N TALKING POINTS

WINNING SCENARIOS

There are several scenarios for four of the five teams in the 2016 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament to claim first place in the final day of games.

If Team USA wins its matchup with Finland they will secure first place outright.

If the Czech Republic defeats Sweden in its 3:30 p.m. matchup and the U.S. loses, Team Czech Republic will win the tournament outright.

If Sweden defeats the Czech Republic in regulation and the U.S. loses in overtime (1 pt), Sweden will secure first place in the tournament in a tie-break.

If Finland defeats the U.S. in regulation and Sweden defeats the Czech Republic in regulation, Finland wins tournament in a tie-break scenario.

GAME DAY PREVIEWS

The final day of the 2016 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament starts with a matchup between the Czech Republic and Sweden at 3:30 p.m. ET at USA Hockey Arena.

The Czech Republic is coming off a 6-2 loss to the U.S. on Friday (Nov. 4) night. Team Czech Republic is being lead offensively by Martin Kaut (2-3-5), Ondrej Machala (2-2-4) and Jachym Kondelik (2-2-4) who have teamed up on scoring plays a number of times throughout the tournament.

The Czech Republic have turned to both of its goaltenders in the tournament but Tomas Vomacka has been in net for both of its victories and has posted a 3 goals-against-average and .864 savepercentage.

Sweden is coming off its rest day after defeating Switzerland in a shootout on Thursday (Nov. 3) night at USA Hockey Arena.

Sweden has only scored four goals

through its three games but are being led by Emil Bemstrom (2-1-3).

Team Sweden's strength has been its two goaltenders who have combined for 80 saves on 86 shots.

The final game of the tournament will see the U.S. square off with Finland.

U.S. is coming off a 6-2 victory over the Czech Republic in which 15 Team USA players registered at least one point.

The balanced U.S. attack has seen all but one player on the roster register at least one point through three games.

Jacob Tortora (Victory, N.Y.) and Grant Mismash (Edina, Minn.) lead the team's offense with four points a piece.

Dylan St. Cyr (Northville, Mich.) has allowed only two goals in all three starts for Team USA. He boasts a .905 save percentage in the tournament.

Finland is coming off a thrilling 5-4 overtime victory over Switzerland on Friday (Nov. 4) afternoon at USA Hockey

Joni Ikonen (2-3-5) and Jesse Ylonen (2-2-4) have led Finland offensively and combined for the overtime goal that gave Finland its second victory of the tournament on Friday.

Lassi Lehtinen and Daniel Lebedeff have split time in net throughout the tournament. Lehtinen leads the duo in goals-against-average (2.56) and savepercentage (.885).

The Czech Republic poured on the offense early, netting its first goal at the 5:58 mark of the first period from Radim Salda. Thirty seconds later Krystof Hrabik doubled the Czech's lead. Marek Skvrne made it 3-0 with assists from Matej Novak and Matyas Zellinger at the 10:25 mark of the period.

After the third unanswered goal, Finland pulled goaltender, Lassi Lehtinen, in favor of Daniel Lebedeff.

Finland got on the board before heading to the locker room, thanks to Santeri Hartikainen, after a scrum in front of the Czech net at the 18:16 mark of the first period.

The teams traded goals early in the second. Ostap Safin added one for the Czech Republic, while Finland's Jesse Ylonen put his lone goal of the night top shelf.

Eero Teravainen pulled Finland within one tally with a power play goal at the 10:13 mark of the second period.

Jachym Kondelik added another for the Czech Republic in the third period to give the Czechs the 5-3 final.

Czech Republic goaltender, Tomas Vomacka made 19 saves while Finland goaltender Lassi Lehtinen saved four shots and Daniel Lebedeff turned away 17 shots.

SWEDEN VS. SWITZERLAND REWIND

Sweden National Under-18 Team forward Anton Johansson registered a shootout tally to lift Sweden past Switzerland, 3-2, on Thursday afternoon at USA Hockey Arena.

Erik Aterius opened the scoring for Sweden with a power play goal at the 7:19 mark of the the first period. Filip Westerlund and Isac Lundestrom assisted on the play.

In the second period, goals by Switzerland forwards Marco Lehmann and Sven Leuenberger gave Switzerland the lead heading into the final regulation period.

