



# **RETURN TO GLORY: THE 2018 WILDCATS**



Since football first debuted at Saint Ignatius High School in 1911, the sport has captured the hearts and minds of many Wildcats.

The football program developed into a strong program over the years. The Wildcats won 12 city championships from 1925-1977, including four under legendary coach and athletic director John Wirtz.

But the Wildcats did not truly become a state and national powerhouse until one of Wirtz's pupils assumed the reins. In 1983, a young Charles "Chuck" Kyle '69 took over the helm and made an immediate impact. For the next five seasons, the Cats earned winning records and sniffed greatness.

In the offseason, following a 6-4 campaign in 1987, the rising seniors and juniors carried a quiet confidence into the 1988 season. The junior class had not lost at either the freshman or JV levels. Even Kyle showed confidence.


"I remember Coach Kyle would have these talks with the players a month or so after the season ended," Pete Fitzpatrick '90 recalled in an interview with Eddie Dwyer. "There I was, a sophomore going to be a junior, and he told me we were going to win the state championship [in 1988]. Honestly, I thought he was off his rocker. We had never even been to the playoffs."

The 1988 season was magical, with plenty of incredible memories along the way. Guided by quarterback Joe Pickens '90 and playmakers such as defensive end Chris Adler '89, linebacker Kareem Ingram '90, and safety Barry Alvis '89, the Cats stormed the playoffs and then the championship game at the Horseshoe. Thanks to a late, memorable goal line stand, the Wildcats won, 10-7, to capture the school's first football state title.

Now, 30 years later, the 2018 Wildcats are eager and hungry for another state championship.

The Football Cats have come close to attaining the 12th title in program history in the last two seasons, but fallen just short. This year, the Wildcats have a host of returning playmakers and a thirst for glory.

Thus, the theme of the 2018 season for the Wildcats will be "Return to Glory."

If time permits, credentials will be mailed, otherwise all passes will be made available at Media Will Call.

#### **PHOTOGRAPHERS**

Credentials for photographers will be issued to those representing newspapers, bona fide publications, and other periodicals by Athletic Director Rory Fitzpatrick or Communications Coordinator for Athletics Joe Ginley. Please make requests in advance. All photographers are expected to honor all sideline policies and are not permitted in the team bench areas, lockerrooms, or other restricted areas within Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium without prior written authorization from the Saint Ignatius Athletic Department.

#### PRESS BOX / MEDIA SEATING

The Press Box at Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium is located atop the east side (home side) bleachers. The working media area of the press box will accommodate a maximum of 32 people. Separate coaches' boxes are available for team personnel only.

For featured games, media members will be assigned seats in the press seating area and seating assignments will be posted throughout the press box.

Approved media or photo credentials can be obtained at the Media Will Call window located in the Day Drive ticket booth of Byers Field. The Will Call window opens approximately 90 minutes before the game.

#### PRESS BOX / MEDIA PARKING

Limited media parking is available in the Ridge Road Lot on the east side of Byers Field. No passes will be granted for this lot and spaces are available on a first-come, firstserved basis.

#### TV / RADIO

Local TV crews and visiting radio crews should request permisssion to broadcast games at Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium through the Saint Ignatius Athletic Department or Communications Department. Courtesy phone lines will be assigned to TV / radio crews on a first-come, first-served basis. All media outlets are responsible for long distance call fees.

Only accredited internet sites will be granted game-day credentials or access to Saint Ignatius coaches/ players for interviews. Requests will be considered and granted on a space-available basis.

McCormick serves as the Director of Development and Planned Giving at Saint Ignatius.




# Communications Coordinator, Athletics & SIBN Moderator Joe Ginley '12

# **SEASON PREVIEW**

### WILDCATS HOPE TO USE SKILL AND SPEED TO RETURN TO CANTON

OHIO CITY - For the 105th time, young men from Saint Ignatius High School gathered at the corner of West 30th and Lorain to prepare for a football season, with high hopes of glory.

Thirty-five years ago, a young Chuck Kyle '69 arrived for his first season as head coach of the Wildcats. Today, the 11-time champion head coach prepares to lead his men yet again, hoping to guide the Wildcats to the program's 12th state championship.

The Wildcats celebrate a number of anniversaries this season – 80 years since the Alma Mater was written, 50 years since Kyle's 1968 team won the City Championship, 30 years since the first state title team in 1988 – but Kyle has his team focused on the present.

The Wildcats have plenty of talent on both sides of the ball, including a number of players who will play both ways. Working hard in the offseason with Strength & Conditioning Coach Anthony Rubino, the Wildcats have been preparing for 2018 since falling to Mentor in last year's Regional Final, 23-21.

This year, the Wildcats have a tough schedule but are prepared for the challenge. Here is a position-by-position preview of the Wildcats.

#### **QUARTERBACKS**

Heading into summer camp, the Wildcats did not have a starter at quarterback. Last season's starters graduated, leaving the team with no signalcallers with any on-field varsity experience.

Senior Patrick Delahunty and junior Griffin Hanna entered as the top two contenders. As of press time, Delahunty had gained a slight edge in the competition, thanks to his experience in the offense.

