TONIGHT'S GAME

The 2015 U.S. National Sled Hockey Team faces Russia tonight at Leduc Recreation Centre in the championship game of the 2015 World Sled Hockey Challenge. This is the second consecutive international tournament in which the United States and Russia will face off in the championship game. Team USA defeated Russia, 1-0, in the gold medal game of the 2014 Paralympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia. The game will be televised in Canada on TSN and streamed live on FASTHockey.com.

USA VS. RUSSIA

-The United States and Russia opened the 2015 World Sled Hockey Challenge against one another, with the U.S. winning, 3-2, thanks to **Declan Farmer**'s goal with 1:45 left in the game.

- Team USA has won five of the last six meetings between Team USA enters the championship game having the two teams, with USA outscoring Russia 13-7 over that span. Russia is the last team to defeat the United States when it came away with a 2-1 victory in preliminary round action at the Sochi 2014 Paralympic Winter Games.

LAST GAME: USA 8, KOREA 0

Dan McCoy had five points, Adam Page and Josh Misiewicz each scored two power play goals, and Steve MAKING AN IMPACT Cash recorded his second consecutive shutout as Team USA defeated Korea, 8-0, in semifinal play of the 2015 World Sled Hockey Challenge. Declan Farmer, Nikko **Landeros** and **Kevin McKee** also scored in the victory. Misiewicz was named U.S. Player of the Game.

FOURTH STRAIGHT WSHC CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

USA advanced to the World Sled Hockey Challenge championship game for the fourth consecutive time with its semifinal victory over Korea on Thursday. Team USA will look to win its third title after winning the event in 2009 and 2012.

IN GOAL TODAY

Steve Cash, who holds a two-game shutout streak, will get the start in goal tonight. Among tournament goalies who have played more than 15 minutes, Cash is first with a 0.56 goals-against-average and 0.947 save percentage. The Overland, Missouri native has back-stopped Team USA to two Paralympic gold medals (2010, 2014) and two World Championship titles (2009, 2012). He was also in goal for Team USA's World Sled Hockey Challenge first place finishes in 2009 and 2012.

LEADING THE WAY

outscored its opponents 21-3 and leads all teams in goals-per-game (5.25), goals-against-per-game (0.75), and power play percentage (42.1%). The United States advanced from preliminary round action with a perfect 3-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record for the first time in tournament history.

Declan Farmer enters the championship game with a tournament-best nine points and 2.25 point-pergame average. Nikko Landeros leads all defensemen with seven points while Josh Misiewicz, Adam Page and Brody Roybal are tied for the tournament lead with two power play goals apiece. Farmer (3-6--9), Landeros (3-4--7) and Roybal (3-2--5) have points in all four games and ten over the last two. Team USA's top line of Farmer, Roybal and Kevin McKee (3-3--6) have combined for 20 points.

TEAM USA THANKS HOST

Throughout the 2015 World Sled Hockey Challenge, host Tanner Fandrey has accompanied Team USA. A Red Deer, Alberta native, Fandrey is a current sled

hockey player with the Edmonton Impact whose home rink is the Leduc Recreation Centre. Coach Jeff Sauer invited Fandrey to ioin the team for its last practice and afterwards presented him with a signed Team USA jersey.









CURLING CHALLENGE SETTLES BET

After their putt-putt challenge at the West Edmonton Mall ended in a tie, four members of Team USA took to the curling rink to decide a winner. The group – consisting of **Steve Cash**, **Chris Douglas**, **Declan Farmer** and **Kevin McKee** – agreed to a curling challenge in which the person whose stone got closest to the center would win. The challenge, which can be seen on USAHockey.com, ended with Douglas as the winner.

MATT HENDRICKS VISITS TEAM USA

Matt Hendricks, current forward with the Edmonton Oileres of the National Hockey League, visited the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team for breakfast on Thursday. Hendricks, who met Team USA's assistant coach, **Guy Gosselin**, while playing at St. Cloud State University, congratulated the team on its shutout victory over Canada the night before and wished them the best of luck in the remainder of the tournament.

A DAY AT THE MALL

With the tournament having no games scheduled on Tuesday, Team USA spent the off day at the West Edmonton Mall. With more than 800 stores and over 100 dining services, the largest shopping mall in North America is equivalent to 48 city blocks and receives approximately 30.8 million visitors a year.

PAULS THE DIRECTOR

At the 2013 World Sled Hockey Challenge in Toronto, Ontario, Team USA finished second place to host Canada. In preliminary round play, the U.S. defeated Russia and Korea before falling to Canada. In the semifinal round, Team USA defeated Russia 4-1, and went on to face Canada in the championship game, falling, 3-1.

INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS

The United States has won four of the last five major international events, including the 2014 Paralympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia; the 2012 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship in Hamar, Norway; the 2010 Paralympic Winter Games in Vancouver, British Columbia; and the 2009 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship in Ostrava, Czech Republic.

Eleven members of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team represented Team USA at the 2014 Paralympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia.

Landeros and Pauls were members of the U.S. squad that won gold at the 2010 Paralympic Winter Games in Vancouver, British Columbia.

LEADING THE WAY

Jeff Sauer, former men's ice hockey head coach at the University of Wisconsin, is in his fourth season as head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team. **Guy Gosselin**, American Developmental Model regional manager for USA Hockey, is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team.
