#### **TONIGHT'S GAME**

The United States takes on Korea at HARBORCENTER (capacity: 1,800) in its final preliminary round game here tonight at the 2016 IPC Sled Hockey Pan-Pacific Championship. A win tonight will guarantee the U.S. playing in the championship game tomorrow at 5 p.m. ET. Tonight's game will be streamed live on Paralympic.org/Buffalo-2016.

## **USA VS. KOREA**

Team USA holds a 10-0-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record all-time against Korea. The two teams met earlier this season when the United States defeated Korea, 8-1, to open the 2016 World Sled Hockey Challenge.

## **LAST GAME: USA 1, CANADA 2**

**Steve Cash** (Overland, Mo.) made 14 saves and **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) scored a power-play goal but the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team fell to Canada, 2-1, Wednesday (March 30) night. Cash was named the U.S. Player of the Game.

### MARCH 29: USA 8, TEAM PAN-PACIFIC 0

**Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) tallied four points and **Bo Reichenbach** (Billings, Mont.) stopped all five shots he faced as the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team blanked Team Pan-Pacific, 8-0, to open tournament play. Five different players scored in the victory and Farmer was named the U.S. Player of the Game.

#### **U.S. RECORD CHASERS**

With his goal on Wednesday (March 30), **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) is now one shy of tying former national team members **Taylor Lipsett** (Mesquite, Texas) and **Alexi Salamone** (Buffalo, N.Y.) for the single-season goal scoring record with 11. He's also one goal shy of tying Lipsett and fellow Team USA member **Adam Page** (Lancaster, N.Y.) for the career goal scoring record of 36. Page tied Lipsett in Tuesday's (March 29) 8-0 victory over Team Pan-Pacific with his two-goal performance.

Additionally, **Kevin McKee** (Chicago, III.) needs three assists to set the new single-season assists record, currently held by line-mate **Brody Roybal** (Northlake, III.) who tallied 13 last season. Meanwhile, Farmer is three points away from eclipsing the single-season point record of 21 points, which he set last season to tie Salamone.

## **TOURNAMENT LEADERS**

Several U.S. players lead the tournament in statistical categories.

**Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) leads the tournament in points (5) and shares the tournament lead in goals with three. Also, **Kevin McKee** (Chicago, III.) and **Josh Pauls** (Green Brook, N.J.) each have three assists, which rank first among all tournament skaters. Meanwhile, goaltender **Bo Reichenbach** (Billings, Mont.) is the only tournament goalie to play that has yet to allow a goal.

Additionally, Team USA leads all teams with goals for (9) and shares the lead for fewest goals allowed (2). The U.S. is also the only team to record a shutout.

#### TIDBITS FROM PAST GAME NOTES

**Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) has tallied a point in ever game this season and leads t point total to 17 (9-8) through six games this season. His nine goals also lead the team and his eight assists are tied for second. Farmer's line-mate, **Kevin McKee** (Chicago, III.), notched a pair of assists yesterday for his teamleading 10 assists through six games.

#### ABOUT THE TOURNAMENT

Four teams are competing in the first-ever IPC Sled Hockey Pan-Pacific Championship: Canada, Korea, Team Pan-Pacific and the United States. Team Pan-Pacific is comprised of players from Canada, Japan and the United States. Tournament play includes a round-robin preliminary round in which the top two teams will advance to a winner-take-all championship game on Saturday, April 2.

#### **CAPTAIN AMERICA**

Josh Sweeney (Portland, Ore.) is serving as captain for the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team for the second consecutive season. Also returning are alternate captains **Nikko Landeros** (Johnstown, Colo.) and **Josh Pauls** (Green Brook, N.J.). A year ago, the trio led Team USA to an undefeated season and a gold medal on home ice at the 2015 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship in Buffalo, New York.

#### **LEADING THE WAY**

Jeff Sauer (Madison, Wis.), former men's ice hockey head coach at the University of Wisconsin and 2014 U.S. Hockey Hall of Fame inductee, is in his fifth season as head coach of the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team. Last season, Sauer led Team USA to an undefeated 12-1-0-0 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record that culminated with a gold medal at the 2015 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship here in Buffalo, New York. Since taking the helm in 2011, Sauer has guided Team USA to a 45-4-2-12 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record that includes reaching the championship game of every major international competition and titles in six major international events, including the 2016 World Sled Hockey Challenge in Bridgewater, Nova Scotia; the 2015 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship in Buffalo, New York; the 2015 World Sled Hockey Challenge in Leduc, Alberta; the 2014 Paralympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia; the 2012 World Sled Hockey Challenge in Calgary, Alberta; and the 2012 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship in Hamar, Norway.

## SEEKING FIFTH STRAIGHT INT'L TITLE

A victory this week would give the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team its fifth straight international tournament title. Team USA, which aims to reach its 10th straight international championship game, has claimed the 2016 World Sled Hockey Challenge in Bridgewater, Nova Scotia, in January; the 2015 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship in Buffalo, New York; the 2015 World Sled Hockey Challenge in Leduc, Alberta; and the 2014 Paralympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia.

