- TODAY'S GAME -- The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team continues its preliminary-round schedule in the XXII Olympic Winter Games today against Russia at Bolshoy Ice Dome. Team USA is the designated home team and will wear its blue jerseys.
- QUICK TO START -- Jonathan Quick will get the call in goal today. Quick stopped 22-of-23 shots in his Olympic debut on Thursday (Feb. 13) in Team USA's 7-1 win over Slovakia. Quick won the 2012 Conn Smythe Trophy in helping the L.A. Kings to the Stanley Cup title.
- LINEUP TODAY -- Team USA's lineup today contains the same players as it utilized on Thursday (Feb. 13) vs. Slovakia. Non-dressing players include netminder Jimmy Howard, defenseman Justin Faulk and forward Derek Stepan.
- ALL-TIME vs. RUSSIA IN THE OLYMPICS -- The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team is 1-0-0-2-1 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time against Russia at the Olympics. In international competition overall, including the Olympics and Men's World Championship, the U.S. is 5-1-0-7-2 (W-OTW-L-OTL-T). (note: The U.S. has a 2-6-0 record in Olympic competition against the Soviet Union).

- THINGS -- The U.S. was dominant in the faceoff circle against Slovakia on Thursday (Feb. 13), winning 37 of 55 faceoffs (.673). Joe Pavelski led the way, winning 12-of-13 faceoffs, while Ryan Kesler won 11-of-13 draws ... Zach Parise and Ryan Suter sat down with Amy Kobach of Good Morning America yesterday at the Main Press Center and then journeyed to the International Broadcast Center to do an interview with NBC's Rebecca Lowe. Suter and Parise met Nastia Luikin in the NBC commisary and also chatted with NBC Sports executive producer Sam Flood ... Ron DeGregorio, president of USA Hockey; Dave Ogrean, executive director of USA Hockey; and Gavin Regan, vice president of USA Hockey and chair or the organization's International Council, are all in Sochi and will be here through the duration of the Olympic Winter Games ... The 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team includes five Ryans (Callahan, Kesler, Suter, McDonagh and Miller). Incidentally, the name Ryan means "little king." ... Staff members from USA Hockey sent the photo below. The organization's national office is located in Colorado Springs, Colo. ... Team USA looks to win its first two games in the Olympic tournament for the second straight time, but only the third time since 1992 ... The U.S. lineup today includes nine players that were born in the first half of the year and 13 that were born in the second half ... The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team stays in the Olympic Village ... U.S. general manager David Poile turned 64 yesterday. Poile is recovering from injury suffered after getting hit with a puck in St. Paul on Feb. 6 and will not be with the team here in Sochi.

U.S. Medals at the Olympic Games

- LAST TIME OUT -- The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team opened its Olympic schedule on Thursday (Feb. 13) with a 7-1 victory over Slovakia. Paul Stastny tallied a pair of goals and Phil Kessel recorded three points (1-2-3), while goaltender Jonathan Quick made 22 saves in his Olympic debut. The U.S. scored six of its seven goals in the second period, tying a modern-day (1956-present) U.S. Olympic record for goals in a single period. All total, 11 players got on the scoresheet with seven players recording at least two points.

- ONLINE MEDIA GUIDE -- Media can find player and staff bios and historical information pertinent to the 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team online at olympics. usahockey.com. A printed media guide is not available.
- ROSTER NUGGETS -- The 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team includes 13 returnees from the silver medal-winning 2010 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. The 25 members of Team USA represent 17 NHL teams and seven states. The New York Rangers and St. Louis Blues each have three players. Minnesota is the home state for the most U.S. Olympians (eight). The U.S. roster includes 15 first-round draft choices, including Patrick Kane, the No. 1 overall selection in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. Twenty members of Team USA played U.S. college hockey, with the University of Wisconsin leading the way with four players.
- CAPTAIN AMERICA -- Zach Parise is captain of the 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. Parise, who played for the U.S. at the 2010 Olympic Winter Games, is a two-time gold medalist (2002 U18 World Championship, 2004 World Junior Championship). Forward **Dustin Brown** and defenseman **Ryan Suter** are serving as Team USA's alternate captains. All three players wear a letter for their respective NHL clubs. Brown is the captain of the L.A. Kings, while Parise and Suter are both alternate captains for the Minnesota Wild.
- COACHING STAFF -- The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team is led by head coach Dan Bylsma, head coach of the Pittsburgh Penguins. Peter Laviolette, captain of the 1994 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team and Stanley Cup-winning NHL coach; Todd Richards, head coach of the Columbus Blue Jackets; and Tony Granato, assistant coach with the Pittsburgh Penguins, are serving as assistant coaches.
- TIDBITS FROM PAST GAME NOTES -- Many of Team USA's players and coaches, including head coach Dan Bylsma, were at the U.S.-Canada women's game on Feb. 12. In addition, players have been taking in other events, both in the coastal and mountain clusters, since their arrival ... Zach Parise, Ryan Suter and Patrick Kane appearaed on Today on NBC with Matt Lauer and Savannah Guthrie on Feb. 12 and also stopped for an interview with The Weather Channel's Al Roker and a photo with Access Hollywood's Billy Bush.
- NTDP ROOTS -- Nine members of the U.S. Olympic squad played at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program in Ann Arbor, Mich., including Justin Faulk, Cam Fowler, Jimmy Howard, Patrick Kane, Ryan Kesler, Phil Kessel, Kevin Shattenkirk, Ryan Suter and James van Riemsdyk.
- YOUNG GUNS -- Of the U.S. 25-man roster, 22 members are under 30 years old. **Justin Faulk** is the youngest member of Team USA at 21 years old, while **Ryan Miller** is the oldest at 33 years old.
- FAMILY AFFAIR -- Ryan Suter made his Olympic debut in 2010, but he isn't the first member of his family to play for Team USA at the Olympics. Suter's dad, Bob, was a member of the gold medal-winning 1980 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team and his uncle, Gary, captured a silver medal with the 2002 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. In addition, Paul Stastny's father, Peter, played for Czechoslovakia at the 1980 Olympic Winter Games and Slovakia at the 1994 Games.

