

## **DUTIES FOR SCOREKEEPER WITH LIBERO SERVING**

The scorekeeper should report to the referee no less than 20 minutes before the start of the match.

### **Scorekeeper Duties:**

Before the start of match, the scorekeeper will:

1. Obtain the roster and lineup sheets from the R2 and record the uniform numbers of the starting players in serving order and the libero on the scorebook. The coach must always list the libero on the roster. If the player is only playing the libero position, the coach will write only the libero number; Ex libero #4 is recorded on the roster as 4. If the player is both a regular player and a libero for different sets during the match but has the same number on both uniforms, the coach will record only the player's number; Ex regular uniform #4, libero uniform is #4, record 4. If the player is both a regular player and a libero for different sets during the match and has a different number uniform for each position, then the coach must record both uniform numbers; Ex a player's regular uniform number is #15 and her libero uniform number is #4, the coach will record 15/L4 (L is for libero). Remember, there can be no duplication of any numbers for any player; this also applies to any number of liberos used, listed on the roster. A Libero, when used, must be designated on the lineup sheet prior to each set and there can only be one libero designated per set. If a libero is designated for a set, the libero's number must be recorded on the lineup sheet for that set. If a libero has not been listed on the lineup sheet for a set, the team may not use a libero in that set.
2. Ensure that the libero tracker accurately records the starting players in the proper service order on the libero tracking sheet when this information is received from the scorer.
3. Review the lineups submitted to ensure that a captain is indicated, no duplicate or illegal numbers are entered, and the libero's number is noted. If no libero is indicated, as a courtesy (clarifies it's not a rule) notify the R2 so the coach can verify that no libero will be utilized in the current set.
4. Review the team information and the positions of the player on the court according to the serving order on the lineup sheet.

### **Scorekeeping Instructions with Libero Serving**

The scorekeeper shall:

1. If the libero serves, they may serve in only one serving position. The scorekeeper designates what serving position the Libero has served by placing a triangle around the number in the serving order column.
2. All points earned as a result of the libero serving are marked with a triangle.
  - a. In the line score in the serving position, place a triangle around each score earned from the libero serve.
  - b. In the running score, draw a triangle around each score earned from the libero serve.

Example: In the partial set illustration below, we see the home team has designated a libero (#5). If the libero serves, the scorekeeper marks the serve order with a triangle. In this example, we see the libero has stepped in for player #2 in the 3<sup>rd</sup> serving position and served points 6, 7 and 8. Thus the 3<sup>rd</sup> serve order is marked with a triangle and any served points by the libero are marked in two places (the line score and the running score) with a triangle. All other points are marked as (a) loss of rally points (points 4 and 5) with a box in both the line score and running score and (b)

served points by players other than the libero (points 1, 2 and 3) are written in the line score and slashed in the running score.

NOTE: If both teams are using the libero player, this scoring will be done for both teams by the scorekeeper.
