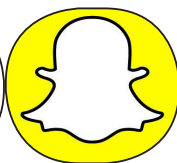

Wildcats Storylines ...

PROMISING START: The 2016 Wildcats have come roaring out of the gate thus far. Coach Kyle's Cats own a 2-0 record, marking the first time since 2012 the team has won its first two contests. The offense's fast start (94 points) is no surprise, as the team scored 119 points in its first two games last year. The defense's performance is a change, however. The 2007 season marks the last time the Cats allowed just 7 points in its opening pair of games.

BIG LEAP: The Wildcats easily handled the Mentor Cardinals last week, 49-7, using a big edge in the trenches to secure the team's first win over Mentor since 2013. Following the win, the Cats rose quickly in the polls, now ranking second in the computer rankings and #7 in the cleveland.com Super 25.

WINNING IN THE TRENCHES: The hidden reason for the Wildcats' success thus far is the strong play of the offensive and defensive lines. The offensive line has paved the way for a bruising rushing attack, which is responsible for 506 yards this season. The Wildcats' backs are averaging an impressive 6.7 yards per carry. On the other side of the line, the front seven has attacked Normandy and Mentor's offenses. The two teams have combined for just 183 total yards, as the Cats have 18 tackles for loss and 5 sacks.

DEPTH IN NUMBERS: The Saint Ignatius defense has showcased its depth so far this season, with 35 different Wildcats recording a tackle. Eight different Cats have had a hand in a sack, too. Defensive Coordinator Ryan Franzinger and his Cats will look to utilize that depth again today, and spread the playing time around.

RUN AT WILL: To counter a potent Mentor offense, the Wildcats ran the ball early and often last week. The team's running backs racked up 278 yards on 48 carries. Mark Bobinski '18 and Jimmy Andrews '17 split the carries last week, with quarterback Patrick Ryan '17 successfully scrambling on several occasions. Dean Stowers '17 only received two carries against the Cardinals, but look for the small, quick back to receive a few more carries this week.

A DIFFERENT APPROACH: Thanks to the Wildcats' dominance on the ground, the offense has only had to pass the ball 34 times in two games. Saint Ignatius may look to Ryan and backup quarterback Dan Alexander '18 for more contributions this week, considering Valley Forge's eight-man front on defense.

HIT THE ROAD, JACK: After today's game, the Wildcats will be on the road until the end of October. However, Saint Ignatius will return to Byers Field on October 1, albeit as the visitors.

UPDATE ON THE WILD KITTENS: The freshman team defeated the Kirtland Hornets, 28-0, at Wasmer Field on Thursday. The JV team plays Painesville Riverside on Saturday at 10 a.m.

UP NEXT: The Wildcats will travel to Novi, Michigan to play Detroit Catholic Central on Friday, September 16 at Byers Field.

Learning about the Patriots ...

TOUGH START: The Patriots have scuffled out of the gate this season, losing two straight to start the year, for the second consecutive season. North Olmsted and Revere have each handed the Patriots a loss this season.

A DIFFERENT STYLE: The Patriots have transitioned to a seldom-used offense in the second year of the Marcello DeAngelis era. Valley Forge will use a Wing-T offense, a system with old roots. The Patriots will use deception and fakes in the backfield to deceive the Wildcats' defense. The system has worked well thus far this season, netting the Patriots 47 points, more points than the team scored in its first four games in 2015. Quarterback John Quinones and running back Louis Arena will lead the way, as each have rushing touchdowns for the Patriots this season.

MORE ABOUT THE WING-T: A combination of the single wing and T-formation, the Wing-T utilizes a four-back system (with a tight end on the line of scrimmage) built to confuse defenses and give smaller teams an edge. As Tubby Raymond, the longtime Delaware coach who mastered the Wing-T, wrote in his book, "The Delaware Wing-T: An Order of Football" (©1986, Parker Publishing):

"This 'order of football' supersedes a formation, because it is a complete approach to the game. It begins with a numbering system that clearly communicates our offensive play and its assignments. It includes a design of offense that relates series and plays creating conflicts. It spreads skills requirements of players so they can realize their greatest potential and gives your team the best chance of winning [...] The Wing-T has been designed to be simple in its execution, but multiple in the problems it presents to the defense. The simplicity is accomplished by executing a relatively small number of blocking schemes. The multiplicity occurs when these blocking schemes are utilized by the three primary series and run from several formations."

