



# Ski and Snowboard Trips

Facilitated by ISD 719 Community Education

Ready to join an activity and get outside? Plan to join the **2025-26 Middle School Ski and Snowboard Trips to Buck Hill!**

We will head to Buck Hill on MONDAYS –starting December 15, 2025. Buck Hill has an on-site ski school and has worked with our school district for years. Lessons are available for beginner skiers and snowboarders as part of the rental purchase **only on the first two dates of our program.**

We will offer a 5-week package.

**Rental Equipment:** Rental equipment is only included in package “A” with the lift ticket or package “C” with NO lift ticket. (option C is for BH season pass holders who need rental equipment).

**Meals:** Students will need to bring money to purchase dinner items/snacks. Buck Hill offers a variety of choices in the main chalet area -- such as burgers, hot dogs, salads, French fries, donuts, drinks (typically \$5-8/per item or more). No outside food.

**Transportation:** The buses will leave the middle school south parking lots at 2:35 p.m. **Bus transportation is ONE WAY**, and supervision ends at 7:30 p.m. so all students need to be picked up at Buck Hill by 7:30 p.m. Most families arrange to meet near the clock tower or in the chalet for pick-up. Staff and parent volunteers will leave at 7:30 each Monday.

**Equipment:** On Ski Trip Mondays, there will be trailers in the south parking lot of Twin Oaks MS. All HOMS and TOMS families need to load their equipment into these trailers with parent volunteer help. Students are not allowed to bring any equipment (skis/boards) on the “regular” school buses. Please arrange to bring your student’s ski/snowboard equipment to the trailer between 6:50-7:15 a.m. on the morning of each trip. Students can bring their boots and warm clothing inside the building to the school storage area at HOMS or TOMS.

- Monday, January 12, 2026 - Trip #3
- Monday, January 26, 2026 - Trip #4

\*\*No refunds will be given after December 10, 2026. Processing fees will be deducted from any refund (due to injury/etc).

**Option A: 5 lift tickets with 2 lessons plus activity fee (\$99) = \$359**

Lessons provided by BH staff are optional. **Rental Equipment and helmet included.**

**Option B: 5 lift tickets with 2 lessons plus activity fee (\$99) = \$229**

Lessons provided by Buck Hill staff are optional.

**Option C: Rental Equipment and helmet for 5-week program plus activity fee (\$99) = \$229**

**Season Pass Holders only – no lessons.**

**Option D: Activity fee/transportation only = \$99**

**Season Pass Holders only – no lessons.**

The activity fee allows PLSAS to facilitate weekly field trips to Buck Hill, where open skiing, lift tickets, optional lessons and equipment rental are available to registered students. Please note that PLSAS Community Education is providing access to these activities, but they are not PLSAS programs or staff. PLSAS Community Education does provide two staff persons as a resource and point of contact for students. Parent volunteers are also very involved and background-checked to assist students as needed.

# Additional Ski and Snowboard Trip Information



## Rental Form:

- ❖ Your student's rental form will be filled out prior to check-in by the coordinator(s).

### **MOST IMPORTANT DATA NEEDED: WEIGHT, HEIGHT AND SHOE SIZE**

- ❖ Your student's rental form will be given to them at check-in at school and they will be advised to keep it safe until they get to the rental shop.
- ❖ After getting equipment – students can store their belongings in a locker or in the rental shop or in a storage spot reserved for our schools. We will show the students this area on the first day.

## Lessons:

- ❖ On the first day, students will begin their lessons as soon as they leave the rental shop. Lessons start at 4:00 p.m. and last about 30-40 minutes.
- ❖ Meet right outside the rental shop BY THE BELL and flag area. If you have any problems – please let someone know. We have chaperones near the rental shop to help with any problems until all students get their equipment. Buck Hill Instructors are located in this area and wear bright blue coats.

## Clothing:

- ❖ Layers of clothing are best to keep kids warm. Ski masks to cover faces are great for cold days.
- ❖ Ski goggles are great for eye protection. Helmets are strongly recommended.
- ❖ Ski Trips will only be cancelled if school is cancelled or we have major low temps; so prepare your child for the weather conditions each week.

# Sample of Online Agreement: Ski and Snowboard Trips Consent and Behavior Form

The undersigned, parents of \_\_\_\_\_, minor, who desired to participate in the Ski and Snowboard Trip activities, hereby give my consent to the participation of said minor in such program.

The undersigned acknowledges having full knowledge of the hazards involved in the activities of skiing and snowboarding and are also aware of the association of risk doctrine that protects most ski areas from injuries resulting from normal use of ski slopes.

The undersigned hereby acknowledges that they have been informed of the general rules regarding the operation of the trips, and the specific rules related to the use of tobacco, alcohol, and other drugs as outlined in the student handbook. I also understand students can have their lift tickets taken away if they are not following the rules of the ski area or if they are skiing or boarding in a manner hazardous to themselves or others.

Furthermore, I understand that violation of the rules for school activities or any other illegal acts will result in removal from the Ski and Snowboard Trips **without a refund!** More specifically, the undersigned acknowledges the following rules and consequences for breaking the rules.

5. Inappropriate ski chalet behavior	Loss of one ski pass	Removal from future trips
6. Inappropriate slope behavior	Loss of one ski pass	Removal from future trips
7. Leaving Buck Hill 3-7:30 p.m. ( <u>without supervisor permission</u> )	Removal from future trips	

If a student is removed from future trips for unacceptable behavior, **NO REFUND WILL BE ISSUED!**

Students must be in good standing academically to participate in ski and snowboard trips.
