For many years, Spring Baseball teams had the number of games that could be played capped at 14, then 16, then 20. To-day it is 26. Summer baseball teams could play an unlimited amount of games for many years. It was not unusual for some teams to play more than 50 games. The WIAA ended summer baseball with games capped at 30 in 2018.

Coaches with suns in front of their names spent at least a major portion of their careers coaching summer ball.

Out of the 424 coaches who responded to Baseball Wisconsin's survey, 122 had 100 or more career victories, 264 had 99 or less career victories, and 38 did not report a career record.
