

Wildcats Storylines ...

KINGS OF OHIO: Entering Saturday's contest, Saint Ignatius owns a 7-1 record, its best start since 2012, when the Wildcats started off 8-0. Looking deeper into the Football Cats' schedule, head coach Chuck Kyle's squad bears a 7-0 record against Ohio teams. The last time a Saint Ignatius squad emerged the regular season without a loss to an Ohio team was 2009. That squad finished the regular season with a 7-0 mark against Ohio teams, and a perfect 10-0 overall record.

PLAYOFF PUSH: Since the announcement of the schedule, Saint Ignatius fans circled the three-game stretch to end the season – Archbishop Moeller, St. Xavier, and St. Edward. The Crusaders, Bombers, and Eagles all traditionally challenge the Wildcats, as Saint Ignatius has a combined 43-37-1 record against these three foes. Without a doubt, the Wildcats passed the first test with a 38-7 victory over Moeller. Now, the Wildcats must play well against St. Xavier and St. Edward to earn a playoff spot. The Cats currently hold the No. 7 spot in the most recent OHSAA computer rankings, making the last two games of the season critical to the team's playoff hopes.

SHUTTING IT DOWN: The Wildcats have simply been dominant on defense this season, allowing just 7.4 points a game. More impressively, the Cats have allowed 100 rushing yards in a game just twice and 100 passing yards in a contest only twice. In fact, the Wildcats have allowed over 50 yards on the ground against only Detroit Catholic Central and GlenOak. Last week, Moeller managed just 15 yards on 19 carries. The Wildcats' eight opponents have a combined three rushing touchdowns this season.

DUAL THREAT: As the stretch run approaches, quarterback Patrick Ryan '17 is beginning to grow into his role as starting quarterback. The senior enjoyed a breakout game against the Crusaders, completing 8-of-10 passes for 130 yards and a 42-yard touchdown strike to Connor Kennedy '17. And Ryan did more than pass, running for 58 yards and 3 touchdowns. The senior showed his grit at the goal line, twice pounding the ball into the end zone with quarterback sneaks. On the year, Ryan has 903 yards and 6 touchdowns through the air, and 252 yards and 6 touchdowns on the ground.

SHARING THE ROCK: The Wildcats' ground game has enjoyed success primarily due to its diversity. Four Wildcats have 200 rushing yards or more on the year: James Andrews '17 leads all rushers with 584, Mark Bobinski '18 follows with 546, Ryan has 252, and Dean Stowers '17 has notched 233. What's more, 14 Wildcats have registered a rushing attempt this season.

UPDATE ON THE WILD KITTENS: The freshman squad played at Erie Cathedral Prep on Thursday evening after press time. The 7-1 JV Cats face St. Xavier on Saturday morning at 10 a.m.

UP NEXT: The Wildcats conclude the season at FirstEnergy Stadium on Saturday, October 29, hosting St. Edward in the 54th matchup between the two storied programs.

Learning about the Bombers ...

OH SO CLOSE: St. Xavier has become accustomed to playing close games. While only one of Saint Ignatius' games have come down to the wire, five of the Bombers' eight games have been decided by 7 points or less. Though St. Xavier has lost its last two, the losses came by a combined four points. The Bombers lost to Warren Central (IN) last week on a Hail Mary pass on an untimed down on the last play of the game. On the flipside, St. Xavier eked out close wins over Moeller and Cathedral earlier this season.

PLAYOFF PICTURE: The Bombers enter Saturday's matchup with an even 4-4 record, needing to win at least one of its final two games to secure a playoff spot. Now in Division I, Region 4, the Bombers sit at No. 5 in the OHSAA Computer Rankings, ahead of Springboro (6-2), Sycamore (4-4), and Fairfield (5-3). St. Xavier's best win thus far this season is its 31-7 win over No. 3 Elder.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Bombers have two quarterbacks who can inflict major damage on opponents. Sean Clifford, a 6'3", 210 pound Penn State recruit, began the year as the starter before injuries sidelined him. The senior has since returned, completing 68-of-117 passes for 758 yards and 3 touchdowns and rushing for 190 yards and 7 touchdowns on the year. Junior Chase Wolf has seen time in Clifford's absence and subbed for him at other times. The 6'1", 183 pound signalcaller led the Bombers to an 18-13 lead before Warren Central won last week in the waning moments. Wolf has completed 65-of-116 passes for 562 yards and 6 touchdowns on the season.

