#### A Tradition and History

Benilde-St. Margaret's School has an enduring and fascinating history that spans an entire century. The foundation from the past is the center of today's educational future.


In 1907, the Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet founded St. Margaret's Academy. The original school was located near the Basilica of St. Mary in downtown Minneapolis. It included two mansions and a carriage house built in the 1880s. Loaded with charm, the school featured winding staircases, a ballroom, and a fireplace in every classroom.

The school gained such popularity that by 1959, 200 students were turned away for every 100 accepted. Due to the demand, the Sisters had the foresight to build a new school on 28 acres of land previously purchased on Upton Avenue, near the Eloise Butler Wildflower Gardens and Wirth Park.

Meanwhile, the Christian Brothers were simultaneously building a new school for boys, called Benilde High School, in St. Louis Park. Brother Mark Sullivan opened the doors to Benilde in 1956. Both schools prospered and functioned until enrollment declined in the 1970s, as costs escalated.

Facing the departure of the Brothers in 1970 and the prospect of the school closing, parents, students, and staff went to great lengths to keep it open. Prayers were answered and their efforts rewarded as the Benedictine Community of St. John's Abbey agreed to provide faculty members and an administrator.

In 1974, the St. Margaret's facility was sold to the Minneapolis school system, and the merged Benilde-St. Margaret's High School opened its door at the former Benilde High School site. One hundred ninety students graduated in its first class.



#### Benilde-St. Margaret's School



In 1989, a junior high was added, and one hundred seventh and eighth graders helped to move BSM into a new era of education in the 1990s.

In 2000, an aggressive capital campaign entitled "Enriching Our Legacy of Excellence" was begun under the leadership of James F. Hamburge. As part of this one-anda-half-year project, a new chapel, library, classroom wing, performing arts center, and both senior and junior high administrative office spaces were built.

Dr. Bob Tift took the reigns as president in 2002, after serving as interim president for one year. He helped BSM embark on its next campaign, officially started in 2008—Raise the Red.

Raise the Red is responsible for the new athletic complex, which made its debut in the fall of 2010. The athletics fields project included an artificial turf stadium in a more centralized position, a gatehouse with restrooms, upgraded track and field facilities, renovated baseball and softball fields, improved practice fields, consolidated wetlands (improving their environmental integrity) and increased parking.

Today, BSM is a strong and viable school that serves over 1,200 students in grades seven through 12.

#### Catholic Tradition, Excellence and Innovation

Faith and family together give students a solid foundation on which to build a lasting and memorable school career and continue to nurture their spiritual growth.

#### **2014 Season Preview**

In the final year of the North Suburban Conference, the Benilde-St. Margaret's Red Knights should be in the hunt for their fourth title in seven years as well as contending for the top spot in Section 6AAA this season.

After a long winter pushed into spring, and pushed the start of the season back by nearly a week, the Red Knights will open with games on April 10, 11, 12, including key section games versus Hopkins and Bloomington Jefferson.

Pitching is expected to be BSM's hallmark in 2014 and, with a strong defense and solid hitting, the Red Knights go into this year's campaign with high hope.

#### **PITCHERS**

"This should be our greatest strength," head coach Greg Hoemke said. "We have a lot of options in the starting rotation and out of the bullpen."

At the top of the starting rotation are Michael Kaminski and co-captain Jimmy Cron.

Kaminski went at least six innings in four of his six starts last season, including an eight-inning, 2-1 win over Richfield in the Section 6AAA playoffs and the Red Knights were 4-2 in his six starts.

Cron was stellar down the stretch last season, allowing just three earned runs in his final 15 innings of work, which included a one-hit shutout of Irondale in BSM's final conference game of the season. His 32 strikeouts led the staff and he completed three of his five starts.

Mikey McGill has been a part of the Red Knight staff the past two seasons and pitched effectively last season despite a 1-3 record. He boasts a 3.03 career earned run average and opponents have hit just .239 against him in two seasons.

Colin Polarek made all seven of his appearances last season out of the bullpen and went 2-1 with a save in a relief role.


Connor Day and John Vecere, both of whom saw mound duty as sophomores last season, will also see action while lefty Tyler Wyvell was impressive during the team's spring trip to Florida and newcomer Riley Crane is

also expected to mound duty as well.

Although the pitching prospects look bright, Hoemke knows where the key lies for his staff. "We need to limit walks and pound the strike zone more than last year," he said. "We have some strong arms this year and our pitchers need to go after hitters and trust the defense behind them.



The catchers return for the Red Knights this season with valuable experience.



