• **TODAY'S GAME** -- The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team concludes its preliminary-round schedule in the XXII Olympic Winter Games today against Slovenia at Shayba Arena. Team USA is the visiting team and will wear its "third" jersey, honoring the 1960 gold-medal U.S. team. A victory for Team USA would assure a bye into the quarterfinals.

• **LINEUP TODAY** -- **Ryan Miller** (East Lansing, Mich./Buffalo Sabres/Michigan State University) will get the call in goal today. Miller was the MVP of the 2010 Olympic Men's Ice Hockey tournament, helping the U.S. to a silver-medal finish. Miller set the all-time U.S. Olympic record with a 1.35 GAA during the 2010 Olympics and left himself only two victories shy of the all-time United States career wins record (Miller has five; Jack McCartan (1960 team) holds the record with seven) ... **Derek Stepan** (Hastings, Minn./NY Rangers/University of Wisconsin) Minnesota Duluth) will be in the lineup today in place of **Max Pacioretty** and **Jimmy Howard** will serve as Miller's back-up in net.

• **OSHIE** -- **T.J. Oshie** shot six times in the shootout yesterday against Russia and converted on four occasions, including the game-winner in the eighth round. Oshie shot five times in a shootout in the IIHF Men's World Championship in Cologne, Germany, on May 18, 2010, converting three times, including the game-winner to help the U.S. to a 3-2 win over Italy in the relegation round ... Oshie made the media rounds last night after the game, including spending 30 minutes in the mixed zone after the game; meeting more media at the Main Press Center with teammates **Paul Stastny**, **James van Riemsdyk** and **Cam Fowler** for 20 minutes; and then finishing the night at the International Broadcast Center for interviews with Dan Patrick and Al Michaels. Oshie was greeted with enthusiastic applause at the NBC compound at the IBC and stopped for photos with many NBC staffers ... Oshie began the day yesterday with approximately 90,000 followers on Twitter and as of this morning had more than 200,000. Oshie was trending worldwide on Twitter last night and received shoutouts from many, including President Obama ... Oshie media requests continue to pour in, including Today, Good Morning America, Dan Patrick Show, Peter King, Piers Morgan Live, and CNN New Day among others.

- **THINGS** -- **Cam Fowler** and **Joe Pavelski** both scored their first Olympic goal yesterday vs. Russia ... **Patrick Kane** had an assist yesterday vs. Russia to extend his Olympic point streak to four games ... **Phil Kessel**, who with 1-3--4 is tied for second in the Olympic Tournament in points, led all U.S. players with seven shots on goal in yesterday's game vs. Russia ... **Ryan Suter** played a game-high 29:56 vs. Russia yesterday ... The U.S. had never participated in a shootout in the Olympic Winter Games prior to yesterday ... The U.S. looks to win its first three games in the Olympic Tournament for the second straight Games and fifth time overall. Prior to 2010, the U.S. last won its opening three games of the Olympic Tournament in 1992. That year the U.S. opened with wins over Italy (6-3), Germany (2-0) and Finland (4-1). Team USA also won its fourth game of the 1992 Olympic Winter Games against Poland (3-0). The U.S. also won its first three games in 1960, 1952 and 1924. ... The U.S. Olympic Women's Ice Hockey Team, which will take on Sweden in the semifinals tomorrow (Feb. 17), was at last night's USA-Russia men's game ... **Phil Kessel**, **Patrick Kane**, **T.J. Oshie** and **Kevin Shattenkirk** are the four U.S. players that have at least one point in each of Team USA's first two games of the Olympic Tournament ... Proctor and Gamble will host members of the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team and their families for a dinner following tonight's game.

• **ALL-TIME vs. SLOVENIA** -- The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team has never played Slovenia in the Olympics. In IIHF Men's World Championship competition, the U.S. is 3-0-0-0-0 (W-OTW-L-OTL-T) and has outscored Slovenia, 19-3. The last meeting between the two teams came on May 4, 2008 -- a 5-1 U.S. victory.

