Ethics Policy and Process for LCS

- 1. Develop the LCS Ethics Policy Committee (Code of Ethics) with the LCS Ethics Representative, Director of Cheer, Director of Lacrosse, and Director of Football.
 - a. Annually review the coaching application so it meets LCS standards and guidelines.
- 2. Send to full Board for review and approval.
- 3. Publish on website and agreed to during registration.
- 4. LCS Ethics Policy Committee develops the Ethics Escalation Process
 - a. Define the process to follow, used as a guideline and format.
 - b. Linkage to Cheer, Flag, Tackle, Lacrosse guidelines, parent code of conduct, coaches code of conduct, players code of conduct, TCYFL, etc.
 - c. Define levels of violations i.e. minor, mid and major with associated consequences for a guide for the Ethics Escalation Sub-Committee.
 - d. Meet annually to review policy and amend as necessary.
- 5. All current LCS Community members are eligible to report a violation or conflict of interest.
- 6. LCS Board selects the Ethics Escalation Sub-committee members from the current Board and member community.
 - a. Determine make-up of the Ethics Escalation Sub-Committee
 - i. 1 Cheer Board Rep., 1 Football Board Rep., 1 Lacrosse Rep., 1 Parent Rep. (1 year term chosen by LCS Board), 1 child advocate (1 year term chosen by the LCS Board).
- 7. Ethics Escalation Sub-Committee
 - a. Meets to review and understand their role.
 - i. Use existing concerns to let themrole play through the events.
 - b. Meet only when there is an escalation.
 - c. Terms for Board Representatives follow their board term and 1 year for parent/child advocate.
 - d. Review Stallions Code of Conduct and Ethics Escalation Process.
 - i. Make recommendations to the LCS Ethics Policy Committee
 - e. An escalation is received from the LCS Code of Conduct webpage.
 - f. Determines if there is a violation or there is an appearance of a violation.
- 8. A representative chosen from the E.E.S.C will provide all details related to an issue and act as a liaison to the LCS Board members per incident.
- 9. The Ethics Escalation Sub Committee comes to a vote for any discipline and recommends to the Full Board for a vote and approval.
