**OPENING TIP**

Champaign and Gateway meet for the second of four contests this season. The Swarm had one of their most lopsided wins of the year when they beat Gateway 124-96 in their first matchup on Jan. 15. Gateway has lost six straight games to sag to the bottom of the standings, most recently a 122-81 blowout loss to St. Louis. Champaign is looking to rebound from a 96-91 loss in Bloomington on Thursday and remain in second place.

**THE BUZZ...**

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Champaign Swarm have been able to handle every team in the Midwest Professional Basketball Association so far except the Bloomington Flex. Bloomington beat the Swarm for the second time this season, 96-91, and grabbed sole possession of first place Thursday night at U.S. Cellular Coliseum. The Swarm trailed the entire game and fell behind 21 points in the third quarter before mounting a furious comeback that cut the deficit to two in the final minute. But Bloomington guard Justin Bocot made a technical free throw and final layup to seal the victory and cap a 35-point performance. The Swarm snapped a three-game winning streak. Swarm newcomer Avery Smith made a mark in his first start with 30 points, 21 in the second half on 11-of-24 shooting. Arnold Louis added 21 points and Aaron Weaver came off the bench to add 19. While the Swarm tamed the Bloomington Flex big men who fell into foul trouble, the backcourt tandem of Bocot and Fabyon Harris combined for 57 points.

**WITH HONORS:** Arnold Louis earned MPBA Player of the Week Award for the week ending on February 8. In two games, he tallied 70 points, including a league and season-high of 43 points on February 5 against the Chicago Force. In each contest he also grabbed 10 rebounds. This is the second time Louis has been recognized by the league. He was an honorable mention for a 24-point, 18-rebound game against St. Louis in the season opener on Jan. 11.

Louis has posted a double-double in three of the last four games and also been the Swarm's leading scorer and rebounder.

**TRANSACTIONAL:** The Swarm bolstered their roster with the addition of two veteran players on Jan. 6, center Livan Pyfrom and guard Avery Smith. At 36, Pyfrom joins as a player-coach, bringing NBA D-League and CBA experience. He played for head coach Chris Daleo in 2005 with the Rockford Lightning. Smith, 28, is a former standout player at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee with international experience. He led the Panthers in scoring his junior year. To make roster room, the Swarm released guards Tiger O'Neil and Matt Neville.

**BAHAMAS TRIANGLE:** The addition of Livan Pyfrom to the Swarm roster makes three Swarm players who were born in The Bahamas -- Arnold Louis, Livan Pyfrom and Mark St. Fort. Louis and St. Fort are first cousins who both played at Savannah State University, and each has three of the six double-doubles posted by Swarm players.

**STINGY:** The Swarm defense ranks second in the league in total points allowed per game at 93.6. Bloomington is first with 91.9.

**THIEVES:** The Swarm lead the MPBA in steals, averaging 10.9 per game. Rob Broughton leads the Swarm with a 2.4 average.

**O-FER:** Twice the Swarm have come up empty from beyond the three-point line, both times against Windy City (1/25, 2/8). The Swarm are a combined 1-for-22 in three-point shooting in three games against Windy City. Nevertheless, they are the top three-point shooting team in the league with a .321 percentage, but they have taken the fewest attempts.

**WITH HONORS:** Arnold Louis earned MPBA Honorable Mention for the week ending on January 11. On Jan. 11, Louis recorded a double-double, registering 24 points and 18 rebounds in a 113-100 win over St. Louis.

**WHO'S ON FIRST?** The Swarm played their first game in team history on January 11, and a number of "firsts" were recorded. Arnold Louis grabbed the first Swarm rebound with 11:24 left in the first quarter. Robert Broughton scored the team's first points at 10:42. Rashard McGill drained the first three-pointer at 8:45. Carl Mitchell punched in the first slam dunk at 5:38 left in the second quarter.

**NEWBIES:** The Swarm are one of five brand new teams in the Midwest Professional Basketball Association, joining the Chicago Force, Gateway Steam St. Louis RiverSharks and Windy City Groove. The Bloomington Flex have played for three seasons, most recently in the Premier Basketball League.

**CHAMPAIGN HISTORY:** The Swarm are the first professional basketball team in Champaign-Urbana, and one of the only professional sports teams ever in the twin cities. A few minor league baseball teams have called Champaign home in the last century, but none since 1994. Prior to tipoff on Sunday, Champaign mayor Don Gerard issued an official proclamation declaring January 11 "Champaign Swarm Day" in the city.

