## **TALKING POINTS**

### GOING FOR THE GOPHERS

The U.S. National Under-18 Team's matchup with the University of Minnesota on Friday night will be the sixth all-time meeting. The U18s are 1-4-1 all-time against the Golden Gophers but their last matchup was the first-ever win for the NTDP. The first overall pick in the 2016 NHL Entry Draft, Auston Matthews, tallied his second goal of the game with 1:33 remaining in overtime to give the Under-18 Team the victory against the fourth ranked Gophers on Nov. 21, 2014. Joseph Masonius, Caleb Jones and Matthew Tkachuk also scored for the U18s. Luke Opilka made 25 saves to pick up the win for the U18s. The two teams first played on Jan. 17, 2003 when the Golden Gophers blanked the NTDP 6-0. Minnesota has outscored the U18s, 31-12, all-time in the series.

### NTDP/MINNESOTA PLAYER HISTORY:

Prior to the 2016-17 season, the National Team Development Program had sent 29 players on to the University of Minnesota. Three former NTDP players are now with the Golden Gophers: defensemen Jack Glover, Ryan Lindgren and Ryan Collins.

Currently, two players playing for the U18s are committed to play college hockey at the University of Minnesota: Nate Knoepke (Farmington, Minn.) and **Scott Reedy** (Prior Lake, Minn.).

### **NCAA OPPONENTS:**

The U.S. National Under-18 Team will skate in 17 NCAA games this season, including 12 tilts with Division I squads. Team USA faces a challenging sevengame schedule in October alone, which includes five teams ranked in the most recent USA Today / USA Hockey Magazine Men's College Hockey Poll.

Last Saturday, the U18s took to the ice against #13 Harvard University at the Bright-Landry Hockey Center and dropped a 5-2 decision. Nate **Knoepke** (Farmington, Minn.) and Randy Hernandez (Miami Fla.) picked up goals for Team USA. Adam Scheel (Lakewood, Ohio) made 31 saves in 55:37 of play. NTDP alum Adam Fox added four assists for Harvard. Prior to playing the Crimson on Saturday, the Under-18 Team fell to second-ranked Boston University at Agganis Arena, 8-2, on Thursday night. Jacob Tortora (Victor, N.Y.) and **Josh Norris** (Oxford, Mich.) added shorthanded breakaway goals for Team USA, while four NTDP alumni on the Terriers roster recorded points for Boston University, Earlier this month, The U18s fell to the University of Notre Dame, 5-1, in South Bend, Indiana. D-I teams that will skate against the Under-18 Team at USA Hockey Arena this season include Princeton University (Oct. 29) and Arizona State University (Feb. 24-25).

### **POINT-PER-GAME**

**Evan Barratt** (Bristol, Pa.) and **Josh Norris** (Oxford, Mich.) currently lead the U18s in scoring, each registering seven points in seven games played.

### **SHOOTING GALLERY**

**Grant Mismash** (Edina, Minn.) currently leads the team in shots on goal. He has registered 26 shots over nine games (2.89/game) which has led to two goals on the season.

### **MATTHEWS SETS DEBUT RECORD**

**Auston Matthews**, who played for the NTDP from 2013-15, recorded four goals in his NHL debut for the Toronto Maple Leafs on Wednesday, Oct. 12 against the Ottawa Senators. This marks the most goals scored by a player making his debut in NHL history.

### 59 ALUMS ON OPENING NIGHT ROSTERS

A total of 59 NTDP alumni were named to NHL opening night rosters across the league. These alums are spread across 21 different NHL rosters.

### NTDP COACHES' COLLEGE PATHS

All four coaches on the U.S. National Under-18 Team staff have ties to Division I college hockey programs. Head coach **John Wroblewski**, a "pioneer" on the inaugural roster of the NTDP started in 1997, skated for Team USA for two seasons (1997-99) before suiting up for the University of Notre Dame.

A four-year letterwinner with the Irish (1999-2003), Wroblewski captained two squads over his tenure, served as alternate captain during his senior year and was the winner of the Notre Dame Monogram Club's Most Valuable Player Award. He was also recognized as the Irish nominee for the college hockey Humanitarian Award and the CCHA's Mike and Marian Ilitch Community Service Award. Wroblewski graduated with a degree in finance from Notre Dame.

Assistant coach **Nick Fohr**, in his sixth season with the NTDP, has seen his career transition from undergraduate assistant coach at Miami University (2002-03) to assistant coach at the University of Nebraska Omaha (2007-10), where he also served as director of hockey operations from 2004-07 and 2010-11. Prior to his coaching days, Fohr played four seasons with the University of Nebraska Omaha Mavericks (1998-2002), where he majored in exercise science.

Intern assistant coach **Greg Moore** is another returning NTDP player who

skated with the U.S. National Under-17 and Under-18 Teams (2000-02). Following his NTDP career, Moore laced his skates up for the University of Maine men's hockey program (2002-06). Moore was selected as team captain during his senior season, was a top-10 finalist for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award and earned the Hockey East First Team and All-American First Team honors.

**Kevin Reiter**, now in his fourth season as goaltending coach at the NTDP, was a four-year letterwinner with the University of Alaska Anchorage. He earned a degree in management and economics before obtaining his masters of business administration at the University of Winchester in England.

### **NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING**

Eighteen players on the U.S. National Under-18 Team were named to the NHL Central Scouting's preliminary players to watch list, released last week. Seven of those players were listed as "B" prospects, indicating potential second or third round picks in the upcoming 2017 NHL Entry Draft. The other 11 NTDP players received "C" ratings, indicating fourth, fifth and sixth round candidates.

### **COLLEGE BOUND**

Twenty of the 23 players on the U.S. National Under-18 Team are currently committed to NCAA Division I college hockey programs. University of Michigan leads the way with four commits, followed by Boston College, Boston University and University of Wisconsin with three each. University of Minnesota and University of Notre Dame have two commits apiece, while Michigan State University, Penn State University and University of North Dakota each have one member of the U18s committed.

### 5 NATIONS

The U.S. Under-18 National Team will compete in the Five Nations Tournament at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Michigan from Nov. 1-5. They welcome the top under-18 players from the Czech Republic, Finland, Sweden and Switzerland over the four day tournament. Each team will compete infour games, with points awarded for wins (3), overtime wins (2) and overtime losses (1). The first-place team will be determined based on final point standings.