As Nick Restifo, the Wildcats' offensive coordinator and QB coach, explained, Delahunty and Hanna each have distinct skills and abilities.

"Pat Delahunty, as a senior, has shown leadership and Griffin has great athletic ability," Restifo said. "We'll see how it goes. We have two talented, quality athletes at that position. As a senior, Patrick has been in the program for four years, so I would expect him to know the offense a little better, seeing as Griffin was injured his freshman year. Last year, he got a good baptism as a JV quarterback and got a lot of snaps, but it's only one year in the offense. But there are some things where it takes a while to really feel comfortable back there."

The offense, as a whole, will look like a traditional Wildcats attack. Fans will see the patented zone run, run-pass options, and a refined passing game.

"The offense is always evolving. We build on what we've done well in the past and we add a few new wrinkles here and there, and we add to the offense in that fashion," said Restifo. "The thing you have to be aware of, in any offense, is you're not trying to do too much. You want to work to the strengths of what your players can do. But we're pretty much an inside zone, outside zone team. Our quar-

terback will run, as well. Obviously, we pass the ball pretty well. Our passing game is pretty sophisticated. The kids know when they can run and when they can take off."

#### **RUNNING BACKS**

The Wildcats have a plethora of talent returning at running back this season. It might be the offense's top unit entering the season.

Senior Jahadge "Bo" Floyd will be the bellcow for the Wildcats this year. As a junior, Floyd rushed for 1,078 yards and 8 touchdowns, showing off his skill in finding and making holes to run through. Floyd has bulked up in the offseason and is ready for another strong season.

"We have a lot of fun with Bo, because he's very laid back," said Terry Fergus '72, the Wildcats' running backs coach. "But you give him the football, and he's not laid back. He has the right attitude.

"His feel for where the hole is going to be is uncanny. You rarely see that. It's not brute force, it's not just, 'I'm the fastest guy on the field and hopefully, I'll break one.' He can make his own holes."

The Wildcats have plenty of talent behind Floyd, too. Jack Welcsh saw playing time as a sophomore following Mark Bobinski's injury. Welcsh tallied 214 yards and 4 touchdowns in 7 games. The rising junior can bruise opponents and hit a hole quickly.

Fellow junior Michael McNamara will also see playing time. Also a star baseball player, McNamara is a bowling ball of a running back. He broke out for 60 yards and a touchdown on five attempts vs. Euclid in last year's Regional Semifinal. McNamara is a special athlete.

#### WIDE RECEIVERS / TIGHT ENDS

Last season, Sammy Snyder dominated the catches, nearly eclipsing the 1,000-yard mark. This year, the Wildcats hope to spread the ball more, with a number of targets at wideout and tight end.

The top returning wideout is Nigel Drummond II. The senior has gamebreaking speed and great hands, with the ability to change a game. He'll also play some at cornerback. Speedster Jack Kennedy returns for his senior year after missing much of last season. Connor Cmiel will also

see lots of snaps at wideout, using his speed and 6'2" frame to beat opposing defensive backs.

Other names to watch include Luke Cooper, Dominic DeVengencie, and Zach LaPorte.

The Wildcats have talent at tight end, including returning senior John Cannon. Primarily a blocker last season, Cannon will look to haul in more passes in 2018. Senior Aidan Wells, though primarily a defensive end, will see snaps at tight end this year. Another Wildcat to watch is Jake Lang. The incoming junior is a strong, smart athlete.

#### **OFFENSIVE LINE**

One of the Wildcats' strengths last season was the offensive line. This season, the Wildcats will have to rebuild, as all five starters from last year graduated.

But the Wildcats do have players who saw action last year, namely Grant Abbott and Xavier Everett. Abbott figures in as a likely center, though the Bowling Green commit can play any position. Everett will also serve as a key leader.

Owen Murphy, Tony Georges, and Nick Schwitzgebel have all impressed in camp, and Seamus McCarthy and Seamus Cooney will also figure into the action.

"Overall, the work ethic is stong with this group. This goes back to the culture aspect. If they weren't working hard, they wouldn't be at the position," said Offensive Line Coach Paul Yappel. "Collectively, if there's one thing I would emphasize, it's the five guys playing as one. We have to be a strong group."

#### **DEFENSIVE LINE**

Two leaders stand out on the defensive line for the Wildcats this season - Aidan Wells and Zach McMahan.

Wells, a Harvard commit, and McMahan combined for 30.5 tackles, 8 tackles for loss, and 5.5 sacks last year, and bring senior leadership to the group.

If you are a fan of HBO's Hard Knocks, which this year is following the Cleveland Browns throughout training camp, you are familiar with linebacker Christian Kirksey's question to his teammates: "What is your why?" That is, why do you play football?

McMahan's "why" is "to continue the lineage of Saint Ignatius and all those who support the school." Wells' "why" is "definitely playing for the guys that have come before us. I can vividly remember seeing disappointment on the faces of the 2016 team in the locker room following

our loss in the state title game. It's something I never want to experience again. Likewise, the D-line was particularly close with the seniors on the 2017 team, and all of us are playing for them. We want to make them proud."

