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Michigan Residency Requirements

Recently there have been questions regarding the rule II. J. "A player is a resident of the district in which he/she resides." The question has been what acceptable proof of residency is. We have had some issues in the past with the validity of some of the evidence that has been offered by those wishing to establish residency. Up until now we have not had an approved list of documents that a family must provide to prove residency. Rather than invent our own list, we have chosen to provide several options that the State of Michigan uses to verify Michigan residency. These requirements will go into effect immediately and will be used for any new participants wishing to establish residency or any participants that are still in the process of providing proof of residency.

Proof of Michigan residency

Present at least **TWO** documents with your name and Michigan residence address on them (Michigan P.O. Boxes are not acceptable residence addresses)

- Valid permanent Michigan Drivers License
- Utility bill or credit card bill issued within the last 90 days
- Account statement from a bank or other financial institution issued within the last 90 days
- Life, health or auto insurance policy
- Federal, state or local government documents such as receipts, licenses or assessments
- Michigan Title and Registration (must show current address)

We hope this will add credibility and help standardize the process of establish residency.
