

2013/2014 Rink Usage








2013/2014 Colorado Cup Tournament

CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-Goals

- Develop all players to their maximum ability through applying USA Hockey's American Development Model (ADM) principles. The ADM promotes the development of all players including the optimum development of the elite player through a scientific approach to age appropriate development.
- To help each individual player reach his/her potential through our comprehensive on- and off-ice training programs and to provide each of our players with the opportunity to further their hockey careers beyond the scope of CSAHA's program through proper development, exposure, and competition
- Develop CSAHA's players and teams to compete for State, District, and National Championships through the use of ADM methods and principles
- To have 75% of Pikes Peak Miners AAA players developed through CSAHA's travel program
- To grow the membership of CSAHA through the retention of our players. The better opportunities we give our players to reach their individual potential, then the more fun they will have playing the greatest game on earth



CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-Divisions

- Division Coordinators
 - Will oversee the players development of all House and Travel at the 10U, 12U, and 14U Divisions
- Responsibilities
 - Design appropriate age-specific curriculum for all players that fits USA Hockey's ADM. Run or be in attendance for one House and one Travel practice each week. These will be primarily skill-based station practices. The DC will have one division-specific coaches meeting per month as well as a preseason orientation meeting. The DC will also attend home games of both House and Travel teams to:
 - Make sure the coaches are coaching games under ADM principles
 - To see how well the teams are applying what they have learned in practice. This will also give DC an opportunity to evaluate the needs of the players. The DC will communicate with the Hockey Directors (HD) on progress of players and coaches and any issues or problems that may occur. The DC will help implement the age appropriate team tactics progression.



CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-Coaches

- Superior coaching is the backbone of every successful hockey program
- Responsibilities
 - Main responsibility of all coaches is to prepare their players for the next level of competition. Important for coaches to attend all games and practices as well as attend a monthly coaches meeting. Coaches will teach within the framework of the Jr. Tigers program following their division's age-appropriate curriculum. Coaches will communicate with DC's about any specific needs of their players that they observe at practice or during games.



CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-House

- House Hockey
 - It is the mission of CSAHA's House Hockey program to provide a positive environment for players to develop the basic skills necessary to enjoy the game of hockey. The House program will offer on and off ice training with a primary focus on individual skill development and fostering a love for the game by following the USA Hockey age-specific ADM guidelines. House teams will compete solely against other CSAHA House teams unless approval is otherwise given by the CSAHA Hockey Directors.



CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-Travel

- Travel Hockey (AA, A, B, C)
- It is the mission of the CSAHA's Travel Hockey program to field teams at the A, B, and C levels that can successfully compete against competitive travel teams throughout Colorado, the United States and internationally. There is an emphasis on individual and team development in accordance with ADM age-specific guidelines as well as fostering a competitive environment to help each player reach their full potential. While all CSAHA teams compete hard to win, no single game is worth sacrificing the overall development of our players and teams. Players are expected to train on and off the fce with the purpose of achieving their maximum potential as individuals. Players in the Travel Hockey program who demonstrate the ability to play Tier 2 or Tier 1 level hockey will be encouraged to transition to the CSAHA Tier programs.

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CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-Tier 2 AA

- It is the mission of the CSAHA's Tier 2 program to field AA teams that can successfully compete against all Tier 2 teams nationwide. Tier 2 teams are the highest level of the Jr. Tiger Travel program and are National Tournament- bound teams. The highest standards of competitive excellence will be expected and maintained by all individual players in the Tier 2 program.
- CSAHA's Tier 2 Program places an emphasis on individual and team development in accordance with ADM age-specific guidelines as well as fostering a competitive environment to help each player reach their full potential. While all CSAHA teams compete hard to win, no single game is worth sacrificing the overall development of our players and teams. Players are expected to train on and off the ice with the purpose of achieving their maximum potential as individual players and teams. Players in the Tier 2 program who demonstrate the ability to play Tier 1 hockey will be encouraged to transition to CSAHA's Tier 1 program known as the Pikes Peak Miners Tier 1 AAA program as soon as possible.

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CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-Tier 1 AAA

- The Pikes Peak Miners are the Tier 1 AAA program of the Colorado Springs Amateur Hockey Association. The Miners have been the premier elite hockey program in Colorado since 1991. The Miners mission is to provide elite youth hockey players the opportunity to develop advanced hockey skills in a program that places emphasis on sportsmanship, integrity, discipline, and character.
- The Miners goals are: To run the most ethical and honest Tier 1 hockey program in North America; to prepare as many players as possible to progress and succeed at higher levels of hockey; and to create positive lifelong hockey citizens who benefit tremendously from their time in the Miners organization. The Miners success is gauged by how many players transition from the Miners program to Junior A and NCAA Division 1 college hockey.

CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-Squirt Travel

Team Breakdown:	A/B/C
Roster Size:	11-12 skaters per team, 1-2 goalies per team.
Ice Sessions:	3-4 sessions (including games) per week or approximately 95 to 105 total sessions per season. Minimum of 3:1 practice to game day ratio.
Games:	20-25 game days and a maximum of 35 games
Practices:	Four practices per month with all three teams, emphasizing individual skill development in a primarily station based or themed practice. Two weekly shared ice practices with two teams on the ice, where teams can work together and/or split the ice. Teams will continue to work on individual skills and be introduced to team concepts. Two 30-40 minute off-ice sessions per week at either the SDC or rink.



CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-Squirt House

Team Breakdown:	Evenly drafted teams based on number of players registered for the age division.
Roster Size:	Evenly drafted teams with rosters of no more than 13 skaters and 1-2 goalies per team. Teams will participate in CSAHA house league.
Ice Sessions:	2-3 sessions (including games) per week or approximately 75 total sessions per season.
Games:	15-20 CSAHA league games with potential games versus outside associations with HD approval.
Practices:	All practices will be 4-team practices emphasizing individual skill development in a primarily station based or themed practice. One 30-40 minute off-ice session per week at either the SDC or rink.

- Division Coordinator will oversee the development of both House and Travel Peewee players

Ice Sessions:	3-4 sessions (including games) per week or approximately 120 total sessions per season.
Games:	30 to 35 game days and a maximum of 40 games.

CSAHA Hockey Program Overview-Peewee House

Team Breakdown:	Evenly drafted teams based on the number of registered players in the age division.
Roster Size:	No more than 12 to 13 skaters and one or two goalies per team. Teams will participate in CSAHA house league.
Ice Sessions:	2-3 sessions (including games) per week or approximately 80 to 85 total sessions per season.
Games:	15-20 CSAHA league games with potential games versus outside associations with HD approval.
Practices:	All practices will be 4-team practices emphasizing individual skill development in a primarily station based or themed practice. One 30-40 minute off-ice session per week at either the SDC or rink.

 - Advanced skill development and situational awareness
 - Age appropriate off-ice training including classroom education
 - 15 Skaters and 2 goalies
 - 35-40 games, 90-95 practices



- Team break down:
 - Bantam B Jr. Tigers
 - Standard Track
 - Competes in CCYHL , limited in-state tournament play
 - Goal is to prepare players to advance to A/AA hockey
 - Advanced skill development and situational awareness
 - Age appropriate off-ice training and classroom education
 - Team trains and competes in Bantam House League and participates in structured team practices (on/off ice)
 - Up to 18 Skaters and 3 goalies, with floating roster for House Select players
 - 20-24 games, 90-95 practices including house practices



Team break down:

Bantam House League

- 4-6 evenly drafted teams
- Focus on skill development and situational awareness
- Employs full time skating coach for practices
- Age appropriate off-ice training and classroom education
- House League fields a Bantam House Select team that competes in 1 or 2 tournaments.
- 12-14 skaters and 1-2 goalies per team
- 20-25 league games including playoffs, 60-65 practices



CSAHA Hockey Program Overview Midget

- Team Break Down
 - Midget A Jr. Tigers
 - Provides continued player development opportunities
 - Structured on and off ice training once per week
 - Emphasis on skill training and conceptual awareness
 - Players chosen from and compete in I-25 League
 - May compete in CCYHL at newly created Midget A level
 - 10-15 games against other Colorado Midget A teams
 - Host of the President's Day Tournament
 - 25-30 players invited to practice
 - 18 players, 2 goalies for games



CSAHA Hockey Program Overview Midget

Team Break Down

- I-25 League
 - Provides structured games to supplement CHSAA high school hockey
 - League is divided into 2 sessions
 - Session A: September- November, 3 practices and 14 games
 - Session B: November-March, 4 practices and 14 games
 - Two games per week (one mid-week, one Sunday)
 - League is limited to 136 players (8 teams, 15 players 2 goalies)



CSAHA Hockey Program Overview - Girls

- Team Break Down
 - **19U A**
 - Will be a full season team that competes against other 19U A teams in Colorado
 - At least one practice per week with off-ice training opportunities.

• **14U AA/A**

- Double roster opportunity
- Skill development and conceptual awareness instruction
- At least one practice per week with off-ice training opportunities.