Other playmakers to watch at the position this season include Anthony Gerace, Max Watters, Rico Levert, and Seamus Cooney. This group will likely cycle in at defensive tackle and as subs for McMahan and Wells.

#### **LINEBACKERS**

One of the Wildcats' top players this season will anchor the team's Linebacker Legion - Tommy Eichenberg.

The Boston College commit starred on last year's defense, notching a team-best 81 tackles. Eichenberg also poured in 19 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks, 9 quarterback hits, and 2 interceptions.

The other two linebacker spots?

"Besides Eichenberg, the other spots are open. We have two seniors and a lot of juniors," Ryan Franzinger '02, the Wildcats' defensive coordinator and LB coach, said. "Typically in the past, if guys have been good enough to play, they'll play. Not everyone can start, but if you're good enough to play, you will play some, it helps to keep people fresh and get players experience."

During camp, seniors Caden Campolieti and Kyle Sullivan have been competing for the gigs, along with juniors Aidan Crummie, Connor Francz, Jake Lang, and Michael McNamara. Sophomores Aidan Conway and Aidan Hubbard also might see time on the field this season.

In determining the other two starters, Franzinger will use two pieces of criteria.

"Each player needs to demonstrate that you know what to do, then you can execute it well," Franzinger said. "You always have some guys who know the whole playbook but don't execute well, and then you have other guys who are tremendous athletes but don't follow the playbook well. It's the coach's job to figure out who puts the team in the best position."

#### **DEFENSIVE BACKS**


One of the Wildcats' deepest positions this year is defensive back. Jett Elad and Connor Cmiel each return, as the two started as shutdown corners last year, and will continue to see time there this season. Safeties Danny Scelza and Chris Velotta, Jr. are back, ready to serve as smart, playmaking security blankets.

Jack Welcsh and Nigel Drummond II plan to play both ways this year, as Welcsh will see time at safety and Drummond will be called upon at corner. Speedsters Dominic DeVengencie and Jack Kennedy will figure into the action, as well.

Mitch Puhalsky and Merick Hartley have been the unsung heroes of the camp, providing two great options at free safety for the Wildcats.

#### SPECIAL TEAMS

Kicker/punter Matt Trickett has graduated, but the Wildcats have talent ready to go. Senior Pat Otter has a great leg as a punter and kicker, with Rory McConville and Declan Mangan ready to provide support. Sean Wracher will handle long snapping duties with skill again this year, after committing to Indiana during the summer.



# WILDCATS TO WATCH

### #20 JAHADGE "BO" FLOYD



Senior running back Bo Floyd will be the full time workhorse in the Wildcats' backfield this season.

Floyd stepped up last season following an injury to senior Mark Bobinski, showcasing his breakaway speed and finishing the season with 1,078 rushing yards, along with eight trips to the end zone. Floyd was also a nice complement to the Wildcats passing game, as he racked up 153 receiving yards including another touchdown. With the Wildcats graduating all five starting offensive linemen from last season, the new-look line will have to mesh quickly. Floyd and the offensive line will work to prove any doubters wrong early in the season. Senior lineman Grant Abbott will be key. Abbott recently committed to play at Bowling Green State University.

Floyd looks to build upon a standout junior season and use his speed and strength out of the backfield to push the Cats to yet another deep postseason run.



### **#45 TOMMY EICHENBERG**

Coming off a junior season that included 81 total tackles, 19 tackles for loss, 7.5 sacks, and three forced turnovers, it's safe to say Tommy Eichenberg is poised for another stellar season in the Wildcats' front seven.

The senior linebacker caused all sorts of problems for opposing offenses last season with his speed, agility, and his non-stop motor on the defensive side



of the ball. Coming into his second season on the varsity level, Eichenberg will be taking on a leader-ship role as a defensive captain for the Wildcats. At 6'3", 225 lbs, Eichenberg's versatility also allowed him to be used on the offensive side of the ball as a blocking tight end on the goal line. Ranked as a 4-star linebacker, Eichenberg received 15 Division I scholarship offers before committing to Boston College on June 27th.

### THE SECONDARY

The Saint Ignatius secondary returns a trio of key players in Jett Elad (left), Danny Scelza, and Connor Cmiel, who look to ensure that this year for the secondary is just as successful as the last.

Despite the graduations of Sands, Toppin and Viancourt, the Wildcats' secondary is still loaded with depth and talent all around. Elad, a Division I recruit who holds 11 scholarship offers, totaled 33 tackles last season, along with an interception returned for a touchdown and nine pass breakups. Scelza was also a mainstay in the secondary during the past season, placing third on the team with 51 tackles, and 10 tackles for loss.

Cmiel will also play a larger role in the secondary this year, as the junior saw his playing time increase mightily during the second half of last season. Year after year, the Wildcats' secondary never fails to produce top level talent, and always forces opposing quarterbacks to think twice before taking a deep shot down the field.





Saint Ignatius High School has a rich tradition of excellence in football, but few have accomplished or contributed more than Head Football Coach Chuck Kvle '69.

Now in his 36th season, Kyle has built a winning program based on doing things the right way. The results speak for themselves during Kyle's tenure.

