THREE-TIME GOLD MEDALIST

The United States captured its third gold medal at the International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship. Team USA has finished atop the podium in three of the last 10 tournaments. During that span, the U.S. also won a pair of bronze medals in 2007 and 2011.

In the 37-year history of the IIHF World Junior Championship, Team USA has garnered eight medals (3 gold, 1 silver, 4 bronze).

TEAM USA IN THE PLAYOFFS

- Team USA has won its last three gold medal games and is 3-1 all-time in the championship contest.

- The playoff format was adopted for the IIHF World Junior Championship beginning in 1996. The U.S. has qualified for the playoffs 16 out of 18 years. From 1977-95, teams played each other once in a round-robin format and medals were awarded based on final standings.

Gibson is the second U.S. player (Zach Parise, 2004) to earn MVP honors and the sixth U.S. goalie to earn a directorate award. For a single tournament, he set the U.S. record for save percentage (.955) and posted the third-best goals against average (1.36).


An alternate captain, Trouba is the third U.S. defenseman to receive a directorate award. His four goals and nine points led all defensemen. He scored a goal in each of the four preliminary round games, then posted four assists vs. Czech Republic.

The captain of Team USA, McCabe was third among tournament defensemen with six points. Of his three goals, two came vs. Canada in the semifinals in which he was named the U.S. Player of the Game. McCabe earned a +9 plus/minus rating, tops on Team USA.

Gaudreau led the tournament with seven goals, tying for second-best ever by a U.S. player. He tallied twice vs. Slovakia to end the preliminary round, notched a hat trick vs. Czech Republic in the quarterfinals and scored twice vs. Canada in the semifinals.

UPDATING THE U.S. RECORD BOOK

John Gibson stamped his name prominently in the U.S. record book. His .955 save percentage ranks first in single-tournament annals, surpassing **Al Montoya's** .940 mark from 2004. Gibson's 1.36 goals-against average is third for a single championship, falling just shy of the 1.33 GAA recorded by Montoya in 2004 and **Rick DiPietro** in 2001.

For a career, Gibson boasts a 1.70 GAA, good for second behind **Rick DiPietro** (1.55, 2000-01)

John Gaudreau tied for second on the U.S. single-tournament goal scoring list with seven tallies. He equaled the efforts of **Chris Bourque** (2006), **Peter Ferraro** (1993), **Scott Young** (1987) and **Mark Green** (1978). **Jeremy Roenick** owns the top spot with eight goals in 1989.

TOURNAMENT LEADERS

John Gaudreau led the IIHF World Junior Championship with seven goals. His four power-play goals are tops among all players. His nine points (7-2) tied for fifth overall.

Jacob Trouba led all defensemen in points (9) and goals (4). Among all scorers, his nine points tied for fifth, while his four goals tied for eighth.

J.T. Miller notched two goals and seven assists. His seven helpers tied for second in the tournament, while his nine points tied for fifth.

Alex Galchenyuk posted eight points (2-6) to tie for 10th in points. The six assists tied for fourth.

Seth Jones trailed only Trouba on the tournament's defenseman scoring chart with seven points (1-6). The six helpers led all defensemen and tied for fourth among all players.

John Gibson led all goalies with a 1.36 goals against average and a .955 save percentage.

LOOKING AHEAD TO MALMO

The 2014 IIHF World Junior Championship will be held in Malmo, Sweden Dec. 26, 2013-Jan. 5, 2014. The U.S. will be in a group with Canada, Czech Republic, Slovakia and Germany.

The 2014 tournament will also feature a new playoff format. The top four teams from each of the two groups will qualify for the playoffs where the eight teams will play cross-over quarter-finals, paired against teams placed 1-4 in the other group.

SEE YOU IN 2014?

Seven players from the 2013 U.S. National Junior Team are eligible for next year's squad. The list includes three of the seven defensemen -- **Seth Jones**, **Patrick Sieloff**, **Jacob Trouba** -- three forwards -- **Riley Barber**, **Alex Galchenyuk**, **Ryan Hartman** -- and back-up goaltender **Jon Gillies**.

BALANCED SCORING

All 20 skaters notched at least point for Team USA, plus goaltender **John Gibson** chipped in two assists.

Fifteen players had at least one goal, while nine had multiple tallies. **Rocco Grimaldi**, Team USA's Player of the Game in the gold medal contest, scored his only two goals of the tournament in the final vs. Sweden.

