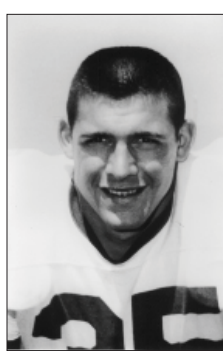
### HERRMANN, NOWATZKE PLUS 24 PREP ATHLETES TO BE HONORED MAR. 6 AT NFF BANQUET IN VALPO *Ticket Orders Due Feb. 28 for Chapter's First Event in NW Indiana*

Two of the finest football players from the northern half of Indiana over the last 50 years will be among the guest speakers Mar. 6 when the National Football Foundation Northwest Indiana Chapter stages its first Scholar-Athlete Banquet at Valparaiso University.

Tickets are now on sale and must be ordered by Feb. 28. NFF members may order tickets at a discounted price of \$35 each by phone (765-427-3303) or email (jvruggink@purdue.edu) and pay for them at the door.

Tom Nowatzke, who starred at running back for Michigan City Elston High School, Indiana University and two NFL teams in the 1960s and 70s and Mark Herrmann, who starred at quarterback for Carmel High School, Purdue University and four different NFL teams in the 70s, 80s and 90s, will be available to sign autographs and meet the public during a silent auction reception prior to the banquet. Each will speak at the banquet.

Nowatzke, who ran for 1,500 yards and scored 136 points at Indiana, earning first team All-America status in 1964, is nearing his final year on the ballot as a candidate for the College Football Hall of Fame.

Herrmann, who set an NCAA record with 9,946 career yards and 71 touchdown passes, earning All-America status in 1980, was voted into the Hall of Fame last year and will be enshrined into the CFHOF in South Bend next July.

After football, Nowatzke built a successful career in the trucking business in the Ann Arbor/Detroit area of Michigan while Herrmann has been a program

director for the NCAA and now works with Peyton Manning's Project 18 for St. Vincent's Hospital in Indianapolis.

"We are pleased that Tom Nowatzke and Mark Herrmann will be able to join us for the inaugural event for our chapter in this part of the region," says chapter president Bart Burrell of West Lafayette. "They are two of the greatest players ever in the state of Indiana, one a Hall of Famer and the other on the verge of getting elected to the Hall of Fame. We hope this event will help garner support for Tom in the Hall of Fame selection process, which concludes for 2011 at the end of March."

Besides Nowatzke and Herrmann, the NFF has invited the college head coaches of Valparaiso (Dale Carlson), Purdue (Danny Hope), Notre Dame (Brian Kelly), Ball State (Pete Lembo), Indiana State (Trent Miles) and Indiana (Kevin Wilson) to attend the banquet.

(As of Feb. 14, Carlson and Hope will attend.)

The Mar. 6 Sunday afternoon event will be held at the beautiful new Harre Union in the center of Valpo's campus during spring break. The banquet will honor 24 high school seniors from throughout Northwest Indiana.

The scholar-athletes come from 24 different schools in the 18-county area that stretches from Lafayette and Kokomo to Michigan City and Gary. All are high school seniors who are headed to college next fall. Academically, five of them are ranked No. 1 in their graduating classes. One will be chosen later this spring as the Scholar-Athlete of the Year for Northwest Indiana. The award is based 40 percent on academics, 40 percent on athletics and 20 percent on citizenship, leadership and character.

General public tickets are available for \$40 each through committee members in the northern part of the state -- John Friend (phone: 219-923-8397), David Schutkovske (219-762-7724, ext. 2101) or Bob Ferguson (219-464-9134).

The chapter typically plans several annual events in the area -- capped off by its marquee event, the Honors Dinner "Celebrating Our Legends" in June. Drew Brees, one of Head Coach Joe Tiller's first recruits

### DANIEL WODICKA HONORED IN NEW YORK AS MIDWEST SCHOLAR-ATHLETE OF 2010

Daniel Wodicka, a May graduate and former football star at West Lafayette High School, was named last fall as one of five regional Scholar-Athletes of the Year by the National Football Foundation and was honored in New York City on Dec. 7 at the organization's annual chapter awards luncheon at the Waldorf-Astoria. He represents the Midwest.

Wodicka, now a freshman receiver at Johns Hopkins University, was chosen by a nation-wide panel of NFF administrators for the successes he enjoyed during his senior year at WLHS. This is the same award that was won by Matt Lancaster, 2009 WLHS grad, a year ago. It is the first time ever that this NFF award has been given in back-to-back years to athletes from the same high school.

