HOW MUCH WILL IT COST FOR MY DAUGHTER AGE 14 AND UNDER TO TRY HOCKEY FOR FREE?

Nothing. No skate rental fees, no ice fees. You don't even need to bring a wallet.

HOW MUCH SKATING EXPERIENCE IS REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE?

None. The event is targeted toward girls of varying levels of skill and experience. We will divide the ice into different stations to meet the needs of absolute beginners who have no skating or hockey experience, intermediate players who have some experience, and advanced players who have played hockey for several years. The idea is to allow all girls to sample hockey and see it if something that they want to pursue further.

WHAT EQUIPMENT IS REQUIRED?

Whatever you have. All participants will be required to have ice skates, a helmet, gloves, and a hockey stick (hockey gloves or ordinary winter gloves are okay). If you don't have your own equipment, we will provide skates, helmets, and hockey sticks for use during the event at no charge. Please bring your own gloves and any other hockey equipment that you have.

WHAT WILL THE EVENT CONSIST OF?

St. Jude Knights coaches will be on hand along with current members of the Girls Knights hockey teams. We'll do some light skating drills and let the girls shoot some pucks around. The current Knights will talk a little bit about why they like to play hockey and what it means to them.
