THINGS TO KNOW

Today marks Day 19 of the journey of the U.S. National Junior Team that began with a team meeting in Boston the night of Dec. 15 ... Team USA's **Noah Hanifin** and Team Canada's Connor McDavid skated together at a camp in Toronto in late July and keep in regular contact. The two first met at a Boston Bruins game ... Three players have points in three of the four games in the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship, including **Dylan Larkin**, **Sonny Milano** and **Jack Eichel**. Larkin and Milano enter today having at least one point in each of the last three games ... Team USA dined at Baton Rouge last night ... The U.S. had a tour of the Montreal Canadiens dressing room yesterday.

TODAY'S GAME

The United States faces Russia today at Bell Centre (capacity: 21,287) in the quarterfinals of the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship. The game will be broadcast live in the U.S. on NHL Network and streamed live on NHL.com. The U.S. and Russia last met in the World Juniors a year ago, with Russia coming away with a 5-3 win in the quarterfinals in Malmo, Sweden.

PREVIOUS QUARTERFINAL GAMES -- The playoff format was adopted for the IIHF World Junior Championship beginning in 1996. The U.S. has qualified for the playoffs 18 out of 20 years, including 15 of the last 16 tournaments. From 1977-95, teams played each other once in a round robin format and medals were awarded based on final standings. Team USA is 7-6-0 in 13 previous quarterfinal games in the World Junior Championship. Below is a look at those contests.

THE SERIES VS. RUSSIA

The U.S. is 5-0-0-10-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) all-time against Russia in the IIHF World Junior Championship. Russia has won the last three games between the two teams, including a 5-3 win in the quarterfinals a year ago. The last U.S. win was by a 3-2 count in the preliminary round in 2007. Team USA is looking for its first win over Russia today in a non round-robin or preliminary round game. See series breakdown later in these notes.

IN GOAL TODAY

Thatcher Demko, who was the U.S. Player of the Game vs. Canada on Wednesday (Dec. 31) with 40 saves, will get the start in goal today. He will start for the third straight game and is playing in his fourth game overall in the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship. Demko is third in the World Juniors with a 1.31 goals against average and .955 save percentage. The San Diego, California, native currently plays at Boston College and is property of the NHL's Vancouver Canucks (2014, 2nd round (36)). Demko has a tribute to U.S. gold medal goal-tenders **Jack McCartan** (1960 U.S. Olympic Team) and **Jim Craig** (1980 U.S. Olympic Team) on the back of his mask. **Brandon Halverson**, who stopped all 14 shots in a 6-0 win over Germany on Dec. 28, will serve as the back-up.

BITS AND PIECES

The U.S. is playing its fourth afternoon contest of the 2015 IIHF World Junior Championship here today. It is 2-1 in the first three afternoon tilts ... Team USA is the home team today and will wear its blue jerseys. The U.S. has won its only game of the tournament in blue jerseys, that by a 2-1 count in a shootout over Finland on Dec. 26 to open play in the event ... **Dylan Larkin** leads the tournament in goals with five; is tied for second in points with seven; and tied for third in plus/minus at +7 ... **Anthony DeAngelo** enters play today tied for seventh in scoring among defensemen (1-1--2), while **Noah Hanifin** is tied for ninth (0-2--2) ... The U.S. is 3-1 in four previous quarter-final games played in Canada in the IIHF World Junior Championship ... For a piece on worldjuniors.usahockey.com, **Jack Eichel** interviewed teammates **Thatcher Demko**, **Miles Wood** and **Nick Schmaltz** to get their thoughts on the Montreal Canadiens dressing room yesterday following the team's tour of the room ... USA Hockey will host the 2015 IIHF U18 Women's World Championship at HARBORCENTER in Buffalo, New York, beginning Jan. 5. The event culminates with the medal games on Jan. 12 ... **Mike Sullivan**, advance scout for Team USA, arrived in Montreal yesterday morning and will be with the team through the remainder of the tournament ... **Ray Shero**, part of the player evaluation staff for the 2015 U.S. National Junior Team, is here in Montreal with Team USA. He arrived on Dec. 29.

THINGS

The U.S. has two shutouts to its credit to date in the tournament. Team USA has also had two shutouts in three previous tournaments (2013, 2004, 1997). The U.S. has never had three shutouts in a single tournament ... **Jack Eichel** and **Auston Matthews** are roommates here in Montreal ... Fourteen of the 20 U.S. forwards/defensemen have recorded at least one point through the first four games of the tournament.