LETHAL WEAPONS: Playmakers are prominent in St. Xavier's offensive attack, as Clifford and Wolf have many important supporting cast members. Micah Farrar is foremost among the options at wideout. The 6'0", 170 pound senior leads the Bombers with 37 catches for 303 yards and 2 scores. Cameron Specht, son of head coach Steve Specht, follows close behind with 35 receptions for 389 yards. Another key piece of the offense is senior Quinn Early. The 6'0", 190 pound running back has 312 yards and 2 touchdowns on the ground this year, along with 130 receiving yards.

BOMB SQUAD: The St. Xavier defense has limited opposing offenses all season, limiting foes to 18.9 points per game. The Bombers have allowed an opponent to surpass 20 points just twice, and those teams were John Bosco and Colerain, teams that have lost a combined one game this season. Senior corner Carl Grimm leads the defense with 53 tackles. Senior linebacker Brady Stoll is close behind with 47 tackles and senior safety Pete Rumpke has notched 43 stops.*

UP NEXT: The Bombers finish off the year by facing another St. Xavier squad, out of Louisville, KY. The Bombers will play the host for the third straight week in a 7 p.m. contest next Friday.

Wildcats to Watch

QB PATRICK RYAN '17



A balanced attack is crucial to any offense. Thanks to Pat Ryan, the Wildcats' offense is becoming both balanced and dynamic. The 6'0", 200 pound quarterback completed 8-of-10 passes for 130 yards and a touchdown and ran for 58 yards and 3 rushing touchdowns against Moeller. Ryan will need to perform well again versus St. Xavier for the offense to continue its winning ways.

CB ALEX RINGFIELD '17



Opposing passers have struggled against the Wildcats this year, averaging just 5.9 yards per pass. Senior Alex Ringfield is part of the reason why opponents are struggling. The 5'11", 180 pound cornerback notched 2.5 tackles and 1 fumble recovery against Moeller last week, and has 10 tackles and 1 interception on the year. Ringfield will be key to stopping a strong Bombers passing attack.

Wildcats roll off 34 straight points in win to keep playoff hopes alive

Parma, Ohio - Trailing their Jesuit School rival Cincinnati St. Xavier, 13-0, with 11 minutes and 55 seconds remaining in the second quarter on Saturday afternoon at Byers Field, Coach Chuck Kyle's Wildcats rolled off 34 unanswered points and held a 34-13 lead after senior captain/wide receiver/defensive back Jack Cook rambled 55 yards for a touchdown off an interception and sophomore Matthew Trickett kicked the extra point with 1 minute and 13 seconds remaining to be played.

Saint Xavier quarterback Sean Clifford, a Penn State recruit, scored on a 3-yard run with 2 seconds left and the record 11-time state champion Wildcats, now 5-3, celebrated the first of what they hope will be two of the most memorable victories in their rich football history, 34-20.

With the triumph over now 5-4 St. Xavier, the Wildcats' first win versus the Bombers since 2012, Saint Ignatius has a strong playoff pulse and can secure what would be its 27th trip to the Division I, Region 1 postseason since 1988 by defeating West Side rival St. Edward (8-1) on Halloween afternoon in legendary Lakewood Stadium. The kickoff in "The Madhouse on Madison" will be 2 PM. The Eagles of St. Edward are ranked No. 1 in the seven-county area and No. 1 in the Associated Press Division I state poll.

In the words of computer playoff guru Joe Eitel on Saturday night, Saint Ignatius "controls its own destiny."

There were heroes galore for Coach Kyle's Cats during a gray sky and brisk game-changing winds Saturday afternoon, including players who took on different roles and players who answered the call like savvy veterans.

A triumph by many who played as one on both sides of the ball, if you will.

St. Xavier, which still leads its all-time gridiron series with the Wildcats, 12-10, controlled the majority of the first 12 minutes in moving to its 13-0 lead. The big play in the early going for the Bombers was a blocked punt that gave Coach Steve Specht's team a first down at the Wildcats' 23-yard line.

The Bombers quickly turned their special-teams gem into 23-yard touchdown sweep over the right side by running back Pete Rumpke with 9:59 left in the opening quarter.

Byers Field can be a windy setting even in August with the sun shining. On Saturday afternoon, however, both teams had to battle not only each other, but a gale of November that definitely came early.

