COLLEGE MATCHUPS

The U.S. National Under-18 Team concludes their NCAA schedule with a pair of matchups with Arizona State University. The U18s head into the series 6-8-1 against NCAA opponents this season. The U18s recorded their first collegiate win of the season on Oct. 22 with a 2-1 victory against currently second-ranked University of Minnesota Duluth.

Evan Barratt (Bristol, Pa.) has recorded 12 points (2-10-12) in 15 NCAA games this season. Grant Mismash (Edina, Minn.) has tallied seven goals in 15 games this season. Dylan St. Cyr (Northville, Mich.) has earned four victories in eight collegiate starts this season.

5 NATIONS CHAMPS

Josh Norris (Oxford, Mich.) scored a game-tying short-handed goal with three seconds remaining in regulation and then tallied two shootout goals in a 5-4 victory against Sweden to capture the 2017 Under-18 Five Nations Tournament Championship.

This is U.S. National Under-18 Team's second Five Nations Tournament championship during the 2016-17 season.

The U18s finished with a record of 3-1-0-0 (W-OTW-L-OTL) to secure a tournamentclinching 11 points. Sweden finished second with a tournament total of nine points.

Norris led a balanced U18 attack in the tournament with three goals and four assists for seven points in four games, followed by Mismash (3-3-6), Quinn Hughes (Orlando, Fla., 3-3-6) and Barratt (1-5-6). St. Cyr (2.60 goals against, .893 save percentage, three wins) and Adam Scheel (Lakewood, Ohio, one goal allowed, 33 saves in one win) both made appearances in net for the U18s.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Arizona State University is in its first season as an NCAA Division I program. Last season, the Sun Devils played a hybrid schedule in which they played American Collegiate Hockey Association (ACHA) opponents and NCAA opponents. They are currently an independent program. The history of hockey at Arizona State University dates to 1973 but joined the ACHA in 1980. In 2013-14 ASU captured the ACHA Division I National Championship. The Sun Devils play out of the Oceanside Ice Arena.

ASU-NTDP HISTORY

Last season, the NTDP U18s swept a twogame series over the Sun Devils at Arizona State. On Feb. 27, 2016, the U18s beat ASU, 3-2, in a shootout. Clayton Keller (2014-16/Boston University) scored the deciding goal in the shootout, while **Kieffer Bellows** (2014-16/Boston University) and Patrick (2014-16/Michigan Khodorenko University) scored in regulation. The NTDP U18s also beat Arizona State, 5-2, on Feb. 28, 2016. Bellows scored twice, while **Luke** Martin (2014-16/Michigan State University) **Adam Fox** (2014-16/Harvard University) and J.D. Greenway (2014-16/University of Wisconsin) added one goal apiece.

STREAKING U18S

The U18s head into this week's series with with a seven-game winning streak. That's the longest winning-streak in this group's two-year history. The team has won 9-of-10 and is 15-3-0-0 since Dec. 8.

After losing to Princeton, 5-4, in overtime on Oct. 29 (3-9-2 at the time), the U18s are 23-8-0 overall.

U18s Dylan St. Cyr has set the single-season record for assists by goaltender (6). He has seven in his two-year career, which is also a team record. St. Cyr has a 20-10-0-0 this season.

CENTRAL SCOUTING UPDATE

Eighteen players on the U.S. National Under-18 Team were named to the NHL Central Scouting's "Players to Watch" list released on Wednesday, Nov. 16. Grant Mismash was listed as an "A" prospect, indicating a first round grade for the upcoming 2017 NHL Entry Draft. A total of seven U18s were listed as "B" prospects, indicating potential second or third round picks. The other 10 NTDP players received "C" ratings, indicating fourth, fifth and sixth round candidates.

NTDP IN HOCKEY EAST

Several NTDP alumni have made an impact in the Hockey East Conference this season. **Tyler Kelleher** (Longmeadow, Mass./2011-13) currently leads the conference in scoring (12-23-35) while he plays his senior season at the University of New Hampshire. His performance through the holiday break has earned him three Warrior Player of the Week Awards and one Player of the Month Award (December).

Anders Bjork (Mequon, Wis./2012-14) has earned two Warrior Player of the Week Awards and the Warrior Hockey Player of the Month in October.

The Boston University trio of **Jordan Greenway** (Potsdam, N.Y./2013-15) **Clayton Keller** (Swansea, Ill./2014-16) and **Jake Oettinger** (Lakeville, Minn./2014-16) has also garnered conference attention. Keller and Oettinger have combined for five Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Week honors while Greenway has earned a Warrior Player of the Week honor.

AHL ALL-STARS

Five NTDP alumni played in the American Hockey League (AHL) All-Star Classic in Lehigh Valley, home of the Philadelphia Flyers affiliate Lehigh Valley Phantoms.

Travis Boyd (2009-11/Hershey Bears), **Jack Roslovic** (2013-15/Manitoba Moose), **Robbie Russo** (2009-11/Grand Rapids Griffins) and **David Warsofsky** (2007-08/Wilkes-Barre Scranton Penguins) will take part in the two-day event.

WORLD JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

Seventeen players who previously played for USA Hockey's National Team Development Program helped the 2017 U.S. National Junior Team capture the International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championship in Toronto and Montreal in January.

KELLER'S 15 GAME POINT STREAK

Clayton Keller (2014-16) recently completed a 15 game point streak for Boston University. The freshmen forward scored 11 goals and 14 assists during the streak that dates back to early November. During the streak, Keller was named the Hockey East Pro Ambitions Rookie of the Week three times. His streak came to an end in a 3-2 loss to University of Massachusetts Lowell on Friday (Feb. 10) night.

#NTDP20

USA Hockey's National Team Development Program is celebrating its 20th anniversary season in 2016-17. Created to help promote and facilitate the development of American players, the NTDP has helped produce 283 NHL draft picks and 15 U.S. Olympians so far.

COLLEGE HOCKEY FRESH FACES

ISS Hockey named its top 30 freshmen in NCAA hockey for 2016-17, a list highlighted by 14 NTDP alumni. Leading the pack was Clayton Keller (Hanover, Mass./Boston College), who led the 2016 IIHF Under-18 World Championship in scoring last spring, ranked second overall. Including Keller, six of the first ten players ranked were NTDP products including Kieffer Bellows (Edina, Minn./Boston College), Luke Martin (St. Louis, Mo./University of Michigan), Rvan Lindgren (Minneapolis, Minn./ University of Michigan), Trent Frederic (St. Louis, Mo./University of Wisconsin), and Adam Fox (Jericho, N.Y./Harvard University).

59 ALUMS ON OPENING NIGHT ROSTERS

A total of 59 NTDP alumni were named to NHL opening night rosters across the league. These alums are spread across 21 different NHL rosters.

NTDP REPRESENTATION GROWING

As of Dec. 7, 71 NTDP alumni have suited up for at least one National Hockey League game, up from 58 at this time last season. In the American Hockey League, 58 alumni have suited up for a game, up from 40 at this point last year. In the NCAA Division I ranks a total of 70 alumni have suited up for at least one game, up from 50 a year ago.

USHL HONORS