**LOCAL CONNECTIONS:** The Swarm's 11-man roster features two local players: **Keith Biggers**, a Champaign Central High School alumus; and **Jordan Walker**, who played at Central before transferring to Seton Academy in South Holland, Ill.

**COACHES CORNER:** Chris Daleo is the first head coach in team history. Since 2008, Daleo has served as the Director of Operations for the El Salvador Basketball League and as a global consultant for the Korea Basketball League. From 2006-2008, he was the head coach and general manager for the Minot (N. Dak.) Skyrockets of the Continental Basketball Association (CBA), where his .620 winning percentage is the fifth-highest in league history.

Prior to his stint with the Skyrockets, Daleo was the head coach and general manager from 2002-2006 for the Rockford Lightning in the CBA, where he won Coach of the Year honors in 2003. Under his guidance, the Lightning won conference championships in 2003 and 2005, and his .699 winning percentage is the highest in team history.

While with Rockford, Daleo was selected to coach the conference All-Star Team three times, and was the head coach of a U.S. team that toured China in 2004, 2005 and 2006. Following the 2006 season, Daleo was picked to be one of eight coaches in the Treviso (Italy) Summer League.

Daleo's first head coaching position was with Barat College, where he worked from 1999-2002. His 2002 team made the NAIA Division 1 Final Four, earning him NAIA Division 1 Coach of the Year honors.

**SAY "NO MORE":** The Champaign Swarm and the Midwest Professional Basketball Association have formed a partnership with the Corporate Alliance to End Partner Violence (CAEPV) to educate its players, staff and fans about saying "NO MORE" to domestic/partner violence and sexual assault.

As the only national organization of its kind, CAEPV is a leading force in the fight against domestic violence, founded by business leaders and focused on the workplace. The organization currently works with Major League Baseball, the National Basketball Association, and was recently asked to consult for the National Football League as it sought to develop a new workplace response to domestic violence and sexual assault.

The MPBA and CAEPV plan to expand the reach of the anti-partner violence/sexual assault message from the workplace to youth-oriented community facilities. Aside from implementing a training/education component, one of the first goals of the partnership will be to develop an official 'no-tolerance' policy toward domestic/partner violence and sexual assault for the league.

**DON'T CROSS THE STREAMS:** Every game of the MBPA's inaugural season will be streamed live and in high definition for free, thanks to a unique partnership with its Minneapolis-based technology provider Sport Ngin, and Coaches Aid, a media, leadership-development and broadcast services organization based in suburban Denver.

The partnership means Coaches Aid will provide multi-camera, high-definition productions of each MPBA game, live streamed to each team's page on the MPBA website, which is created and hosted by Sport Ngin.

Mark St. Fort registered the only double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds.</p>	<p><b>Jan. 25 vs. Windy City (W, 115-89):</b> Despite 10 days off, the Champaign Swarm rolled to a 115-89 defeat of Windy City. Aaron Weaver came off the bench and scored a team-high 24 points. The Swarm held a seven-point lead after one quarter, which they built to 16 at halftime. Champaign held Windy City to just one field goal in the first six minutes of the third quarter to help put the game out reach, expanding a lead to 36 points at one point. The bench contributed 54 points. Mark St. Fort had his second straight double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds.</p>	<p><b>Jan. 29 vs. Bloomington (L, 81-102):</b> The Flex handed the Swarm their first loss of the season. Bloomington's front line was dominant; Terrence Green and Anthony Slack teamed up for 10 of Bloomington's 11 blocks. Anthony Slack poured in 21 points and grabbed 13 rebounds. The Flex defense forced 19 Champaign turnovers and had 14 steals, holding the Swarm to their lowest scoring output in four games. The Swarm pulled to within 15 points early in the fourth quarter but came no closer. For the second straight game, Aaron Weaver came off the Swarm bench to tally his squad's game-high with 22 points. Mark St. Fort posted his third straight double-double with 13 points and 11 rebounds.</p>
<p><b>Jan. 30 at Windy City (W, 92-84):</b> The Swarm outlasted Groove in their first road contest of the season and beat Windy City for the second time in as many chances. Champaign's biggest lead was 14 points early in the fourth quarter, but Windy City pulled to 79-78 with 4:22 left in the game. The Swarm closed it out by sinking nine free throws from there, including Matt Neaville's 6-for-6 performance in the final minutes. Champaign dominated the glass, outrebounding Windy City 52-26.