Emil Bemstrom knotted the game at two for Team Sweden with 1:24 remaining in regulation and forced the game to overtime

Switzerland registered two shots in overtime but neither team was able to find the back of the net.

After Bemstrom failed to score in the first round for Sweden, Johansson deked to his backhand to beat Switzerland goaltender Nils Johnson for the game-winning shootout goal.

Swedish goaltender Olle Eriksson Ek made 23 saves to pick up his first win of the tournament while Johnson registered 21 saves for Switzerland in his first appearance of the tournament.

U.S. VS. SWEDEN REWIND

The U.S. National Under-18 Team fell to Sweden, 2-1, Wednesday night in its second game of the 2016 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament.

After a hooking call against Team USA, Sweden took the lead late in the first period when a penalty shot was awarded to Anton Johansson, who buried it past U18s goaltender Dylan St. Cyr. (Northville, Mich.).

Jacob Tortora registered the lone U.S. goal at the 5:12 mark of the second period. He now leads the tournament in goals with three over two games.

Sweden regained the lead with just less than four minutes to play with a goal from Emil Bemstrom.

U.S. goaltender **Dylan St. Cyr** stopped 12 shots while Team Sweden goaltender Adam Ahman turned away 39 shots.

CZECH REPUBLIC VS. SWITZERLAND REWIND

Czech Republic defeated Switzerland 5-3 in the first game of the day. Ondre Machala started the scoring at 8:55 in the 1st period off a power play goal.

The scoring opened up in the 2nd period, with Nando Eggenberger and Jan Petrig each netting one for Switzerland. Petrig's goal was short handed, and Sven Leuenberger tallied the assist on both goals. Czech defenseman Dalimil Mikyska also scored a short-handed goal in the 2nd period.

Machala's second goal came in the third period off a pass behind the net dished by Jáchym Kondelik – his second assist. Kondelik later scored, along with Martin Kaut. The final goal of the game came from Switzerland's Lucas Matewa with 30 seconds left in the game. Swiss goalie Joakim Da Silva had a busy afternoon, saving 42 shots.

U.S. VS. SWITZERLAND REWIND

Jacob Tortora netted two goals in the U.S. National Under-18 Team's opening game of the Five Nations Tournament Tuesday (Nov. 1) night at USA Hockey Arena. Team USA picked up three points with its 7-2 win over Switzerland.

Other Team USA goals were scored by **Grant Mismash**, **Evan Barratt** (Bristol, Pa.) **Randy Hernandez** (Miami, Fla.) **Brady Tkachuk** (St. Louis, Mo.) and **Logan Cockerill** (Brighton, Mich.).

Dylan St. Cyr finished with 25 saves while Joel Messerli turned away 32 shots. Fifteen U.S. players recorded points.

FINLAND VS. SWEDEN REWIND

Team Finland defeated Team Sweden 3-0 in the opening game of the U18 Five Nations Tournament Tuesday afternoon at USA Hockey Arena.

After scoreless first and second periods, Finland's Jesse Ylonen broke the tie at 1:53 of the third period. On a pass from Jesse Koskenkorva, Ylonen deked Swedish goalie, Olle Ek Eriksson, left and shot a wrister low glove slide. Three minutes later Aarne Talvitie doubled Finland's lead. Joni Ikonen made it 3-0 with 13:25 left in the game with a shot from the right face-off circle.

TOURNAMENT DETAILS

Each team will compete in four games, with points awarded for wins (3), overtime wins (2) and overtime losses (1). The first-place team will be determined based on final point standings.

TEAM USA HISTORY

The U.S. National Under-18 Team has won eight of the last nine international events held each November.

TEAM USA CAPTAINS

Brady Tkachuk and **Phil Kemp** (Greenwich, Conn.) will serve as team captain's for the U.S. National Under-18 Team during the tournament. Tkachuk will serve as captain when Team USA wears its blue sweaters while Kemp will wear the "C" when Team USA plays in its white uniforms.

Josh Norris (Oxford, Mich.) and Kemp will be alternate captains when wearing blue sweaters while Tkachuk and Norris will serve as alternate captains during games where Team USA is wearing white

jerseys.

