

District 3 Score Sheet Instructions

Visiting team provides the official score sheet.

Obtain score book from team manager.

The top half of the score sheet will be filled out for you.

Off-Ice Minor Official:

Scorekeepers are considered an off-ice minor official. As part of this role, you are asked to refrain from cheering for your team.

Scoring:

The referee will skate to the window where you are sitting and tell you who scored the goal and/or who assisted. Enter the information as in the sample below. H = Home, V = Visitor

Penalties:

The official will skate to the window and tell you who received the penalty, the offense and the time of the penalty.

Fair Play Points:

U12 games have a maximum threshold of 10 Fair Play minutes.
 Score keeper enters 10 in the Max FP Minutes for this level.
 At the end of the game, score keeper totals the number of Fair Play minutes (penalty minutes) for each team.
 Referee will review totals at end of game and circle the Fair Play Points Earned answer.

Sign the score sheet:

Get person running the clock to sign the timekeeper box.
 You as scorer need to sign the Scorer box.

Ejections:

If there is an ejection of a coach, player or fan, the referee will take the score book from you and will return it to the team manager.

Return the score book to the team manager immediately following the game.

- He/she will have to review it and provide one of the copies to the opposing team's manager.

How to fill out a score sheet

For all penalties-

Enter period number, team and player number in the appropriate column. Enter the name of the penalty assessed, the minutes for the penalty (2:00 for minor, 5:00 for major), time on the game clock when the penalty started. Enter the time that the penalty expired (either goal is scored by non-offending team or the time expires). Enter Fair Play Point assessment for the penalty in the proper column (2 for minor, 5 for major and 10 for misconduct, game misconduct or match penalty).

1. Single minor penalty -

Put 2:00 minutes on the clock for the offending team.

2. Coincidental minor penalties-

Put no time on the game clock. Players cannot leave the penalty box until the first stoppage of play (whistle) after the penalties expire.

3. Power Play goal scored -

Penalty to the offending player terminates. Enter the time on the game clock in the "TIME OUT" column of the score sheet for that penalty.

4. Major penalty -

Enter 5:00 minutes on the score board clock for the offending team. The player must serve the entire 5-minutes regardless of how many goals are scored by the non-offending team.

5. Check from Behind -

There are two separate score sheet entries for this penalty. The first is for 2:00 minutes for "Checking from Behind". A second entry directly below the first is a 10-minute penalty for "Misconduct". Enter 2:00 minutes on the scoreboard for the offending team. The 10-minute misconduct penalty does not start until the minor penalty expires, either by scoring a power play goal or the minor penalty expires. The additional player in the penalty box serving the minor penalty can leave upon expiry of the minor penalty. Enter the start time for the 10-minute penalty on the score sheet. The offending player cannot leave the penalty box until the first stoppage of play after the 10-minute misconduct penalty expires.

6. Two minor penalties assessed to one player

Enter both penalties on the score sheet as separate entries. Enter the start time from the game clock for the first penalty only. Enter 4:00 minutes on the penalty clock of the scoreboard. If a power play goal is scored before the first 2-minutes expires, the first penalty expires at the time of the goal. Reset the score board penalty clock to 2:00 minutes and record the time for the start of the second penalty. If a power play goal is scored after the first 2-minutes expires, treat as if it were a single minor penalty.

7. Major + Game Misconduct Penalty

Enter the penalty assessed, followed by, "-Major" and on the line directly below it make a second entry that states, "Game Misconduct". The offending player is ejected from the game and another player from his team will be sent to the penalty box. The player in the box will serve the penalty as if it were a major penalty in #4 above. The referee will take the white copy of the score sheet for any game where a game misconduct or match penalty has been assessed.