Named head coach prior to the start of the 1983 season. Kyle has directed the Wildcats to a 345-87-1 (.798) record, 28 playoff appearances, 15 regional championships, and 11 state titles in that time. Kyle passed John Wirtz as the school's all-time winningest coach, on November 23, 1996, as the Wildcats defeated Canton McKinley, 31-24, in a state semifinal game played at the Rubber Bowl in Akron.

Kyle stays busy in the offseason. In July 2016, he was inducted into the National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Hall of Fame in a ceremony in Reno, Nevada. In May 2016, the Cleveland Browns hired Kyle as a youth football advi- Blue Streaks. sor to help with the team's youth football programs.

In 2013, Kyle was inducted into the Greater Cleveland Sports Hall of Fame along with Ted Ginn, Sr., Mike Hargrove and Earl Boykins.

In 2010. Kyle was inducted into the Ohio High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame and was presented with the Lifetime Achievement Award by the Greater Cleveland Sports Commission

In 2008, Kyle was named the head coach of the United States' first junior national football team, Team USA. The team competed in the International Federation of American Football Junior World Championship from June 27-July 5, 2009, at Fawcett Stadium in Canton. Kyle led the 2009 Team USA to



an undefeated season.

Kyle has earned Ohio Associated Press Coach of the Year honors four times, including in 1988 and 1989 after the school's first two football state titles.

Before becoming head coach, Kyle spent 11 years as an assistant coach at Saint Ignatius. Kyle coached backs and spent four years as the defensive coordinator.

Kyle also played football at Saint Ignatius, playing halfback for the Wildcats in 1967 and 1968. During his two years as a varsity player, Saint Ignatius had a mark of 18-1-1, captured the West Senate crown in each of those two years and won the 1967 Charity Game, 21-0, over Collinwood. Kyle also scored a touchdown in the 14-14 tie vs. Cleveland John F. Kennedy at Municipal Stadium in 1968.

From the time he first stepped onto the Saint Ignatius Saint Ignatius football has risen to unprecedented campus as a freshman in 1965, Kyle has been a part of over 50 seasons of Wildcats football. In that span, Saint Ignatius has amassed over 400 wins, 6 city championships, 11 state titles and the team has had only two losing seasons.

> Following his 1969 graduation from Saint Ignatius, Kyle continued his football career at Xavier University in Cincinnati. After one year (the Musketeers made a decision to disband the football program), Kyle transferred to John Carroll University to continue his playing career with the

> Besides his role as head football coach, Kyle teaches several classes in the English Department. He received the Rossing Award for Excellence in teaching in 1987.

Kyle has also served as head track and field coach for 46 years. The program has since won two state championships, including in 2016.

As a student, teacher, football player and coach, Saint Ignatius has always been the right place for Kyle.

"I think a person is always inclined to stay at a place where the situation is a good one," Kyle says. "That's been the case with Saint Ignatius and myself. This is an outstanding academic institution so I knew I'd get a good education. We also have a great football tradition here."

A native Clevelander, Kyle and his wife, Pat, have been married for 43 years and have four children.

### Saint Ignatius' Home Stadium Since 2001

(First official 'home' game was played on October 7, 2000, vs Canton McKinley)

The Wildcats have played at least one game at Byers Field in 33 of the last 35 years (seasons without games - 1984 and 1991)

2018 marks the 91st season that football has been played on this location, now known as Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium.

In 1921, the cities of Parma and Parma Heights opened the first high school for their residents on a site just outside the east bleachers. Seven years later, the apple orchard and grass field located behind the new school was converted into the athletic field with the gridiron laid out in a north-south alignment, just as it is today.

Despite being in the heart of the of The Great Depression, the WPA constructed a 200-seat stadium on the site, with the field made of hard clay. Regionally, the project was considered a 'White Elephant' because Parma, despite its growing populaton, was





still considered a rural city on the outskirts of the central city.

By 1937, the population growth of Parma and Parma Heights forced the city to build a new high school and the Ridge Road School was converted to a junior high, just as the country was coming out of the Depression.

As the varsity athletic competitions were no longer held on the site, the football field was under-utilized and fell into disrepair for more than a decade.

By 1951, nearly 100,000 residents called Parma and Parma Heights home and the sports programs at the high school, especially the football team, were again looking for a location to construct a suitable stadium for the everexpanding program.

Parma Schools superintendant Carl C. Byers proposed a plan to rehabilitate the decaying Ridge Road Stadium so that the future Parma Senior High School, which would be finished in 1953, would have a world-class facility. Byers was anxious to showcase an updated Parma football facility to gain entrance into the Lake Erie League.

Renovations of the stadium began that year. Lights were installed and the renovations were complete in time for the 1953 season. The Parma Board of Education unanimously voted to change the name from Ridge Road Stadium to Byers Field in commemoration of Byers, "whose contribution to education has been far-reaching, lasting and of incalculable value to the community, teachers, and pupils in the Parma City School District," according to a Plain Dealer article on March 26, 1953.

