

Coon Rapids Tournament Rules

Welcome to the 2018 Coon Rapids Girls Cardinal Classic. Each team will be permitted to have TWO COACHES admitted free per game.

1. Minnesota High Schools rules will apply except as noted below.
2. All games will consist of two 14 minute stop time halves with 3 minutes in between.
3. Each team is allowed three time-outs per game with one time-out during an overtime period. One minute per time-out.
4. First overtime will be two-minute stop time. Second overtime will be the first team to score, wins.
5. Attendance is required 15 minutes before first scheduled game of the tournament. At least three minutes will be allowed for warm-up. Line-ups must be in official score book at least three minutes before start of game. Any team not present or ready to play five minutes after the scheduled starting time will forfeit. A team must have five players on the floor to start a game.
6. Home team is the team listed on the top or first in the bracket or pool play. **The home team must supply the official book scorekeeper.**
7. Bonus free throws will be shot on the 7th team foul of each half, after the 10th foul, 2 shots will be given.
8. If a team received a technical foul, the opposing team will be awarded 2 points and possession of the ball. A fifth personal foul will result in that player being removed from the game.
9. No presses are permitted by a team with more than a 20 point lead. After the first warning, the penalty for each violation of this rule will be a technical foul.
10. No pressing allowed for 3rd and 4th grade teams.
11. The three point shot line will be used at all grade levels
12. Play will be running time with 7 or less minutes in the second half and a 20 point lead. Stop time will resume if lead is reduced to 10 points or less.
13. Pool play tie breaker will use the MYAS tie breaker criteria. These rules will be posted at each scorer's table.
14. No protest will be considered. –NO exceptions
15. All 3rd and 4th grade teams MUST play man-to-man defense in the half court, all other grades are allowed to run any defense.
16. Referees are not expected to receive abuse from coaches, players or spectators and have been instructed to be strict in calling technical fouls on coaches and players for unsportsmanlike conduct.
