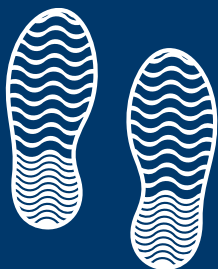

Everything you do for God is worthwhile.

Trinity has a proud history of sending high school and adult missionaries to Mexico every year to help put roofs on houses. It is hard work – but every year that people go, they are reminded of God's presence in their lives as they do work for others – and Trinity is proud to have this mission work be part of our identity!

It's a gift to be able to do work for the Lord – and we are reminded of the wonderful service so many have done as we celebrate the return of our Mexico Missionaries – how amazing that they were able to do such important work!

But we must remember – there is no service too small to be worthwhile in God's eyes. We are all missionaries – even though not all of us are able to serve in Mexico.

Each one of us has been called to share the Good News – and in that, live our lives in a way that honors God, and the gifts we have been given.

I know not everything we do is so obviously connected to serving God – but if your heart is focused on God, you will be serving God in everything you do.

(I feel it important to note that when I use the word God, I mean the triune God – Creator, Jesus, Holy Spirit – and for you, if one of those aspects of God's being is more meaningful, please know that is just fine – we all have different ways of relating to God, and that's beautiful).

When we neglect our connection to God, it's easy to become focused on ourselves – our own agenda, pumping our own egos, and forgetting we need God to bring peace and balance to our lives. Jesus did not die on the cross and rise from the dead just so we would be saved from death – but also to give us a connection to God through the Holy Spirit – to offer peace, hope and guidance in THIS life – but it's up to us to seek God's will for ourselves. God never leaves us – but is always waiting to be invited in.

I invite you to devote time to prayer. Make it a practice every day – when you wake in the morning, for a break at lunch, before you go to bed – spend time in prayer. Sit with God – ask what God wants from you and for you. You might be surprised at what happens when you make prayer a part of your daily life.

When you pray, ask God what God wants from you, be thinking about how you can do the work of the Lord. Is there a particular mission or ministry at Trinity that you feel called to? Are there places to serve around the community? Can you find ways to serve God in your day to day work and lives that help keep you focused on doing the Lord's work?

We can only stand firm with the help of God – so do your best to keep focus on God and God's will for you!

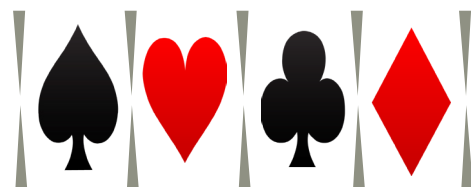

From the Congregational Council

*So if anyone is in Christ,
there is a new creation:
everything old has passed away;
see, everything has become new!*
-2 Corinthians 5:17

Just as our Minnesota winters seem to symbolize the waiting and watching of Advent and the solemn journey of Lent, spring reflects the hope and new life promised by Easter and Jesus' resurrection. So, too, Trinity has been through a long journey of waiting and watching and we eagerly anticipate the new growth that is to come.

The Transition Team has been incredibly busy for the last several months, gathering and synthesizing information from the Trinity community, delving into documents and operational structures, and much more. Our sincerest gratitude to the members of the Transition Team for its thoughtful and prayerful work, and thank you to all those who participated in the sessions hosted by the Transition Team, provided information, and completed the LEAD survey. The team expects to conclude its work in the coming weeks with recommendations for the council's consideration and a report to the congregation about its findings, preparing us to embark on our call process for a new senior/lead pastor.

SENIOR/LEAD PASTOR CALL COMMITTEE TO BE FORMED

With our Transition Team soon concluding its work, the time to start the call process for a new senior/lead pastor has finally arrived. Trinity has been greatly assisted and guided since last August by Interim Senior Pastor Paul Svingen; we are grateful for his experience and guidance and he will continue to lead us until our call process is complete.

The call process starts with the formation of our senior/lead pastor call committee. For anyone interested in being part of the call committee, applications are available at www.trinitylc.org > NEWS > Congregational Council > Call Committee or in the church office. The call committee will be chaired by Arba-Della Beck, who leads one of the Transition Team work groups; six additional members will be appointed. Applicants for the call committee should prayerfully consider whether they can make the significant time commitment needed for the call committee. This will include attending all call committee meetings (at least biweekly and sometimes more), as well as devoting additional time to writing, reading and researching, consultation with the synod, visiting candidates' congregations, reviewing applications

and interviewing candidates, and congregational meetings. It is the council's goal for this group to be highly collaborative, to represent the broad interests of Trinity and its mission, to be effective communicators, and to reflect our congregation's diversity to the extent possible. Trinity members interested in being considered for the call committee are invited to submit an application no later than Sunday, April 24. The council plans to select call committee members at its meeting scheduled in late April.

The call committee's first critical task will be to create a Trinity ministry profile. Once that is completed, the call committee will begin to consider potential pastoral candidates; we expect that will be in early to mid-summer. As we have said previously, it is important that our call process be thoughtful and to take the time needed, but with the goal of moving forward as expeditiously as the process permits.