In 1962, Byers Field was again renovated and expanded. The locker rooms were renovated and

the press box was enlarged. This was also the biggest expansion era for Byers Field. It was expanded to seat an excess of 12,000 fans, with a portion of the old west bleachers moved to the north end of the stadium to accommdate endzone seating.

The expansion was completed in time for the recently-opened Valley Forge High School to play its first football game on site.

By the 1980's, five high schools played 'home' games at Byers Field – Parma, Normandy, Valley Forge, Holy Name, and Padua.

Renovations began again in 1991, as artificial turf replaced the grass surface in time for the 1993 season.

Recently, other renovations have been completed on the facility.

In the last decade, a new lighting system was installed, bleacher improvements (including installation of handrails) were completed along with renovations to the locker rooms, restrooms and concession areas.

Other improvements include the installation of a video board at the north end of the stadium, one of the largest video boards at a high school facility the state.

The press box, which has been upgraded in the past five seasons with a new working media area and new windows, seats 30 journalists and broadcasters.

New field turf was installed for the 2012 season. The stadium has also had handicap seating added to both sets of grandstands, including 46 wheelchair and companion seats on the home side of the stadium.

Parma City Schools invested nearly \$1.2 million into the facility during the summer of 2014, including a new parking lot on the south end of the stadium and the full replacement of the parking lot on the east side of the stadium under the press box.

On August 26, 2009, Byers Field was re-dedicated and renamed in honor of Robert M. Boulton, the retired Superintendent of Athletics for the Parma City Schools and a Parma Senior High grad.

The new name - Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium - was revealed, during a 50-yard line ceremony, to Mr. Boulton for his many years of service to the community.

## EUCLID COMMUNITY STADIUM vs. Euclid

In the last few years, the Euclid School District has updated and renovated a number of its facilities. A large part of the project was building a new football facility.

In early 2017, Euclid began construction on a new stadium. Construction continued quickly into the fall, and Euclid hosted its first game at the new stadium on November 3, 2017. Euclid defeated Massillon Jackson, 49-29, in the Regional Quarterfinal to open the new stadium.

Work on the stadium has continued into 2018, with work done on bathrooms, concession areas, and a new scoreboard. The stadium will be officially christened on Friday, August 24, 2018, as Euclid will host the Glenville Tarblooders.

The stadium's horseshoe shape is a defining characteristic of the stadium. Another memorable trait of the stadium is the close proximity of the stands to the field, as the stadium does not have a surrounding track.

The Motz Group installed a two-tone green turf with a block E at midfield. The field features blue end zones, with EUCLID at the North end zone and PANTHERS in the South end zone.

On the home side, the facility has a state-of-theart press box with two rows for media and staff. Other highlights include a video board and a large scoreboard.

At the old Sparky DiBiasio Stadium, the Wildcats had a 4-2 record. The Wildcats have played a total of 13 games in the city of Euclid, winning six, losing six, and tying once (6-6-1).

The Wildcats and Panthers enjoyed a mini-rivalry in the 1980s, particularly in the later stages of the decade.

The teams met in the playoffs in 1988 and 1989 and played the first-ever nationally televised high school game on September 2, 1989. The two games in 1989 were both memorable, as the contests featured star Saint Ignatius QB Joe Pickens '90 and Euclid's talented running back Robert Smith.

## TRESSEL FIELD at FINNIE STADIUM vs. West Toronto Prep

Tressel Field at George Finnie Stadium is the home of Baldwin Wallace Yellow Jacket football, men's and women's lacrosse, men's and women's soccer and men's and women's outdoor track and field.

Finnie Stadium was built in 1971 and has a capacity of 7,800. The Finnie Stadium field was dedicated as Tressel Field as part of donation by the Tressel Family in the summer of 2008.

During the summer of 2018, the Tressel Field playing surface was upgraded with new turf and a safety pad to reduce concussions.

In August of 2016, the construction of a new video scoreboard, which is one of the largest in all of NCAA Division III, was completed. The video scoreboard measures 21 feet and 11 inches high by 36 feet wide. The video area measures 10'11" high and 36' wide and can be divided into five separate zones.

Also a part of the Tressel Family donation, the track surface was updated to the same surface that was used during the 2008 Beijing Olympics.

Finnie Stadium has hosted three NCAA Division III national championship track meets, numerous NCAA and Ohio High School Athletic Association football playoff games as well as being the home field to Berea-Midpark High School. The Ohio Sports Festival/Ohio State Games have also used Finnie as both a regional and state championship site.

Finnie Stadium is located at 100 E. Bagley Road next to Berea-Midpark High School and across the street from the Lou Higgins Center.

## TOM BALLABAN FIELD at St. Xavier

Built in 1962, Tom Ballaban Field at St. Xavier Stadium has seen many great teams play on its field, as the Bombers have fielded some impressive teams.

However, by the late-1990s, the field had begun to deteriorate, as the facility did not have stadium lights, had a grass playing surface, and a seating capacity of under 4,000.

Then in 2000, the school and athletic department began a capital improvement campaign of \$3.6 million for a new football stadium and athletic facility. In 2004, St. Xavier completed the project, as the newly constructed Ballaban Field was opened to the public.

