## TODAY'S GAMES

International play resumes at the 2016 USA Hockey National Junior Evaluation Camp in Plymouth, Michigan, when Canada faces Finland at 1 p.m. ET and the United States squares off against Sweden at 4 p.m. ET.

Both matches will take place in the main rink at USA Hockey Arena (capacity: 3,600) and will be televised live on NHL Network (U.S.) and TSN (Canada). ## ON-ICE CAMP TIDBITS THUS FAR

Through two days of competition, **Kieffer Bellows** (Edina, Minn.) and **Tage Thompson** (Oyster Bay, N.Y.) lead all skaters with six points each. Thompson leads the camp with five goals while Bellows and **Clayton Keller** (Swansea, Ill.) share the lead in assists with three. **Jake Oettinger** (Lakeville, Minn.) paces all goaltenders with a 1.87 goals-against-average and .941 save percentage.

## U.S. SETS FINAL CAMP ROSTER AT 32 PLAYERS

Yesterday, the roster for the 2016 USA Hockey National Junior Evaluation Camp was trimmed to 32 players for the remainder of camp.

"We've been pleased with the level of competition in the camp so far," said **Jim Johannson**, USA Hockey's assistant executive director of hockey operations and the general manager of the 2017 U.S. National Junior Team. "This is just one step in the process, but we like the direction our players are headed and look forward to having our head coach, Bob Motzko, behind the bench for the remaining games as we continue to develop our identity. We will continue to evaluate the players released today, along with some others not here, throughout the fall."

## MOTZKO TO LEAD TEAM USA FOR FIRST TIME

**Bob Motzko** (St. Cloud, Minn.), head coach of St. Cloud State University's men's ice hockey program, will make his international head coaching debut as head coach of the 2017 U.S. National Junior Team. This is the second time Motzko will be behind a Team USA bench after serving as an assistant coach for the 2014 U.S. National Junior Team at the IIHF World Junior Championship in Malmo, Sweden. Head coach at his alma mater since 2005, the 2014 NCHC Coach of the Year and two-time WCHA Coach of the Year (2007, 2006) has produced seven 20 or more win seasons; seven NCAA tournament appearances; one NCAA Frozen Four appearance; two regular-season conference titles (one each: WCHA, NCHC); and one NCHC Frozen Faceoff Championship.

## BROWN, POTULNY, MAYOTTE AND MILLER ROUND OUT TEAM USA COACHING STAFF

**Greg Brown** (Scituate, Mass.), **Grant Potulny** (Minneapolis, Minn.), **Kris Mayotte** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and **Steve Miller** (Colorado Springs, Colo.) are the assistant coaches for the 2017 U.S. National Junior Team. Brown, a two-time U.S. Olympian (1988, 1992) and current associate head coach at Boston College, is serving on his second U.S. National Junior Team after filling the same role alongside Motzko in 2014. Potulny, an assistant coach at University of Minnesota, returns to the U.S. national team staff after helping Team USA claim gold at the 2013 IIHF World Junior Championship in Ufa, Russia. Mayotte, an assistant coach at Providence College, and Steve Miller, director of hockey for Air Force Academy, are both making their debuts on a U.S. national team staff.

## HOME OF TEAM USA

USA Hockey Arena, home of USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, is serving as host of USA Hockey's National Junior Evaluation Camp for the first time. All practices and games will take place at USA Hockey Arena, a two-sheet facility with regulation ice (85x200) in the main arena and Olympic-size ice (100x200) for the secondary sheet.

## JOHANNSON ADDRESSES MEDIA

On Sunday (July 31), Jim Johannson, general manager of the 2017 U.S. National Junior Team, addressed the media prior to the start of international competition to state that **Matthew Tkachuk** (St. Louis, Mo.) would not participate in on-ice activities at camp and would remain with the team until Tuesday, Aug. 2. Additionally, **Colin White** (Hanover, Mass.), who was a member of the bronze-medal winning 2016 U.S. National Junior Team, will arrive on Thursday, Aug. 4, and be with the team in an off-ice capacity for the remainder of the camp. White is still recovering from a previously announced offseason surgery.

## CAMP GUEST COACHES KNUBLE, ROLSTON

**Mike Knuble** (East Grand Rapids, Mich.) and **Ron Rolston** (Fenton, Mich.) served as guest coaches from Friday, July 29, through Tuesday (Aug. 2). A Stanley Cup champion with the Detroit Red Wings and veteran of 1,068 NHL games, Knuble skated for Team USA on five occasions, including four U.S. Men's National Teams (1995, 1999, 2001, 2005) and the 2006 U.S. Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team. Rolston, who spent seven seasons (2004-11) as head coach with USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, is the only coach in U.S. history to guide the U.S. Men's National Under-18 Team to three gold medal finishes at the IIHF Men's Under-18 World Championship (2005, 2009, 2011).



## DAY BY DAY TEAM USA CAMP HAPPENINGS

### DAY 5: AUG. 2

Yesterday morning, the 2017 U.S. National Junior Team staff announced the final 32-player U.S. roster for the remainder of USA Hockey's National Junior Evaluation Camp. After practice on the Olympic Rink from 1:30-2:45pm ET., head coach Bob Motzko took part in a Facebook Live Q&A on USA Hockey's Facebook page. ### DAY 4: AUG. 1

**Jeremy Bracco** (Freeport, N.Y.) and Tage Thompson each scored twice as USA Blue edged Sweden, 6-4, in the day's first game while Kieffer Bellows tallied five points to lead USA White past Finland, 8-2, in the second game of the day.

