Coach Kelli's Tips to Get Ready to Compete

As skaters prepare their skills for competition, here are some other planning skills to remember!

- *Set achievable goals! Goals should be attainable yet challenging. i.e. land a new jump in competition. Or getting a certain amount of revolutions on a spin.
- *Do not set expectations too high. Remember you can only control how you skate, not how others in your group skate or what the judges think! Skate your best and be proud when you do. Placements cannot be controlled by you as a skater, so don't forget the rush and happiness you felt even after results are posted.

on the ice for an event is short, make it memorable for yourself.

- *Remember everyone gets nervous. Find ways that help you relax, listen to music, talk with friends, coach or parents.
- *Visualize your program how you want to skate it! This is a great tool to help skaters gain confidence.
- * A good way to gain confidence is PRACTICE PRACTICE! We have lots of ice during spring contract, buy on a few extra sessions. Get a extra lesson or two. Use the exhibition to your advantage, pretend its competition and see how you do under pressure. Practice the way you want to compete.
- **Be respectful of everyone at the rink. It takes hundreds of man hours to run a competition, and they all come from volunteers. Say please and thank you to your volunteers. Be patient. Be kind. Treat others how you want to be treated! *Thank your parents and coaches for all their time and effort to get you where you are! Good Luck Skaters!


