June 11th teams will be fitted for game jerseys and team issued apparel. If you can not attend you will need to provide your player's sizes. There are no exchanges for items that do not fit.

Welcome Weekend

Welcome Weekend will be Aug 27/28. This is a mandatory weekend for all player and parents. Players will be receiving their apparel and jerseys as well as participating in on-ice skills sessions and off-ice team building activities. Upcoming season information and organization details from the board of directors will be handed out to parents.

50/50 Raffles

Each year the Green Bay Gamblers provide our organization the opportunity to sell tickets for the 50/50 Raffle at some of their games. Players and parents are encouraged to help sell tickets at the games. All proceeds go to the organization to offset costs. Dates will be released and posted on the GBJG website.

We believe in developing players both on and off the ice through our code of ethics that stresses discipline, respect of others and commitment.

Player cards can be signed beginning May 29th, 2016. Once a player has committed to the Jr. Gamblers, and signed their player card they cannot be released to play with a Tier 2 organization.

Payments can be made **online only** with a credit card or via checking draft if using the six month payment plan. Those paying in full with a one time payment can pay online with a credit card, checking draft or physical check. *There is a transaction fee for use of the online payment system

How to help offset your fees:

Motorsports Raffle - Each player is given 20 raffle tickets to sell, sell your tickets and you can reduce your fee by \$200

Sponsorships - 85% of the proceeds from yearbook advertisement goes directly to offset the player's fees

Scrip - purchase scrip to pay for everyday items you would be buying anyway. Last season 23 families participated, totaling over \$6100 in rebates.

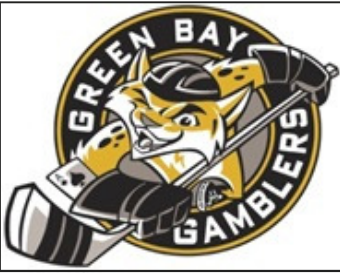

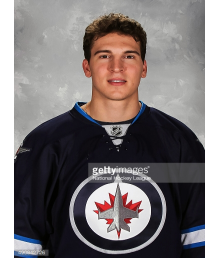

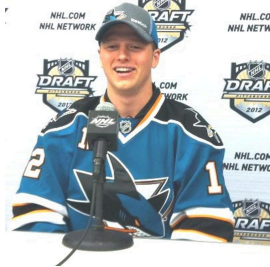