### DAY 3: JULY 31

International play got under way at the USA Hockey National Junior Evaluation Camp. In the first game, USA White outshot Sweden, 44-32, including 20-8 in the opening period, but fell, 6-3. In the second game, 10 different players registered at least a point, including Tage Thompson who netted a hat trick, to lead USA Blue past Finland, 8-1.

### DAY 2: JULY 30

Both USA Blue and USA White took the ice for the first time before taking part in an intrasquad scrimmage in the evening. USA White, led by associate coaches Greg Brown and Ron Rolston, edged USA Blue, who were led by associate coaches Grant Potulny and Mike Knuble thanks to a goal by **Rem Pitlick** (Plymouth, Minn.). Upon returning to the hotel, several players took part in interviews, including a one-on-one session between **Charlie McAvoy** (Long Beach, N.Y.) and Matthew Tkachuk.

### DAY 1: JULY 29

The 42 U.S. players and staff members arrived throughout the day. In the evening, they attended a meeting where staff members, including 2017 U.S. National Junior Team general manager, Jim Johannson, and head coach, Bob Motzko, discussed camp expectations.

## UPCOMING USA HOCKEY HAPPENINGS

### **SCHEDULED UNVEILED FOR USA HOCKEY'S NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM**

USA Hockey's National Team Development Program, which enters its 20th anniversary season in 2016-17, announced the schedule for its U.S. National Under-17 and Under-18 Teams. The Under-17 Team will begin the campaign with a home-and-home preseason series against the United States Hockey League's Muskegon Lumberjacks on Sept. 9-10. The Under-18 Team will open the 2016-17 season with games against the United States Hockey League's Sioux City Musketeers and Omaha Lancers at the Omaha Fall Classic on Sept. 9-10 at Ralston Arena. Tickets for all home games, to be played here at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Michigan, are available now through the box office.

### **95 PLAYERS INVITED TO 2016 WOMEN'S NATIONAL FESTIVAL IN LAKE PLACID, N.Y.**

Ninety-five players have been invited to the 2016 USA Hockey Women's National Festival, which will take place Aug. 8-14, at the Olympic Center in Lake Placid, New York. The festival is an annual training session that will also be used to select two 22-player rosters for a pair of series against Canada held simultaneously from August 17-21 in Calgary, Alberta, at Canada Olympic Park. The U.S. entries will feature an Under-18 Select Team and Under-22 Select Team.

### **FIVE NATIONS CUP TO TAKE PLACE IN DALLAS**

The 2016 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament will be held at the Dr. Pepper Star Center Arena Frisco from Aug. 9-13 in suburban Dallas, Texas. The annual tournament, which features many of the world's best hockey players under the age of 17, will include national teams from the Czech Republic, Germany, Slovakia and Switzerland, in addition to the United States. Team USA won the Under-17 Five Nations Tournament last year, finishing undefeated (3-1-0-0) in Arosa, Switzerland. It marked the sixth championship in eight tries for Team USA, which also claimed top honors in 2013, 2012, 2011, 2010 and 2008. Last contested on American soil in 2011, the tournament provides an international stage for a select team of players chosen at the USA Hockey Boys Select 16 Player Development Camp, held each July in Williamsville, New York.

### **ST. LOUIS TO HOST 2016 USA HOCKEY NATIONAL COACHES SYMPOSIUM**

USA Hockey's 2016 National Hockey Coaches Symposium will take place Aug. 11-14 in St. Louis, Missouri, at the Marriott St. Louis Grand Hotel. Typically held every other year, the USA Hockey National Hockey Coaches Symposium is for aspiring coaches seeking to attain their Level 5 coaching certification, the highest offered by USA Hockey. In addition to general sessions, coaches also have the opportunity to explore innovative approaches to coaching through intensive breakout sessions dedicated to age-specific teaching and techniques.

### **FLYERS TO HOST 2016 CCM/USA HOCKEY ALL-AMERICAN PROSPECTS GAME**

The Philadelphia Flyers and Wells Fargo Center have been selected to host the fifth annual CCM/USA Hockey All-American Prospects Game. The CCM/USA Hockey All-American Prospects Game includes two teams made up of the top American-born prospects eligible for the 2017 NHL Entry Draft. The game will take place on Thursday, Sept. 22, with opening faceoff set for 7 p.m. ET. Tickets are on sale at ComcastTIX.com, by calling 1-800-298-4200, or by visiting the Wells Fargo Center Box Office.

### **2016 WORLD CUP OF HOCKEY TO TAKE PLACE**

Nationwide Arena in Columbus, Ohio, will serve as host for Team USA in preparation of the 2016 World Cup of Hockey. The camp, which will begin Monday, Sept. 5, will culminate on Friday, Sept. 9, with a game against Canada at Nationwide Arena. The 2016 World Cup of Hockey will take place from Sept. 17 - Oct. 1 in Toronto and includes the U.S., Canada, Czech Republic, Europe, Finland, North America and Sweden.

### **WORLD JUNIORS RETURNS TO BUFFALO IN 2018**

On Dec. 4, 2015, USA Hockey announced that the Buffalo Sabres, along with First Niagara Center, HARBORCENTER and Ralph Wilson Stadium, will serve as host for the 2018 IIHF World Junior Championship. The tournament, which will take place Dec. 26, 2017-Jan. 5, 2018, will include an outdoor game as part of the preliminary round for the first time ever.