STACK THE BOX: Just like the offensive system, the Valley Forge approach on defense is a different system than most. While a majority of high school teams use a 6 or 7-man front approach (the Wildcats play a 6-man front, 3-3-5 defense), Valley Forge uses an 8-man front. This style of defense is particularly suited to stopping the run, the Wildcats' strongsuit. However, the Patriots are still learning how to master the system, having allowed 88 points in the last two games. The North Olmsted Eagles managed 290 rushing yards in the opening game, too.

UP NEXT: The Patriots will travel to Knights of Columbus Field on Thursday, September 15 to play Elyria Catholic in a Great Lakes Conference matchup.

Wildcats celebrate rich tradition with win over Patriots in 1,000th game

Saint Ignatius, the area's third-ranked team, struck early and often against the Patriots in improving its record to 2-1.

Before the kickoff on Friday night, Valley Forge and the City of Parma Heights paid tribute to Coach Chuck Kyle's late father-in-law, Paul William Cassidy, who had a remarkable four-plus decades as the Mayor of Parma Heights (see the corner's story from Tuesday, Sept. 8).

As part of the recognition, a \$1,000 Scholarship was awarded from the Cassidy family to Valley Forge's outstanding senior student/athlete and two way lineman Dustin Nelson.

While Friday night was a milestone game for the storied football program from Cleveland's Jesuit Preparatory School, Coach Kyle '69, the most successful high school football coach in Greater Cleveland and the winningest Division I coach in Northeast Ohio, will direct his Wildcats Varsity program for the 400th time when Saint Ignatius travels to Pennsylvania next weekend (Saturday, Sept. 19) to face the Keystone State's two-time defending AAAA state champions St. Joseph's Prep, the Jesuit School of Philadelphia.

Saint Ignatius defeated St. Joe's Prep, 42-34, last season in what was a wild see-saw game at Byers Field. After Friday night's triumph over the Patriots of Valley Forge, Coach Kyle's career record is 318-80-1. Chuck is currently in his 33rd season as the head of his alma mater's football program.

UNDER THE FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS OF PARMA:

The persistent rain that swirled across Byers Field all night couldn't dampen the spirits of the Wildcats, as they were determined to bounce back from last weekend's 63-56 loss at Mentor.

After Friday afternoon's pregame Mass on campus, Coach Kyle turned to his players and said "men of character correct a flaw." Coach Kyle was referring to the Mentor game and the defensive assignments that were not fulfilled.

"Okay gentlemen, we're back on the football field. Correct the mistakes and play like we can," said Coach Kyle as his Wildcats huddled around him just seconds before Friday's opening kickoff.

What the record 11-time state champions and three-time national champions are capable of was more than a game bunch of Patriots (0-3) could deal with.

After a superb punt return by gifted senior wide receiver/defensive back Jack Cook had the Cats purring in Valley Forge territory, a pass from stand-out senior quarterback Dennis Grosel to promising junior wide receiver Michael Daugenti put the ball on the Patriots' 1-yard line.

Three plays later, tough and talented junior tailback Jimmy Andrews swept the left side and fought his way into the end zone from 2 yards out. Junior Colin Goodfellow kicked the extra point and Saint Ignatius led, 7-0, with 8 minutes and 46 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

Following a strong defensive charge by the Wildcats that was keyed by junior nose tackle Joe Gibbons and senior lineman Nate Keirn, the Cats took possession at their 45.

A 45-yard burst up the middle by Andrews made it first-and goal at the Patriots' 10 and from there Andrews fired up the gut again for his second trip to the Day Drive end zone.

With Gibbons and senior middle linebacker/co-captain Ben Cray helping keep Valley Forge on its heels offensively, Saint Ignatius began to take total control en route to scoring all 41 of its points in the first half.

Eddie Dwyer's Corner: Valley Forge Preview

From Wasmer Field in The Ohio City - Last season's matchup with Valley Forge on Byers Field was a very special night for Wildcats Hall of Fame Coach Chuck Kyle '69, his wife Pat and their family, as prior to the kickoff the City of Parma Heights and Valley Forge High School paid tribute to Coach Kyle's late father-in-law, Paul William Cassidy.