After the wind swallowed up a St. Xavier punt, Saint Ignatius took possession at the Bombers' 40.

Behind the passing of gifted senior quarterback/captain Dennis Grosel and the receiving of underrated senior wide receiver Tyler Musbach, the Wildcats moved to a first-and-goal at the 3. On the next play, gritty senior tailback Elijah Wahib fought his way into the end zone and Trickett's ensuing extra-point kick cut the deficit to 13-7 with 7:20 to go in the first half.

Trickett, who also is a mainstay for Coach Mike McLaughlin's state and nationally acclaimed Varsity Soccer Team, made it a 13-10 game by halftime by sending home a 38-yard field goal.

Saint Ignatius, which came into the St. Xavier game knowing exactly what the task at hand was, took advantage of some more solid field position and turned it into a perfectly executed 39-yard touchdown pass from Grosel to one of the premier receivers and route runners in Ohio, senior Cal Grbac. Another Trickett PAT was high and true, and Coach Kyle's Cats took a 17-13 lead and never looked back.

Eddie Dwyer's Corner: St. Xavier Preview

Cleveland, Ohio - The record 11-time State Champion Saint Ignatius Football Wildcats, again ranked among the area's and state's best, will take a 7-1 record into Saturday's big-time matchup with the 4-4 Bombers from Cincinnati St. Xavier, as both teams are competing for OHSA Division I playoff spots in their respective regions.

Saint Ignatius is currently seventh in the Region 1 computer playoff ratings and St. Xavier is fifth in Region 4. The top eight teams in each region at the end of the regular season (Oct. 29) qualify for the playoffs, which for Division I begin on Friday, November 4.

A 2 PM kickoff on Tom Ballaban Field in St. Xavier Stadium will get the 23rd meeting in the Jesuit School rivalry underway, a gridiron series that is highlighted by two Division I state championship game encounters, which were both won by the Wildcats - 24-14 at then Canton Fawcett Stadium in 1992 and 37-6 in 2001, also at old Fawcett Stadium, which is now Tom Benson Hall of Fame Stadium.

Saint Ignatius, under the direction of its Hall of Fame Head Coach Chuck Kyle '69, is looking for its second consecutive victory over Coach Steve Specht's Bombers, who still lead the all-time series, 12-10.

Last season on Byers Field in Parma's Robert M. Boulton Stadium, the Football Cats, trailing, 13-0, early in the second quarter, ran off 34 unanswered points and defeated their Jesuit Brothers, 34-20, to take possession of the rivalry's Cannon Bell. The Cannon Bell came into play when an on-line contest was held to name something that would become a traditional fixture in the rivalry.

Former Saint Broadcast Network President John Fanta '13, currently an outstanding broadcaster/reporter for Seton Hall University, submitted the winning entry.

As for St. Xavier, the Bombers have faced a schedule this season that in the summer was rated as the most demanding in the nation by various football and .com sites.

Last Friday night, St. Xavier took on another nationally ranked opponent, as Indianapolis Warren Central came calling to Ballaban Field as the 19th-ranked team in the country by USA Today.

As per their website game report, the Bombers, behind the play of promising junior quarterback Chase Wolf, took an 18-13 lead over Warren Central on a Wolf TD pass with 23 seconds remaining to be played. On the ensuing kickoff, the Warriors from Warren Central gained 40 yards on the return and took possession at the St. Xavier 40-yard line.

After a Warriors penalty for chop block and completion of 10 yards, Warren Central had the ball at its own 43-yard line with two seconds left.

St. Xavier finally brought a Warriors ball carrier to the ground after several laterals and the game appeared to be over. At least that is what the Bombers thought.

Not so, my friends.

St. Xavier was whistled for illegal participation for having 12 men on the field (players who thought the game was over), which gave Warren Central one untimed down with 0:00 on the clock. The Warriors threw a 42-yard Hail Mary pass that was caught in the end zone off a deflection and won the game, 19-18. There are tough losses, and then there are REAL TOUGH LOSSES.

The Bombers, who are blessed with two solid quarterbacks in senior Penn State recruit Sean Clifford and Wolf, will look to bounce back from last weekend's stunner when they face a Saint Ignatius team whose only loss came during Week 4 at Detroit Catholic Central, 28-21, in overtime.

Clifford has completed 68 of 117 passes for 758 yards and three touchdowns. He has also rushed for 190 yards and seven touchdowns on 67 carries.

