

Varsity/JV Rugby Coach

Bellarmine College Preparatory, a Jesuit secondary school, has been educating young "men for others" in the Jesuit tradition of St. Ignatius Loyola, founder of the Society of Jesus, since 1851.

Description

Bellarmine's rugby team was founded in 1981 as an off-campus club, called College Park and has been a school-sponsored club sport since 2010, making it one of the longest-tenured programs in California. The program has enjoyed numerous successes as College Park and has produced representative players, including Todd Clever, the long-time captain of the men's National Team. Since the change to Bellarmine Rugby, the program has finished as a top 4 single school team in NorCal four times.

Currently, the team is hiring for both varsity and JV coaches for the upcoming season.

Responsibilities

- Provide coaching at two to three practices per week, held 3:00 -5:00 pm. Days and times can be flexible, if needed
- Provide coaching during the competitive season, January through April, yearly
- Provide administrative support for the team (maintain rosters, communicate with parents, register for tournaments, order uniforms) with support from former coaches on campus
- Provide supervision for off-campus contests, which may require driving a school van or accompanying busses, as well as coordinating with parent volunteers
- Maintain a safe environment at practices and contests, including supervision, instruction on technique, and managing injuries in partnership with the athletic training staff
- Work collaboratively with former coaches, who assist with program administration and morning touch rugby (7:00 am, September-January)
- Work with the Athletics Department and Business Office to maintain team budget
- Communicate with parents proactively and responds promptly to enquiries
- Other duties or tasks as needed
- Uphold and promote the mission of Bellarmine

Preferred Qualifications

- Excellent organizational and communication skills
- Previous coaching experience preferred
- Experience working with a diverse group of people

Physical Requirements

- Ability to lift 40 lbs. without help
- Ability to stand and sit for long periods of time

- Ability to safely and comfortably travel around our 27-acre campus
- Ability and license to drive school vans (provided)
- Ability to demonstrate the sport techniques safely

- Stipended position, based on level of involvement and experience
- Not eligible for benefits
- Work hours typically Monday Friday afternoons, with evenings and weekends for matches as necessary
- Reports to Assistant Principal for Student Affairs

School Requirements

- Satisfactory clearance of a TB test
- Satisfactory clearance of a background check, pursuant to a fingerprint scan
- Eligible to legally work in the United States
- CPR and First Aid Certification
