TALKING POINTS

USA VS CANADA WHITE SERIES

The U.S. and Canada White have met one previous time at the World Under-17 Hockey Challenge. In that matchup on Nov. 2, 2015, Team USA topped Canada White, 7-5. Grant Mismash, currently a member of the U.S. National Under-18 Team, led the charge with two goals while goaltender Adam Scheel, also with the U18s, made 24 saves. Canada White went on to finish that year's event in first place.

The U17s and Canada White are currently in the top two spots in Group A having earned wins in the opening day of preliminary play. The Canadians sit in first place after earning three points in a 4-1 win against Canada Black, while the U.S. walked away with two points from an overtime victory against the Czechs.

LAST NIGHT'S TEAM USA RECAP

The U.S. defeated Czech Republic, 3-2, in its first preliminary round matchup of the tournament last night. Team USA erased a two-goal deficit in the third period to send the game into overtime, where Joel Farabee (Cicero, N.Y.) netted the game winner just :29 into the extra frame. Bode Wilde (Birmingham, Mich.) and Patrick Giles (Chevy Chase, Md.) also both scored in the come-from-behind win.

TEAM USA CAPTAINS

Ty Emberson (Eau Claire, Wis.), Patrick Giles (Chevy Chase, Md.), Jake Pivonka (Woodridge, III.) and Jake Wise (North Andover, Mass.) will serve as U.S. captains during the 2016 World U17 Challenge, it was announced yesterday by the U.S. coaching staff.

TALKING POINTS CONTINUED...

WORLD U17 CHALLENGE HISTORY

Team USA has competed at the World U17 Hockey Challenge on 23 previous occasions, including the Quebec Cup in 1990 and the Quebec Esso Cup in 1986.

Combined, the U.S. has a 81-7-5-32-7 (W-OTW-OTL-L-T) record, good for first in the all-time event standings. Team USA has finished in the top three 14 times; first place in January 2014, 2010, 2002 and 2001; second place in November 2014, 2012, 2011, 2008, 2006, 1998 and 1996; and third place in 2013, 2009 and 1998.

INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

Multiple U.S. players are coming into the 2016 World U17 Hockey Challenge with previous international experience. Of the 22 players, 11 were members of the 2016 U.S. Youth Olympic Men's Ice Hockey Team that earned gold at the Youth Olympic Games last February in Lillehammer, Norway. Those players include forwards Jack DeBoer, Jonathan Gruden, Erik Middendorf, Jake Pivonka, Oliver Wahlstrom, Tyler Weiss and Jake Wise; and defensemen Ty Emberson, Christian Krygier, Will MacKinnon and Jacob Semik.

Additionally, Krygier and Semik were members of the U.S. Under-17 Select Team that went undefeated at the 2016 Under-17 Five Nations Tournament last August in Frisco, Texas.

ABOUT THE NTDP

The pinnacle of amateur player development in the U.S., the NTDP scouts and selects the top 22 players in two age groups (Under-17 and Under-18) to train and develop in a highly competitive two-year program. The teams (Under-17 and Under-18) face a rigorous domestic schedule including competition against older, more developed players. The U17s play a majority of a 60-game junior schedule in the USHL, while the U18s face USHL, NCAA Division I and III opponents. Both squads also compete in several international events each season.

Additionally, the players face a daily routine of off-ice development that includes strength training, cross-training, cognitive skill testing and academics.

USHL COMPETITION

The NTDP plays a full United States Hockey League season, split between the U.S. National Under-17 and Under-18 Teams. The records for both teams are combined into one in USHL standings. At this point, the U17s are 1-5-0 in the USHL regular season while the U18s are 1-0-1, putting Team USA

at eighth in the Eastern Conference.

COACHING STAFF AT THE CHALLENGE

Danton Cole (Pontiac, Mich.) will lead the U.S. in the event for the fourth time, having previously coached the U.S. to top-three finishes in each previous appearance. Joining Cole will be assistant coach **Chris Luongo** (Fraser, Mich.), goaltending coach **Kevin Reiter** (Pittsburgh, Pa.), intern assistant coach **Mason Graddock** (Stowe, Vt.) and development coach **Sean Braziel** (West Haven, Ct.). Reiter, who works with both the U17 and U18 Teams, is coaching at his fourth consecutive World U17 Hockey Challenge.