TEAM USA INTERNATIONAL EXPERIENCE

Twenty-two of the 23 players on this year's U18 Five Nations Tournament roster have international tournament experience. In last year's U17 Five Nations tournament **Sean Dhooghe** (Aurora, III.) scored four goals and recorded one assist in four games played. **Scott Reedy** (Prior Lake, Minn.) registered 10 points in six games at the 2015 World Under-17 Challenge and had four points in last year's U17 Five Nations tournament. At the 2015 U17 Four Nations **Jacob Tortora** netted five goals in just four games played. **Evan Barratt** also recorded seven points (3-4) in Slovakia at last year's U17 Four Nations Tournament. Twelve players registered points in last year's U17 Five Nations Tournament for Team USA. Goaltender **Dylan St. Cyr** appeared in five games in last year's tournament while **Adam Scheel** (Lakewood, Ohio) appeared in two.

ABOUT THE NTDP

The pinnacle of amateur player development in the U.S., the NTDP scouts and selects the top 22 players in two age groups (Under-17 and Under-18) to train and develop in a highly competitive two-year program.

The teams (Under-17 and Under-18) face a rigorous domestic schedule including competition against older, more developed players. The U17s play a majority of a 60- game junior schedule in the USHL, while the U18s face USHL, NCAA Division I and III opponents. Both squads also compete in several international events each season.

Additionally, the players face a daily routine of off-ice development that includes strength training, cross-training, cognitive skill testing and academics.

ABOUT USA HOCKEY ARENA

Built in 1996 by Carolina Hurricanes owner Peter Karmanos, Jr. and purchased in March of 2015 by The USA Hockey Foundation, USA Hockey Arena is the home for the USA Hockey National Team Development Program.

Located in Plymouth, Michigan (20 miles west of Detroit and 15 miles east of Ann Arbor, Michigan), USA Hockey Arena encompasses close to 190,000 square feet with two ice surfaces. The main arena seats 3,400 (4,000 for standing room) and is a regulation National Hockey League ice surface (85 X 200). Four private suites are available with media facilities to accommodate live television broadcasts.

The second rink seats 900 with an Olympic-sized ice surface (100 X 200).

USA Hockey's National Team Development Program is celebrating its 20th anniversary season in 2016-17. Created to help promote and facilitate the development of American players, the NTDP has helped produce 283 NHL draft picks and 15 U.S. Olympians so far.

WORLD UNDER-17 CHALLENGE

The U.S. National Under-17 team concluded its participation in the in the 2016 World Under-17 Hockey Challenge yesterday afternoon with a victory over Canada Red.

With the win, Team USA finished the tournament with a 2-1-0-2 (W-OTW-OTL-L) record for fifth place in the overall standings.

USA HOCKEY INTERNATIONAL NEWS

The U.S. Women's National Team recently wrapped up a pre-tournament camp in East Meadow, New York, in preparation for the upcoming Four Nations Cup.

Team USA is readying to face Sweden (Nov. 1), Finland (Nov. 2) and Canada (Nov. 4) in the preliminary games of the annual international event, taking place at multiple locations in Finland.

The 2016-17 U.S. National Sled Hockey Team is training this weekend at the Extreme Ice Center in Indian Trail, North Carolina. The five practices are all open to the public.

NHL CENTRAL SCOUTING

Eighteen players on the U.S. National Under-18 Team were named to the NHL Central Scouting's preliminary players to watch list, released last week. Seven of those players were listed as "B" prospects, indicating potential second or third round picks in the upcoming 2017 NHL Entry Draft. The other 11 NTDP players received "C" ratings, indicating fourth, fifth and sixth round candidates.

COLLEGE BOUND

Twenty of the 23 players on the U.S. National Under-18 Team are currently committed to NCAA Division I college hockey programs. University of Michigan leads the way with four commits, followed by Boston College, Boston University and University of Wisconsin with three each. University of Minnesota and University of Notre Dame have two commits apiece, while Michigan State University, Penn State University and University of North Dakota each have one member of the U18s committed.

59 ALUMS ON OPENING NIGHT ROSTERS

A total of 59 NTDP alumni were named to NHL opening night rosters across the league. These alums are spread across 21 different NHL rosters.

NTDP COACHES' COLLEGE PATHS

All four coaches on the U.S. National Under-18 Team staff have ties to Division I college hockey programs. Head coach **John Wroblewski**, a "pioneer" on the inaugural roster of the NTDP started in 1997, skated for Team USA for two seasons (1997-99) before suiting up for the University of Notre Dame.

