2013 Men's World Championship Recap

The 2013 U.S. Men's National Team (6-1-0-3, W-OTW-OTL-L) captured the bronze medal in Stockholm, Sweden, earning Team USA's first medal since 2004. After placing third in the preliminary round, the U.S. topped Russia, 8-3, in the quarterfinals before falling to Switzerland, 3-0, in the semifinals. Team USA bounced back to defeat Finland, 3-2, in a shootout highlighted by **Alex Galchenyuk**'s heroics. Overall, captain **Paul Stastny** led the team with seven goals and 15 points. **Craig Smith** notched a team-best 10 assists and had 14 points. Goalie **John Gibson** had a 3-1-0-1 record, 1.56 GAA, .951 SV% and one shutout.

· TODAY'S GAME

The U.S. Men's National Team faces Belarus in the opening game for both teams of the 2014 International Ice Hockey Federation Men's World Championship at Minsk Arena in Minsk, Belarus.

• FAST STARTERS

Team USA has won its opening game of the Men's World Championship in each of the past three years and eight times in the last nine tournaments.

· ALL-TIME vs. BELARUS

Team USA is 4-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) against the Belarusians in the IIHF Men's World Championship. Most recently in 2012, the U.S. won 5-2 in a preliminary round game. Justin Abdelkader tallied a goal and an assist and was named Team USA's Best Player.

· CAPTAINS AMERICA

Justin Abdelkader was named captain of the 2014 U.S. National Team earlier today. Abdelkader is playing in his second Men's World Championship (2012).

Craig Smith, who is playing on his fourth straight U.S. Men's National Team, will serve as a full-time alternate captain. Colin McDonald and Tim Stapleton will split the role of Team USA's second alternate captain. McDonald will wear an 'A' when the U.S. wears white, and Stapleton will don an 'A' when the U.S. wears blue.

• 2013 RETURNEES

Jeff Petry, Craig Smith, Tim Stapleton and Jacob Trouba were members of the 2013 U.S. Men's National Team that won the bronze medal in Stockholm, Sweden, by topping Finland, 3-2, in a shootout. Smith led Team USA with 10 assists, while his 14 points were second-best on the squad. Stapleton chipped in two goals and three assists. Trouba had a goal and two helpers. Petry did not record a point.

MEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE

Nine players are IIHF Men's World Championship veterans. Of particular note are **Craig Smith**, who has played in a team-high 21 Men's World Championship games, and **Tim Thomas** who is participating in his seventh tournament. Only Eric Weinrich (9) and Mark Johnson (8) have played for more U.S. Men's National Teams than Thomas.

TRANSLATING JUNIOR SUCCESS

Eleven U.S. players have won gold medals at the IIHF World Junior Championship, while four more have earned bronze medals.

Matt Donovan, Jake Gardiner and Tyler Johnson helped the 2010 U.S. National Junior Team win gold in Saskatoon, Sask.

In 2011, **Brock Nelson** and **Drew Shore** received bronze medals in Buffalo. N.Y.

Johnny Gaudreau, Seth Jones, Jake McCabe, Connor Murphy, Vincent Trocheck and Jacob Trouba helped the 2013 U.S. National Junior win the gold medal in Ufa, Russia. Gaudreau, McCabe and Trouba were named to the media all-star team. Trouba was also named Best Defenseman by the directorate.

Justin Abdelkader and **Peter Mueller** collected a bronze medal with the 2007 U.S. National Junior Team in Leksand & Mora, Sweden.

Additionally, **Jimmy Hayes** was a member of the 2009 U.S. National Junior Team in Ottawa, Ont.

DEVELOPING CHAMPIONS

Team USA has medaled in 11 consecutive IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championships and 12 out of 13 tournaments (gold-8, silver-3, bronze-1). Seven players on the 2014 U.S. Men's National Team have contributed to that success.

Seth Jones and **Jacob Trouba** won gold in 2012.

Jake McCabe, Connor Murphy, Jones and Trouba won gold in 2011.

Drew Shore earned gold in 2009. **Jimmy Hayes** earned silver in 2007. Peter Mueller claimed gold in 2005.

All seven players were part of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program based in Ann Arbor, Mich.

CALDER TROPHY FINALIST

Tyler Johnson is one of three finalists for the NHL's Calder Memorial Trophy in 2013-14. He tallied 24 goals for the Tampa Bay Lightning, tying for most by a rookie this season. Johnson's 50 points (24-26) ranked third among first-year NHL players. He would be the first American to claim the Calder Trophy since Patrick Kane in 2007-08.

Johnson tallied a pair of goals for Team USA in its 3-1 win vs. Germany Tuesday (May 6) in pre-tournament action.

BROTHERS HAYES

Brothers Jimmy (24) and Kevin (22) Hayes are teammates for just the second time of their careers. The duo from Dorchester, Mass., played at Boston College together during the 2010-11 season. Jimmy represented Team USA at the 2007 IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championship (silver medal) and 2009 IIHF World Junior Championship, while Kevin is making is Team USA debut. Furthermore, they are cousins of former NHLers Keith Tkachuk and Tom Fitzgerald.

COVERAGE

NBC Sports Network will televise each of Team USA's games at the 2014 IIHF Men's World Championship. All seven preliminary round games will air live. Additionally, all Team USA preliminary round games will be streamed live online through NBC Sports Live Extra.

TEAM USA COACHING STAFF

Peter Laviolette is serving as head coach of the U.S. Men's National Team for the third time. Previously, he led Team USA at the 2004 and 2005 IIHF Men's World Championships, leading the team to a bronze medal in 2004.

He was the head coach of the 2006 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team in Torino, Italy. He then served as an assistant coach for the 2014 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team in Sochi, Russia.

Also, he served as an assistant coach for the United States during the 2004 World Cup of Hockey, where he helped Team USA to the semifinals.

Joe Sacco is serving as an assistant coach of the U.S. Men's National Team for the third time (2009, 2010).

In 2013, Sacco was head coach of the U.S. squad that won the bronze medal at the IIHF Men's World Championship in Stockholm, Sweden and Helsinki, Finland.

Phil Housley is serving as an assistant coach for the U.S. Men's National Team for the second year in a row and third time overall. Last year, he helped Team USA win the bronze medal in Stockholm, Sweden, and Helsinki Finland. He was also an assistant in 2011.

In 2013, Housley was head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team that won the gold medal at the IIHF World Junior Championship in Ufa, Russia.

He has been a head coach at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program since the 2011-12 season, having led the U.S. National Under-17 Team in 2011-12 and 2013-14, and the U.S. National Under-18 Team in 2012-13.

He will serve as an assistant coach for the 2015 U.S. National Junior Team.

MANAGEMENT TEAM

The 2014 U.S. Men's National Team is under the direction of the U.S. Men's National Team Advisory Group, including NHL general managers Stan Bowman (Chicago), Paul Holmgren (Philadelphia), Dean Lombardi (Los Angeles), David Poile (Nashville), Ray Shero (Pittsburgh) and Dale Tallon (Florida); Calgary Flames president of hockey operations Brian Burke; Pittsburgh Penguins pro scout Don Waddell; and Jim Johannson, USA Hockey's assistant executive director for hockey operations. Tom Kurvers,

senior advisor to the general manager of the Tampa Bay Lightning, joins the group in 2014. The U.S. Men's National Team Advisory Group was formed in February of 2007 to assist USA Hockey with the selection of players and staff of U.S. Men's National Teams, including the Olympic Team.