Chris Landis also saw action last season and has developed his skills further since. After spending the summer with the Chester Bird Junior Legion team, he joined the Legion squad and proceeded to bat .379 for The Birds.

Riley Simonetti, the only sophomore on this season's squad, got a late-season call up to the Red Knight varsity squad last season and

produced a .333 batting average.

"We should have plenty of competition at this spot all year," Hoemke said. "Watkins blocks the ball very well, Landis had a strong finish with Chester Bird and has really improved his skills in the last year and Simonetti threw out three base stealers in Florida."

#### **INFIELD**

The Red Knights return their starting infield intact from last season with McGill (first base) and Kaminski (third base) manning the corners while Nathan Hanks is back at second base and co-captain Keaton Studsrud returns for his third season as the team's starting shortstop.

Three of the team's top four hitters last season were on the infield and made up the middle of the lineup as Studsrud batted .349 and led the team with 12 RBI while batting third. McGill, batting fourth, and Kaminski, batting

Jimmy Cron earned all-conference honors after leading BSM with a 2.80 ERA and three complete games.

fifth, both batted .339 with 10 and nine RBI respectively.

Hanks, who batted ninth most of the season, led the team with five bunt hits and was steady in the field, producing a .964 fielding percentage with just three errors in 21 games.

'They have all improved," Hoemke said of his returning infielders. "Studsrud will be the cornerstone of our defense and when he is playing well, the rest of our defense tends to follow. He makes some incredibly tough plays, turns the double play well and has a very strong arm.

"Kaminski's glove looks better than ever and Hanks is a very smart defensive player at second base. McGill is back at first base and gives our infielders a big target with good hands."

Wyvell and Cron are expected to see action at first base when McGill takes the mound and Hoemke likes both options.

"Wyvell is big, has soft hands and can drive the ball," Hoemke said. "Cron has experienced at first as well and gives up plenty of depth at the position."

Chris Racchini is expected to see action at both second, where he played in a reserve role last season, and third base. "He has worked exceptionally hard the last year and will help us with his versatility and with his bat," Hoemke added.

Vecere and Day are also expected to see action at third base and provide defensive depth on the infield.

#### **OUTFIELD**

Year in and year out, the Red Knight outfield has always been one of the team's strengths and that should be no different this season with two starters returning along with a pair of reserves.

Co-captain Sam Lynch will anchor the outfield from his spot in center field. Not only did he hit .333 last season, he also led the team with five sacrifice hits. In two varsity seasons, he has not committed an error in the field nor has he been caught stealing on the base paths.

"He can just go get the ball," Hoemke said of the third-

year starter. "He is one of the best defensive outfielders I've seen at BSM."

The other starter returning is the coach's son, Marshall, who made just one error in 20 games in the outfield, providing range and a strong arm in right field.

The competition for playing time will be in left

field where Polarek and John O'Connor return after serving as backups last season and Crane enters the fray for playing time as well.

As for its offense,



Mikey McGill made six starts on the mound in addition to providing a strong presence in the batting lineup.

BSM will need to make use of its speed on the bases to offset its lack of power at the plate, according to Hoemke.

"We didn't show a lot of power last year and will need to improve our doubles production if we are going to be successful," Hoemke said. "Studsrud, Lynch, McGill and Kaminski can all drive the ball and Simonetti has tremendous pop and could be the power spark this team needs.

"We must cut down on last year's strikeout total if we are going to get deep in the playoffs.



Sam Lynch is in his third season as a starter in the BSM outfield and is errorless in his first two seasons.

With the team speed we possess, we must challenge defenses by putting the ball in play."

Hoemke will be counting on his veterans, having a roster consisting of 12 seniors.

"There is always the senior factor and I'm counting on it this year," he said. "The seniors on this year's squad will bring confidence and physical maturity to the team. All are stronger and driving the ball more consistently.

"The key to the season will be how much we have improved as hitters and, with our seniors, we should get the power surge that we lacked last year."

#### Varsity Head Coach Greg Hoemke

Greg Hoemke enters his seventh season as the Red Knights' head coach, having led BSM to North Suburban Conference titles in three of his first six seasons.

After leading the Red Knights to the NSC title and the top seed in the Section 6AAA playoffs in 2012, Hoemke served

as a coach in the Lions All-Star Game.

He took over the reigns of the BSM program in 2008, following five seasons as the Red Knights' assistant coach, and promptly won the first of his three NSC crowns.

In six seasons under Hoemke, the Red Knights have finished no worse than fourth in the 11-team conference, including five seasons of finishing either first or second.

In his six seasons as head coach, Hoemke has seen 15 of his graduating players go onto play collegiate baseball at all three NCAA levels.