Wodicka was selected from 400,000 high school football players covered by the NFF Chapter Network, which solicits nominations from 4,800 high schools in 47 states each year. Daniel was chosen as the Joe Tiller Chapter of Scholar-Athlete of the Year last spring from a field of 27 area nominees. Criteria is based 40 percent on athletic achievements, 40 percent on academic accomplishments and 20 percent on community service.

Throughout his high school career, Wodicka es-

tablished himself as a truly versatile student-athlete, matching his stellar athletic accomplishments with an impeccable record in the classroom and as a leader in the West Lafayette community.

Daniel earned the state's Mr. Football honors as a senior in 2009, and he was selected as the Most Valuable Player of the Indiana North-South All-Star Game last summer. In his four-year prep career, he garnered four football letters, playing quarterback, defensive back, wide receiver and running back. After collecting all-state honors at wide receiver as a junior, Wodicka moved to quarterback his senior season and again garnered all-state honors while leading West Lafayette to an undefeated state championship season in Class 3A. He was named as one of the state of Indiana's top 50 players by the Indiana Football Coaches Association.

In all, Wodicka caught 109 passes for 1,617 yards and 17 touchdowns; rushed for 2,011 yards and 34 scores on 249 carries; and completed 180 of 328 passes for 2,531 yards with 28 touchdowns against just six interceptions. In addition, he returned 35 punts for 436 yards and a touchdown; returned 17 kicks for 352 yards; and collected nearly 200 tackles, 12 interceptions, 26 pass breakups and five fumble recoveries.

### CHAPTER CREATES NEW EVENTS FOR 2011

#### Scholar-Athlete Banquet & 'Bowling with the Stars' enhance NFF Slate, Targeting New Fund-Raising Goals

Feeding off a very successful year in 2010, the National Football Foundation's Joe Tiller Chapter of Northwest Indiana has set some lofty goals for 2011.

After raising more than \$50,000 for scholarships and other charities last year, the chapter's board of directors has set a goal of raising \$60,000 to help others this year.

Part of the plan includes staging at least two new events, the Scholar-Athlete Banquet on Mar. 6 at the Harre Union at Valparaiso University and our charity fund-raiser, "Bowling with the Stars," on Apr. 30 at Arrowhead Lanes in Lafayette.

Also on the calendar is the third annual NFF 12th Boiler Golf Outing on May 4 at the Birk Boilermaker Golf Complex in West Lafayette and the highly-anticipated seventh annual NFF Honors Dinner "Celebrating Our Legends," featuring Drew Brees again on June 16 at Purdue University's Memorial Union. A possible concert is in the planning stages for late summer or early fall.

"While our scholarship goal of \$30,000 remains the same as last year," says Executive Director Jim Vrugink, "our board has approved a plan to hopefully contribute \$15,000 each to the PALS (Purdue Athletes for Lifetime Skills) Program in Tippecanoe County and the John Purdue Club's 12th Boiler Fund, which endows a football scholarship at Purdue.

"The commitment of Drew Brees, through his Brees Dream Foundation, and other former Purdue players and coaches has led us to form a plan to dedicate funds this year to the PALS and 12th Boiler Funds, in addition to our chapter's continuing scholarship program," adds Vrugink. "This allows us to provide financial assistance for young people on all levels in our region - grade school, high school and college. As the chapter grows and as we experience fund-raising success in the Lake Michigan District of the chapter, we hope to add commitments to programs in that area as well."

In addition to the Scholar-Athlete Banquet and the Honors Dinner, the chapter is focusing on putting together very successful charity bowling and

golf events in late April and early May.

With the help of our event co-sponsors, Purdue's Delta Delta Chapter of Sigma Chi Fraternity and the John Purdue Club's 12th Boiler Program, respectively, the "Bowling with the Stars" project has the potential of raising nearly \$15,000 and the "12th Boiler Golf Outing could raise about \$6,000, if both events sell out. Purdue and area "celebrities" will be involved with both events. Chapter members are encouraged to participate as sponsors, players or spectators.

A Charity Concert, featuring country singer Levi Riggs along with other area artists, is being discussed, possibly as an outdoor event in the Lafayette area later this year. Last March, Riggs staged a charity concert, raising \$6,000, at the West Lafayette High School Auditorium. It was co-hosted by the NFF and Purdue's Gimlet Leadership Honorary. Riggs, a former high school quarterback himself, featured a football theme in his fall 2010 hit, "Tailgate Time." He performed with his band at Leigh Steinberg's 25th Annual Super Bowl Party at Eddie Deen's Ranch in Dallas on Super Bowl weekend.

"As the chapter continues to grow and takes on additional financial commitments, it is important for us to diversify our fund-raising efforts," says Vrugink. "Even with 300-plus members in the chapter, we can't expect the same sponsors and supporters to step up every time we ask for contributions. By planning a variety of events and activities, hopefully we can appeal to more and more people to help provide funding and support for our designated charities, while also providing entertaining opportunities.