Wolf is 65 of 116 through the air for 562 yards and six TD strikes.

Among Coach Specht's other offensive weapons is 6-foot, 190-pound senior running back Quinn Earley, who has produced 312 yards and two touchdowns rushing on 85 carries and has hauled in 11 passes for 130 yards.

Senior Micah Farrar leads the way in the receiving department with 37 receptions for 303 yards and two touchdowns, followed by junior Cameron Specht, Coach Specht's son, with 35 catches for 389 yards. Junior Andrew Wittrock has grabbed 26 passes out of the air for 249 yards and four touchdowns.

Defensively, senior cornerback Carl Grimm has 53 tackles, senior linebacker Brady Stoll has made 47 stops and senior safety Pete Rumpke has been in on 43 tackles.

An interesting stat, provided by former Plain Dealer Librarian/Researcher/ Sports Department Information Assistant Brian Zawicki (in the good old days), a Saint Ignatius graduate and a great Wildcats fan, shows three Bombers averaging more than 20 yards on

kickoff returns - Louis Raines, 23.2, Specht, 22.4 and Farrar, 20.4. Always credit your sources my young friends, even in today's world of unaccountable journalism.

Saint Ignatius will look to offset those impressive special teams numbers behind the All-Ohio leg of senior kicker/punter Colin Goodfellow, who has consistently boomed kickoffs deep into the end zone this season and last year.

CATS STATS: Senior quarterback Patrick Ryan keyed last weekend's 38-7 victory over Archbishop Moeller at Otterbein University by completing 8 of 9 passes for 130 yards and a touchdown, and rushing for 58 yards and three touchdowns. On the season, Patrick has completed 69 of his 111 passes for 903 yards and six touchdowns, and has rushed for 252 yards and six touchdowns on 70 carries.

GROUND CONTROL TO MAJOR FERGUS: Showing the way for Running Backs Coach Terry Fergus '72 are the 1-2 punch of senior tailback Jimmy Andrews and junior tailback Mark Bobinski. Jimmy has rushed for 584 yards and seven touchdowns on 90 carries, and Mark has carried the pigskin 91 times for 546 yards and 11 TDs.

THE GOOD HANDS CLUB: Among those on the board of directors are senior wide receiver Travis Pot with 15 receptions for 261 yards, senior tight end/linebacker James Leyden with 15 grabs for 189 yards, junior wide receiver Connor Kennedy with 8 catches for 173 yards and three touchdowns, and senior wide receiver Mike Lehto with 7 receptions for 80 yards.

FOR THE DEFENSE: Leading one of the premier units in Ohio are senior linebacker/captain Adam Shibley with 50 tackles, including six sacks, senior defensive lineman Mike Chime with 40 tackles and 5 sacks, senior linebacker/captain Johnny Velotta with 26 tackles and three sacks, and the man in the middle, senior Joe Gibbons, with 23 tackles and five sacks.

Also throwing their weight around are senior defensive end Mike Czaja (21 tackles), senior defensive back/captain Matt Wiegandt (21 tackles) and Leyden (20 tackles).

As we emphasized last week, the impressive stats on both sides of the ball have been compiled with the starters playing less than two full quarters in three of the Wildcats' eight games.

FROM COACH KYLE ON THE ST. XAVIER BOMBERS: "Absolutely bizarre," said Coach Kyle of the Bombers' loss last weekend. "I haven't seen an ending like that in a long time, if ever. It had a little flavor of the Stanford Band thing.

"Defensively, they're very good," Coach Kyle continued in reference to St.

Xavier. "In their losses, they were close games. It has always been hard to score against them and playing down there they defend their field well. The kids know that, that it's going to be a challenge there.

"The quarterback (Clifford) is healthy now, he was out for awhile," Coach Kyle said. "He's a Division I quarterback, who can throw it around. And they have mixed in Chase Wolf a bit. He's going to be a good one."

Saint Ignatius features one of the biggest and best offensive lines in Ohio, but Coach Kyle emphasized that the Bombers' O-Line isn't lacking in size either. "They always have size down there in Cincinnati," he said. "But this year, we can match their size."

While Coach Kyle expects the Bombers to key on the Wildcats' running game, he said he and his staff have been encouraged by the progress of the passing game.

"Special-teams wise, we have to work very hard," Coach Kyle said. "Last year they blocked a punt on us and they are very good at that. It set up their first touchdown. They do a lot of different things in coming after your punter.

