Dear WRWBL:

After 11 years the WRWBL has grown into a strong and vibrant league. Without question we had our most competitive on-the-field season ever with 10 teams posting 10 or more victories. In addition to the strong on-the-field play, the league has enjoyed a continued cooperative relationship with our umpiring union, field administrators and the local media. In short, the WRWBL is in the strongest position it has ever been.

It is with that knowledge and comfort that I have decided to step-down as commissioner of the league. I was fortunate enough to be selected as the incoming commissioner of the WRWBL in 2000, as it switched from an aluminum bat to wood bat endeavor. For seven years, I have had the profound pleasure of interacting with many of you. Admittedly, we've had our ups and downs together, but my experience has been life enriching and I will always cherish my tenure running the best wood bat league in the country.

My reasons for stepping down are two-fold. First, is my recent involvement with the Miracle League – an organization that brings baseball to disabled children. I have been named as the Executive Director of the Miracle League of Westchester chapter and will be running the new \$600,000 specialized facility slated to open at Ridge Road Park in Hartsdale in September. Given the enormous responsibilities associated with this new challenge, I simply cannot do both jobs effectively. My second reason ties to the first. I believe the WRWBL needs committed leadership focused on its future. After seven seasons a new voice is needed at the top.

Unfortunately, I could not be in attendance today as a family commitment posed a conflict I could not avoid. However, I still plan to remain engaged with the league during a transition period over the winter. My hope is to keep my status as a trustee of the league and assist with the selection of a new commissioner while ensuring all items pertaining to the 2006 season are tied down in an appropriate fashion.

Once again, it has been a wild ride – one which I have enjoyed every step of the way. Thank you for allowing me the honor of facilitating this wonderful league. I am confident the future remains very bright and of course I will always be watching from afar.

League MVP

Lou Gigante – Yonkers Indians – First Base -- Gigante was the clear-cut winner of the 2006 MVP award receiving nine of ten first place votes on the ballots cast by the WRWBL selection committee. He was an easy choice given his impressive numbers. Lou led the league or was among the league's best in most major offensive categories. He led the WRWBL in batting (.451), hits (37) and doubles (11). He was also second in RBIs (31), sixth in on-base percentage (.505) and finished the year with a .992 fielding percentage among the best at his position.

Cy Young Winner

Greg Palanzo – Danbury Barons – With his selection as the 2006 Cy Young winner Palanzo becomes the first two-time winner of the award having been chosen in 2002. After two seasons in the Italian Professional League Palanzo returned to the WRWBL to post a 5-0 record and 0.54 ERA in nine appearances. The 0.54 ERA is a new league record amassed after allowing a mind boggling three earned runs in 50 innings pitched. Greg led the league in ERA (0.54), WHIP (0.90) and was third in strikeouts (42). Over his two Cy Young seasons he is a perfect 13-0 with a 0.88 ERA.

Co-Rookie of the Year

Chris Alleva – Yonkers Indians – Second Base – The slick fielding two-bagger shares this year's rookie of the year award with the Brooklyn Falcons' Jorge Rosado. In 26 games Alleva hit .352 with 25 hits including four doubles a triple and 13 runs scored. In the field he compiled a .921 fielding percentage turning 11 double plays.

Jorge Rosado – Brooklyn Falcons – Shortstop – Like his co-winner Alleva, Rosado was a smooth and poised first year player for the Falcons. Rosado hit .407 with 22 hits including four doubles, 11 RBIs, 16 runs scored and 22 stolen bases. In the field he compiled a .986 fielding percentage turning three double plays.

Comeback Player of the Year

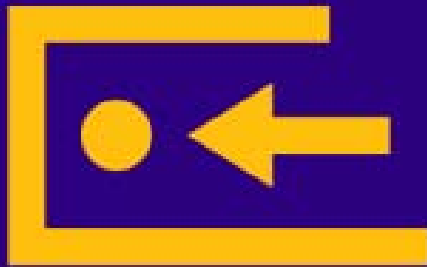
Marc Casey – Yonkers Indians – Pitcher – With the exception of three innings early in the season Marc Casey missed the entire 2005 campaign due to arm problems. In 2006 the starter bounced back and carried the Indians staff. Casey finished the year 7-2 with a 2.08 ERA and one save. He led the WRWBL in wins, was among the league's leaders in ERA and had one of the strongest turnaround years in recent memory.