A four-year letterwinner with the Irish (1999-2003), Wroblewski captained two squads over his tenure, served as alternate captain during his senior year and was the winner of the Notre Dame Monogram Club's Most Valuable Player Award. He was also recognized as the Irish nominee for the college hockey Humanitarian Award and the CCHA's Mike and Marian Ilitch Community Service Award. Wroblewski graduated with a degree in finance from Notre Dame.

Assistant coach **Nick Fohr**, in his sixth season with the NTDP, has seen his career transition from undergraduate assistant coach at Miami University (2002-03) to assistant coach at the University of Nebraska Omaha (2007-10), where he also served as director of hockey operations from 2004-07 and 2010-11. Prior to his coaching days, Fohr played four seasons with the University of Nebraska Omaha Mavericks (1998-2002), where he majored in exercise science.

Intern assistant coach **Greg Moore** is another returning NTDP player who skated with the U.S. National Under-17 and Under-18 Teams (2000-02). Following his NTDP career, Moore laced his skates up for the University of Maine men's hockey program (2002-06). Moore was selected as team captain during his senior season, was a top-10 finalist for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award and earned the Hockey East First Team and All-American First Team honors.

NTDP'S NCAA OPPONENTS

The U.S. National Under-18 Team will skate in 17 NCAA games this season, including 12 tilts with Division I squads. Team USA recently concluded a seven-game schedule in October alone, which included five teams ranked in the most recent USA Today / USA Hockey Magazine Men's College Hockey Poll.

Most recently, Team USA welcomed its first NCAA opponent to USA Hockey Arena on Saturday, Oct. 29. The U.S. National Under-18 Team fell to Princeton University in overtime, 5-4. **Scott Reedy** recorded two goals and an assist in the loss.

Team USA picked up its first victory against an NCAA opponent on Saturday, Oct. 22 when **Michael Pastujov** (Bradenton, Fla.) scored with 32 seconds remaining in regulation to break a 1-1 tie with secondranked University of Minnesota Duluth at AMSOIL Arena in Duluth, Minnesota. **Brady Tkachuk** scored a short-handed goal in the second period to tie the game. **Dylan St. Cyr** made 32 saves en route to picking up his third win of the season.

Prior to its win over the Bulldogs, Team USA traveled to Madison to take on the University of Wisconsin at the Kohl Center on Friday (Oct. 21) night. Despite a late comeback attempt, the U18s lost 4-3. **Jacob Tortora** tallied two goals in the game while **Tommy Miller** added two assists. **Dylan St. Cyr** made 24 saves on 28 shots.

Prior to its matchup with the Badgers, the U18s traveled to Maricucci Arena to take on the University of Minnesota on Friday, Oct. 14. They fell to the eighth-ranked Golden Gophers, 9-0. Other games this month included a 5-2 loss to Harvard University (Oct. 8), a 8-2 loss to second-ranked Boston University (Oct. 6) and a 5-1 loss to the University of Notre Dame.

Princeton is one of two teams that will skate against the Under-18 Team at USA Hockey Arena. Arizona State University will visit for a pair of matchups on Feb. 24 and 25.

CCM/USA HOCKEY ALL-AMERICAN PROSPECTS GAME

Seventeen members of the U.S. National Under-18 Team recently competed at the 2016 CCM/USA Hockey All-American Prospects Game in Philadelphia. Players selected to compete in the game, which took place Sept. 22, were chosen by USA Hockey in conjunction with NHL Central Scouting. All 42 American players that competed in the game are eligible to be selected in the upcoming 2017 NHL Entry Draft.

Logan Cockerill, Nate Knoepke (Farmington, Minn.), Logan Hutsko (Morristown, N.J.) and Grant Mismash scored goals in the game. Max Gildon (Plano, Texas), Josh Norris, Scott Reedy and Tyler Inamoto tallied assists and goaltender Adam Scheel (made four saves in 30:28 minutes of play). Eight other U18 players participated in the game.

USHL COMPETITION

The NTDP plays a full United States Hockey League season, split between the U.S. National Under-17 and Under-18 Teams. The records for both teams are combined into one in USHL standings. At this point, the U18s are 1-1-1 in the USHL regular season, while the U17s are 1-5-0, putting Team USA eighth in the Eastern Conference.


