Minnesota Hockey Reebok High Performance 14/15 Program Tryouts in June, 2013 - Camp in Sept, 2013

The Minnesota Hockey Reebok High Performance 14/15 program is designed to provide players born in 1999 and 2000 the opportunity to train and compete against players of similar age. The process begins on June 1st and 2nd of 2013 with tryouts at Buffalo arena. A group of 34 High Performance 14/15 players will then be announced to train for 3 weekends in September. A final group of 20 players will then compete in the HP 14/15 Festival at Braemar arena on the weekend of September 28-29, 2013.

Players who were born in 1999 or 2000 and participated at the Pee Wee AA and A level and Bantam AA and A level are able to apply for tryouts at: http://www.minnesotahockey.org/page/show/753126-high-performance-14-15.

The HP 14/15 program is part of Minnesota and USA Hockey Player Development Process and will be staffed by High School, College, Youth, and USA Coaches.

We had several officials work high-level post-season tournaments including, Kris Moran working as the referee at the girls Class A HS State Championship game. And Shane Paskey worked the women's NCAA Frozen Four.

Ken Thielman is attending instructor training this spring.

Congratulations to all these officials and all the D5 officials that worked a very successful D5 post season.

Game Reports

This was a very interesting season due to the enforcement and reporting of the enhanced penalties.

We had a total of 3565 game reports written in the state this past season. This is in comparison to 797 last season.

D5 teams had 39 game reports written against them this season, 35 game misconducts and four match penalties. This continues a downward trend; last season there were 37 game reports. Checking from behind game misconducts are still the most called game misconduct penalty. D5 players had 14 CFB GM penalties this season this compares to five last season.

We have a great amount of information on our penalty report. It is good to analyze the information but I also believe we can create paralysis by analysis. The simple conclusion is D5 coaches, players, and officials understand what we all need to do to make our game safer. I believe much of this is due to our leadership. Doug Kephart and Brian Johnson have done a great job with holding our coaches accountable for their teams. But I believe the difference in D5 are the coaches. The collective coaching staff in D5 has done a great job teaching players how to make legal and

safe body contact. These coaches need to be recognized for their hard work, Thank You!

One part of our report that may be worth looking into is the overwhelming amount of game reports are written against Bantam players and the Bantam B players are called for the most reportable penalties.

I have pasted the summary of the penalty report below. I will be happy to share the entire report with any association officier or coach.
