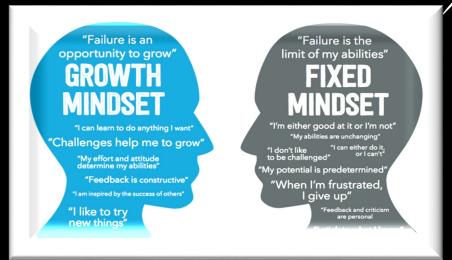

Growth Mindset vs. Fixed...

This week marked the beginning of our TPW (Tough Players Win) conditioning period. The MHSAA allows us to participate in non-sport specific conditioning over the next two weeks leading up to our season, but mandates no basketball activities (downtime). Six years ago, my staff and I came up with a competitive conditioning period to enhance motivation and focus while working to get into shape. This has been a staple of our programs since, and it was exciting to get it going here in Rockford. In addition to the physical conditioning, we spend 30 minutes each day on mental training. My former assistant (now head coach), Brent Jameson is the brain child behind most of the topics we use for this period. Brent has been a head coach in the making for years, but now is seeing the fruits of his labor as he begins with his own program in Indiana. He deserves much credit for helping make this pre-season program what it is today.

This morning, we asked our players to learn the difference between a fixed mindset and a growth mindset. If you are not familiar with this concept, it essentially examines our ability to grow and learn versus being stuck in our ways. The purpose of this lesson is to teach our players how to fine-tune the internal monologue that scores every aspect of our lives, from leadership to love. A person with a fixed mindset often says things like, "I'm either good or I'm not," "When I'm frustrated, I give up," "I don't like to be challenged." On the contrary, a person with a growth mindset says, "I can learn anything I want to," "When I'm frustrated, I persevere," or "I want to challenge myself." These are just a few of the examples we examined today.

I gave them an example of me personally having a fixed mindset that I am sure my wife would agree with. When we moved into our house, we obviously had a lot of decorating to do. My wife expected (rightfully so) me to do a lot of this "decorating." The problem is, I know and understand tools about as much as I know Latin. This isn't something I am particularly proud of, but reality. At first, I got frustrated and called it quits...I couldn't find a stud, kept pounding the nails in the wrong spots, and realized getting something to be level AND centered was about as hard as winning a regional championship. Nonetheless, I reminded myself of the growth mindset, and proved that I could learn how to successfully get stuff up on the walls the way she wanted. Hopefully she doesn't look behind the pictures to see the 3-4 extra holes from my initial attempts.:)

The point here is that we can all GROW...and it is important to have that mindset. Too often, our society refuses to be coached, criticized or critiqued. All of these are important. All of them are necessities to becoming successful in areas we currently have little to no experience. Drive yourself this week to have a GROWTH mindset instead of a FIXED. Rephrase your statements and see how you feel...our guys did a great job today on day 1!