"We're very close in getting out there in the playoffs (the Cats did not qualify last year), so we need this game. Then we can take a look at next week (versus St. Edward at the Browns' FirstEnergy Stadium) and take care of business there."

SIBN!: If you can't make the trip to the Queen City this weekend, senior Brendan DeVenney and junior Matt MacKenzie will bring you the game live over the Saint Ignatius Broadcast Network.

JUST FYI in closing, the Wildcats' Junior Varsity and Freshmen Football Teams, who are both sporting 7-1 records, will be in action this week and weekend. Coach Paul Yappel's JV Cats will take on the St. Xavier Jayvees at 10 AM on Saturday at St. X, and Coach Rodney Gallaway's Freshmen Team heads to Erie, Pennsylvania on Thursday evening for a matchup with the Ramblers from Cathedral Prep. The kickoff from the Keystone State is 6 bells.

Eddie Dwyer's Corner: Moeller Recap

From Dwight C. Ballenger Field in Memorial Stadium on the campus of Otterbein University: All week long, the scouting reports singled out how Cincinnati Archbishop Moeller's defense was exceptional when it came to defending the run.

Well, you know what? When it comes to defense, the Saint Ignatius Football Wildcats are awfully good at shutting down the run and the pass.

In fact, what it came down to in the Wildcats' thorough 38-7 victory over Archbishop Moeller on Friday night at "Smokey" Ballenger Field, was Saint Ignatius' ability to do a lot of exceptional things on both sides of the ball.

Under the direction of Hall of Fame Head Coach Chuck Kyle '69, the state's fifth-ranked Division I team jumped on the Fighting Crusaders early and often, and wore down Archbishop Moeller, 38-7.

Eleven-time state champion Saint Ignatius, now 7-1, strengthened its position for what would be the 'Cats' 27th OHSAA playoff appearance since 1988 by limiting the Crusaders to a net 15 yards rushing and a total of 214 yards on 53 plays.

The Wildcats, who were also National Champions in 1989, 1993 and 1995, and a National Runner-Up in 2008, did, in the words of multi-skilled senior quarterback Patrick Ryan and Coach Kyle, play a complete game in the atmosphere-rich facility known as Memorial Stadium.

So complete that it had nine-time state champion Archbishop Moller on its heels in the first half searching for answers.

Saint Ignatius, which experienced a 55-52 loss to the Crusaders last season that went a long way in preventing the Wildcats from qualifying for the playoffs in 2015, is the team that is on a mission this fall.

The victory by Archbishop Moeller last year was the Crusaders' only triumph in what are now seven meetings with Coach Kyle's 'Cats on the gridiron.

"Adam Shibley (Wildcats standout senior linebacker/captain) said we had to play a complete game without turnovers," said Ryan, who is a cousin to former Saint Ignatius All-Ohio linebacker, University of Michigan standout and current Green Bay Packers defensive mainstay Jake Ryan. "We're ready for St. Xavier and St. Eds."

The traditional home-and-home Week 9 matchup with another of the Queen City's best, the St. Xavier Bombers, will take place on October 22 at 2 PM on the Bombers' Tom Ballaban Field in St. Xavier Stadium and the 54th meeting with longtime West Side rival and two-time defending Division I state champion St. Edward is Oct. 29 at 6 PM in the Browns' First Energy Stadium.

A victory in either one of those rivalry games should return to the Wildcats to their familiar place in the OHSAA postseason and a sweep would most likely secure a first-round home game.

As for Friday night, Saint Ignatius took the opening kickoff and, behind the passing and running of Ryan, the receiving and authoritative yards after the catch by tough and talented senior tight end/linebacker James Leyden, and the powerful running of senior tailback Jimmy Andrews, marched 93 yards on 12 plays.

Ryan, displaying the exceptional vision that Coach Kyle commented on after the game, scored on a 10-yard keeper over the left side and, following the extra-point kick by junior Matthew Trickett, the 'Cats led, 7-0, with 6:28 remaining in the first quarter.

With hard-nosed veteran defensive linemen Mike Chime and Joe Gibbons setting the tone for Defensive Coordinator Ryan Franzinger '02 with sacks on Archbishop Moeller's first offensive series, the Crusaders were forced to punt from their end zone.

Taking possession at its 45-yard line, Saint Ignatius covered the 55 yards in 10 plays with Ryan doing the honors again, this time on a 1-yard keeper be-

hind the block of All-Ohio senior center/captain and East Carolina recruit John Spellacy.

