



Riley Zuhn Selected to Play on Youth National Training Team

Riley Zuhn has been selected one of 24 players to participate in the U.S. Girls' Youth National Training Team (GYNTT).

Zuhn, a freshman outside hitter for NORCO 16 Black, is the first athlete in NORCO history to be selected to a USA Volleyball National Training Team.

The roster consists of the top high school freshmen and sophomores from around the country. Zuhn is one of 10 outside/opposite hitters selected. She is the only player from the Rocky Mountain Region selected to the team.

"I am excited to have the opportunity to compete with the best players in the country," Zuhn said. "I know it will be difficult, but I want to represent NORCO and the RMR."

Erin Virtue, associate head coach at Northwestern University, has been selected to serve as the U.S. Girls' Youth National Team head coach. Stacy Sykora (USA Volleyball) will serve as an assistant coach for the team, while Jared Hazel (formerly of Colorado State University) will serve as technical coordinator. A second assistant coach will be added to the coaching staff in the near future.

"On behalf of the entire coaching staff, we are thrilled to announce this exceptional group as the 2016 U.S. Girls' Youth National Training Team," Virtue said. "These 24 athletes are among the best in the nation in their age group and will compete to represent USA at the NORCECA Championship. Our staff is honored to implement and teach the core values, philosophies and strategies of our U.S. Women's National Team to these young athletes. The High Performance pipeline is a critical piece to achieving success at the highest levels in USA Volleyball and we are excited to create a culture of learning within this training group." Tentatively, the GYNTT will train July 11-24 in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, with the final 12-player U.S.

The team will reconvene in Puerto Rico and compete in the NORCECA Women's U18 Continental Championship with tentative dates set for Aug. 26-Sept. 5.

I received your introductory two-line email and read through it. I must say your first sentence was painfully familiar as you introduced yourself by first name only. I assumed if you were trying to make an impression that you would have paid more attention to punctuation, but my assumption appears incorrect. While your opening email failed to identify your last name, what year in school you are, where you are from, or what position you play, you managed to include your most pressing question as to whether our team is "giving out scholarships".

A week later, I received a second email with full color resume attachment

including your action photos, and a variety of links to related newspaper articles. Each of these items were compiled in an orderly fashion and sent out directly from both your parents' emails.

As a word of advice, while many college coaches support parental enthusiasm, initiative taken by the athlete is crucial if you are serious about connecting with a quality program. Our staff explained to your parents that we would prefer to connect with you directly, but they continue to respond on your behalf. This will be a red flag for any coach, so please be aware of this feedback being a possibility from any of your other options."

This Week at NORCO!

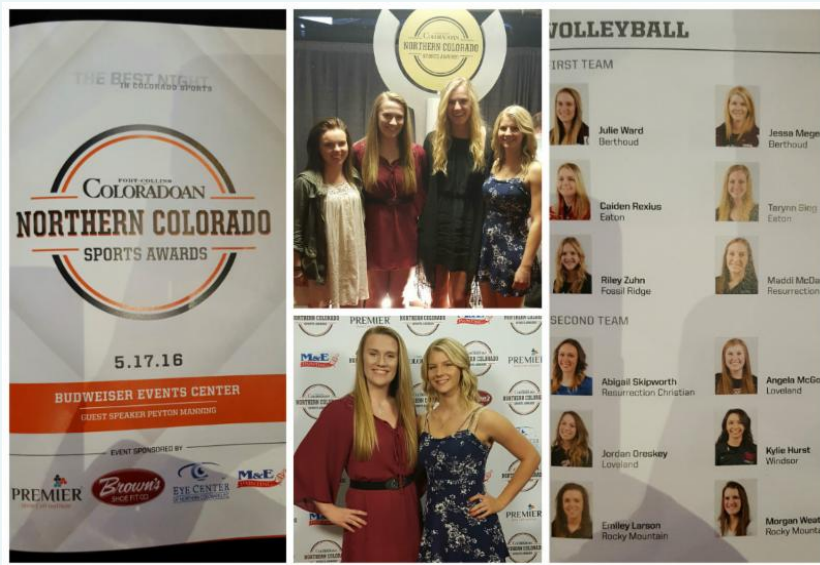


12 Blue had their end of season party over the weekend.