Mr. Cassidy had a remarkable career as the Mayor of Parma Heights for 43 years. His successor as mayor, Martin Zanotti, described Cassidy as "an outstanding mayor, an incredible family man and an undying patriot."

Mr. Cassidy, who passed away in July 2013 at the age of 94, won the Distinguished Flying Cross in World War II. He flew 28 missions over Europe and navigated the lead bomber on the first daylight raid of Berlin.

Cassidy practiced law before, during and after his years as mayor. He represented Cox Cable, Parma Community General Hospital and others from offices downtown, in Parma and in Parma Heights, and was an early champion of regional transit, a regional sewer system and strong regional government.

The third of six children, Mr. Cassidy was born in Pittsburgh and sold magazines there when he was just 5 years old. Living in the Glenville area of Cleveland by age 7, he began to deliver newspapers.

Mr. Cassidy graduated from legendary Cathedral Latin School and spent two years at John Carroll University before working at Cleveland Graphite Bronze and attending Cleveland-Marshall College of Law at night.

In 1942, Cassidy married Elise A. Romano and joined the Army Air Corps. He served with the 447th Bomb Group in England.

After the war, Mr. Cassidy represented General Motors to dealers and graduated from Cleveland-Marshall College of Law. He joined the Ohio bar in 1947 and moved to Parma Heights a year later. He practiced downtown at first, then in Parma and Parma Heights until retiring in 2009 at age 90.

Mr. Cassidy, said Coach Kyle, loved to read and discuss history, especially topics such as George Washington and the Civil War. In fact, Coach Kyle said his late father-in-law played the major role in the naming of Valley Forge High School, which is appropriately located on Independence Boulevard in Parma Heights and carries the nickname of the Patriots. In 2011, Zanotti told The Plain Dealer, "Paul Cassidy was Parma Heights' George Washington."

Coach Kyle grew up in Indiana before his family moved to Parma when he was in the sixth grade. Coach Kyle said he lived near the border of Parma and Parma Heights and spent a lot of time in Parma Heights. "I attended a lot of Valley Forge games as a kid," he said.

As part of the recognition for Mr. Cassidy that Friday night of September 11th, 2015, a \$1,000 Scholarship was awarded from the Cassidy Family to Valley Forge's outstanding student/athlete and two-way lineman Dustin Nelson from the Class of 2016. Coach Kyle said the Cassidy Family scholarship tradition will continue on Saturday night.

Here is The Corner's preview on what will be the ninth meeting on the gridiron between the Wildcats and the Patriots, and only their second since 1992, when they kick off at 7 PM Saturday on Byers Field in Parma's Robert M. Boulton Stadium.

After a 41-0 victory by the Wildcats last year, the 1,000th game in the history of Saint Ignatius football, the 'Cats lead the series, 7-1. Now senior tailback Jimmy Andrews helped fuel last season's dominant victory by scoring the game's first two touchdowns on runs of 2 and 10 yards.

Coach Kyle, the most successful high school football coach in Great Cleveland and the winningest Division I coach in Northeast Ohio, will be directing his Varsity Football Wildcats for the 408th time on Saturday night.

Saint Ignatius and Valley Forge met in football for the first time in 1986, Coach Kyle's fourth year at the helm of his alma mater. The Patriots came away with a 7-6 victory on a Byers Field that was a muddy quagmire thanks to Mother's Nature's week long rain assault.

After a 35-6 victory over Valley Forge in 1987, the Wildcats, in what was their first state championship season of 1988, rallied to a 14-13 victory over the Patriots when junior quarterback Joe Pickens scrambled away from heavy pressure on a third-and-20 from the Valley Forge 43 and found junior wide receiver Patrick Friend open in the end zone with just over four minutes remaining. The ensuing extra-point kick by Phil Mohr and an interception by senior defensive tackle Dave Vernon helped prevent Valley Forge from pulling off what would have been a major statewide upset.

Coach Kyle's 'Cats would go on to dominate the next four meetings with the Patriots

and add another resounding victory in the series last fall.

As for the 2016 Patriots, they stand 0-2, losing to North Olmsted, 39-14, and Revere, 49-33. The Eagles of North Olmsted rushed for nearly 300 yards against the Patriots and limited Valley Forge to 128 yards of total offense.