When opened, Ballaban Field was one of the best athletic facilities not just in the Cincinnati region, but all of Ohio. The seating capacity was increased to nearly 7,000, lights were added, and artificial turf was installed.

The facility also now includes a state-of-theart press box, which can accomodate nearly 40 members of the media, along with coaches and game day staff.

In addition to football, Ballaban Field houses soccer, lacrosse, and rugby at St. Xavier.

The namesake of the stadium is legendary Bombers head coach Tom Ballaban, a 1951 graduate, who played offensive line there and began teaching and coaching football in 1953. He accrued a 142-91-8 record in a quarter-century as head coach.

### FIRST ENERGY STADIUM vs. St. Edward

This will be the fourth time that the Wildcats will pay a visit to FirstEnergy Stadium, home to the National Football League's Cleveland Browns. Saint Ignatius lost to Lake Catholic in 2010, 28-21; defeated Cardinal Mooney in 2012, 31-7; and beat St. Edward in 2016, 34-7. The first two of those games were part of the Cleveland Browns' High School Football Charity Game.

Construction on FirstEnergy Stadium began in May 1997 when it was announced that the Cleveland Browns were making a comeback to the city in 1999. It officially opened on September 12, 1999, when the Browns hosted the Pittsburgh Steelers.

The stadium is a natural concrete and glass structure, using precast and concrete for the upper concourse structure. The construction of the base and structure took more than 6,000 truckloads of concrete. The playing surface is Kentucky Bluegrass. FirstEnergy Stadium is one of the few NFL stadiums that has natural grass as its playing surface. The field has an underground heating system for the cold Cleveland winters and for when snow is on the field.

In January of 2013, after Jimmy Haslam bought the Cleveland Browns, he announced that the naming rights of the stadium would be sold to FirstEnergy Corporation, an Akron-based electricity service. Haslam then announced major renovations to the stadium, which included a new audio system, two new scoreboards (4th largest in the NFL), adding more seats to the lower bowl, improving concessions, installing WiFi around the entire stadium, more video screens around the stadium, and QB Matt Hoyer in the Plain Dealer preview of the enhancing the premium club suites.

### A LOOK BACK: First Game in the New Stadium **August 28, 2010**



Eight years ago this fall, the Saint Ignatius football team played its first game at the home of the Cleveland Browns since the team returned to a brand-new stadium in 1999.

The Browns played the Lake Catholic Cougars on August 28, 2010, in the second game of a doubleheader as part of the Browns' High School Football Charity Game.

The event harkened back to the days of the Cleveland Plain Dealer Charity Game, hosted at Cleveland Municipal Stadium from 1931-1968. Played on Thanksgiving Day, the game featured the Wildcats 12 times. Saint Ignatius won four City Championships and shared the title in 1950 and 1968. The program's first Charity Game appearance came in 1945 vs. Cathedral Latin.

Overall, from 1932-1980, the Wildcats played at Cleveland Municipal Stadium 27 times.

The Wildcats did not manage to win in the team's first trip to the new stadium, falling 28-21 to the Cougars. But the Cats enjoyed plenty of highlights.

Junior guarterback Matt Hoyer tossed three touchdown passes, including two to senior wideout David Joseph. Sophomore Tim McVey made his debut with a receiving touchdown, the start of a special career. Safety Mike Svetina starred on defense, as he was involved in more than 20 tackles.

### Wildcats open season with Thursday night road win over the Knights

AKRON - Coach Chuck Kyle's Wildcats came up with big plays on defense and timely efforts on offense in wearing down Archbishop Hoban, 17-3. Along with his 48-yard field goal, which accounted for the game's final points with just under three minutes left, and two extra-point kicks, Saint Ignatius' kicker/punter Matthew Trickett did his part in the battle of field position with his punting.

After Archbishop Hoban took a 3-0 lead on a 37-yard field goal by Jack Branham with 6 minutes and 16 seconds remaining in the second quarter, Quarterback Kyle Hall directed a drive that saw him combine with wide receiver Max Pike on a 34-yard touchdown strike. Trickett's PAT extended the Wildcats' lead to 7-3 with 3:39 left in the first half. Hall completed 15 of 25 passes for 213 yards. Wide receiver Sammy Snyder had 6 receptions for 112 yards, including a 57-yard catch.

On an 11-play 44-yard drive, which took five minutes and 5 seconds off the 3rd Quarter clock, Saint Ignatius scored, when the ball squirted loose off a running play from the Archbishop Hoban 2-yard line, Wildcats tackle Billy Corte recovered it for a touchdown. ## Wildcats score 24 unanswered points to put away Golden Eagles

PARMA - Matthew Trickett set a new Saint Ignatius record with a 59-yard field goal. Matt's kick, which was the fourth-longest in OHSAA history, came with 2 minutes and 6 seconds remaining in the third quarter and extended the Wildcats' lead to 34-10. Matt opened the scoring against GlenOak with a 42-yard field goal.

