# Western Wisconsin Baseball League End of Year Tournament Information 

## Philosophy:

The End of Year tournament is a "new season" where all teams start with a $0-0$ record. The regular season standings are used for seeding purposes, but they have no bearing on the play offs, including tie-breakers.

## Format:

- Format will consist of pool play followed by a Championship bracket tournament.
- All teams are guaranteed 2 games. An attempt will be made to schedule so that each team plays once on home field.
- Seeding for the playoffs will be determined based on the league standings at the end of week 7.
- $1^{\text {st }}$ and $2^{\text {nd }}$ place teams in each division will be seeded in pool play.
- Filling the rest of the pools will be done in order to equalize the pools as closely as possible.


## Tournament responsibilities:

- Hosting community must prep the field and supply umpires for tournament games.
- All disputes must be resolved at the game, there is no protest mechanism.


## WWBL Playoff Rules

Unless otherwise specified, rules will be the same as during the regular season.

- All players in the tournament must have played in at least $1 / 2$ of the regular season's games
- Exception will be made for:
- Player(s) that missed games due to injury
- Supplemental players if needed to have 8 or 9 players at a game.
- There is no time limit for playoff games.
- The 10 -Run rule is still in effect.
- Extra innings: Tournament games cannot end in a tie. If the game is tied at the end of 7 innings, use the following Extra Inning procedure:
- The player who had the last official at-bat for the last out in the previous inning will be placed on 2nd base to start each half of the 8th inning and each consecutive half-inning needed to complete the game.
- The half inning will start with 0 outs and a runner on $2^{\text {nd }}$ base.
- All disputes must be resolved at the game - there is no protest mechanism
- Home team determined by flip of coin before game
- Home team keeps the official book. It is Highly recommend that you compare books every half inning so there are no discrepancies.
- Pitchers are limited to 4 innings a game with 1 re-entry. If a game goes into extra innings, pitchers are awarded 2 extra innings with a single re-entry.
- During first 7 innings:
- Player pitched 4 innings, is awarded 2 extra innings
- Player pitched 3 innings, can pitch for 3 innings during extra innings
- Player pitched 2 innings, can pitch 4 innings during extra innings,
- Player pitched 1 inning, can pitch 5 innings during extra innings.
- There is no weekly maximum of inning pitched during the tournament.


## Pool Play

- Winning team must report score to wwbleague@yahoo.com the SAME NIGHT as the game or EARLY the next morning
- You can also text your score to 651-442-4438, but e-mail is the preferred method of reporting scores.
- The $1^{\text {st }}$ place teams in each pool will advance to bracket play.
- If a pool has 4 teams, the top 2 teams in that pool will advance.
- Tie breakers apply only to the games between the teams that are tied at the end of pool play.
- Tie breakers may be used to determine pool 1st and 2nd place, then re-applied to determine teams that advance to Bracket Play.
- Tie breakers in order of precedence:

1. Head-to-Head game
2. Least Total runs allowed in pool play
3. Most Total runs scored in pool play
4. Coin Flip

Example: 3 team pool, all 3 teams have a 1-1 pool record
Game $1 \mathrm{~A}=5, \mathrm{~B}=4 \quad$ Team A: $1-1 \quad$ Allowed 10 runs in pool play
Game $2 \mathrm{~A}=3, \mathrm{C}=6 \quad$ Team B: 1-1 Allowed 7 runs in pool play
Game $3 \mathrm{~B}=6, \mathrm{C}=2 \quad$ Team C: $1-1 \quad$ Allowed 9 runs in pool play

- Cannot use "head-to-head" tie breaker, all 3 teams are 1-1
- The "Least Total Runs allowed" tie breaker eliminates team A and leaves teams B \& C
- Re-apply tie breakers and team B is pool $1^{\text {st }}$ place due to head-to-head win over team $C$.


## Rain out or Darkness rules

Below are the scenarios when a game gets called because of weather or darkness:

- Once the game is started, the Umpire has the final say as to whether or not to continue a game
- Safety is always the primary concern when making a decision to continue a game.
- The game is considered FINAL if:
- 5 or more innings completed and the teams have had the same number of at-bats.
- $4 \frac{1}{2}$ innings have been completed and the home team is ahead at the time the game was called.
- 5 or more innings have been completed and the teams have not had the same number of at-bats
- the score will be that of the LAST COMPLETED INNING unless the home team is ahead at the time the game was called.
- The game is considered POSTPONED and must be completed if:
- The game is called before 5 completed innings (or $41 / 2$ if home team is ahead at the time the game was called)
- The postponed game will start with the score at the LAST COMPLETED $1 ⁄ 2$ INNING
- The lineup and pitcher do not have to be the same as when the original game was called.
- Pitchers will have 4 innings allowed and 1 re-entry in postponed game.
- 1st rained out/postponed game, play on the first available date at originally scheduled field
- 2nd rained out/postponed game, play on the second available date on originally scheduled field
- In either scenario, If the scheduled field is unavailable, move the game to the other team's field