As per the OHSAA, the Patriots are a Division II, Region 6 program.

FROM COACH KYLE:

"Coming in, we thought we matched up well," said Coach Kyle of last week-end's outstanding all-around performance in a 49-7 victory over the always sound program from Mentor. "We spent some time looking at what we needed to work on from last year (a 63-56 loss at Mentor). So we felt good about the game plan and with our lines, we're going to have an effective front, no matter what.

"It was a very nice step," continued Coach Kyle. "Yes, it's early in the year and all of that, but winning that one, it feels like a cloud cleared away (snapping a three-game losing streak to the Cardinals). The kids get a little worried about playoffs all of the time and counting computer points. Well, let's not worry about that right now. Let's focus on becoming a better football team."

Saint Ignatius, now 2-0, will enter Saturday night's game ranked seventh in cleveland.com's Super 25 State Poll. Yes folks, the days of the area-only rankings, when "Cleveland area" teams would get excited if they cracked one of the lower 20 spots in the then Plain Dealer Top 25 poll, are just a fond memory. The record 11-time Division I state champion Wildcats entered the Mentor game as the 20th-ranked team in the "Super 25" and as a unanimous pick to lose by the cleveland.com staff.

Hey, everyone's entitled to their opinion. That's what makes polls so contagious and fun.

"Valley Forge has moved to doing a Wing-T offense," said Coach Kyle. "Whether it's high school or it's college, you don't see it that often. It's a bit of a problem, because it is so much misdirection.

"They're getting good at it," Coach Kyle said of the Patriots' new offense. "Last week (versus Revere) they scored plenty of points. We have to be disciplined in what we're reading. If we're looking in the backfield we're going to be in trouble. If you look in the backfield and are going the wrong way, and they have a reverse or counter called, look out. So it's a good week to work on those sort of details.

"It's not enough to just be aggressive, we have to read and react to what people do," Coach Kyle continued. "In an offense like that (the Wing-T), first down is so important. You try to get them in second and long, and get them out of their comfort zone."

Coach Kyle said that defensively, the Patriots are in an eight-man front.

"So after our game last week, when we ran it 45 times, I would think that we would see an eight-man front," said Coach Kyle. "But we're the type of team that okay, is that what you're giving us? Well, we have plan B also. On any level, you try to take what the defense is giving you. We feel we're prepared for anything the defense tries to take away."

Eddie Dwyer's Corner: Mentor Recap

Parma, Ohio - As Saint Ignatius' outstanding senior linebacker and captain Adam Shibley said more than once late Saturday night, "This is a different Saint Ignatius defense."

And unlike last season, when the Mentor Cardinals racked up 823 yards of offense in a 63-56 shootout victory over the Wildcats in Mentor, that "different" defense was more than Coach Steve Trivisonno's Cardinals could deal with.

Saint Ignatius, with its Hall of Fame Head Football Coach Chuck Kyle '69 describing his team's performance as a true team victory, with the highest mark going to the defense, dominated Mentor in the second half and went on to a resounding 49-7 victory on Byers Field in Parma's Robert M. Boulton Stadium.

In outscoring Mentor, 35-0, in the second half, the Wildcats snapped a three-game losing streak to the Cardinals and improved to 2-0 on the young season.

Mentor, which was coming off a 57-point performance in a one-sided victory over the Massillon Tigers, now stands 1-1.

Coach Trivisonno's Cardinals entered Saturday night's headliner as the ninth-ranked team in cleveland.com's "Super 25" state poll, 11 spots higher than Saint Ignatius. What is it they say about polls?

"This has been the goal since freshman year, to come out here and beat these guys," said Shibley, referring to the three-game losing streak to Mentor. "All offseason this was in our minds, this is the one we had to win. Our defense brought it, just like we always do. Last year, wasn't us. Look out for a new defense, we're here."

That new defense, combined with an offense that featured the leadership and athleticism of senior quarterback Patrick Ryan, an authoritative ground game led by the 1-2 punch of junior tailback Mark Bobinski and senior tailback Jimmy Andrews, a deep receiving corps, and one of the top offensive lines in all of Ohio, sent a large chunk of the Mentor faithful heading for the highway after the third quarter.

