





Coaches Code of Conduct

Coaches Code of Conduct

- place the emotional and physical well-being of my players ahead of any personal desire to win.
- remember to treat each player as an individual, remembering the large spread of emotional and physical development for the same age group.
- · do my very best to provide a safe playing situation for my players
- promise to review and practice the necessary first-aid principles needed to treat injuries to my players.
- do my best to develop each player as much as possible within the limits of their physical and mental
 abilities.
- · do my best to organize practices that are fun and challenging for all my players
- lead, by example, in demonstrating fair play and sportsmanship to all my players. Cursing has no place in our program. Under no conditions will I verbally or physically abuse a player, parent, or Umpire.
- ensure that I am knowledgeable in the rules of each sport that I coach, and that I will teach these rules to my players.
- use those coaching techniques appropriate for each of the skills that I teach.
- maintain team discipline and take reasonable measures to enforce violations of team rules. I will follow
 the discipline policy as stated in this handbook.
- praise my players and offer constructive criticism.
- be accessible to players and parents on a reasonable basis to discuss the player's progress or lack of it, or to clear up misunderstandings.
- · Strive to keep post-game meetings with players short, constructive, and in a general nature.
- not use drugs and alcohol before or during games and practices, nor will I use tobacco while on the field.
- · remember that I am a youth coach, and that the game is for the kids and NOT for the parents or coaches.

 - > President





 - B. Active- Keep kids moving. Small groups with lots of reps. Station based practices
 - C. Fun and Exciting- Bring the energy!

Coaches Expectations

Practice Nights

You will have to set bases before practice, and remove bases after

- Base plugs- ALWAYS leave plugs under the base during use
 - > After- return plug to mark location
- Rake field after- Batter's box, pitching mound, base paths, large holes dug, etc.
 - Rakes and white boxes are locked at City Park and Big woods. This is the same ATL key you will receive.

Pre-Game Inspection

Field will be drug and chalked for you

 Base distances and pitching rubber will be set for your level. Please double check for proper distance and notify Sam Weber of any concerns.

Post-Game Responsibilities

- 1- Hand rake- batters box, pitching mound, all base paths, large holes dug, etc
- 2- Bases removed, holes plugged, placed in dug out
- 3- Leaf Blower (located in concession stand storage and Driste storage)
- 4- Check scoreboard controller is plugged in (located in concession stand storage and Driste storage)
- 5- Pick up any trash or wrappers
- 6- Check everything is locked up if you're last to leave
- 7- Pitching mound is coaches responsibility to remove from playing area

- Pitching mound is <u>Coaches responsibility</u>
 to move onto the field before <u>AND</u> after your
 game. Train your players to do it safely.
 Carry a tape measure in your equipment
 bag.
- 3rd base line
- Do not- Block the dugout, or Maintenance gates
