Hi Scott sorry for the confusion. Yes I will throw my hat into the ring.

I've worked in the non-profit sector for approximately 30 years and possess an MBA and MA-Sociology. I've served on a number of boards of directors. I lived in India and Nepal from March 2009-August 2016. While in India I coached able bodied basketball at the YMCA and became involved with wheelchair basketball due to my work at the National Trust-Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment-Government of India. We worked with 900 non-profits throughout the country involved in the field of developmental disabilities. I became involved with wheelchair basketball in November 2011 (New Delhi) when I collaborated on a clinic and sports wheelchair donation with Wheelchair Athletes Worldwide (WAW) of which Pete Hughes of the University of Arizona is affiliated. When I moved to Nepal I was again involved with WAW in a clinic/donation in May 2013. From there I was involved with coaching the Nepal Army Wheelchair Basketball Team and also mentored a number of Nepalis in coaching. I was also the Commissioner for the very first wheelchair basketball league in Nepal which occurred last year. I moved to Tucson specifically to learn the finer points of wheelchair basketball and currently serve as an Assistant Coach under Pete Hughes. I have also helped out

with the Tucson Lobos and am currently involved with helping to establish a non-profits involved with disability sports in Tucson. My experience in the non-profit sector, my love for basketball and being a pair of fresh eyes would greatly benefit the NWBA.