LEADERSHIP TEAM

Jack Eichel is serving as captain of Team USA and is the youngest captain of a U.S. National Junior Team since Bryan Berard (3/5/77) in 1996. **Will Butcher** and **John Hayden** are the alternate captains. A year ago, Eichel helped Team USA capture the gold medal at the 2014 IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championship in Lappeenranta, Finland. He contributed five goals and five assists. Butcher and Hayden were teammates on the U.S. squad that earned the silver medal at the 2013 IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championship in Sochi, Russia.

SUCCESS AT U18 WORLDS

The United States has medaled in each of the last 10 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championships (7 gold, 2 silver, 1 bronze). Team USA has reached the gold medal game in six consecutive tournaments, claiming gold five times.

Seven players on the 2015 U.S. National Junior Team helped Team USA to the gold medal at the 2014 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship, including **Ryan Collins**, **Jack Eichel**, **Dylan Larkin**, **Auston Matthews**, **Sonny Milano**, **Alex Nedeljkovic** and **Alex Tuch**.

Eight players were silver medalists at the 2013 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship, including **Will Butcher**, **JT Compher**, **Thatcher Demko**, **Jack Eichel**, **Hudson Fasching**, **John Hayden**, **Anthony Louis** and **Tyler Motte**.

Additionally, **Will Butcher** and **JT Compher** were members of the U.S. team that won gold at the 2012 IIHF Under-18 Men's World Championship.

PRE-TOURNAMENT RECAP

The United States began a journey with 30 players vying for a spot on the 2015 U.S. National Junior Team the night of Dec. 15 at the Royal Sonesta Hotel in the Boston area with a team meeting. The U.S. had a camp at Boston University from Dec. 16-19 that culminated with a 5-2 victory over BU in a pre-tournament game at Walter Brown Arena on Dec. 19. The team had a dinner at Fenway Park the night of Dec. 18 at which **Mike Eruzione**, captain of the gold medal-winning 1980 U.S. Olympic Team, spoke to the group. The U.S. then moved to Kingston, Ontario, on Dec. 20 where it continued preparation for the IIHF World Junior Championship through noon on Dec. 24. The time in Kingston included pre-tournament games against Germany on Dec. 21 (5-2 win) and Sweden on Dec. 23 (10-5 win). Team USA arrived in Montreal the afternoon of Dec. 24.

HEAD COACH MARK OSIECKI



Mark Osiecki is serving as head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team for the first time.

A three-time assistant coach for the U.S. National Junior Team, Osiecki helped Team USA capture gold medals in 2010 and 2013, plus a bronze medal in 2011.

Osiecki has had a variety of U.S. coaching positions. In 2000, he was head coach of the U.S. Under-18 Select Team that placed second at the Ivan Hlinka Memorial Tournament. He led the U.S. Junior Select Team to a first-place finish at the 1999 Freedom Challenge. He was an assistant coach for the 1999 U.S. Under-18 Select Team that finished second at the Ivan Hlinka Tournament. Osiecki also served as video coordinator for the 2006 U.S. Men's National Team at the IIHF Men's World Championship.

Currently, Osiecki is in his second season as an associate coach for the American Hockey League's Rockford IceHogs.

From 2010-13, Osiecki was head coach of the Ohio State University men's ice hockey team. He served as an assistant coach for the University of Wisconsin men's ice hockey team from 2004-10, helping the Badgers to the 2006 NCAA national title and the 2010 NCAA national championship game.

From 1997-2004, Osiecki was the general manager and head coach of the United States Hockey League's Green Bay Gamblers. The Gamblers won four straight division titles (1999-2002) and captured the Clark Cup in 2000. Osiecki was named the USHL Coach of the Year in 1999.

The former University of Wisconsin defenseman (1987-90) served as an alternate captain for the 1990 NCAA national championship team. He played two seasons in the National Hockey League (1991-1993) with the Calgary Flames, Ottawa Senators, Winnipeg Jets and the Minnesota North Stars. He also competed for the U.S. at the 1992 IIHF Men's World Championship in Prague.

The 2015 U.S. National Junior Team has 12 "under-agers" including nine players born in 1996 (Brandon Carlo, Ryan Collins, Jack Eichel, Brandon Halverson, Dylan Larkin, Sonny Milano, Alex Nedeljkovic, Nick Schmaltz, Alex Tuch) and three in 1997 (Noah Hanifin, Auston Matthews, Zach Werenski).