- TEAM USA EXPERIENCE -- Members of the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team have played in a combined 651 games in a U.S. uniform. Ryan Suter (65), Phil Kessel (54), Dustin Brown (53), Zach Parise (39), Ryan Kesler (35) and James van Riemsdyk (35) lead the pack for the U.S. Most recently, three members of the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team -- Justin Faulk, T.J. Oshie and Paul Stastny -- helped the 2013 U.S. Men's National Team capture the bronze medal at the IIHF Men's World Championship.
- JUNIOR CONNECTION -- Eight members of the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team played in either the United States Hockey League or the North American Hockey League, including Ryan Miller, who suited up for the Soo Indians of the NAHL.
- BACK IN THE OLYMPICS -- Team USA returns 13 players from its silver medal-winning 2010 Olympic Team, including goaltenders Ryan Miller and Jonathan Quick; defensemen Brooks Orpik and Ryan Suter; and forwards David Backes, Dustin Brown, Ryan Callahan, Patrick Kane, Ryan Kesler, Phil Kessel, Zach Parise, Joe Pavelski and Paul Stastny.
- INTERNATIONAL HONORS -- Ten members of Team USA have received directorate awards or have been selected to media all-star teams at IIHF tournaments. The list includes goal-tender Ryan Miller, who was awarded most valuable player, best goaltender and all-star honors at the 2010 Olympic Winter Games, and forward Zach Parise, who was a media all-star pick at the 2010 Olympics.
- INTO THE RECORD BOOKS -- Ryan Miller set the all-time U.S. Olympic record with a 1.35 GAA during the 2010 Olympics and left himself only two victories shy of the all-time United States career wins record (Miller has five; Jack McCartan holds the record with seven).
- TEAM USA HOST -- Nikita Evsey is the team host for the 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. He lives in Minsk, the capital of Belarus and is fluent in English, Belorussian and Russian. Evsey founded a marketing agency called Eting Mark Agency and also works as a lecturer at Belarusian National Technical University.

- NHL LEADERS -- Several U.S. players rank in the topfive among all NHLers in league statistical categories. Phil Kessel (65) and Patrick Kane (63) are fourth and fifth in points. Kessel is second in goals (31), while Joe Pavelski is tied for fourth with 29. Ryan Suter leads the league in average TOI (29:49). Kevin Shattenkirk is third among NHL defensemen with 20 power-play points. Kane, Pavelski and Zach Parise are tied for third in the NHL in power-play goals (10). Max Pacioretty is tied for second in the league with seven game-winning goals. Ryan Kesler is tied for fifth in shots (205). Kessel leads the league in assists (17) and points (28) since Jan. 1, while Pavelski leads the league in goals (13) during that time. Jonathan Quick ranks fourth overall in goals against average (2.05) since Jan. 1.

USA Hockey Happenings

- The **2014 U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team** completed preliminary-round play Wednesday (Feb. 12) with a 3-2 loss to arch-rival Canada. The U.S. women, which finished 2-0-0-1 in group play, will enter the medal round as the second-seeded team and play a semifinal game Monday (Feb. 17) against a yet-to-be-named opponent. The contest will be broadcast live in the United States on NBC Sports Network.
- The **U.S. Paralmypic Sled Hockey Team** is currently taking part in a 10-day training camp in Charlotte, N.C., as part of its final preparations for the Paralympic Winter Games. A PBS documentary on the Paralympic team will air nationally Feb. 24 at 10 p.m. ET.
- The ninth annual **Labatt Blue/USA Hockey Pond Hockey National Championships** took place Feb. 7-9 in Eagle River, Wis. Some 340 teams participated in the event on Dollar Lake.