Manager of the Year

Kevin Grimley – Bronx Royals – Grimley's Royals posted a remarkable improvement over their 2005 campaign in which they finished dead last at 3-24. In one off-season Grimley remade the roster and the high-energy Royals went to 12-14, qualified for the playoffs in just their second season and took the higher seeded and more veteran Fordham Red Sox to three games before bowing out of the playoffs. His teams were always prepared and the result was a 400% improvement in wins this year and a nucleus of players that should only improve in 2007.

Sportsman of the Year

Scott D'Ottavio – North Castle Lookouts – Shortstop – D'Ottavio has played in the WRWBL for nine seasons, eight with the Lookouts. During that time he has embodied everything our league aspires for. He is a committed, hard working, respectful person who plays the game with a sincerity and understanding that we're all amateurs who have to go to work the next day. He is well known around the league as a voice of reason and a person who always respects his teammates, his opponents and our officials.

2006 Hall of Fame Inductees

Bobby Accardi, Outfielder – Tarrytown Lookouts (1999-2004) – For six seasons Accardi was one of the Lookouts core players and one of manager Chris Jones's first three signings. In the team's early years, he helped to establish the club locally and nationally. In his six seasons, Accardi led the team to the playoffs every year including a run of three consecutive championship appearances and one league title in 2002. Accardi was a rare blend of speed, smarts and ability. However, it was the intangible leadership qualities he possessed that lifted the play of his teammates and coaches to succeed at a higher level. Usually batting near the top or at the top of the order he affected the way other teams pitched and played defense. Several times teams expressed how they had to 'game plan' to stop him – like a football player. Accardi is the only player in the league's 11-year history to win the WRWBL MVP award twice -- doing so in 2001 and 2004. In 2001 he set the original record for most steals in a season swiping 32 bags in 26 games while hitting .452 and leading the Lookouts to a championship appearance. In 2004 he again was named MVP after hitting .494 one of the highest averages ever recorded during our wood bat years. Accardi was a five-time all-star, won four gold gloves for his play in centerfield and is currently the WRWBL's all-time stolen bases leader with 132. His career numbers:

Rick Damo – Northern Highlanders (1996-2000) Tarrytown Lookouts (2001-2004) – For eight seasons Rick Damo was one of the WRWBL's brightest stars originally with the Northern Highlanders a team he founded in 1996 and then later with the Tarrytown Lookouts. Teams Damo played for reached the playoffs seven of the eight years he competed. He was a pitcher's best friend, a cerebral catcher who painstakingly took the time to learn many of the hitter's tendencies. At the plate, he was a gap power hitter and an on-base machine. He always worked the count rarely giving in to the pitcher or giving away an at-bat. Damo was the 1999 WRWBL MVP when he hit .529 – the fourth highest batting average on record in league history. He was a 4-time all-star and won a league championship with the Lookouts in 2002. Off the field, Rick played a vital role in the league's success as he sat on the first board of directors in 1998. For several years he was also responsible for catering the early all-star games back in the late 90s. On and off the field Rick was dedicated to his team, teammates and the league playing at a high level for all eight seasons. His career numbers:

Bobby Stowers – Catcher – Pleasantville Red Sox (1996-2004) – Bob Stowers was one of the best catchers in the WRWBL for many years and has set the standard for future catchers looking to reach our Hall of Fame. A hard nosed, no-nonsense guy, Stowers was a major driver of the Red Sox dominance during the late 90s. At the plate, he was a power hitting catcher who merged a rare combination of solid defense and big-time offense. His strong arm would have earned him several gold gloves if the award was available when he played. He often did not receive the same fanfare that his teammates received but there was a reason they had him hit behind them in the order. He was an RBI machine. What made Bobby more special was his versatility. As a pitcher, he was equally as valuable, serving as the Red Sox closer, spot starter and middle reliever. Like his fellow inductees, whatever the team needed Bobby did. Bobby epitomized what a great teammate was. Stowers was a 4-time league all-star, the 1999 playoff MVP and a 2-time WRWBL champion (1999 & 2000) His career numbers speak for themselves:
