**15/02/02** BE IT RESOLVED that the SHSAA Classification Bylaw be amended as follows effective September 2016:

#### CLASSIFICATION OF SCHOOLS

1. For the purposes of this section, enrolment shall be taken from Ministry of Education enrolment figures for each school of the Grades 9-11 students as of September 30th of the previous year for classification of schools for the fall activities (cross country, golf, volleyball, soccer and football). The classification of schools for winter (curling, wrestling and basketball) and spring activities (badminton and track and field) will be based on the September 30th numbers of the current school year for students in grades 10-12. Schools may apply to have students who have used up their athletic eligibility prior to entering grade 12 be excluded from the count.

#### SHSAA Classification Guidelines:

*Urban schools are defined as those located in communities with a population of 5000 people or more, and have been awarded city status by the Government of Saskatchewan.*

*Rural schools are defined as those located in communities with a population under 5000 people, and have town, village, or hamlet status.*

*Volleyball and Basketball declarations (schools will have the opportunity to declare what category they would like to participate in):*

**4A:** *Urban school - Tier 1: schools located in communities of more than 5000 people that are seeking the most competitive environment in which to participate.*

**3A:** *Urban school - Tier 2: schools from communities of more than 5000 people that are seeking a competitive environment in which to participate.*

**2A:** *Rural school - Tier 1: schools from communities of less than 5000 people that are seeking the most competitive environment in which to participate.*

**1A:** *Rural school - Tier 2: schools from communities of less than 5000 people that are seeking a competitive environment in which to participate.*

**Notes to the classification guidelines:**

- 1) **School teams can be classified in different categories. For example, a school may have a 3A Boys Basketball team but enter their Girls Basketball team in the 4A category. A school may also have 3A Basketball teams but 4A Volleyball teams. The entries are sport specific.**
- 2) **Schools located in rural communities that draw students from many different communities are encouraged to reclassify to the urban category.**
- 3) **Schools located in rural communities that are residential in nature, therefore without attendance boundaries, are encouraged to reclassify to the urban category.**
- 4) **After schools have declared their intentions for the sports of Basketball and Volleyball, lists of participating teams will be posted on the SHSAA website. There will be a period of time that schools can submit a letter of concern regarding another team's classification. The SHSAA office will determine if an investigation is required regarding the team of concern. If necessary, discussions may happen between the SHSAA office and the team identified in the letter of concern to encourage that team to reconsider their classification selection.**

2. Each school must file a completed School Enrolment Declaration (Form E-10) on September 30 and return to the SHSAA Office by October 6th. Penalty for late filing of this form shall be \$50.00. Notification will be sent on the second Monday of October to schools entered in the classified activities for not complying. Schools will be excluded from the SHSAA activity if the form is not completed by:  
 Soccer – the Friday of the week preceding Regional Soccer and;  
 Volleyball – the Friday of the week preceding Conference Volleyball and;  
 Basketball – the Friday of the week preceding Conference Basketball.

3. ~~In the event that the number of ineligible students listed on an enrolment declaration results in the school being placed in a lower classification, the principal of the school will be required to forward to the Executive Council, a list of ineligible students, which will include the reason the students have been declared ineligible.~~

4. 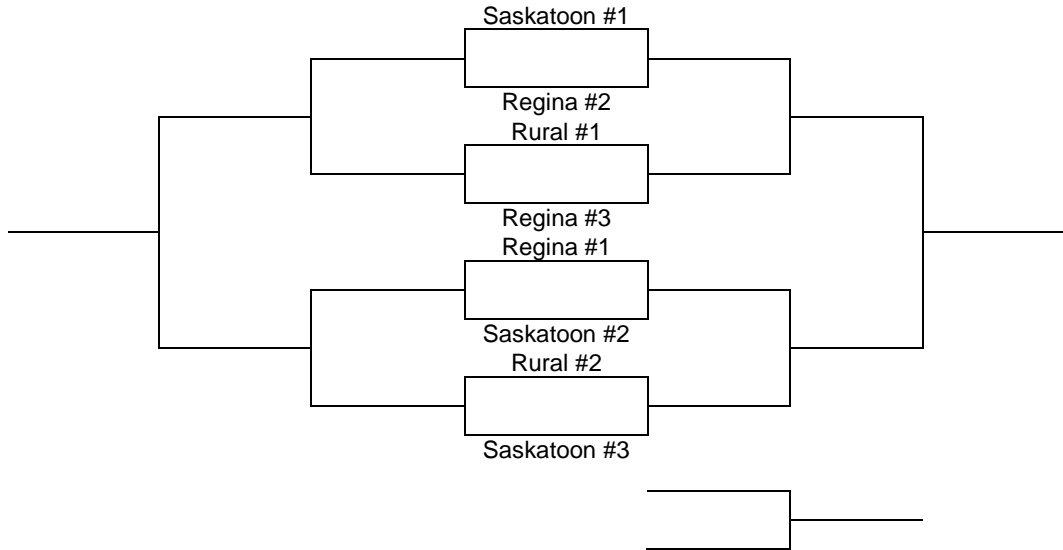

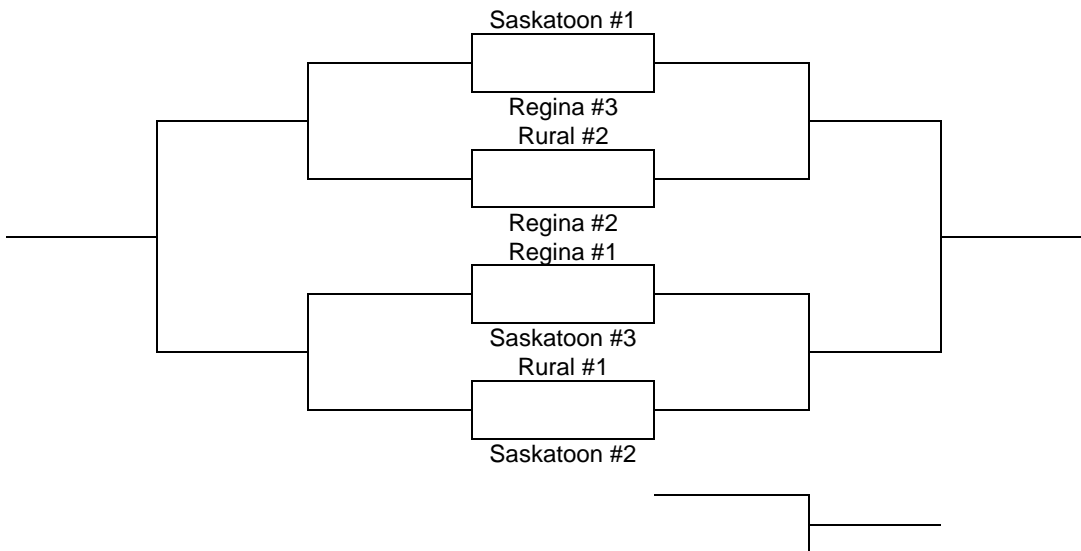
