



Community Makers: Duty Calls - Nov. 5 at Bruno's NFF HOSTS LUNCHEON FEATURING JOSH LINDBLOM AND BENEFITTING TIPPECANOE COUNTY CHARITIES

Four local charities will benefit from a Nov. 5 luncheon entitled "Community Makers: Duty Calls" that will be held at Bruno's Restaurant on the Levee in West Lafayette as part of the lead-in to Military Appreciation Day four days later at Ross-Ade Stadium for the Purdue - Iowa football game.

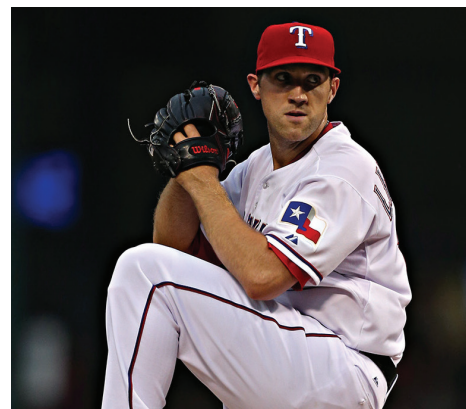
Josh Lindblom, a graduate of Harrison High School and Purdue University, will serve as guest speaker, discussing his call to community service and how he and his wife, Aurielle, have used his platform as a Major League pitcher with the Los Angeles Dodgers, Philadelphia Phillies and Texas Rangers to provide school supplies and food for needy children in Tippecanoe County.

Part of the proceeds from the luncheon will go to Food Finders of Lafayette, through the Josh Lindblom Foundation. Other programs benefitting are Honor Flight through the Lafayette Gold Star Mothers, Krannert School

of Management's EBV Program (Entrepreneurship Bootcamp for Veterans with Disabilities) and the scholarship program of the National Football Foundation's Joe Tiller Chapter.

The program will also include:

- 91-year-old Ray Miller, a World War II veteran who recently participated in an Honor Flight to Washington, D.C., to visit the new World War II Monument.
- 19-year-old Ryan Spesard, the NFF's scholarship winner as the Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the State of Indiana in 2013. (See related story below.)
- A still-to-be determined veteran with disabilities who will be taking part in the Entrepreneurship Bootcamp at Krannert that week.

Rob Hughes, the new WLFI-TV sports director, will serve as emcee for the luncheon and patriotic music will be provided by local "rising star" vocalist Carli Edging.

Tickets for the luncheon are priced at \$25 each and are available through several organizations (Food Finders, Gold Star Mothers, Krannert's EBV Program and the NFF), as well as online through Eventbrite.com. Proceeds will be divided up based on the ticket order response form and the remainder split equally

CARROLL'S SPESARD WINS STATE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

Ryan Spesard of Carroll High School has been named the National Football Foundation's State of Indiana Scholar-Athlete of the Year for 2012-13, making him the first recipient of what is hoped will become an annual award.

The announcement came in July as part of the North-South All-Star Game Banquet sponsored by the Indiana Football Coaches Association,

at Primo's South in Indianapolis where Spesard was introduced as one of five finalists for the award. Representing the NFF's Joe Tiller Chapter of Northwest Indiana and Region 4 of the IFCA, Ryan received a large football trophy and a modest scholarship check.

The decision was made by a panel of judges representing all five NFF chapters in the state. The "competition" was based 40 percent on academics, 40 percent on athletics and 20 percent on citizenship, leadership and character.

Spesard was salutatorian of his senior class with a 4.17 grade point average and scored 2,070 points on the SAT. He won 10 varsity letters at Carroll, including four as quarterback, tailback, receiver, safety and long snapper in football while serving as team captain his senior year and earning All-Hoosier Heartland Conference recognition and honorable mention all-state honors from the Associated Press. He also earned three letters each in basketball and baseball.

In addition, Spesard was a member of National Honor Society, the school's conference champion math team, the Mentor Program and was chosen as recipient of the school's highest

honor, the Carroll Honor Award. He was also a member of 4-H for 12 years and the Burlington Methodist Youth Group, took part in a Habitat for Humanity Mission Trip and served as a Kokomo Rescue Mission Volunteer. He is now in the freshmen engineering program at Purdue, plays intramural sports and is helping as an intern for the Tiller Chapter of the NFF.

The other four finalists for the award were:

- Samuel Schrader of Mishawaka H.S., representing the Moose Krause Chapter and

AWARDS FOR JOE TILLER CHAPTER OF NORTHWEST INDIANA

HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

Nominations are evaluated by the Scholar-Athlete Committee, which recommends at least one recipient per year. This recommendation must be ratified by the Board of Directors and the presentation should be made at the annual Honors Dinner. Other nominees will also be recognized at the Honors Dinner.

annual Honors Dinner in the appropriate IFCA Region. It is recommended that this award be rotated between Region 1(odd numbered years) and Region 4 (even numbered years).

Chapter Director's Report for 2013:

FOCUS IS ON SUSTAINABILITY, ATHLETES, COACHES, CHARITIES

As we enter our 10th year of existence as a chapter of the National Football Foundation, the attention of our Board of Advisors focuses on three important aspects.

The first is creating long-range stability for the chapter, both in terms of financial support and leadership. Secondly, it is important to the board to continue to honoring and recognizing scholar-athletes, former athletes and coaches. And, thirdly, the chapter will continue to support charitable causes (especially our scholarship programs) in our region, especially within Tippecanoe County, where most of the fund-raising takes place.