- **LAST TIME OUT** -- **T.J. Oshie** capped "Marathon on Ice" last night as his shootout goal in the bottom of the eighth round lifted the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team to a thrilling 3-2 victory over Russia. **Oshie** scored four times on six shootout attempts. **Cam Fowler** and **Joe Pavelski** each tallied power-play goals in regulation, and goaltender **Jonathan Quick** made 29 saves during regulation and overtime, plus another five stops in the shootout.

- **ONLINE MEDIA GUIDE** -- Media can find player and staff bios and historical information pertinent to the 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team online at olympics.usahockey.com. A printed media guide is not available.

- **ROSTER NUGGETS** -- The 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team includes 13 returnees from the silver medal-winning 2010 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. The 25 members of Team USA represent 17 NHL teams and seven states. The New York Rangers and St. Louis Blues each have three players. Minnesota is the home state for the most U.S. Olympians (eight). The U.S. roster includes 15 first-round draft choices, including **Patrick Kane**, the No. 1 overall selection in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. Twenty members of Team USA played U.S. college hockey, with the University of Wisconsin leading the way with four players.

- **CAPTAIN AMERICA** -- **Zach Parise** is captain of the 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. Parise, who played for the U.S. at the 2010 Olympic Winter Games, is a two-time gold medalist (2002 U18 World Championship, 2004 World Junior Championship). Forward **Dustin Brown** and defenseman **Ryan Suter** are serving as Team USA's alternate captains. All three players wear a letter for their respective NHL clubs. Brown is the captain of the L.A. Kings, while Parise and Suter are both alternate captains for the Minnesota Wild.

• **COACHING STAFF** -- The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team is led by head coach **Dan Bylsma**, head coach of the Pittsburgh Penguins. **Peter Laviolette**, captain of the 1994 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team and Stanley Cup-winning NHL coach; **Todd Richards**, head coach of the Columbus Blue Jackets; and **Tony Granato**, assistant coach with the Pittsburgh Penguins, are serving as assistant coaches.

- **NTDP ROOTS** -- Nine members of the U.S. Olympic squad played at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program in Ann Arbor, Mich., including **Justin Faulk**, **Cam Fowler**, **Jimmy Howard**, **Patrick Kane**, **Ryan Kesler**, **Phil Kessel**, **Kevin Shattenkirk**, **Ryan Suter** and **James van Riemsdyk**.

• **FAMILY AFFAIR** -- **Ryan Suter** made his Olympic debut in 2010, but he isn't the first member of his family to play for Team USA at the Olympics. Suter's dad, Bob, was a member of the gold medal-winning 1980 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team and his uncle, Gary, captured a silver medal with the 2002 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. In addition, **Paul Stastny's** father, Peter, played for Czechoslovakia at the 1980 Olympic Winter Games and Slovakia at the 1994 Games.

• **YOUNG GUNS** -- Of the U.S. 25-man roster, 22 members are under 30 years old. **Justin Faulk** is the youngest member of Team USA at 21 years old, while **Ryan Miller** is the oldest at 33 years old.

• **TEAM USA EXPERIENCE** -- Members of the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team have played in a combined 651 games in a U.S. uniform. **Ryan Suter** (65), **Phil Kessel** (54), **Dustin Brown** (53), **Zach Parise** (39), **Ryan Kesler** (35) and **James van Riemsdyk** (35) lead the pack for the U.S. Most recently, three members of the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team -- **Justin Faulk**, **T.J. Oshie** and **Paul Stastny** -- helped the 2013 U.S. Men's National Team capture the bronze medal at the IIHF Men's World Championship.

• **JUNIOR CONNECTION** -- Eight members of the U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team played in either the United States Hockey League or the North American Hockey League, including **Ryan Miller**, who suited up for the Soo Indians of the NAHL.

• **BACK IN THE OLYMPICS** -- Team USA returns 13 players from its silver medal-winning 2010 Olympic Team, including goaltenders **Ryan Miller** and **Jonathan Quick**; defensemen **Brooks Orpik** and **Ryan Suter**; and forwards **David Backes**, **Dustin Brown**, **Ryan Callahan**, **Patrick Kane**, **Ryan Kesler**, **Phil Kessel**, **Zach Parise**, **Joe Pavelski** and **Paul Stastny**.