FAMILY TIES

A number of U.S. players have family roots in college and/or professional hockey.

- **Will Butcher's** dad, Joe, skated for the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point.
- **Ryan Collins'** dad, Dan, played for Connecticut College. Ryan's uncle, Jim Warner, played at Colorado College and in the NHL.
- **Tyler Motte's** brother, C.J., skated for Ferris State University.
- **Nick Schmaltz's** brother, Jordan, also plays at the University of North Dakota and was drafted by the St. Louis Blues in 2012.
- **Miles Wood's** father, Randy, played 12 seasons in the NHL, while Miles' uncle skated at Boston University.

CONNECTIVITY OF TEAM USA COACHING STAFF

Check out the story of the connectivity of the 2015 U.S. National Junior Team coaching staff at worldjuniors.usahockey.com. Head Coach **Mark Osiecki** and Assistant Coach **Don Granato** played together for Burnsville (Minn.) High School beginning at age 13 where the pair helped the Braves to a Minnesota State High School League hockey championship; went on to play junior hockey together for the Madison Capitols; and helped the University of Wisconsin win the NCAA men's ice hockey national championship in 1990.

BANTAM TEAMMATES

The 2015 U.S. National Junior Team includes three players that were teammates on the Westchester Express Bantam team in Brewster, New York, during the 2007-08 season. The group includes **John Hayden**, **Anthony DeAngelo** and **Sonny Milano**. In addition, **Steven Santini**, who likely would have made the U.S. National Junior Team this year had he been healthy, also played on that squad. Santini's father, who owns the Brewster Ice Arena (which he built in 1998), coached the squad to a third-place finish at the USA Hockey National Championships that year.

SLED HOCKEY WORLDS

From April 24-May 2, 2015, HARBORCENTER in Buffalo, New York, will play host to the top sled hockey players in the world at the 2015 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship. Team USA, which has won the gold medal on two occasions (2009, 2012), has hosted the event twice previously (2000, 2008).

BOB SUTER A MENTOR

U.S. defenseman **Will Butcher** had Bob Suter from the 1980 U.S. Olympic "Miracle on Ice" Team as a mentor growing up in Wisconsin. Butcher played in the Madison Capitols organization at the rink Suter owned in Middleton, Wisconsin, just outside Madison, from the third grade until he went to USA Hockey's National Team Development Program in 2011. Butcher's father, Joe, who coached him growing up, was good friends with Suter and Will had regular interaction with Bob Suter and the entire Suter family. Butcher's brother, Mike, is currently member of the Madison Capitols U16 Midget Minor Team coached by Bob's son Garrett. Bob Suter passed away unexpectedly this past September 9 at the age of 57. Suter lived by the motto, "It's all about the kids."

WINNING A BYLSMA STICK

U.S. forward **Chase De Leo** won the stick of Dan Bylsma in a raffle when he was playing for his first-ever hockey team -- the Norwalk Knights in Norwalk, California. De Leo grew up attending Anaheim Ducks game, where Bylsma played from 2000-04. The stick still hangs in De Leo's bedroom today. Hancock is a risk manager for Mercedes Benz in Toronto. The duo has been instrumental in helping the U.S. have a seamless experience to date at the IIHF World Junior Championship. Both have been embedded with Team USA since its arrival for pre-tournament competition in Kingston, Ontario, on Dec. 20 and will be with the team through the end of the tournament ... Team USA's average age is 18 years, 10 months. Last year's team was, on average, 19 years, 3 months old ... HAP on the masks of goaltenders **Alex Nedeljkovic** and **Brandon Halverson** stands for Have A Purpose ... **Alex Tuch** and **Ian McCoshen** are roommates at Boston College, while **Dylan Larkin** and **Zach Wer-**

enski are roommates at the University of Michigan ... Members of Team USA give **Dylan Larkin** the nod as the best sewer ball player in the group ... Head Coach **Mark Osiecki's** wife Robin and daughter Emily (17) and son Jake (14) were here in Montreal through Dec. 31. Osiecki's father, Tom, was also here. Tom spent more than 40 years coaching hockey at various levels in the state of Minnesota, including 24 seasons as the head coach of Burnsville High School, where he led the team to two state titles ...