Hoemke came to BSM from St. Agnes, where he spent six seasons as the assistant baseball coach in addition to serving as an assistant football coach during his tenure there. He also served as the school's B-squad softball coach in 1984 and as an assistant baseball coach in 1985 while attending the University of Minnesota.

A junior high English teacher at BSM, Hoemke also is a member of the Red Knight football staff, working with the Junior High program.

A 1983 graduate of St. Agnes, Hoemke earned his bachelor's degree from Minnesota in 1986.

He and his wife, Jane, have two children; Rachel, 22, a 2010 BSM graduate who played varsity softball and tennis and currently attends the University of Minnesota; and Marshall, 17, a BSM senior who is a member of the Red Knights' varsity baseball and football teams.

#### Varsity Assistant Fred Hennen

Fred Hennen is in his seventh season as a varsity assistant coach following three seasons as the Red Knights' B-Squad coach.

He also coached the BSM Mickey Mantle team during the 2008 summer season and was an assistant coach with that team

in 2010.

A junior high math teacher at BSM, Hennen also spent four seasons as the Red Knights' girls junior varsity hockey coach.

Hennen is a 1994 graduate of Hill-Murray High School where he led the Pioneers to a runner-up finish in the 1993 Class AA state hockey tournament.

He spent one season as a goaltender in the United States Junior

League before enrolling at St. Mary's University in Winona, Minn. He played hockey for four seasons for the Cardinals before earning his bachelor's degree in 2000.

### Pitching Coach Alex Wahl

A key member of the BSM pitching staff on the Red Knights' 2005 state tournament team, Alex Wahl is in his third season at his alma mater, where he works with the pitching staff.

An all-conference honorable mention selection as a senior, Wahl was 8-0 in 2005 with a team-best 0.62 earned run aver-

age, allowing just 43 baserunners in 56.1 innings.

Wahl went on to pitch at St. John's University where he made 29 appearances in three varsity seasons. He posted a 6-6 career record with one save and a 4.92 ERA for the Johnnies.

Alex's brother, Zach, was also a BSM baseball player who earned honorable mention all-conference honors in 2010.

After playing six seasons for the Northwest Suburban Redhawks, for which he managed the three years, he now plays for the Blooming-

plays for the Bloomington Bandits. He was also an assistant to Fred Hennen with the 2008 Mickey Mantle Team.

A 2009 graduate of St. John's, Wahl earned degrees in finance and accounting. He has worked as an accountant at United Health since 2009 and was married to his wife, Amber, in 2010.



#### B-Squad Coach Rob Eberle

In his sixth season with the BSM staff is B-Squad coach Rob Eberle.

A 1986 graduate of Minneapolis Southwest, Eberle had been the freshmen coach at Orono for four seasons prior to joining the BSM staff. He also coached the Minnesota Twins RBI All-Stars in 2001-02, leading

the team to its first victories in regional tournament play.

Now in his 10th season on the Red Knight staff and his 14th season of work with Greg Hoemke, is Keith Johnson.

The Freshman Red Team coach for five seasons, Johnson is in his fifth season working with Rob Eberle and the Red Knight B-Squad.

Before coming over to BSM,

Johnson was the freshman coach at St. Agnes for five years.

In addition, Boyd has been a member of the BSM football staff, coaching the 7th grade squad.


Boyd works for Mauer Chevrolet and is engaged to be married this summer to Tristan Zabel.

# **CHESTER BIRD AMERICAN LEGION**

The Chester Bird American Legion Post 523 baseball team, the summer program for Benilde-St. Margaret's, had its best season ever in 2013, finishing 22-11 on the season, tying for second in the South Hennepin League and advancing to its first state tournament.

Guided by 2005 BSM alum Isak Tranvik and former classmates Mike DesLauriers and Alex Zeman, members of the Red Knights' only Class AAA state tournament team, with 2011 BSM grad Brendan Rooney serving as the pitching coach, The Birds advanced to the state tournament with a 13-3 win over Coon Rapids in the Sub-State 9 tournament, one day after losing to the tournament host, 18-8.

Without any seniors on the squad from the 2013 Red Knight team, Chester Bird welcomed back four 2012 graduates with remaining eligibility, all of whom made significant contributions.

Jimmy Heck returned from an outstanding rookie season at Minnesota-Duluth and batted .523 on the season with 21 doubles, 29 runs batted in and a .822 slugging percentage while scoring a team-leading 35 runs. On the mound, he turned in a 5-0 record with two saves and a 1.93 earned run average.

Gabe MacDonald and Marcus Barone both saw significant playing time on the junior varsity team at St. John's before returning for a final seables and 29 RBI to lead The Birds to son with The Birds

MacDonald's 37 RBI led the team and he

batted .326. Working 13.0 innings on the mound, he also posted a 2-1 pitching record.

Barone saw action in both the outfield and on the mound. He posted a team-high 38 strikeouts while going 5-1 with a 3.45 ERA.

Joe Melles, who played at Gustavus Adolphus in the spring, made a position change from second base to left field and tied for second on the team with 29 RBI while batting .279.

The good news for BSM baseball was that 13 players saw playing time and will return for the 2014 spring season, led by Keaton Studsrud, who hit .408, and Sam Lynch, who batted .306, was second on the team with 29 runs scored and a .494 on-base percentage.

They were among six returning players who got at least 70 plate appearances over the course of the summer. Six players got nine innings of work or more on the mound to give the returning pitching staff ample experience as well.

Behind Heck and Barone, Jimmy Cron was the team's number three starter, working a team-high 47.1 innings while putting together a 4-2 record. One of those victories was a regular-season win over eventual state champion Eden Prairie. He issued just nine walks while striking out 26.

Mike McGill and Michael Kaminski, both of whom collected over 100 plate appearance while being regular starters in the lineup, combined for four wins and 54 innings of work.

Chris Landis, who spent most of the summer with the Junior Legion team, came up at the end of the season and was a regular in the Chester Bird lineup during its playoff run, finishing with a .379 average.



# Pat Scanlon '70

James Patrick Scanlon was drafted in the fifth round, 99th overall, by the Montreal Expos following his senior season at Benilde High School. He made his Major League debut on Aug. 27, 1974, and played three seasons for the Expos before being traded to the St. Louis Cardinals following the 1976 season. He was then traded to the San Diego Padres in 1977 and played 47 games that year, his final season in Major League Baseball.

# Mike Mason '77

Michael Paul Mason graduated from Benilde-St. Margaret's in 1977 and was drafted by the Texas Rangers, following his junior season at Oral Roberts University, 12th overall in Major League Baseball's 1980 amateur draft. He was also drafted by the Detroit Tigers in 1978 following his freshman season at Normandale Community College. He made his MLB debut on August 13, 1982, and played six seasons with the Rangers before being traded to the Chicago Cubs during the 1987 season. He played his final season in MLB with the Minnesota Twins in 1988.

Following seven seasons as a Major League player, Mike Mason joined the coaching ranks.

He is in his 23rd season as a professional coach and, after six seasons as pitching coach with the lowa Cubs, he takes over as the pitching coordinator for the Chicago Cubs' organization.

Previously, he was the Kansas City Royals' minor league pitching coordinator in 2007 and served as their minor league pitching instructor for three seasons before that role.

Mason split time in 2004 between his minor league instructor position and interim pitching coach for the major league club.

He spent 10 seasons as a pitching coach in the Royals minor league system for Appleton (1991-92), Memphis (1993-94), Springfield (1995), Lansing (1996-97) and Wichita (1998-99). He spent the 2000 and 2001 campaigns as the Royals minor league pitching instructor and then served as a pitching coach from 2002-03 for Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (AAA) in the Phillies organization.

He resides in Chanhassen, with his wife, Terri, and has two children, Derek, who played four seasons for Concordia University in St. Paul, and Stephanie.

# Adam Weisenburger '07 Huntsville Stars

For the second year in a row, Weisenburger was a non-roster invitee to Milwaukee's spring training camp.

He saw limited action for the Brewers during Cactus league play but hit his first home run in a Major League uniform before being sent to Class AA Huntsville,

where he is in his third season with the Stars.

Last season, he spent the entire year with Huntsville and was named to the Southern League's Mid-Season All-Star team en route to hitting .251 with five home runs and 24 RBI. The Brewers also opted to send Weisenburger to the Arizona Fall League, where each MLB team sends seven of its top prospects. He was a member of the AFL-champion Surprise Saguaros.

In 2012, Weisenburger split time between Class A Brevard County, of the Florida State League, and Huntsville, of the Southern League, and was named the defensive catcher of the year in the Milwaukee organization.

In 2011, his first professional season, with the Brewers' rookie team in the Arizona League, Weisenburger batted .276 in 33 games after finishing a stellar four-year career at Miami University and being selected in the 34th round of the 2011 Major League Baseball draft by the Brewers.

In four seasons at Miami University, Weisenburger played 154 games, starting 132, while batting .298 with 16 home runs and 92 RBI and led the team with a .408 on-base percentage as a senior. A two-year captain for the RedHawks, Weisenburger committed just 16 errors in 908 chances in four seasons, fielding .982 for his career.

One of the most accomplished athletes in school history, Weisenburger earned all-conference honors in three sports (baseball, hockey, soccer) during his career as a Red Knight. He was the team's starting catcher for four years, earning all-conference honors in each season. He was a two-time All-Metro selection, a member of the 2005 all-state tournament team and the team's most valuable player in 2007.

He played in 94 consecutive games, beginning with



the season opener in 2004, before missing the only game of his career as a senior. In 105 career games, Weisenburger batted .396, had a .473 on-base percentage, drove in 76 runs, scored 96 runs and stole 19 bases.

As a member of the Red Knights' 2006 state championship soccer team, he led the conference in assists before earning all-conference honors in hockey as a senior.

He also played three

seasons for the St. Cloud River Bats, serving as the team's primary catcher all three seasons. In that time he saw action in 122 games, hitting .217 with one home run and 38 RBI.

Weisenburger's jersey number, 3, was retired in 2008 to honor both he and Mike DesLauriers ('05).



# David Tranvik '10 Gustavus Adolphus College

A four-year letterwinner for the Red Knights and a three-year starter at catcher, Tranvik is now a senior at Gustavus Adolphus.

His senior season has seen him start off by hitting .389 while he has also made two appearances on the mound.

When Adam Weisenburger missed the only game of his career, in 2007, Tranvik made his varsity debut. He also saw action in three games at first base in the Section 5AAA playoffs.

As a junior, Tranvik became an offensive threat for BSM, hitting .383 with a .487 on-base percentage and 16 RBI. He did not make an error in the field and earned the first of his two all-conference honors that season.

As a senior, he batted .339 to raise his four-year career average to .306. He also sported a .427 OBP for his career.

He followed in the footsteps of his brother, Izak, who was a key member of BSM's 2005 state tournament team, as a Red Knight standout and played two seasons for Izak on the Chester Bird American Legion baseball team.

In four seasons with the Gusties, Tranvik has seen action in 89 career games, including 74 starts. During his career, he has committed just six errors in 386 chances behind the plate, fielding .990 for his career.



#### Marcus Barone '12 St. John's University

After two varsity seasons, in which he earned all-conference accolades, Barone is in his second collegiate season with the Johnnies, playing for the junior varsity squad.

A mainstay of the Red Knight pitching staff in 2011 and 2012, Barone went 6-3

with two saves and a 3.05 ERA, making 18 appearances, including 13 starts.

While also playing outfield, he batted .278 in two seasons, including .308 as a senior when he earned team co-MVP honors.



#### Jimmy Heck '12 University of Minnesota-Duluth

Heck moved seamlessly from the high school ranks to collegiate baseball, batting .353 as UMD's primary third baseman while also making eight appearances on the mound, including four starts.

This season, he has started 19 of 22 games at third base and has made one start on the mound. He is batting .242 on the season and has stolen three bases.

Heck's three-year career as a Red Knight saw him bat

.344 with 31 RBI in 59 games while he played eight of the nine positions in the field during his career.

On the mound, Heck was 9-4 with two saves in 21 appearances, posting a 3.34 earned run average while striking out 89 batters in 86 innings.

Heck earned All-North Suburban Conference honors as both a junior and senior. He was the team's co-MVP in 2012 while earning a spot in the Lions' All-Star Game.



# Gabe MacDonald '12 St. John's University

In his senior season, MacDonald made the switch from third base to catcher and he has now moved onto St. John's, where he is in his second season with the Johnnie program, including his first on the varsity.

Through SJU's first 13 games this season, MacDonald has split time behind the plate and is batting .400 and has not committed an error in 42 chances.

While moving behind the plate in 2012, MacDonald put together an all-conference campaign which saw him lead the team with a .557 slugging percentage and a .554 on base percentage while tying for the team lead with 18 RBI.



#### Joe Melles '12 Gustavus Adolphus College

After a stellar sophomore season as a pitcher for the Red Knights, Joe Melles' career on the mound was derailed by an arm injury but he contributed two all-conference seasons as an infielder before beginning his collegiate carer at Gustuvas Adolphus.

Melles batted .407 with three home runs, 25 RBI and a .532 on base percentage as a junior before wrapping his career up by hitting .329 as a senior while stealing seven bases and earning a spot in the Lions' All-Star Game. He earned the Red Knights' Gonsior Hustle Award in 2011 and the team's Coaches Award in 2012.

As a Gustie, Melles has moved to the outfield, seeing action in 14 games last season and four games in 2014. He has not made an error in his 18 career collegiate games.