EXTRA SPECIAL TEAMS

The U.S. led the tournament in penalty killing at 89.3%, having allowed three power-play goals over 28 chances. The U.S. had perfect penalty kill games against Germany, Canada (twice) and the Czech Republic, while allowing a single power-play goal to Russia, Slovakia and Sweden.

The U.S. finished fourth in power-play efficiency (29.3%, 12-for-41) in the IIHF World Junior Championship, highlighted by a 4-for-9 showing vs. Slovakia

and a 5-for-13 effort against the Czech Republic. Of Team USA's 34 goals, 35% have come with a man-advantage. **John Gaudreau** had a tournament-best four power-play goals.

PRODUCTIVE BLUE LINE

Team USA's defense corps contributed 10 of the team's 34 goals, including 4-of-12 on the power play. **Jacob Trouba** had four goals, while **Jake McCabe** had three, including two in the semifinal victory over Canada. **Shayne Gostisbehere**, **Seth Jones** and **Mike Reilly** had a goal apiece. The seven-man group also had 19 assists.

Jacob Trouba's four goals tied **John Carlson** (2010) and **Erik Johnson** (2007) for the most single-tournament goals by a U.S. defenseman since at least the 2000 IIHF World Junior Championship.

FACE-OFF FORTUNES

Each of Team USA's four primary centers succeeded at above 50% in the face-off circle. **Vince Trocheck** led the way at 60% (79-52), followed by **J.T. Miller** (60%, 58-39), **Cole Bardreau** (58%, 54-39) and **Sean Kuraly** (52%, 53-49).

SHUTOUT SHOUTOUT

By blanking Germany, 8-0, and Czech Republic, 7-0, Team USA notched two shutouts in a single tournament for the first time since the 2004 IIHF World Junior Championship. **John Gibson** and **Jon Gillies** shared the shutout of Germany, while Gibson played all 60 minutes against Czech Republic. In 2004, **Al Montoya** whitewashed Austria and Slovakia en route to a gold medal and the directorate award for top goaltender.

CAPTAIN AMERICA

Defenseman **Jake McCabe** wore the captain's 'C' for Team USA. Joining McCabe as alternate captains were **Cole Bardreau**, **Seth Jones**, **J.T. Miller** and **Jacob Trouba**. The alternate captains were split into two pairs, with Jones and Miller wearing an 'A' when the U.S. wore its white jerseys and Bardreau and Trouba doing do so in the blue jerseys.

McCabe is in his second season at the University of Wisconsin. He is the third Wisconsin Badger in the last four years to lead the U.S. National Junior Team. **Derek Stepan** captained the U.S. to a gold medal in 2010, while **John Ramage** helped the U.S. to a bronze medal in 2011 in Buffalo, N.Y.

WELCOME BACK

Team USA returned three players from the 2012 IIHF World Junior Championship. Forward **J.T. Miller** played in all six games in 2012, registering two goals and two assists. Defenseman **Jacob Trouba** was the youngest player on Team USA in 2012. He collected two assists and was Team USA's Player of the Game vs. Canada on Dec. 31, 2011. Goaltender **John Gibson** made one start last year, making 23 saves on 27 shots in a loss to Finland.

GOLD MEDAL PEDIGREE

The United States has won the last four IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championships. Thirteen players on the 2013 U.S. National Junior Team roster have won gold medals at those events, including four players who have won twice; **Tyler Biggs** and **Rocco Grimaldi** did so in 2010 and 2011, while **Seth Jones** and **Jacob Trouba** equaled the feat in 2011 and 2012. The other gold medalists in 2011 were **Cole Bardreau**, **John Gibson**, **Jake McCabe**, **J.T. Miller**, **Connor Murphy** and **Blake Pietila**. In 2012, **Riley Barber**, **Patrick Sieloff** and **Ryan Hartman** also stood atop the medal stand.

In 2011, Gibson was named best goalie of the tournament by the directorate.

TEAM BUILDING

Thirteen of the 23 players on the U.S. National Junior Team preliminary roster were members of the U.S. National

Team Development Program. Additionally, **Sean Kuraly** and **Mario Lucia** played brief stints with the NTDP during their junior careers.