- **INTERNATIONAL HONORS** -- Ten members of Team USA have received directorate awards or have been selected to media all-star teams at IIHF tournaments. The list includes goaltender **Ryan Miller**, who was awarded most valuable player, best goaltender and all-star honors at the 2010 Olympic Winter Games, and forward **Zach Parise**, who was a media all-star pick at the 2010 Olympics.

- **INTO THE RECORD BOOKS** -- **Ryan Miller** set the all-time U.S. Olympic record with a 1.35 GAA during the 2010 Olympics and left himself only two victories shy of the all-time United States career wins record (Miller has five; Jack McCartan holds the record with seven).

- **TEAM USA HOST** -- **Nikita Evsey** is the team host for the 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. He lives in Minsk, the capital of Belarus and is fluent in English, Belorussian and Russian. Evsey founded a marketing agency called Eting Mark Agency and also works as a lecturer at Belarusian National Technical University.

- **TIDBITS FROM PAST GAME NOTES** -- Many of Team USA's players and coaches, including head coach Dan Bylsma, were at the U.S.-Canada women's game on Feb. 12. In addition, players have been taking in other events, both in the coastal and mountain clusters, since their arrival ... **Zach Parise**, **Ryan Suter** and **Patrick Kane** appeared on Today on NBC with Matt Lauer and Savannah Guthrie on Feb. 12 and also stopped for an interview with The Weather Channel's Al Roker and a photo with Access Hollywood's Billy Bush ... **Zach Parise** and **Ryan Suter** sat down with Amy Kobach of Good Morning America on Feb. 14 at the Main Press Center and then journeyed to the International Broadcast Center to do an interview with NBC's Rebecca Lowe. Suter and Parise met Nastia Luikin in the NBC commissary and also chatted with NBC Sports executive producer Sam Flood ... **Ron DeGregorio**, president of USA Hockey; **Dave Ogrian**, executive director of USA Hockey; and **Gavin Regan**, vice president of USA Hockey and chair of the organization's International Council, are all in Sochi and will be here through the duration of the Olympic Winter Games ... The 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team includes five Ryans (Callahan, Kesler, Suter, McDonagh and Miller). Incidentally, the name Ryan means "little king." ... The U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team stays in the Olympic Village ... U.S. general manager David Poile turned 64 on Feb. 14. Poile is recovering from injury suffered after getting hit with a puck in St. Paul on Feb. 6 and will not be with the team here in Sochi.

Oshie scored four times in six shootout attempts, including the game-winner in the eighth round, and Jonathan Quick made 29 saves, to lead the U.S. to victory in an epic preliminary-round game before a sold-out crowd that included Russian president Putin. Cam Fowler and Joe Pavelski both scored their first Olympic goals (both on the power play) and the U.S. killed five-of-six Russian power play chances to help key the win. Patrick Kane had an assist to extend his Olympic point-scoring streak to four games.

Kessel is second in goals (31), while **Joe Pavelski** is tied for fourth with 29. **Ryan Suter** leads the league in average TOI (29:49). **Kevin Shattenkirk** is third among NHL defensemen with 20 power-play points. Kane, Pavelski and **Zach Parise** are tied for third in the NHL in power-play goals (10). **Max Pacioretty** is tied for second in the league with seven game-winning goals. **Ryan Kesler** is tied for fifth in shots (205). Kessel leads the league in assists (17) and points (28) since Jan. 1, while Pavelski leads the league in goals (13) during that time. **Jonathan Quick** ranks fourth overall in goals against average (2.05) since Jan. 1.

## USA Hockey Happenings

- The U.S. Men's and Women's National Under-18 Teams will compete in their respective IIHF World Championships in the coming weeks. The women will travel to Budapest, Hungary, March 23-30, while the men will be in Lappeenranta and Imatra, Finland, April 17-27.