"Just hard work in the offseason, getting stronger," said Shibley of a 2016 front seven on defense that made things miserable for Mentor's talented junior quarterback Tadas Tatarunas for almost the entire game. Yes, the same young man who passed for 531 yards and four touchdowns versus Saint Ignatius last season.

Tatarunas was 7-for-16 for just 97 yards on Saturday night.

"We play with pride and passion, I just love these guys," added Shibley.

After Saint Ignatius moved to a 14-0 lead on a pair of 2-yard touchdown runs by Bobinski and two extra-point kick by multi-skilled junior Matthew Trickett, who also excels for the Wildcats' state and nationally acclaimed soccer program, Mentor got back in the game on a 47-yard touchdown pass from Tatarunas to junior wide receiver Derek Kleinhenz with 52 seconds left in the first half.

Following a fumble recovery at the Wildcats' 29-yard line with 35.7 seconds on the first-half clock, the Cardinals were threatening again.

But up stepped 'Cats' senior defensive back Matt Wiegandt, who intercepted a pass in the left corner of the jumbo screen scoreboard end zone. Matt's clutch effort came after Tatarunas was flushed from the pocket and had to throw on the run. Matt is a rare two-sport captain for this school year - football and hockey.

Coach Kyle was very pleased not only with his defense, but the balance the Wildcats displayed on offense in the second half.

Clinging to that seven-point halftime lead, Saint Ignatius came out for the third quarter and began to play as flawless as the perfect thumbnail moon that made itself comfortable over the visiting side of Byers Field.

With Andrews picking up tough, second-effort yards and Ryan, a first-year starter, running the offense like a savvy veteran, the Wildcats outscored the Cardinals, 21-0, in the third quarter. Saint Ignatius' take-charge attitude in the third quarter featured touchdown runs of 2 and 30 yards by Andrews and sandwiched in between Andrews' TDs was a 21-yard touchdown sweep over the left side by Ryan off a keeper that displayed Patrick's speed and vision.

It was Katy Bar the Door after Bobinski powered his way into the jumbo scoreboard end zone from 7 yards out and, following the PAT by Trickett, the OHSAA deficit rule of a running clock came into play with 6 minutes and 23 seconds remaining in the game.

As for Saint Ignatius' final touchdown, it was only fitting that it came from the de-



fense - a 43-yard pick six by senior linebacker Justin Perpar. The Wildcats also had an interception in the first half, a leaping effort by senior corner Alex Ringfield.

"We're motivated every week, but I think this week we were excited about this game," said Bobinski, who rushed for 138 yards and three touchdowns on 18 carries. Bobinski is from St. Mary's of Mentor Parish. "Our offensive line did an excellent job, all credit to them and the receivers blocking down field. The defense did a great job shutting them down. It was hard-nosed, good football out there."

"There was some motivation coming in, with everybody from The Plain Dealer (cleveland.com) picking us to lose," Mark continued. "It's truly special to come out here and do what we did tonight and with the way we prepare, I'm confident we can keep this going."

GETTING THEIR KICKS: Along with Matt Trickett's place kicking, senior Colin Goodfellow, an All-Ohio punter in 2015, was constantly forcing Mentor to start drives at its 20-yard line with booming kickoffs out of the end zone. A couple of Colin's kiss the sky efforts flirted with Saint Ignatius' outstanding Marching Band, which was sitting in the Day Drive end zone.

SOME NUMBERS TO CHEW ON: Saint Ignatius rushed the football 45 times for 263 yards. Patrick Ryan passed for 165 yards and rushed for 42 yards and a touchdown.

Mentor was limited to 50 yards rushing on 23 carries.

The Wildcats totaled 428 yards of offense on 69 plays and the Cardinals ran 41 plays for 147 yards.

Jimmy Andrews rushed for 79 yards and two TDs on 14 carries and leading the 'Cats' receivers were Travis Pot with 3 receptions for 38 yards, tight end/linebacker James Leyden with 2 catches for 44 yards, and Connor Kennedy and Ryan Cook, who each had two receptions for 30 and 26 yards, respectively.

Saint Ignatius was 10 of 13 on third-down conversions and Mentor was 1 for 8 on third down. The 'Cats led in first downs, 26-7, and in time of possession, 29:49 to 18:11 for the Cardinals.

