season at the University of Wisconsin. He is the third Wisconsin Badger in the last four years to lead the U.S. National Junior Team. **Derek Stepan** captained the U.S. to a gold medal in 2010, while **John Ramage** helped the U.S. to a bronze medal in 2011 in Buffalo. N.Y.

WELCOME BACK

Team USA returns three players from the 2012 IIHF World Junior Championship. Forward J.T. Miller played in all six games last year, registering two goals and two assists. Defenseman Jacob Trouba was the youngest player on Team USA in 2012. He collected two assists and was Team USA's Player of the Game vs. Canada on Dec. 31, 2011. Goaltender John Gibson made one start last year, making 23 saves on 27 shots in a loss to Finland.

GOLD MEDAL PEDIGREE

The United States has won the last four IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championships. Thirteen players on the 2013 U.S. National Junior Team roster have won gold medals at those

"It's been a blast, very exciting. I think as the tournament goes on the games are only going to get even bigger. I think we started off the game against Russia very well and we can build on it throughout the tournament."

On Team USA's chemistry ...
"I've played with a lot of the guys on the team and a lot of us know each other from different places, like the U.S. National Team Development Program, and we've gelled together. I think we are heading in the right direction."

On playing with Gaudreau and Miller ... "It's been great having the opportunity to play with Galchenyuk and Kuraly for two games and now Gaudreau and Miller for a game. I'd have to say Miller likes to get in on the forecheck, use his big body in physical play. Guadreau is a guy who likes to pass. They compliment me well. With Gaudreau's passing skills, it helps me as I like to shoot. With Miller, I like to get into the forecheck as well so we can play off of each other."

On his path from Pittsburgh to Detroit ...
"I moved from Pittsburgh to Detroit before
my seventh grade year, mainly for hockey.
Vince Trocheck and I both went to play
for Little Caesars. My family followed and
we still live in Michigan, but we return to
Pittsburgh a lot to see family."

On Team USA's Pittsburgh connections ...
"I played with Vince Trocheck and J.T.
Miller for years with the Pittsburgh Hornets.
We made it al the way to the national championship game together one year.
Gibson played a few seasons with us too."

On his dad, Don, who played in the NHL ... "He's been a huge influence since I've been younger. He's always helped me learn the game and the little things. It's awesome to have him as a resource. He coached me from when I started until I moved to Detroit. He also coached John Gibson, J.T. Miller and Vince Trocheck when we played on the Pittsburgh Hornets."

events, including four players who have won twice; Tyler Biggs and Rocco Grimaldi did so in 2010 and 2011, while Seth Jones and Jacob Trouba equaled the feat in 2011 and 2012. The other gold medalists in 2011 were Cole Bardreau, John Gibson, Jake McCabe, J.T. Miller, Connor Murphy and Blake Pietila. In 2012, Riley Barber, Patrick Sieloff and Ryan Hartman also stood atop the medal stand.

In 2011, Gibson was named best goalie of the tournament by the directorate.

LEAGUE LEADERS

A number of U.S. players are prominent scorers in their respective leagues.

John Gaudreau (Boston College) is tied for seventh in NCAA hockey with 23 points. His 11 goals are tied for third in the college ranks. Blake Pietila (Michigan Tech University) has 10 goals in 17 games, which is tied for seventh in the NCAA. Riley Barber (Miami University) is the top point-getter among rookies in the NCAA with eight goals and 22 points in 18 games.

Alex Galchenyuk's (Sarnia Sting), whose 27 goals in 33 games are tied for first in the Ontario Hockey League. Vince Trocheck (Saginaw Spirit) is fifth on the OHL points list with 50 (24-26) in 35 games. Seth Jones (Portland Winterhawks) has 28 points (8-20) to rank fifth among Western Hockey League defensemen and second for WHL rookies.

Goalie **John Gibson** (Kitchener Rangers) is tied for fifth in the OHL in both goals against average (2.33) and save percentage (.929). Also in the OHL, **Garret Sparks** (Guelph Storm) has a league-best 950 saves and four shutouts.

TEAM BUILDING

Thirteen of the 23 players on the U.S. National Junior Team preliminary roster were members of the U.S. National Team Development Program. Additionally, **Sean Kuraly** and **Mario Lucia** played brief stints with the NTDP during their junior careers.

The list of past NTDP members includes forwards Riley Barber (2011-12), Cole Bardreau (2009-11), Tyler

Biggs (2009-11), Rocco Grimaldi (2009-11), Ryan Hartman (2010-12), Blake Pietila (2009-11), J.T. Miller (2009-11); defensemen Seth Jones, Jake McCabe (2009-11), Connor Murphy (2009-11), Patrick Sieloff (2009-11), Jacob Trouba (2010-12); and goaltender John Gibson (2009-11).

YOUTHFUL EXUBERANCE

Typically a tournament for 19-year olds, the U.S. roster includes seven players born in 1994: Riley Barber, Alex Galchenyuk, Ryan Hartman, Jon Gillies, Seth Jones, Patrick Sieloff and Jacob Trouba.

FAMILY TIES

A number of U.S. players have family roots in college and/or professional hockey.

- **Riley Barber's** dad, Don, played at Bowling Green State University and in the NHL.
- **Tyler Biggs'** dad, Don, played in the NHL.
- Alex Galchenyuk's father, Alexander, played in the International Hockey League, including Milwaukee, where Alex was born, and throughout Europe.
- John Gaudreau's dad, Guy, skated at Norwich University.
- **Jon Gillies'** dad, Bruce, played in the IHL.
- **Seth Jones**' father, Ron "Popeye", did not play hockey, however, he had an 11-year career in the National Basketball Association and is currently a coach for the NBA's Brooklyn Nets.
- **Sean Kuraly's** father, Rick, starred at Miami University and is the program's career scoring leader.
- Mario Lucia's dad, Don, also played at Notre Dame and is the head coach of the University of Minnesota men's ice hockey team.
- **Stefan Matteau's** dad, Stephane, had a 14-year NHL career that included a Stanley Cup Championship with the New York Rangers.
- Connor Murphy's dad, Gord, played
 14 seasons in the NHL and is on the coaching staff of the Florida Panthers
- Blake Pietila has a brother, Chad, and cousin, Aaron, playing alongside him at Michigan Tech. His uncle, Jim Storm, also played for the Dallas Stars.