The ministry profile, which will be submitted to the Saint Paul Area Synod of the ELCA, will be used by the call committee, the synod, and interested pastors to help identify appropriate potential pastoral candidates. The ministry profile consists of an overview of Trinity and its mission and ministries, demographics of our congregation and our community, historical data, etc., and also will reflect the findings of the Transition Team. The draft ministry profile will be shared with the congregation before it is final.

Even if you are not on the call committee, you will play an important part in this process. We ask that all of the Trinity community remember the call committee and process in prayer. As people of hope, we also can help shape the process and the results by being both optimistic and constructive as we provide feedback to the call committee about God's mission for Trinity and what we are looking for in a senior/lead pastor.

This is an exciting time for Trinity. Thank you for your continued support of Trinity's ministry and mission. Happy Spring!

Update

THANK YOU! THANK YOU! THANK YOU! To all who participated in Trinity's Heart2Heart Listening sessions, Dialogue Sessions, and the LEAD Assessment tool. Your participation is critical for Trinity's commitment to listen to, and gather the thoughts, hopes, and dreams representative of our congregation.

Offered in January and early February, the Heart2Heart sessions were your opportunity to share whatever thoughts were on your hearts and minds about Trinity. The Transition Team's job was to just listen. We offered over 84 listening sessions, with over 200 individuals from elementary age to our beloved elders participating, resulting in over 65 pages of typed notes.

From your input during the Heart2Heart Listening Sessions, the Transition Team identified eight themes that reoccurred most frequently, meaning these were subjects that were on the hearts and minds of Trinity's members most frequently. Even though we identified only eight themes, rest assured that all of your comments have been recorded and will be considered as Trinity develops its mission, vision, and plans for the future.

In February, The Transition team hosted 17 Dialogue Sessions with over 50 participants. In these sessions we asked you to rank those eight themes in order of importance with a small group of fellow members. Why were you asked to do this? For Trinity to emerge from this transition with a common vision for the future, we need to work together to forge that vision. In a small way, these dialogue sessions have shown us the diversity of our opinions, but more

importantly how through listening and conversation we can achieve the common vision we all hope for.

The final phase of our gathering was the LEAD assessment. LEAD, which stands for Living Everyday As Disciples, is an organization whose mission is to grow leaders with deep, bold, consequential faith in Jesus Christ, and whose vision is leaders growing ministries and faith communities to serve the world, living every day as disciples. LEAD often accompanies congregations in transition, such as Trinity.

The LEAD assessment was not a survey. It did not ask you what you preferred or if you were satisfied with Trinity. It was 20 statements about the congregation and its behavior in specific ministries. Participants were asked to choose the response they thought best described the congregation in areas such as worship, learning, outreach and mission, its role in the community, and more. The results of the Congregational Assessment will be one of several tools Trinity has engaged in over the past year and half to help us shape a path for the future, as we consider what God is up to in and through the people of Trinity.

With the completion of the LEAD Assessment, the Transition Team concluded our gathering process. The results of the Heart2Heart listening sessions, the Dialogue sessions, and the LEAD assessment will contribute to completing our task of describing the mission and vision of Trinity Lutheran Church.

At the end of April, the Transition Team will complete its work on mission and vision, organizational structure, leadership, and governance. The Team will submit a report to the Council and congregation on all that we learned, and will offer recommendations for the leadership, staff, and the Call Committee(yet to be formed), for their future work together.

I stand firm on the foundation laid for me, and possess the unshakable knowledge of how wide, how long, how high and how deep my heavenly father's love is for me. My grandpa showed me this great love of God first, and my prayer is you would know that as well, beloved child of God.

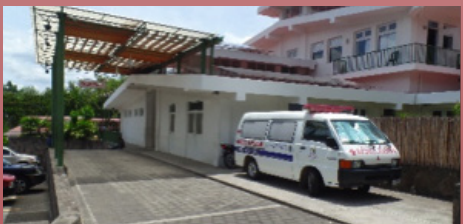

Honey Mustard Pretzel Chicken

This sauce makes a great dressing too! Yummy and easy!
You can also skip the pretzels if you prefer.

INGREDIENTS

1/3 C Dijon mustard
1/4 C honey
2 T mayo
1 t steak sauce
20 oz. pack chicken breasts, pounded about 1/2 in. thick
2 1/2 C pretzels (optional)

DIRECTIONS

In a bag or bowl mix together first 4 ingredients. Remove about 1/3 C and chill for dipping sauce. Add chicken and chill for at least 30 minutes to overnight.

Put pretzels into zip bag and pound them. Then pour into shallow bowl or deep plate for dipping.

Heat oven to 350° and spray baking dish with cooking oil. Coat chicken in pretzel crumbs (if desired) and bake approx 30 min. or until done. Serve with sauce.

Cook's Note: The sauce recipe makes a nice honey mustard dressing too, just thin it with a bit of milk or water.