Saturday night's encounter was the 20th game in the Saint Ignatius versus Mentor gridiron rivalry, with the 'Cats now leading the all-time series, 12-8.

LOOKING BACK: Saint Ignatius' 49-7 triumph over Mentor on Saturday night was the largest margin of victory in the series since 2009, when the 'Cats defeated the Cardinals, 47-7. Leading the defense in 2009 was All-Seven County area, All-District and All-Ohio linebacker Jake Ryan, who went on to a great career as a Captain for the Michigan Wolverines and is currently a starting linebacker for the Green Bay Packers. Patrick Ryan is Jake's cousin.

The Wildcats opened their state and national championship season of 1989 with a 43-2 victory at Mentor.

Eddie Dwyer's Corner: A History of Wildcats Football

Cleveland, Ohio - On September 11, 2015, the Saint Ignatius Wildcats added another milestone to their illustrious football legacy by playing their 1,000th game.

Coach Chuck Kyle's Wildcats, scoring all of their points in the first half, defeated the Valley Forge Patriots, 41-0, on Byers Field in Parma's Robert. M. Boulton Stadium.

Although the early years of Saint Ignatius football were not laden with the success Wildcats faithful have grown accustomed to, the man who put the football program on the local map was Mr. Ralph Vince, a graduate of Martins Ferry High School and Washington & Jefferson University who studied law at Western Reserve University.

The astute and eloquent Coach Vince guided his Golden Tornado, as Saint Ignatius was known then, to a City Championship in 1925, a 15-game winning streak and an overall record of 29-6 from 1923 through 1926. Those 29 victories included a City Runner-Up finish in 1926 and 19 shutouts. Coach Vince's legendary 1925 team yielded just 25 points all season and compiled 25 consecutive shutout quarters. In 1925 and 1926, the Golden Tornado posted 8-1 seasons.

Although the makeup of Ohio High School Football changed dramatically in 1972 with the birth of the Ohio High School Athletic Association's Harbin Postseason Computer Playoffs, Saint Ignatius continued to enjoy success on the area gridirons.

And directing a huge portion of those winning ways were Saint Ignatius Hall of Fame inductees, Coaches Mr. John J. Wirtz and Mr. Paul Nemec.

From 1951 through 1970, Coach Wirtz led his Wildcats to four City Championships and an overall mark of 146-40-6. Coach Wirtz put together one of the greatest teams in the history of area high school football - the 10-0 Hall of Fame City Champion Wildcats of 1964.

Behind one of the most storied all-around athletes ever to come out of Ohio - senior quarterback/safety Brian Dowling - Saint Ignatius capped its dominant '64 season with a 48-6 victory over Benedictine in the annual Thanksgiving Morning City Championship Charity Game at old Municipal Stadium. A crowd of 41,183 witnessed the Wildcats' dominance, as on the second play from scrimmage Dowling called his own number and rambled 71 yards for a touchdown.

Dowling's athletic careers at Saint Ignatius and Yale were so legendary that he became a regular character, "B.D.," in the Doonesbury Comic Strip.

Coach Nemec, who succeeded Coach Wirtz, also produced four City Championships. In 1972 and 1973, Coach Nemec's Wildcats finished 9-1. Paul put together an overall record at Saint Ignatius of 42-16-2.

Prior to Coach Wirtz and Coach Nemec, Coach Fred George compiled a record of 19-6-3 and won two City Titles while directing Wildcats football from 1948



through 1950.

As impressive as the records of Coach Vince, Coach Wirtz, Coach Nemec and Coach George teams were, Saint Ignatius Football would reach a whole new level of state and national recognition under one of Coach Wirtz's All-City tailbacks - Hall of Fame Coach Mr. Chuck Kyle.

Taking over his alma mater's football program in 1983, Coach Kyle has set a standard that most high school coaches can only dream about.

Saint Ignatius had never qualified for the OHSAA playoffs until 1988, when Coach Kyle began what is one of the greatest runs not only in football-rich Ohio, but the entire nation.

From his 14-0 Division I State Championship Team of 1988 came a string of an Ohio-best 11 big-school state football championships, including a record five row from 1991 through 1995. The 'Cats were state runners-up 1996.

