## 2014 Annual General Meeting Resolutions

**Constitution**  
**14/01/01**

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the following be added under DISTRICT COUNCILS:

### DISTRICT COUNCILS

1. a) Each district shall establish a District Council to be made up of all the SHSAA High School Representatives in the district.
- b) A District Council may provide in its bylaws that other persons such as trustees, coaches, or officials may be voting members of the District Council provided:
  - i) that the appointment or election of such persons must be approved by the Member operating the high school that the persons are representing; and
  - ii) that such persons shall not vote to elect the Voting Delegates to the annual meeting.
2. a) The District Council may pass a District constitution, bylaws, elect officers, hold meetings and collect district membership fees, provided however, that the purposes, aims, and rules of such District Councils shall be compatible with the constitution, bylaws and policies of the Association.
- b) Prior to any District Council constitution, bylaws or amendments to the constitution or bylaws, taking effect, the bylaws or amendments passed by the District Council must be brought forward for approval by the Executive Council.
- c) ***In the absence of a District Bylaw or Policy to deal with a particular situation arising in a District, the current SHSAA Bylaws and Policies shall be used.***

These policy changes would require a 75% majority vote to become policy.**

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the Bylaw **GRADE 8 STUDENTS** be amended to include the following:

**Grade 8 Students**

- 2. a) In the case of a high school designated as 1A or 2A by the Association a Grade 8 student may play as a representative of the high school in the sports of basketball, volleyball, soccer and curling provided that:
  - i) the use of grade 8 students is required to establish a team, and
  - ii) the Executive Director has approved of the use of Grade 8 students, (See Form E2) and
  - iii) if approved, no more than 25% of the team consists of Grade 8 students, and
  - iv) other than being in Grade 8, each student otherwise meets all the eligibility requirements of the Association, and
  - v) **the student must be attending the school which is making the application for use of the Grade 8 student.**
  
- b) In the case of all other high schools, a Grade 8 student may play as a representative of the high school in the sports of basketball, volleyball soccer and curling provided that:
  - i) the use of Grade 8 students is required to establish a team, and
  - ii) the Executive Council of the Association has approved of the use of Grade 8 students for that school in that school year (See Form E2); and
  - iii) if approved, no more than 25% of the team consists of Grade 8 students; and
  - iv) other than being in Grade 8 each student otherwise meets all the eligibility requirements of the Association.
  - v) **the student must be attending the school which is making the application for use of the Grade 8 student.**

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the following be added to the bylaw **ELIGIBILITY TO REPRESENT SCHOOL TEAMS**:

**ELIGIBILITY TO REPRESENT SCHOOL TEAMS**

- 5. Students registered in sport specific school programs/courses or academies in Saskatchewan or any other province shall not be eligible for competition in SHSAA sanctioned events in that sport or sports (only) for that school year or in the event of a program/course or academy occurring after the season of play, the student will be ineligible to participate in that sport for the following season of play. However, these students remain eligible to represent their school in any other SHSAA sport.

**BE IT RESOLVED** that the SHSAA amend the bylaw regarding provincial competitions, effective September of the 2014-2015 school year, to read:

- 3. b) A team that withdraws from the playoffs leading to a provincial championship, including consolation playoffs, must pay the sum of \$200 to the Association as a withdrawal fee. ***Any school that is unable to travel due to School Division weather policies be exempt from the withdrawal fee. The school must communicate with the SHSAA office and the host school prior to the scheduled competition.*** Those teams that do not contact the SHSAA office or do not show up for their scheduled contests are suspended from provincial play downs the following year and are assessed a \$1000.00 fine. Offending schools would be suspended from all SHSAA competitions that school year until payment is received.

**CLASSIFIED ACTIVITIES**

Classified activities will advance teams through three levels of play to determine provincial champions. Playoffs at the conference, regional and provincial level will be organized by the SHSAA office. ***The conference boundaries for volleyball and basketball will be released by the SHSAA office six weeks prior to the date of the Conference playoffs.*** The conferences will be conducted by the school named by the District to host on their behalf (soccer, football, volleyball, curling, wrestling, badminton and basketball).

The classification of schools for winter (curling, wrestling and basketball) and spring activities (badminton and track and field) will be based on the September 30th numbers of the current school year for students in grades 10-12. Schools may apply to have students who have used up their athletic eligibility prior to entering grade 12 be excluded from the count.***

1A - 1 to 20 male students
- Girls Volleyball: 5A - 151 or more female students  
4A - 51 to 150 female students  
3A - 31 to 50 female students  
2A - 21 to 30 female students  
1A - 1 to 20 female students
- c) Boys Basketball: 5A - 251 or more male students in Regina and Saskatoon  
4A - 121 or more male students  
3A - 51 to 120 male students  
2A - 31 to 50 male students  
1A - 1 to 30 male students
- Girls Basketball: 5A - 251 or more female students in Regina and Saskatoon  
4A - 121 or more female students  
3A - 51 to 120 female students  
2A - 31 to 50 female students  
1A - 1 to 30 female students
- d) Football: 1A 6-Man: One half of all schools entered in the activity, made up of those schools having the lowest enrolments of male students. Six-man football will include schools with a maximum of 85 male students in grades 10-12.  
2A 6-Man: All other schools entered in the activity.  
2A 9-Man: One half of all schools entered in the activity, made up of those schools having the lowest enrolments of male students. For schools with a maximum of 250 male students.  
3A 9-Man: All other schools entered in the activity.  
3A 12-Man: Schools from the Moose Jaw league and those schools involved in the Regina and Saskatoon leagues with 325 or fewer male students.  
4A 12-Man: Schools involved in the Regina and Saskatoon leagues with 326 or more male students.
- e) **Boys Wrestling: 4A - 251 or more male students in grades 10-12**  
**3A - 250 or fewer male students in grades 10-12**
- Girls Wrestling: 4A - 251 or more female students in grades 10-12**  
**3A - 250 or fewer female students in grades 10-12**
- f) **Cross Country: 4A - 500 or more male and female students in grades 10-12**  
**3A - 200 to 499 male and female students in grades 10-12**  
**2A - 100 to 199 male and female students in grades 10-12**  
**1A - 1 to 99 male and female students in grades 10-12**
- g) **Track & Field: 4A - 500 or more male and female students in grades 10-12**  
**3A - 200 to 499 male and female students in grades 10-12**  
**2A - 100 to 199 male and female students in grades 10-12**  
**1A - 1 to 99 male and female students in grades 10-12**
5. Schools that only have a grade nine population eligible for high school competition will be placed in classifications according to their school's grade 9 enrolments.

  - a) Crosses the one-yard restraining zone; or
  - b) Sets up in a pass-blocking stance
 Penalty: A 15-yard unnecessary roughness penalty.
- 3) It is illegal for any player outside the 'close line play area' to block below the waist. The CLPA is defined as two yards on either side of the line of scrimmage and tackle to tackle (9-man: five offensive linemen provided these 5 are in formation taking their normal splits of 1-2 yards from their nearest inside man; 6-man: three offensive linemen with the above provision accounted for; ends in the 6-man and 9-man games are not allowed to block below the waist if they are split further than 2 yards from their nearest inside lineman).
- 4) When a player goes down with an injury where he/she is attended to by a person from the sideline, the player must remain off the field for a minimum of three plays including special team play.
- 5) For nine man and twelve man football, the clock shall stop after a first down has been gained.
- 6) ***Effective 2015, high school football teams will keep the eligible and ineligible numbering system currently in place by Football Canada.***