Trickett, who is also a mainstay for Coach Mike McLaughlin's seven-time state champion Soccer Program, was money on the PAT and it was a 14-0 game with 8.3 seconds left in the opening quarter.

Experiencing what all of Saint Ignatius' opponents have encountered this season, that field position

is hard to come by when going up against an All-Ohio kicker/punter in senior Colin Goodfellow, Archbishop Moller did produce some offense during its first possession of the second quarter.

Moving from its 20-yard line to a first down at the Wildcats' 38, Moeller's drive was stalled when 'Cats savvy cornerback/captain Matt Wiegandt broke up a pass play off a fourth-and-3 from the Saint Ignatius 31. Matt will also serve as a captain this winter for Coach Pat O'Rourke's defending State Champion Ice Hockey Program.

After Moeller forced Saint Ignatius to punt, the Wildcats' defense came to the fore again behind aggressive senior linebacker/captain Johnny Velotta.

Johnny V's pursuit and tackle resulted in a 2-yard loss on first down and two plays later Johnny pounced on a fumble.

In the final minutes of the first half, Ryan helped engineer a 9-play, 66-yard drive that featured the tough-as-nails running of Andrews and was capped by an 18-yard field goal by Trickett. The place kickers from both teams had to deal with the narrower college goal posts.

Early in the second half, Saint Ignatius took full advantage of a shanked punt by the Crusaders that went out of bounds at the "Big Moe" 44.

Seven plays later, Ryan scored again from the 1-yard line and Trickett's PAT was high and true en route to a 24-0 lead with 8:13 to go in the third quarter. Fueling the drive were the sure hands and runs after the catch by Leyden.

Archbishop Moeller, whose playoff aspirations suffered a major blow with a loss that puts them at 3-5, cut the deficit to 17 points on an impressive 11-play, 80-yard drive that was capped by a 4-yard TD pass from senior quarterback Evan Ernst to junior wide receiver Eric Wills and the ensuing extra point by Thomas Capano.

The night belonged to Ohio City's Jesuit Preparatory School, however, as Ryan combined with oh so promising junior wide receiver Connor Kennedy on a 42-yard touchdown pass that Coach Kyle described as a "beautiful pass." Kennedy never had to break his stride on a scoring strike that was set up by an interception by Saint Ignatius' athletic 6-foot-4 senior defensive end Michael Czaja.

A fumble recovery by "Cats senior defensive back Alex Ringfield at the Moeller 27 led to the final points of the night, a 1-yard touchdown run by Andrews and another extra point by Trickett.

With Andrews picking up 91 yards on 17 carries, Saint Ignatius rushed for 195 yards. Ryan completed 8 of his 9 passes for 130 yards with Leyden hauling in five of those throws for 74 yards.

The Wildcats ran 56 plays for 325 total yards and Archbishop Moeller's Ernst was 22-of-34 through the air for 199 yards.

Eddie Dwyer's Corner: A History of Wildcats Football

Cleveland, Ohio - On September 11, 2015, the Saint Ignatius Wildcats added another milestone to their illustrious football legacy by playing their 1,000th game.

Coach Chuck Kyle's Wildcats, scoring all of their points in the first half, defeated the Valley Forge Patriots, 41-0, on Byers Field in Parma's Robert. M. Boulton Stadium.

Although the early years of Saint Ignatius football were not laden with the success Wildcats faithful have grown accustomed to, the man who put the football program on the local map was Mr. Ralph Vince, a graduate of Martins Ferry High School and Washington & Jefferson University who studied law at Western Reserve University.

The astute and eloquent Coach Vince guided his Golden Tornado, as Saint Ignatius was known then, to a City Championship in 1925, a 15-game winning streak and an overall record of 29-6 from 1923 through 1926. Those 29 victories included a City Runner-Up finish in 1926 and 19 shutouts. Coach Vince's legendary 1925 team yielded just 25 points all season and compiled 25 consecutive shutout quarters. In 1925 and 1926, the Golden Tornado posted 8-1 seasons.

Although the makeup of Ohio High School Football changed dramatically in 1972 with the birth of the Ohio High School Athletic Association's Harbin Postseason Computer Playoffs, Saint Ignatius continued to enjoy success on the area gridirons.