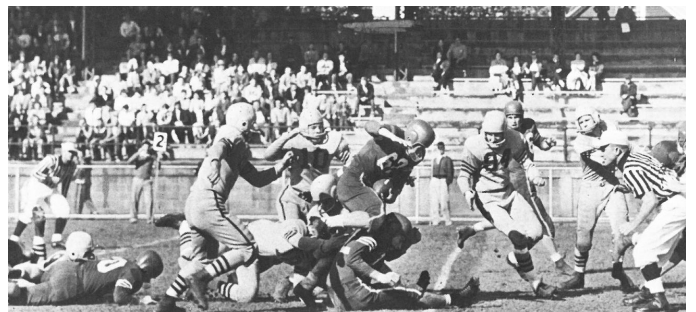
The most successful coach in Cleveland area high school football and the most successful Division I coach in Northeast Ohio with 321 career victories entering the 2016 season, Coach Kyle has also guided the Wildcats to National Championships in 1989, 1993 and 1995, and a National Runner-Up in 2008.

The 'Cats enter 2016 seeking their 27th OHSAA playoff appearance.

In what is one of this seasoned reporter's fondest memories in covering and reporting on Coach Kyle's teams for The Plain Dealer came moments after the dramatic 10-7 victory over Cincinnati Princeton in the Division I 1988 State Championship Game at Ohio Stadium in Columbus, which produced Saint Ignatius' first undefeated and untied season since 1964.

In the 'Cats' locker room at Ohio Stadium, Coach Kyle, while celebrating the dramatic goal-line stand that sealed the victory, lifted up his blue-and-gold sweater and pulled out two small gold footballs linked to a chain.

"They're from my grandfather's letter sweater when he played on a state championship team in Alabama in 1918 and from my dad's letter-sweater when he competed on a state-championship team in Indiana in 1937," Coach Kyle said. "I think I called on both of them in the end."

PRE-GAME PRESENTATION: CASSIDY FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP TO JUSTIN HORTON

For forty-three years, mayor Paul W. Cassidy served as mayor of Parma Heights, Ohio. Mayor Cassidy was very instrumental in the building and naming of Valley Forge High School, in honor of the courage and dedication of our Founding Fathers during the Revolutionary War.

But along with the close ties to Valley Forge High School, Mayor Cassidy had strong ties with St. Ignatius High School, where both of his sons and four grandsons attended. Also, Mayor Cassidy's son-in-law Chuck Kyle is the head football coach of the St. Ignatius Wildcats.

So to honor Paul Cassidy and to celebrate tonight's contest between the Patriots and the Wildcats, the Cassidy family is awarding a \$1,000 scholarship to an honor student who is a member of the Valley Forge football team. That student-athlete is Justin Horton.

TODAY'S VENUE: BYERS FIELD AT ROBERT M. BOULTON STADIUM

Built in 1928, Byers Field has long been a landmark in Parma, Ohio. But Parma schools are not the only programs to utilize the facility.

The Wildcats have played in Byers Field, recently dedicated as Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium, in 32 of the last 34 seasons. The Cats' first home game at Byers was a game against Canton McKinley on October 7, 2000.

Ever since, Byers Field has served as the Wildcats' home stadium for football. Since its construction, Byers has been renovated five times, including in 2013.

The facility now seats about 11,850 fans, plus over 30 members of the media in its renovated press box. The stadium features lights, artificial turf, and locker rooms for both home and away teams.

The Wildcats have an 88-24 record in 112 games at Byers.

Byers Field at Robert M. Boulton Stadium is named after Carl C. Byers, the Parma Schools superintendent who led the 1953 renovation of the stadium, and Robert Boulton, a retired Superintendent of Athletics for the Parma City Schools and a Parma Senior High grad.

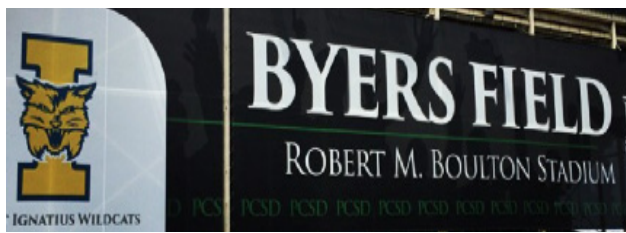