The list of past NTDP members includes forwards **Riley Barber** (2011-12), **Cole Bardreau** (2009-11), **Tyler Biggs** (2009-11), **Rocco Grimaldi** (2009-11), **Ryan Hartman** (2010-12), **Blake Pietila** (2009-11), **J.T. Miller** (2009-11); defensemen **Seth Jones**, **Jake McCabe** (2009-11), **Connor Murphy** (2009-11), **Patrick Sieloff** (2009-11), **Jacob Trouba** (2010-12); and goaltender **John Gibson** (2009-11).

LEAGUE LEADERS

A number of U.S. players were prominent scorers in their respective leagues at the time of the tournament.

John Gaudreau (Boston College) was tied for seventh in NCAA hockey with 23 points. His 11 goals were tied for third in the college ranks. **Blake Pietila** (Michigan Tech University) has 10 goals in 17 games, which was tied for seventh in the NCAA. **Riley Barber** (Miami University) was the top point-getter among rookies in the NCAA with eight goals and 22 points in 18 games. **Alex Galchenyuk's** (Sarnia Sting) 27 goals in 33 games were tied for first in the Ontario Hockey League. **Vince Trocheck** (Saginaw Spirit) was fifth on the OHL points list with 50 (24-26) in 35 games. **Seth Jones** (Portland Winterhawks) had 28 points (8-20) to rank fifth among Western Hockey League defensemen and second for WHL rookies.

Goalie **John Gibson** (Kitchener Rangers) was tied for fifth in the OHL in both goals against average (2.33) and save percentage (.929). Also in the OHL, **Garret Sparks** (Guelph Storm) had a league-best 950 saves and four shutouts.

FAMILY TIES

A number of U.S. players have family roots in college and/or professional hockey.

- **Riley Barber's** dad, Don, played at Bowling Green State University and in the NHL.
- **Tyler Biggs' dad**, Don, played in the NHL.
- **Alex Galchenyuk's** father, Alexan-

der, played in the International Hockey League, including Milwaukee, where Alex was born, and throughout Europe.

- **John Gaudreau's** dad, Guy, skated at Norwich University.

- **Jon Gillies'** dad, Bruce, played in the IHL.

- **Seth Jones'** father, Ron "Popeye", did not play hockey, however, he had an 11-year career in the National Basketball Association and is currently a coach for the NBA's Brooklyn Nets.

- **Sean Kuraly's** father, Rick, starred at Miami University and is the program's career scoring leader.

- **Mario Lucia's** dad, Don, also played at Notre Dame and is the head coach of the University of Minnesota men's ice hockey team.

- **Connor Murphy's** dad, Gord, played 14 seasons in the NHL and is on the coaching staff of the Florida Panthers

- **Blake Pietila** has a brother, Chad, and cousin, Aaron, playing alongside him at Michigan Tech. His uncle, Jim Storm, also played for Michigan Tech, and eventually the Dallas Stars.

- **Jim Vesey's** father, Jim, played at Merrimack College and also in the NHL.

PRE-TOURNAMENT RECAP

Team USA began its training camp on Dec. 16 at the New York Rangers' Madison Square Garden Training Facility in Tarrytown, N.Y. Three days later, the team arrived in Helsinki, Finland, where it played a pair of pre-tournament games. Against Sweden on Dec. 20, the U.S. notched a 3-2 victory in overtime on **Shayne Gostisbehere's** blast from the point. **Connor Murphy** (power play) and **Ryan Hartman** also had a goal apiece in the win. In a 5-1 loss to Finland on Dec. 22, **Blake Pietila** was Team USA's goal scorer.

Head Coach

Phil Housley

Phil Housley served as the head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team for the first time. Previously, he held assistant coach-

ing positions for the 2007 and 2011 U.S. National Junior Teams that received bronze medals. Additionally, Housley was an assistant coach for the 2011 U.S. Men's National Team.

A seven-time member of the U.S. Men's National Team (1982, 1986, 1989, 1996, 2000, 2001, 2003), Housley earned a silver medal with the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team at the 2002 Olympic Winter Games. In 1996 helped Team USA to a first-place finish at the World Cup of Hockey. He made his Team USA debut at the 1982 IIHF World Junior Championship.

Housley spent 21 seasons in the NHL (1982-2003) and has the highest career point total (1,232) by an American defenseman. He is a member of the IIHF and U.S. Hockey Halls of Fame.

A native of South St. Paul, Minn., Housley is in his ninth season as the head coach of the Stillwater (Minn.) High School boys' ice hockey team.