## 2016 WORLD SLED HOCKEY CHALLENGE

The U.S. National Sled Hockey Team opened the 2016 campaign by claiming the 2016 World Sled Hockey Challenge in Bridgewater, Nova Scotia. After outscoring opponents 16-6 in preliminary round play, the U.S. defeated Russia, 2-1, the semifinals and went on to face Canada in the championship game where **Josh Pauls** (Green Brook, N.J.) scored the championship-clinching goal for the second consecutive year. The title gave Team USA back-to-back titles in the event for the first time and third overall title in the last four tries. Forward **Declan Farmer** (Tampa, Fla.) finished as the tournament leader in goals (7) and points (13) while **Kevin McKee** (Chicago, III.) led all skaters in assists (8).

#### COACH SERTICH JOINS TEAM USA

Mike Sertich (Duluth, Minn.), who coached at the University of Minnesota-Duluth (1982-2000) and Michigan Tech University (2000-03), joined the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team here in Buffalo on Tuesday (March 29). A longtime friend and coaching rival of Team USA head coach Jeff Sauer (Madison, Wis.), Sertich is with the team throughout the tournament providing additional support to the Team USA coaching staff.





## TEAM USA VISITS SABRES LOCKERROOM

On Monday (March 28), the U.S. National Sled Hockey Team received a tour of the Buffalo Sabres' locker room at First Niagara Center. This is the second consecutive year a professional sports team in Buffalo has hosted Team USA after the Buffalo Bills welcomed the team to a spring practice last April.

#### **COACH PAULS**

Last week, U.S. National Sled Hockey Team alternate captain **Josh Pauls** (Green Brook, N.J.) was a guest camp coach at USA Hockey's National Team Development Program Evaluation Camp at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Michigan. The camp, which helps select the 2016-17 U.S. National Under-17 Team, included 48 of the top American hockey players born in 2000.

#### PAGE VISITS KNOXVILLE'S NEW PROGRAM

Buffalo native and Team USA member Adam Page (Lancaster, N.Y.) visited Knoxville, Tennessee, on March 19 to take part in a free sled hockey clinic with the Knoxville Amateur Hockey Association (KAHA). KAHA has been chosen as one of ten programs across the country to receive a \$25,000 grant as part of Labatt USA's "Pass It Forward" initiative to help create new sled hockey programs across the country.

#### **TEAM FIRST**

Members of Team USA are already teammates on club teams with Buffalo Sabres (Adam Page, Paul Schaus), Colorado Avalanche (Tyler Carron, Nikko Landeros, Bo Reichenbach), DASA St. Louis Blues (Steve Cash, Billy Hanning, Josh Pauls), RIC Blackhawks (Kevin McKee, Brody Roybal) and San Antonio Rampage (Luke McDermott, Rico Roman).

#### SIX PURPLE HEARTS

Six members of Team USA are Purple Heart recipients. Last year, former Marines Luke McDermott (Westerlo, N.Y.), Josh Misiewicz (La Grange, Ill.), Paul Schaus (Buffalo, N.Y.) and Josh Sweeney (Portland, Ore.) helped Team USA to an undefeated season and the 2015 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship. Retired Army staff sergeant Rico Roman (Portland, Ore.) is back with the national team after helping Team USA claim gold at the 2014 Paralympic Winter Games in Sochi, Russia. Additionally, former Navy Seal Bo Reichenbach (Billings, Mont.) spent last season as an alternate captain for the U.S. Developmental Sled Hockey Team before being named to his first U.S. National Sled Hockey Team.

## **RECAPPING LAST SEASON**

The 2014-15 campaign saw Team USA go undefeated (12-1-0-0/W-OTW-OTL-L) and end the season as world champions on home ice. After defeating Russia. 2-1, in overtime to win the 2015 World Sled Hockey Challenge in Leduc, Alberta, the U.S. outscored its opponents 29-1 while going a perfect 5-0 to claim the gold medal at the 2015 IPC Sled Hockey World Championship. The U.S. finished both tournaments as leaders in goals per game, goals against per game, power play percentage and shutouts. In 13 games, Team USA scored 59 goals, allowed just six goals and set 12 team records to finish the season undefeated for the second time in team history. Declan Farmer (Tampa, Fla.) paced all skaters in goals (10) and points (21) and goaltender Steve Cash (Overland, Mo.) finished with a career-best 0.45 goals against average and .950 save percentage.

#### LABATT USA'S PASS IT FORWARD INITIATIVE

On November 5, 2015, USA Hockey unveiled the 10 sled hockey programs that will equally share \$250,000 in grants provided by Labatt USA through its Pass it Forward initiative. The funding will assist five newly created programs this year and five other previously established USA Hockey sled programs. Each of the 10 programs will receive \$25,000 to be used for items such as sleds, stick, ice time and uniforms.

Of the 10 programs selected by USA Hockey, five are new for this season. U.S. National Sled Hockey Team captain **Josh Sweeney** (Portland, Ore.) is leading the creation of the Winterhawks Sled Hockey Program in Portland, Oregon, while U.S. National Sled Hockey team members **Steve Cash** (Overland, Mo.),



Billy Hanning (Festus, Mo.) and Josh Pauls (Green Brook, N.J.) are members of the DASA St. Louis Blues organization in St. Louis, Missouri. Additionally, Team USA doctor, Mike Uihlein (Grafton, Wis.), is overseeing the newly created program in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