While our chapter's financial status remains healthy, we have seen an unfortunate and dramatic drop-off in donations, contributions, advertising sales and tickets sales for our events, resulting in a reduction of our scholarship commitment. The board wants to place an emphasis this next year (and for several years to come) on fund-raising with the goal of establishing an endowment to help assure long-term stability.

Regarding administration of the chapter, we need to identify some future leaders who are interested, willing and able to take over important roles and responsibilities. We have a terrific board and many effective committee members, but there are probably other chapter members ready to step forward. Our ninth annual NFF Honors Dinner "Celebrating Our Legends" on June 10 was a success, as it drew a crowd of 400, down from our previous four, but solid none-the-less. Also last spring, May 3 to be exact, we had 57 golfers participating in the Ryan Kerrigan/12th Boiler Golf Outing, sponsored jointly by the NFF and Purdue's Trademark Licensing Office at the Birck Boilermaker Golf Complex.

Total chapter income this year, so far, through the end of September is \$41,920, about \$22,000 off last year's total and about half of our high-water mark of three years ago.

Through our first nine years as a chapter, we have honored 217 individuals for their accomplishments, including 173 scholar-athletes who have been awarded a total of \$161,757 in scholarships for their first year of college.

Also, in this report, I want to single out the great efforts of a special member of our chapter - Jonathan Gandolf, who has been providing the production expertise for these newsletters and other publications for the Tiller Chapter for the last six years, since his freshman year at Purdue. He doesn't know I'm writing this, but I wanted our members to know that Jonathan has won a special service award from his employer, ExactTarget in Indianapolis, for his volunteer work with us. And, with that IMPACT Award comes a check for \$500 for our scholarship fund. Thank-you, Jonathan!

We greatly appreciate the continued support of ALL our members.

Region 2 (now at Butler University to play football and study business).

“On behalf of the five NFF chapters in Indiana, I want to congratulate all the scholar-athletes who were nominated and all the coaches and principals who nominated them this year as we advanced the NFF’s recognition and scholarship program to all football-playing high schools in Indiana,” said Jim Vrugink, the chapter director for the Joe Tiller Chapter of Northwest Indiana.

“We also appreciate the generosity of our primary sponsors, AdvoCare distributors Andy and Mandy Hosier of Westfield, and the cooperation of Dave Land, executive director of the IFCA, for providing the connections to the coaches and the venue for our presentation of the state award,” he added.

The National Football Foundation has 120 chapters in 47 states providing recognition and scholarship opportunities for high school football players from 4,800 schools, awarding more than \$1 millions a year in scholarships and honorariums.

Sperard was chosen as the Tiller Chapter Scholar-Athletes of the Year from a group of six high school football standouts who were singled out in May by NFF judges as the finalists from an original group of 24 scholar-athletes nominated by their coaches from throughout Region Four. The other finalists were Austin Brown of Griffith, Spenser Kersey of Lowell, Jacob Layton of Tri-County, Sam McKay of Lafayette Jefferson and Brandon Rooze of Benton Central.

They were joined by eight other individuals honored at the NFF Honors Dinner: Celebrating Our Legends” in West Lafayette for their impressive accomplishments in the last year, representing a wide range of talent and charm.

Olympic David Boudia accomplished the ultimate dream, winning an Olympic Gold Medal in platform diving last summer in London with a spectacular finish on the final day of the Olympics after earning a Bronze Medal in synchronized diving during the first week of the event. The Noblesville, Ind., product, who earned six NCAA championships and eight Big Ten championships while diving for Purdue, received the chapter’s top award, the Gold Medallion.

NFL Executive of the Year Ryan Grigson, a former Highland High School and Purdue University football player who last year became the Indianapolis Colts General Manager and transformed the Colts into a playoff team through many tough decisions and brilliant acquisitions to earn the honor of NFL Executive

The chapter’s Distinguished American Award was given to Noble Kizer, long-time Lafayette resident, chapter member and son of Noble E. Kizer, one of Purdue’s greatest coaches and early athletic directors prior to his death at age 40, nearly 73 years ago. The award recognizes both Kizers for their outstanding accomplishments and loyalty to our nation.

Also, the chapter honored Mark Ebelhar, who stepped down last fall after 27 years of volunteer work with West Lafayette Little Gridiron, including the last 15 as head of the program. He helped to coach and guide many young players who eventually went on to play high school and college football. Ebelhar received the Bernie Flowers Award for Outstanding Contribution to Amateur Football Award.

This year’s Courage Award, which is sponsored by the Lafayette Journal & Courier, had co-recipients -- seven-year-old Cooper Fulmer of Winamac and 18-year-old Patrick Mackey of Lafayette, for their inspirational battles with leukemia that tied together the athletic communities for Winamac and Lafayette Central Catholic high schools.

Also recognized was Jamie Marsh, wife of Munster High School coach Leroy Marsh, as the Arnette Tiller Service To Football Award winner, presented by the Indiana Football Coaches Association. She had been honored at the IFCA Hall of Fame Banquet in Merrillville in May.

Among the speakers and presenters on stage were Purdue’s new football coach Darrell Hazell, emeritus football coach Joe Tiller and director of the athletics Morgan Burke while Purdue President Mitch Daniels and New Orleans Saints All-Pro quarterback Drew Brees provided video presentations.