And directing a huge portion of those winning ways were Saint Ignatius Hall of Fame inductees, Coaches Mr. John J. Wirtz and Mr. Paul Nemec.

From 1951 through 1970, Coach Wirtz led his Wildcats to four City Championships and an overall mark of 146-40-6. Coach Wirtz put together one of the greatest teams in the history of area high school football - the 10-0 Hall of Fame City Champion Wildcats of 1964.

Behind one of the most storied all-around athletes ever to come out of Ohio - senior quarterback/safety Brian Dowling - Saint Ignatius capped its dominant '64 season with a 48-6 victory over Benedictine in the annual Thanksgiving Morning City Championship Charity Game at old Municipal Stadium. A crowd of 41,183 witnessed the Wildcats' dominance, as on the second play from scrimmage Dowling called his own number and rambled 71 yards for a touchdown.

Dowling's athletic careers at Saint Ignatius and Yale were so legendary that he became a regular character, "B.D.," in the Doonesbury Comic Strip.

Coach Nemec, who succeeded Coach Wirtz, also produced four City Championships. In 1972 and 1973, Coach Nemec's Wildcats finished 9-1. Paul put together an overall record at Saint Ignatius of 42-16-2.

Prior to Coach Wirtz and Coach Nemec, Coach Fred George compiled a record of 19-6-3 and won two City Titles while directing Wildcats football from 1948



through 1950.

As impressive as the records of Coach Vince, Coach Wirtz, Coach Nemec and Coach George teams were, Saint Ignatius Football would reach a whole new level of state and national recognition under one of Coach Wirtz's All-City tailbacks - Hall of Fame Coach Mr. Chuck Kyle.

Taking over his alma mater's football program in 1983, Coach Kyle has set a standard that most high school coaches can only dream about.

Saint Ignatius had never qualified for the OHSAA playoffs until 1988, when Coach Kyle began what is one of the greatest runs not only in football-rich Ohio, but the entire nation.

From his 14-0 Division I State Championship Team of 1988 came a string of an Ohio-best 11 big-school state football championships, including a record five row from 1991 through 1995. The 'Cats were state runners-up 1996.


The most successful coach in Cleveland area high school football and the most successful Division I coach in Northeast Ohio with 321 career victories entering the 2016 season, Coach Kyle has also guided the Wildcats to National Championships in 1989, 1993 and 1995, and a National Runner-Up in 2008.

The 'Cats enter 2016 seeking their 27th OHSAA playoff appearance.

In what is one of this seasoned reporter's fondest memories in covering and reporting on Coach Kyle's teams for The Plain Dealer came moments after the dramatic 10-7 victory over Cincinnati Princeton in the Division I 1988 State Championship Game at Ohio Stadium in Columbus, which produced Saint Ignatius' first undefeated and untied season since 1964.

In the 'Cats' locker room at Ohio Stadium, Coach Kyle, while celebrating the dramatic goal-line stand that sealed the victory, lifted up his blue-and-gold sweater and pulled out two small gold footballs linked to a chain.

"They're from my grandfather's letter sweater when he played on a state championship team in Alabama in 1918 and from my dad's letter-sweater when he competed on a state-championship team in Indiana in 1937," Coach Kyle said. "I think I called on both of them in the end."

TODAY'S VENUE: TOM BALLABAN FIELD AT ST. XAVIER

Built in 1962, Tom Ballaban Field at St. Xavier Stadium has seen many great teams play on its field, as the Bombers fielded some impressive teams during that era.

However, by the late-1990's, the field had begun to deteriorate, as the facility did not have stadium lights, had a grass playing surface, and a seating capacity of under 4,000.

Then in 2000, the school and athletic department began a capital improvement campaign of \$3.6 million for a new football stadium and athletic facility. In 2004, St. Xavier completed the project, as the newly constructed Ballaban Field was opened to the public.

When opened, Ballaban Field was one of the best athletic facilities not just in the Cincinnati region, but all of Ohio. The seating capacity was increased to nearly 7,000, lights were added, and artificial turf was installed.

The facility also now includes a state of the art pressbox, which can accommodate nearly 40 members of the media, along with coaches and game day staff.

In addition to football, Ballaban Field houses soccer, lacrosse, and rugby at St. Xavier.

The namesake of the stadium is legendary Bombers head coach Tom Ballaban, a 1951 graduate, who played offensive line there and began teaching and coaching football in 1953. He accrued a 142-91-8 record in a quarter-century as head coach.