"All of our good causes, the PALS Program, the 12th Boiler Fund and our own NFF Scholarship Fund, are now recognizable and have good traction in the area, especially in the Lafayette community. A goal is to eventually develop similar events, activities and opportunities in the northern part of the region to benefit good causes there," adds Vrugink. "We've come along way, but there's still much more to be accomplished."

The board has also voted to provide recognition of the Tippecanoe Football Camp in hopes that it's organizers, Chris and Clay Oppy of Lafayette, will share their plan called "Dream Season" with high school football programs in other communities to develop similar camps for disabled and physically-challenged children.

Tippecanoe Football Camp earned the IHSAA Blue Horseshoe Award from the Indianapolis Colts in January. Our recognition allows the Oppys to come under our umbrella of a 501 3-C foundation in their attempts to apply for funding from organizations like Peyton Manning's PeyBack Foundation in Indianapolis in order to further advance their plans for "Dream Season." There is no financial commitment at this time from the NFF or from our chapter for this program.

With a 3.98 GPA on a four-point scale, Wodicka was valedictorian of his high school class of 165. He was one of five players to earn an Indiana Football Hall of Fame scholarship and was the state’s Class 3A Phil N. Eskew Mental Attitude Award recipient.

“What you see is the honest reflection of Daniel,” said West Lafayette head coach Marshall Overley. “He is positive and joyful whether he was competing for a state championship, working with elementary players in the summer, competing on the practice field or spending time with Larry, a friend with Down’s Syndrome. Humility, joy in competition, stability in times of challenge concern for others and just delighting in life are hallmarks of this young man and his family.

“Last fall Daniel was in the rotation at a slot position at Johns Hopkins, where he is working on a degree in biomedical engineering. If anyone can succeed and enjoy the ride, Daniel can,” added Overley.

Outside the gridiron, Wodicka and his friend Larry earned Indiana’s “Best Buddy Pair of the Year.” He played cello in the school orchestra; mentored elementary school football players and visited residents of a local nursing home. He also started at point guard for three years on the West Lafayette basketball team and was a four-year starter in baseball.

chapter recognizes individuals from the region with its Distinguished American Award, the Outstanding Contribution to Amateur Football Award, the Drew Brees Mental Toughness Award, and the Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award. The chapter also awards its Gold Medallion on special occasions. As a non-profit organization, this chapter has awarded more than \$112,000 in grants, scholarships and honorariums since receiving its charter in the fall of 2004.

The chapter offers scholarship opportunities for scholar athletes at 73 high schools in 18 Northwest Indiana counties (Benton, Carroll, Cass, Clinton, Fountain, Fulton, Howard, Jasper, Lake, LaPorte, Miami, Newton, Porter, Pulaski, Starke, Tippecanoe, Warren and White). In addition to seeking donations and sponsorships to support the scholarship program, the chapter also receives money (\$500 for every 50 dues-paying members in the local chapter) from the national office in Irving, Tex. In its first six years, this chapter has recognized 98 scholar athletes and awarded them between \$250 and \$5,000 each.

The 24 high school football players, nominated this year by their coaches and principals for the Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award, are: Austin Atherton (Crown Point), Jonathan Bush (Carroll), Keisten

Childers (Knox), Cody Christopher (Lafayette Central Catholic), Arion Clanton (East Chicago Central), Austin Colby (Kokomo), Jesse Dority (Clinton Prairie), Daniel Falloon (Munster), Sam Ficken (Valparaiso), Tyler Hanson (River Forest), Brant Hartman (Caston), Alex Hegg (Seeger), Tanner Hess (Logansport), Garrett Howe (Twin Lakes), Justin Hunt (Maconaquah), Derek Mumaw (Northwestern), Spencer Murphy (North Miami), Alex Niccum (McCutcheon), Kyle Patton (West Lafayette), Kramer Phalen (Lake Central), Tanner Pierce (Fountain Central), Joel Ripke (Lafayette Jefferson), Dustin Rivich (Michigan City) and Alec Stuard (Frankfort).

Six of these young men will be singled out by judges and announced Mar. 6 as finalists for the Scholar Athlete of the Year Award. The winner will be announced at the NFF Honors Dinner in West Lafayette on June 16.

In addition to the scholarships, the local chapter is involved with youth football programs such as the Tippecanoe Football Camp (providing experiences for kids with disabilities) and the Lafayette 56ers, Attica Youth Football, Little Gridiron, and West Side Flag Football, providing opportunities for elementary school-aged players in the area. The chapter helped secure grants from the National Football League to assist programs in Attica and Rossville.