After Trickett's 42-yard effort staked The Wildcats to a 3-0 lead with 4:01 remaining in the first quarter, GlenOak put together a 7-play, 80-yard drive that was highlighted by a 51-yard touchdown run by the Golden Eagles' quarterback Tate Rhoads. Dean Sarris kicked the extra-point and GlenOak led, 7-3, with 28 seconds left in the opening quarter. Saint Ignatius regained its 3-point advantage on a 37-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Danny Alexander to wide receiver Sammy Snyder and the extra point by Trickett with 10:22 to go in the first half. After the Golden Eagles knotted the score at 10 on a 31-yard field goal by Sarris with 6:41 in first-half, the Wildcats stunned GlenOak by scoring on a 66-yard TD pass from Alexander to wide receiver Connor Kennedy with just 20 seconds left in the first half. Following another PAT by Trickett, the Wildcats led, 17-10, at halftime.

Saint Ignatius took control after Alexander and Kennedy hooked up again, this time on a 31-yard TD strike that saw Alexander find Kennedy in the end zone. That score, combined with a 2-yard touchdown run by Alexander, two more PATs by Trickett and Matt's record-setting field goal had the 'Cats leading 34-10 late in the third quarter. GlenOak scored the game's final 10 points off a 6-yard touchdown run by Rhoads, the ensuing extra point by Sarris and Sarris' 32-yard field goal with 2:13 left in the game.

BY THE NUMBERS: Saint Ignatius had 13 first downs to GlenOak's 11. The Golden Eagles rushed for 181 yards on 41 carries and the Wildcats totaled 157 yards on the ground off 37 rushing attempts. The total offensive plays and yards showed Saint Ignatius with the edge in yards, 336 to 240. Both teams ran 53 plays Rhoads rushed for 109 yards and two TDs on 14 carries And Michael Rekstis had 54 yards on 21 carries. WESTERVILLE - Saint Ignatius fell to the Archbishop Moeller Crusaders 41-20.

Moeller defensive back Alexander Deyhle intercepted a pass on the third play from scrimmage at the Wildcats 33-yard line. After a catch by tight end Brenden Bates, Moeller scored on an 11-yard touchdown by tailback Colin Thurman. The extra-point kick failed and it was a 6-0 game with 9 minutes and 37 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

## Wildcats avenge state title loss, downing the Bombers at Byers

PARMA - The 8-1 Saint Ignatius Wildcats defeated the previously undefeated and state's top-ranked St. Xavier Bombers, 28-14, and ended defending state champion and Associated Press Poll Division 1 top ranked Saint Xavier's 14 game winning streak, 28-14. Saint Ignatius avenged last year's 27-20, double-overtime loss to St. Xavier in the state title game.

Saint Ignatius' defense limited the Bombers to a net 31 yards on the ground. The Wildcats, behind 215 yards rushing off 36 carries by tailback Jahadge "Bo" Floyd, totaled 269 rushing yards.

Jahadge opened the scoring with a 75-yard touchdown burst off a third-down-and-5 from the Wildcats' 25-yard line with 2 minutes and 33 seconds remaining in the first quarter. Kicker Matthew Trickett added the extra point for a 7-0 lead.

PARMA - The 10-1 Wildcats trailed Perry, 7-0, with 11:56 remaining in the first half and 7-3 at halftime before adjusting to the Wing-T offense and controlling the final 24 minutes, in a 24-7 victory over the Panthers.

Led by its Wing-T quarterback Max Baker and running backs Tyler Cowan, Jarin Curtis, Richard Coleman and Sha'VeA Lightner, the Panthers put together a 9-play, 80-yard drive that was capped off by Baker's 9-yard scoring run and the extra-point kick by Caden Basham with less than a minute gone in the second quarter.

Perry outrushed the Wildcats, 187-64, in the first half and for the game the Panthers had a net 304 yards on the ground off 52 rushes. Saint Ignatius totaled a net 149 yards rushing on 38 carries.

The 'Cats closed to 7-3 by halftime on a 38-yard field goal by kicker Matt Trickett.

The second half belonged to the Wildcats as quarterback Danny Alexander connected with tailback Jahadge "Bo" Floyd on a 32-yard touchdown pass that highlighted a nine-play, 88-yard drive. Trickett's PAT made it a 10-7 game with 2:56 left in the third quarter.

After a fumble recovery at the Perry 3-yard line by nose tackle/fullback Aidan Gill, running back/defensive back Jack Welcsh scored off a third-and-goal from the 1. Another Trickett extra point gave Saint Ignatius breathing room at 17-7 with 2:03 to go in the third quarter.

With the defense continuing to make the adjustments, a 5-yard scoring run by Alexander and Trickett's third PAT put the 'Cats in control at 24-7 with 8 minutes and 46 seconds remaining to be played. It was his seventh rushing touchdown on the season.

Alexander was 11-of-19 passing for 154 yards, a touchdown and no interceptions, giving Danny 1,101 yards and 11 TDs for the season. Perry managed just a net 4 yards through the air.

Wide receiver Nigel Drummond II had four receptions for 64 yards. Floyd led the ground game by picking up 114 yards on 20 carries. Welcsh finished with 25 yards and a TD on seven carries. "Bo" now has 866 yards rushing off 137 carries.

Perry's Baker had 78 yards off 13 carries, Cowan totaled 72 yards off eight carries, Lightner also had eight carries that produced 65 yards, and Curtis carried 17 times for 54 yards.