FARABEE AMONG ROOKIE LEADERS

Joel Farabee (Cicero, N.Y.) is averaging .83 points per game in six USHL games this season. His five points are eighth among USHL rookies and his point-per-game average is sixth best among USHL rookies.

GRUDEN MAKING HIS MARK

Jonathan Gruden (Rochester, Mich.) currently leads the team in both goals (7) and points (7-3—10). He has recorded points in three of his last four appearances, and the U.S. National Under-17 Team is 4-3-0 (W-L-OTL) when he adds either a goal or an assist.

LAST WEEKEND REVIEW

The U17s skated to a 4-1 loss at the hands of the Omaha Lancers of the USHL last Friday at USA Hockey Arena in Plymouth, Michigan. **Jake Goldowski** (Thornhurst, Pa.) scored Team USA's only goal, his third of the season. Wahlstrom and **Spencer Stastney** (Mequon, Wis.) added assists on the play.

ALUMNI NHL PERFORMANCES

Auston Matthews (NTDP 2013-15) had a record-breaking first NHL game when he scored four goals in his NHL debut for the Toronto Maple Leafs on Wednesday, Oct. 12 against the Ottawa Senators. His performance marked the most goals scored by a player making his debut in NHL history.

USA HOCKEY INTERNATIONAL BREAK

The U.S. National Under-18 Team is gearing up for its first international competition of 2016-17, the Under-18 Five Nations Tournament. Teams from the Czech Republic, Finland, Sweden and Switzerland will travel to USA Hockey Arena from Nov. 1-5. HockeyTV is providing live streaming coverage of the entire event.

The U.S. Women's National Team recently wrapped up a pre-tournament camp in East Meadow, New York, in preparation for the upcoming Four Nations Cup.

Twenty of the 22 players on the U.S. National Under-17 Team are currently committed to NCAA Division I college hockey programs. Boston University leads the way with four commits, followed by the University of Notre Dame and University of Wisconsin with three recruits. Harvard University, University of Denver and University of Michigan each have two players committed while Boston College, Miami University, Penn State University and University of North Dakota all have one NTDP recruit apiece.

U17 COACHES' COLLEGE PATHS

All five coaches on the U.S. National Under-17 Team staff have ties to Division I college hockey programs.

Head coach **Danton Cole**, who has been with the National Team Development Program since 2010, played four seasons of college hockey at Michigan State University (1985-89).

A four-year standout, he helped the Spartans claim the 1986 Division I national championship. Over his collegiate career with the Spartans, Cole was recognized with the 1989 Big Ten Medal of Honor and honored three times as a member of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association All-Academic Team. Cole also coached at the collegiate level, serving at the University of Alabama-Huntsville from 2007-10 and assistant coach at Bowling Green State University from 2006-07.

Assistant coach **Chris Luongo**, in his second season with the NTDP, played college hockey at Michigan State University from 1985-89. A four-year teammate of Cole, he helped the Spartans claim the 1986 NCAA Division I national championship. He served as team captain his senior season (1988-89), alternative captain as a junior (1987-88) and was selected to the NCAA All-Tournament Team in 1987.

Intern assistant coach **Mason Graddock** played four seasons of college hockey at Middlebury (Vt.) College (2005-09), helping the team to the NCAA Division III national championship his freshman year. Following his playing career, Graddock coached at

Middlebury and spent the 2015-16 season as an intern assistant coach at the University of Notre Dame.

Kevin Reiter, now in his fourth season as goaltending coach at the NTDP, was a four-year letterwinner with the University of Alaska Anchorage. He earned a degree in management and economics before obtaining his masters of business administration at the University of Winchester in England.

Development coach **Sean Braziel** played hockey at Iona College in 1992-93 before pursuing a military career.