STAT OF THE NIGHT: Perry ran 57 plays for 308 yards and Saint Ignatius ran 57 plays for 303 yards.

## Dominance on the ground paves way to rematch win over Euclid

## Wildcats' season ends with a heartbreaking loss to the Cardinals

BEDFORD - The Mentor Cardinals scored the winning points on a 27-yard field goal by Conor McIntosh with 37 seconds remaining and then watched a 52-yard field goal attempt by Saint Ignatius sail wide left in the final seconds.

Mentor took a 7-0 lead on a 7-play, 80-yard drive that featured a 36-yard touchdown run by TB Elijah McDougal. McIntosh's extra-point kick was good with 9 minutes and 36 seconds remaining in the first quarter. McDougal's TD came on a fourth down-and-1 from the Wildcats' 36. Saint Ignatius answered with a 12-play 73-yard scoring drive. Tailback Jahadge "Bo" Floyd scored from 1-yard out and the extra point by kicker Matthew Trickett tied the score at 7 with 5:28 left in the first quarter.

The Wildcats rode a third-down reception by TB Jack Welcsh, the running of Welcsh and Alexander, and a diving reception by WR Connor Kennedy to a first-and-goal at the Mentor 2. After a holding penalty on the 'Cats made it first-and-goal at the 13, Snyder came up with a catch at the 1-yard line and from there Alexander scored. Trickett's PAT stretched Saint Ignatius' lead to 14-7.

The third quarter saw Mentor scoring from McDougal, on an 18-yard run off a 10-play, 80-yard drive. McIntosh's PAT tied the score at 14 with 5:42 left in the third quarter.

Saint Ignatius drove 59 yards in eight plays and went back on top off a 13-yard TD run by Welcsh and the extra point by Trickett with 3:10 remaining in the third quarter. Welcsh kept the drive alive by picking up a first down off a fourth-and-1 from the Cardinals' 29. Most of the fourth quarter belonged to Mentor, as QB Tadas Tatarunas hurt the Wildcats with his poise under pressure on third down conversions and his ability to scramble for big yards.

A 32-yard touchdown pass, Tatarunas to wide receiver Luke Floriea cut the Cardinals' deficit to 21-20 and the Wildcats held that 1-point advantage after they blocked the attempt for the tying extra point with 7:45 remaining. The TD finished off an 8-play, 83-yard drive.

Mentor's offense put together a 17-play, 71-yard march that ate up 5 minutes and 15 seconds, and ended with McIntosh's eventual game-winning field goal. Saint Ignatius' 52-yard field goal attempt, which sailed away to the left in the final 5 seconds, came after a catch by Floyd and a scramble for a first down by Alexander. The ensuing missed field goal ended the Wildcats' season in Bedford.

# **CHRISTIAN ACTION TEAM**

## A DIFFERENT KIND OF TEAM

The largest team at Saint Ignatius doesn't hang any banners in the hallway between Sullivan and Murphy gyms. There are no cuts, and everybody gets to play. Sure, different seasons bring about different activities, but the hundreds of student members involved in this team are going strong 365 days a year.

The Christian Action Team, more commonly known as C.A.T., is a team unique to Saint Ignatius High School. Students work to fulfill the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy and the Seven Themes of Catholic Social Teaching, and they do this through 20 different Christian Service Initiatives.

Some of the flagship C.A.T. programs are the Saint Benedict Joseph Labre Ministry to the Homeless, which has shared food and friendship with Cleveland's homeless community for nearly 16 years, and which has been adopted at high schools and colleges nationwide. Approximately 500 juniors and seniors compose the Saint Joseph of Arimathea Pallbearer Ministry, which carries the deceased to their final resting place. Often those served in this ministry are very poor and have no family to pray for the repose of their soul. Many other Catholic high schools around the country have begun similar programs in imitation of this one.

Five days a week, Saint Ignatius students can mentor, tutor and coach neighborhood youth through Arrupe after-school programs. In addition to bigbrother programs, Arrupe includes homework help, sports, LEGO Robotics, and field trips.

Two signature events of C.A.T. are the Rini Family Christmas Food Drive and Spring Into Action. The food drive is the culmination of eight weeks of





student planning, which results in thousands of collected food items, thousands of dollars in donations and the delivery of 700 large food baskets to needy families throughout Cleveland on the Saturday before Christmas. Spring Into Action is a neighborhood day of service in Ohio City, whereby student leaders coordinate cleanup tasks at various sites with community partners. Together, these initiatives help Saint Ignatius students see the residents of Ohio City and the greater Cleveland area as their own neighbors.

All told, during the 2017-2018 school year, Saint Ignatius students voluntarily gave more than 15,000 hours of their time through Christian service. Through the many initiatives of C.A.T., Saint Ignatius students grow in their understanding of the world around them, build relationships with those on the margins, discern where their faith calls them to action, and find God in all things.

With the Christian Action Team, there is no bench, there is no score, there are no first, second or third teams. Everybody plays. Everybody serves. Everybody works toward the same goal: to give greater glory to God.




